**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 3-3 on their nine-game, 10-day road trip...won 2-of-3 at Seattle after losing 2-of-3 at Oakland...begin 3G at Minnesota (tonight-Wed.)...following an off day Thursday, return to the Bronx for their final homestand of the season, incl. 3G vs. Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 3G vs. Boston (9/18-20) and 3G vs. Baltimore (9/21-23).

- ▶ Are 5-6 in their last 11G, but are 14-8 in their last 22G and 21-12 in 33G since 8/6...are 80-45 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 89-54 (.622), are tied with Houston (89-54, .622) for the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (98-46, .681)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records for 116 of the last 130 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 35G over .500, 1G below their season-high watermark...have been 36G over .500 four times this season (last: 89-53 at the end of play on Saturday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10.
- ▶ Are 8.5G behind Boston in the AL East...lead Oakland by 2.5G for the first AL Wild Card spot.
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road (are 3-3 so far).
- ▶ Have lost just 9-of-43 series since 4/19 (26-9-8).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (56-9, .862)...have the second-best record when scoring first (62-13, .827) behind Boston (65-13, .833).

**BEAN COUNTING:** Any combination of 11 Boston wins or Yankees losses will eliminate the possibility of the Yankees winning the AL East...in the AL Wild Card race, the Yankees have magic numbers (Yankees wins or opp. losses) to clinch playoff standing ahead of the following teams: Oakland (19), Seattle (10), Tampa Bay (10), Los Angeles-AL (2)...will secure a postseason berth by clinching a better record than three of these teams.

**I LOVE THE 90's:** *With their next win*, the Yankees will secure their second consecutive 90-win season after winning fewer than 90 games in each season from 2013-16.

- ▶ A win tonight would mark their quickest to 90 wins since they started 90-50 in 2009.

**ROAD TRIPPING:** The Yankees are 3-3 on their nine-game road trip...are 11-4 in their last 15 road games (since 8/6)...are 41-30 (.577) this season, the fifth-best road record in the Majors.

- ▶ Have clinched a winning road record for the first time since 2015 (42-39)...last won more than 42 road games in a season in 2012 (44-37).
- ▶ Of their 16 road games this month, 13 are against teams with winning records...are 3-3 so far.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 232HR...is the sixth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 263HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

- ▶ Had their nine-game HR streak snapped on Sunday but have homered in 15-of-17 games since 8/24 (30HR total)...have hit 57HR in the last 33G (since 8/6).

**10 SQUARED:** C Austin Romine hit his 10th HR of the season on Sat. at Seattle...the Yankees have tied a franchise record with 10 players with double-digit HRs this season (also 2012 and 1998)...are tied with Toronto for the highest total in the Majors.

- ▶ INF Neil Walker (9HR) and 1B Luke Voit (7HR w/ NYY) give the Yankees a chance to break the Major League record of 11 players, done four times (2017 Astros, 2016 Twins, 2015 Astros, 2004 Tigers).

**JUST DU IT:** 3B Miguel Andújar went 2-for-4 with an RBI double on Sun. at Seattle...was his second consecutive multi-hit game and 47th this season, most among MLB rookies...only six Yankees rookies in the last 100 years have totaled 50 multi-hit games in a single season.

- ▶ Leads Major League rookies in BA (.299), hits (150), doubles (39), RBI (77), XBH (64) and OPS (.856)...is the 15th Yankees rookie to reach 150 hits in a season.
- ▶ Is tied for seventh in the Majors with 39 doubles...are the fourth-most by a Yankees rookie in a season, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936), Hideki Matsui (42 in 2003) and Bob Meusel (40 in 1920)...are the most by any Yankee since Robinson Canó had 41 in 2013...has 41 doubles through 136 career games, tied for 11th-most in Major League history through 136G.

**PITCHING IN:** Yankees pitchers have allowed a total of 4R in their last four wins (4-2 on Sat. at Seattle, 4-0 on Fri. at Seattle, 5-1 on Tues. at Oakland, 2-1 on 9/1 vs. Detroit).

- ▶ Have recorded at least 8K in a Major League-record 24 consecutive games (since 8/15).

**EARNING HIS PINSTRIPES:** LHP J.A. Happ is 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 14ER) in his first seven starts as a Yankee...is tied for the Majors' second-best record since 7/29 (Tampa Bay's Blake Snell, 6-0)...the Yankees are 11-3 in the 14 games started by either Happ or fellow trade deadline acquisition RHP Lance Lynn.

- ▶ In 41 career post-trade deadline games (37 starts) with new clubs, Happ has compiled a 20-8 record with a 3.24 ERA (216.1IP, 78ER).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees fell, 3-2, in the finale of their series at Seattle on Sunday...LHP CC Sabathia (5.0IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 4K) started and took a no-decision...DH Miguel Andújar (2-for-4) hit an RBI double in the first inning...1B Luke Voit (2-for-4, 1 double) had multiple hits...LF Giancarlo Stanton (1-for-5, 1R) hit his 30th double...RHP Dellin Betances (1.0IP, 1ER, 1BB, 2K) took the loss...RHP Chad Green (2.0IP, 3K) retired all 6BF...Yankees batters went 2-for-15 with RISP.

- ▶ Snapped their nine-game home run streak, as well as a 14-game home run streak at Safeco Field.
- ▶ Was just their eighth loss this season when allowing 3R-or-fewer (64-8).

**HOW LOW CAN YOU GO?:** The Yankees outscored Seattle, 10-5, during their three-game series...the 15 combined runs were tied for their second-fewest in a three-game series this season (14R from 6/8-10 at the Mets, 15R from 6/25-27 at Philadelphia)...was their lowest-scoring three-game series with an AL opponent since 9/29-10/1/17 vs. Toronto (10R).

**BEST OF THE WEST:** The Yankees finished with a 22-10 (.688) record vs. the AL West this season, their best record ever vs. the division...is the Majors' best mark vs. the AL West in 2018.

**CENTRAL PERK:** The Yankees are 22-9 (.710) vs. the AL Central this season...are 26-9 in their last 35G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 55-28 (.663) outside the AL East and 34-26 (.567) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ This marks the Yankees' final series outside the AL East...will finish the season with five consecutive series vs. divisional opponents.

**TWIN KILLING:** The Yankees have won seven consecutive games against the Twins, with all 7G coming at Yankee Stadium...is tied for their longest winning streak over one opponent since they won eight straight over Minnesota from 7/25/15-6/18/16...are 18-4 vs. Minnesota since 7/25/15.

**SAINT 'LOUIS':** 1B Luke Voit is batting .357/.419/.750 (20-for-56) with 11R, 1 double, 7HR, 13RBI and 6BB in 16G since 8/24...is tied for the Major League lead in HRs during that span...has hit safely in 14 of his last 17 starts.

- ▶ In 23 games as a Yankee, is batting .324/.383/.622 (24-for-74) with 13R, 1 double, 7HR, 15RBI and 7BB...his 10.57 AB/HR ratio is second-best in the AL this season (min. 50AB), behind Kansas City's Ryan O'Hearn (10.56).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 10, 1922:** The Yankees play their final regular season game at the Polo Grounds, defeating Philadelphia, 2-1. The next season, the Yankees will debut the state-of-the-art Yankee Stadium.

**TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY**

**Sept. 11, 2009:** Derek Jeter breaks Lou Gehrig's all-time franchise mark of 2,721 hits with a leadoff single off Baltimore's Chris Tillman in the third inning at Yankee Stadium. Gehrig had held the mark since 9/6/37.

**Sept. 11, 1995:** In a 4-0 win at Cleveland's Jacobs Field, the Yankees record zero assists in a game of at least nine innings for the only time in franchise history. The Indians ground out twice, with 1B Don Mattingly recording an unassisted putout each time.

**Sept. 11, 1988:** The Yankees defeat the Tigers in 18 innings, 5-4. After neither team scores from innings 8-17, the Tigers take a 4-3 lead in the top of the 18th, only to have Claudell Washington follow with a two-run, "walk-off" homer for the Yankees.

# YANKEES at MINNESOTA TWINS

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 4-0 through the first four of 7G vs. the Twins in 2018...are 18-4 in the last 22G since 7/25/15...have won seven of their last eight series (since 7/3/14)...are 54-21 (.720) against the Twins since 2008, their best record vs. any AL club over the last 11 seasons...are 82-31 since 2002...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have won 12 consecutive season series (2007-18)...have won or split 17 consecutive season series vs. the Twins, going 15-0-2 since 2002 (went 3-3 in 2005 and 2006)...marks their longest active streak of non-losing season series vs. any AL opponent...**AT TARGET FIELD:** Went 1-2 at Target Field in 2017, snapping a streak of eight consecutive road series wins in Minnesota (2009-16)...are 20-8 (.714) since it opened in 2010, their best record at any current AL ballpark and the best mark at Target Field by a visiting AL club (second: Tampa Bay, .667, 22-11)...are 38-19 at Minnesota since 2002.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP J.A. HAPP (15-6, 3.90 ERA)

**LHP J.A. Happ** will make his eighth start as a Yankee and 28th start of the season in Monday's series opener at Minnesota...the 35-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-1 win at Oakland on Tuesday (6.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP)...is 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 32H, 14ER, 9BB, 40K, 8HR, 5HP, 2WP) in seven starts with the Yankees...was the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to *both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee* according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...missed nine team games on 10-day D.L. from 8/2 (retro to 7/30)-8/9 with hand, foot and mouth disease...is tied for eighth in the Majors with 15 wins, the second-highest total of his career (20-4 in 2016)...was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for INF Brandon Drury and OF Billy McKinney on 7/26/18...his first name is pronounced "JAY"...according to STATS, LLC, is the fourth pitcher to make starts for both the Yankees and Blue Jays in the same season, and the first since David Cone in 1995...finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4 with Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in the Majors...is one of seven pitchers to record double digit wins in each of the past five seasons...the Yankees are his sixth Major League team, also the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015) and Pirates (2015)...was originally selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern (Ill.) University.

**LAST START:** Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-1 win at Oakland on Tuesday (6.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP)...allowed only 2H after recording a season-high-tying 10H in his previous start...gave up his only run on a solo HR to Stephen Piscotty in the second inning...after surrendering the HR, did not allow a hit to his final 15BF (1BB, 1HP)...is undefeated in his first seven starts as a Yankee.

**WINNING WAYS:** Is undefeated over his last eight starts (since 7/22), matching his longest such streak of the season (6-0 over eight starts from 5/16-6/25 w/ Toronto)...won five consecutive starts from 7/29-8/25, his longest stretch since also winning five straight from 7/24-8/17/16...was the second Yankees starter this season to win five consecutive games (also Luis Severino from 6/16-7/7).

**IN PINSTripES:** Is 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 32H, 14ER, 9BB, 40K, 8HR, 5HP, 2WP) in seven starts as a Yankee...opponents are hitting .213 (32-for-150)...earned the win in his Yankees debut on 7/29 vs. Kansas City (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP)...became the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to *both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee* according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...was the first Yankee to *win his first five starts* with the club since Rob Gardner, who had relief appearances mixed in among his first five Yankees starts stretching from 1970-72...is the first Yankee to go undefeated in his first seven starts with the Club since Chase Whitley (3-0 in seven starts from 5/15-6/18/14).

- ✦ As a Yankee, has held opponents to a .143 (3-for-21) BA with RISP.
- ✦ Yankees July acquisitions Happ and RHP Lance Lynn (2-2, 4.79 ERA, 41.1IP, 22ER in 8G/7GS) have combined for a 7-2 record and 3.95 ERA in 15G/14GS, with the Yankees' going 11-3 in their starts.

**VS. MINNESOTA:** Is 2-4 with a 5.73 ERA (33.0IP, 21ER) in seven career games (six starts) vs. the Twins...marks his third-highest ERA vs. a single opponent (6.25 ERA vs. Milwaukee; 6.00 ERA vs. Chicago-NL)...is 2-2 with a 5.01 ERA (23.1IP, 13ER) in five appearances (four starts) at Target field.
