MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (272-277) and third full season.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing **Ron Roenicke**.....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

TODAY'S STARTER: #56 - RHP AARON WILKERSON (1g, 0gs, 0-0, 15.00)

WILKERSON AT A GLANCE: Aaron Wilkerson, 29, is making his second appearance and first start for the Brewers this season.....he was recalled from Triple-A Colorado Springs, where he was 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA in 8 games / 7 starts (34.2ip, 29h, 12r, 8er, 17bb, 29k, 1hr)..... this is his second stint with the team this season....Wilkerson made his only appearance with Milwaukee in relief last Sunday at Cincinnati (3ip, 5h, 5r, 5er, 0bb, 3k, 1hr)....he was optioned back to the Sky Sox the next day....he was acquired from Boston, along with 2B Wendell Rijo, on 7/17/16, in exchange for INF Aaron Hill and cash....bio is on p. 167 of the media guide.

LAST SEASON: Wilkerson went 11-4 with a 3.16 ERA in 24 starts at Double-A Biloxi.....he was a Southern League All-Star.....the team went 17-7 in his starts.....he had 10 quality starts.... opponents batted .228 (117-for-513, 12hr)....his 1.07 WHIP led the Southern League.....he also ranked among the leaders in strikeouts (3rd, 143), wins (T4th, 11) and ERA (7th, 3.16).... Wilkerson started for Triple-A Colorado Springs on 9/7 at Memphis in the Pacific Coast League playoffs and tossed 7.0 no-hit innings in a 5-0 win (1bb, 11k).

LAST SEASON WITH MILWAUKEE: Wilkerson was selected by Milwaukee on 9/15 and went 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA in 3 games / 2 starts....he made his Major League debut in relief on 9/15 vs. Miami (1ip, 2k)....his first Major League start came on 9/20 at Pittsburgh as he received no decision in a 6-4 loss (2.1ip, 4h, 3r, 3er, 1bb, 0k)....he earned his first career win in a 6-1 victory on 10/1 at St. Louis as he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning (7ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 0bb, 5k, 1hr).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Wilkerson has gone 37-19 with a 3.08 ERA (510.2ip, 175er) in 97 games (86 starts) with Class-A Lowell (2014), Class-A Greenville (2015), Class-A Salem (2015), Double-A Portland (2015-16), Triple-A Pawtucket (2016), Triple-A Colorado Springs (2016 and 2018) and Double-A Biloxi (2017).

CLEAN UP ON AISLE 12!: After undergoing "Tommy John" surgery in 2011, Wilkerson found himself working in the frozen foods section of a supermarket in Waco, TX....just after being offered a promotion to manager, he ended up signing with the Fort Worth Cats of the independent United League Baseball.

INDEPENDENT LEAGUES: Prior to signing with Boston on 7/18/14, Wilkerson pitched for the Fort Worth Cats (2013), Florence Freedom (Frontier League - 2013) and the Grand Prairie AirHogs (American Association - 2013-14).

CAREER AT HOME: His only career appearance at Miller Park came in relief last season on 9/15 vs. Miami (1ip, 2k)....was his Major League debut.

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 1-0 with a 6.57 ERA in 3 games / 2 starts (12.1ip, 9er).

AT THE PLATE: Is 0-for-5 with a strikeout....does not have a sacrifice bunt....**THIS SEASON:** Is 0-for-1.
