RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers rallied from a 7-3 eighth inning deficit to defeat the Chicago White Sox, 9-7, in 10 innings on Thursday afternoon at Guaranteed Rate Field. Trailing 7-4 with one out and nobody on in the ninth inning, the Tigers put together a three-run rally with a two-run home run from Niko Goodrum and a RBI double by Victor Martínez. After Joe Jiménez pitched a scoreless ninth inning to send the game to extra innings, Detroit plated two runs in the top of the 10th on a RBI fielder's choice by Leonys Martin and a RBI single by Jeimer Candelario. Shane Greene worked a scoreless bottom of the 10th to notch his first save of the season. The Tigers and White Sox continue their three-game series this afternoon. Following the series in Chicago, the seven-game road trip continues with four games in Cleveland (April 9-12).

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT: Trailing 7-4 entering the ninth inning, the Tigers rallied for three runs to tie the game and went on to score two in the top of the 10th to win 9-7. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the comeback marked the ninth time since the start of the 2009 season that the Tigers have rallied from a deficit of three-or-more runs in the ninth inning-or-later to win with it last happening on June 30, 2016 at Tampa Bay, when Detroit overcame a 7-2 deficit with an eight-run ninth. The Tigers have made a habit of staging ninth inning rallies early in the season. Through the first six games of the season, Detroit has scored nine runs in the ninth inning, which is tied with Washington for the most among all Major League clubs.

MACHY, MACHY MAN: Dixon Machado had a pair of doubles in Thursday's game and now has five doubles on the season, which ranks tied for second in the Majors. Machado's five doubles are the most by a Tigers player in the first six games of a season since Melvin Nieves had six doubles in the first six games of 1996.

SAINT NICHOLAS: Nicholas Castellanos went 3x5 with two runs scored in Thursday's game and has now hit safely in five of the first six games this season, including four multi-hit performances. Castellanos enters today's game batting .385 (10x26) with eight runs scored, one double, two triples and three RBI. He is tied for the American League lead with two triples, while he ranks tied for third with eight runs scored, ninth with a .385 batting average, tied for ninth with 10 hits and 10th with a .448 on-base percentage.

A PAIR OF FIRSTS: Niko Goodrum and Joe Jiménez each recorded milestones in Thursday's victory. Goodrum belted his first Major League home run, hitting a two-run shot in the ninth inning off Joakim Soria to cut the White Sox lead to 7-6. Jiménez earned his first Major League win, throwing a scoreless ninth inning.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Miguel Cabrera enters today's game with 365 doubles as a member of the Tigers and 548 doubles in his Major League career. With his next double, Cabrera will tie Hank Greenberg (366) for the eighth-most doubles in Tigers history and will tie Chipper Jones (549) for 29th place on the MLB all-time doubles list.

FULMER AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2016: This afternoon's starting pitcher Michael Fulmer has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since making his Major League debut early in 2016. Dating back to April 29, 2016 Fulmer ranks fifth among active American League pitchers with a 3.39 ERA.

V-MART ON THE MARK VS. THE SOX: Victor Martínez has put up impressive numbers in his career against the White Sox. Entering today's game, Martínez is hitting .327 (241x738) with 40 doubles, 31 home runs and 121 RBI in 208 games vs. Chicago (AL). He leads all active players with 241 hits and 121 RBI vs. the White Sox, while he is second with 31 home runs and a .327 batting average, third with a .403 on-base percentage and ninth with a .507 slugging percentage. In 106 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field, Martínez is batting .345 (132x383) with 17 doubles, 20 home runs and 69 RBI.

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers opened their 19-game season series against the White Sox with a 9-7 win in 13 innings on Thursday. Chicago (AL) won the season series last year, going 10-9 against Detroit. It marked the first time the Tigers have lost the season series to the White Sox since 2008. Detroit went 3-6 against the White Sox last season at Guaranteed Rate Field.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with an 2-4 (.333) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,070-1,043 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his second start of the season this afternoon at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer was the tough luck loser in Game 1 of the doubleheader on Sunday vs. Pittsburgh, throwing 8.0 innings and allowing only one run on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts.

VS. CHICAGO (AL): Fulmer has made five career starts against the White Sox and has a 1-1 record with a 4.41 ERA (32.2IP/16ER) and 20 strikeouts. He faced Chicago (AL) three times last season and was 1-1 with a 4.71 ERA (21.0IP/11ER) and 12 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Fulmer has made 28 road starts in his career and has compiled a 12-13 record with a 3.55 ERA (175.0IP/69ER) and 139 strikeouts. In 12 road starts last season, Fulmer was 4-8 with a 4.14 ERA (76.0IP/35ER) and 57 strikeouts.

AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Fulmer will make his third career start at Guaranteed Rate Field today. In his two previous starts, Fulmer has posted a 0-1 record with a 4.85 ERA (13.0IP/7ER) and eight strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fulmer has started 20 games in his career against teams from the American League Central and has an 8-7 record with a 4.20 ERA (122.0IP/57ER) and 91 strikeouts. In nine starts vs. divisional opponents last season, Fulmer was 5-3 with a 4.25 ERA (59.1IP/28ER) and 42 strikeouts.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Fulmer allowed just 13 home runs in 164.2 innings pitched last season, leading the American League with 0.71 home runs allowed per nine innings. Fulmer posted a homerless streak of 73.2 innings during the season.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fulmer finished the 2017 season tied for fifth in the American League with one complete game, while he was sixth with a 1.15 WHIP and 2.19 walks per nine innings and ninth with a .243 (150x617) opponents batting average.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .232 (143x617) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .242 (143x590) against him. In 25 starts last season, righties batted .225 (74x329), while lefthanded hitters posted a .264 (76x288) batting average.

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City and he joined Philadelphia's Zach Eflin and Colorado's Jon Gray as the only Major League rookies to throw a shutout last season.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.
