LEADING OFF: Happy Birthday to Andrelton Simmons!...Angels play the sixth contest (3-2) of a 10-game, 11-day trip to **Houston** (2-2), **Texas** (Sept. 3-5; 1-0) & **Chicago White Sox** (Sept. 7-9)...LAA has won four of seven but have dropped nine of 13 and are 18-23 since the break...Halos have spent last 68 days in fourth place...20 of 23 remaining games are with divisional foes: Seven with **Texas** (6 home, 1 road), six vs. **Oakland** (3 home, 3 road), four vs. **Seattle** (all at home) & three at **Houston**...Following the road trip, Angels return home to face **Texas** (Sept. 10-12) and **Seattle** (Sept. 13-16).

HEANEY ON THE HILL: Andrew Heaney is six strikeouts shy of 150 on the season, would be first Halo pitcher to reach the mark since 2015 (**Garrett Richards**; 176 & **Hector Santiago**; 162)...**Heaney has set career highs in wins (8), starts (25), strikeouts (144) and innings pitched (152)**...He is the Angels' **Roberto Clemente Award** nominee (award recognizes the MLB player who best represents the game through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions).

FREE FISH: MIKE TROUT has walks in seven straight games, tying his longest free-pass streak this season (also June 13-21).

LIVIN' THAT GLOBE LIFE: Trout is batting .341 (76/223) with 17 doubles, four triples, 12 home runs and 47 RBI in 61 career games at **Globe Life Park**...Since 2016, he leads all opposing players batting .368 (25/68) at the venue (min. 15 G)...Two of the first three big league homers for **Taylor Ward** have come in **Arlington** (5 of first 8 RBI here as well).

DID YOU KNOW? RHP **Junichi Tazawa** is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (**Shigetoshi Hasegawa**, **Hideki Matsui**, **Hisanori Takahashi** & **Shohei Ohtani**)...He is also the 58th player (35th pitcher) to appear for the Halos this season, extending the franchise record.

FAST FACTS: Ohtani has recorded 63 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first 10 career starts (previous was 56 by **Bo Belinsky** in 1962)...**Ohtani is the first player since Babe Ruth in 1919 with 50 IP and 15 HR in a single season.**

PUJOLS SURGERY: On August 30th, **Albert Pujols** underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks. Updates will be provided when appropriate...**Pujols ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)**...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (**Mays, Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez**)

MINOR MENTIONS: Salt Lake shortstop **Luis Rengifo** has split time on three minor league levels this season (**A+ Inland Empire – 41 G, AA Mobile – 40 G & AAA Salt Lake – 46 G**). The Venezuelan prospect has combined to hit .299 (150/502) with 109 runs, 30 doubles, 13 triples, seven home runs, 64 RBI and 41 stolen bases in 127 games played. **Rengifo**, who bats leadoff for the **Bees**, boasts a .399 on-base percentage this season...**LHP Patrick Sandoval** (Mission Viejo HS), has made seven combined starts in Angels' system at **Mobile (AA) & Inland Empire (A+)** allowing just three earned runs in 34.1 IP (0.79 ERA; 3 R, 3 ER, 18 H, 14 BB, 48 K)...**All told, he is 11-1 with two saves and a 2.43 ERA (122.1 IP – 28 ER; 29 BB, 145 K) in 26 games 20 starts this season.**

YOUTH SERVED: In his last seven games, rookie **Jaime Barria** is 4-1 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2 IP – 11 ER) after going 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) in previous seven starts...**Barria leads MLB rookies with nine wins (min. 10 GS).**

SHO OFF: **Shohei Ohtani's** 15 HRs are three shy of matching the MLB rookie record by a Japanese native set by **Kenji Johjima** in 2006 with **Seattle** (144 games)...**Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS).**

2019 SCHEDULE: MLB announced the 2019 season schedule this week with Angels' highlights including a two-game series (**May 4-5**) against **Houston** at **Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico**...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. **Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico**...Angels previously played internationally in **San Juan, Puerto Rico** for a three-game series with **Montreal** in 2003...Matching up against the **N.L. Central** for interleague play, **LAA** faces **St. Louis** at **Busch Stadium (June 21-23)**, **Albert Pujols'** first visit to **St. Louis** as an opponent.

THE NEW ME: In 65 games in return from D.L., **Kole Calhoun** is batting .280 (67/239) with 48 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 home runs and 43 RBI (*hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games*)...**Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18th rank tied for third in A.L.**

WAIVER CLAIM: Yesterday, the Angels claimed RHP **Luke Farrell** off waivers from the **Chicago Cubs**. Farrell, the son of former **Boston Red Sox** manager and Halo alum **John Farrell** (1993-94), has spent time in **Royals, Reds, Dodgers** and **Cubs** systems.

HI, MY NAME IS... 58 players (35 pitchers, 14 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (**MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers**)...14 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

TROUT TRIFECTA: With an MLB-leading 109 walks, **Trout** is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of **25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks** by age-26 season-or- younger...Joins **Jeff Bagwell** (3), **Bobby Abreu** (3) & **Barry Bonds** (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time **Gold Glove Andrelton Simmons** is tied for **MLB lead** among shortstops with 202 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...**Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs**...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DFS) also lead **MLB...Thru 906 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.**

GLOVE STORY: With 67 errors committed this season, Angels are on pace to break the club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...**Halos lead MLB turning 148 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)**...Catchers own a 41.2 caught stealing pct. (28 of 65), tops in A.L. (STATS)...**Mike Trout** is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...**Kole Calhoun's** 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.73 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...**Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0 % to score (49 of 223)**...Bullpen has logged 526 IP, second in A.L. to **Tampa Bay**...**Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 196 games pitched lead A.L. (162.2 IP)**...Over last two seasons (2017-18), **Alvarez and Blake Parker** are tied for A.L. lead with 132 games pitched apiece.

THIS N' THAT: Club is 18-25 when lefty starts (49-46 vs. RHS)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...**Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season**...**Shohei Ohtani** is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (**D. Palka, CWS**)...**Halos are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+25)**...**Angels' 178 HRs hit rank sixth in A.L.**...**Andrelton Simmons** leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.21 (517PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .290 (47/162) with two strikes...**Mike Scioscia** (1,637 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (**Jim Leyland** 17th with 1,769).

FISH FACTS: **Mike Trout & Willie Mays** are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (**Trout** is only player in A.L. history)...**Trout** turned age 27 on August 7th...His **62.4 career WAR** is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (**Ty Cobb, 63.4**).

HOT HALOS: Over his last four starts, **Felix Pena** has posted a 2.88 ERA (25 IP – 8 ER)...**Jose Fernandez** has hit safely in 12 of 17 games with Angels this season (nine of 12 starts)...18 of last 21 outings for **Justin Anderson** are scoreless...**David Fletcher** has a hit in 16 of last 20 games (seven multi-hit efforts) and is batting .309 (25/81) with four doubles and nine runs scored in span...**Jose Alvarez** has not been scored upon in 16 of last 18 outings (1.15 ERA; 15.2 IP – 2 ER)...**Mike Trout** has successfully reached base in 20 of his last 21 games with 17 runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and 25 walks in that span.

@ TEXAS: Halos lead 2018 season series 7-4 (5-3 on road)...Seven games remaining with **Texas** (six at home)...**Angels are 28-18 in Arlington since 2014**...**Kole Calhoun** is batting .312 (59/189) with 8 HR & 34 RBI in 47 career games at **Globe Life**.

WHITE SOX ON DECK: 2018 season series is tied at 2-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped nine of last 12 in **Chicago**...Angels are 34-20 overall vs. **CWS** since 2011.

September 4

(2016) **Albert Pujols** hit his 134th career first-inning HR, breaking an all-time record he shared with **Babe Ruth** and **Barry Bonds**.

September 5

(1961) **Lee Thomas** became the first Angel to post three home runs in a game in the second game of a doubleheader at **Kansas City** (a 13-12 loss)...Thomas also set a then club-record with eight RBI and finished 5-for-5 in the game and was 9-for-11 in the doubleheader.

AGE: 25

- Pitched one perfect inning Sunday night in first appearance since being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Saturday for second stint of season with Angels...Appeared in one game during first stint with the club.
- Made Angels debut on July 5 at SEA (1 IP, 2 H, 2 ER, 1 SO).
- Began season on minor league disabled list (shoulder)...Made one rehab appearance with AZL Angels on June 18 (one scoreless inning).

AGE: 29

- Retired one of two batters faced last night in first appearance of road trip...One of two inherited runners scored.
- Earned fifth win of season on Aug. 15 at San Diego; sets new career-high in wins
- 68 appearances are second most in Major Leagues this season.
- Has stranded 40 of 47 inherited runners this season...47 IR are the most in the Majors...85.1% stranded rate is fourth best in Majors.
- Retired first batter faced in 53 of 67 outings the year.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (5 games; 2 IP) and 10 ER against all other opponents (54.2 IP).
- 48 appearances before the All-Star Break are an Angels record.

#38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)

AGE: 25

#31 TY BUTTREY (RHP)

AGE: 25

- Worked 5.1 shutout frames across first five games after joining Angels.
- Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings Monday vs. Rockies in longest outing for Angels.
- Made Major League debut Aug. 16 at TEX, working one scoreless inning.
- Became 32nd different pitcher used by Angels this season, which set a new club record.
- Acquired from Boston on July 30 (with LHP Williams Jerez) for INF Ian Kinsler.
- After joining Angels organization, made one appearance with AZL Angels (1 IP, 3 SO) and four with Triple-A Salt Lake (4 IP, 2 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 7 SO).
- In 32 games with Triple-A Pawtucket, went 1-1 with one save and a 2.25 ERA (44 IP – 11 ER) and 64 strikeouts.
- Was ranked by MLB.com as the #19 prospect in the Red Sox system when he was acquired by Angels.

#67 TAYLOR COLE (RHP)

AGE: 28

- Earned first win of Major League career last night in first appearance of road trip.
- Has pitched to a 1.13 ERA across his last 16 relief innings (2 ER), dating to July 7.
- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Aug. 28 for third stint of season with Angels.
- Made first Major League start on Aug. 12 vs. A's and allowed three runs in 1.1 IP...In two games as a starter, is pitching to a 23.14 ERA (2.1 IP – 6 ER), compared with a 1.35 ERA (20 IP – 3 ER) as a reliever.
- Pitched 3.2 scoreless innings Aug. 5 at Cleveland...Longest professional outing since Aug. 11, 2016 (5 IP in start for Double-A New Hampshire).
- Has recorded 4+ outs in nine of 11 games for Angels.
- Made Angels debut on July 1 and pitched three scoreless innings...First reliever to work at least three shutout frames in Angels debut since **David Pauley** in 2012.
- Prior to joining Angels, only previous Major League appearance came on Aug. 9, 2017 for Toronto vs. NYY (1 IP, 6 H, 4 ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 1 HBP).
- In 32 games for Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 3-0 with a six saves (nine opportunities) and a 5.16 ERA (52.1 IP – 30 ER) and 60 strikeouts.

#33 JIM JOHNSON (RHP)

AGE: 34

- Pitched 1.2 scoreless innings Sunday night in first appearance of the road trip.
- Earned win on Aug. 27 vs. COL but allowed grand slam to DJ LeMahieu in 8th inning
- Charged with loss Aug. 12 at SD after allowing season-high four earned runs.
- Season-high 2.1 innings pitched on July 29 marked longest outing since June 28, 2014 (2.1 IP for A's at Miami).
- Reinstated from disabled list on July 22...Missed 32 games with a lumbar strain.
- Has stranded 16 of 24 inherited runners on the season.
- Has recorded four-or-more outs 11 times this year...Recorded four-or-more outs in just three of 61 outings last season for Atlanta.
- In 33 games before being placed on DL, went 2-2 with one save, a 3.93 ERA (34.1 IP – 15 ER) and 31 strikeouts.

#53 BLAKE PARKER (RHP)

AGE: 33

- Earned 14th save of season last night in third outing of road trip.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings across three games on last homestand.
- Holding right-handers to a .203 (24/118) batting average this season.
- Save on Aug. 10 vs. Oakland was the first for an Angles pitcher since July 8...Streak of 25 games without a save was fifth longest in Angels history.
- In 43 first half appearances, was 2-1 with 10 saves, a 3.05 ERA (44.1 IP – 15 ER) and 50 strikeouts.
- Earned the win on July 6 vs. Dodgers with one scoreless inning.
- Has established a new career-high in saves this year (previous was eight in 2017).
- Has inherited the bases loaded three times this season and has not allowed any of the nine runners to score.
- Earned first save of season on March 30 at Oakland.
- **Last Outing:** 9/3 @ TEX (SV; 1 IP, 1 H, 1 SO) **Holds:** 2 **Saves/Opps:** 14/17

#25 NOÉ RAMÍREZ (RHP)

AGE: 28

- Worked two perfect innings Sunday night...Inherited bases loaded with no outs in 5th inning and stranded all three runners.
- Made first start of Major League career on Tuesday vs. Rockies...Became first player in Angels history to record a save one night and then make a start the following day...Charged with fifth loss of year after allowing two runs in one inning.
- Recorded first career save on Aug. 27 vs. Colorado.
- Made 45 first half appearances and went 4-3 with a 4.17 ERA (54 IP – 25 ER).
- Recorded fourth win of the year on July 10 vs. Seattle with 1.1 shutout frames.
- On June 21 vs. Toronto, registered the win after working 2.2 scoreless innings
- Matched career highs with three innings pitched and four strikeouts on May 12 vs. Twins...Charged with loss after allowing two earned runs in the 12th inning.
- Induced double-play against Dee Gordon (only batter faced) to end the game on May 6 at Seattle after inherited a bases loaded situation with one out in 9th.
- Earned first Major League win on April 4 vs. Cleveland.
- **Last Outing:** 9/2 @ HOU (2 IP, 2 SO) **Holds:** 6 **Saves/Opps:** 1/4

#57 HANSEL ROBLES (RHP)

AGE: 28

- Allowed two runs (both unearned) Saturday night in second outing of road trip.
- Reinstated from disabled list on Aug. 26...Missed nine games with a right shoulder impingement.
- Worked two scoreless frames Aug. 6 in longest appearance with Angels.
- Had streak of 16 straight outings without allowing a HR from June 25 – July 29.
- Has not been charged with a run in 17 of last 22 appearances...Stranded 10 of 15 inherited runners since joining Angels.
- On July 23 vs. CWS, was charged with one run and allowed both of his inherited runners to score (blown save)...Snapped streak of eight straight scoreless outings.
- Made 12 first half appearances for Angels, going 0-1 with a 2.38 ERA (11.1 IP – 3 ER) and 12 strikeouts.
- Inherited bases loaded on June 27 at Boston and stranded all three runners.
- Charged with loss in Angels debut on June 24 vs. Toronto after allowing go-ahead HR to Kendrys Morales in 10th inning.
- Claimed off waivers on June 23 from Mets after being designated for assignment by New York on June 22.
- Appeared in 16 games with the Mets this season, going 2-2 with a 5.03 ERA (19.2 IP – 11 ER) and 23 strikeouts (10.53 strikeouts per nine innings).

#47 JUNICHI TAZAWA (RHP)

AGE: 32

- Made Angels debut Sunday night at Houston...Became 58th different player and 35th pitcher used by Angels this season (extending club records).
