## COLORADO ROCKIES (46-43) vs. SEATTLE MARINERS (56-34) Sunday, July 8, 2018 • 2:10 p.m. MDT • Safeco Field • Seattle, Wash. RHP Antonio Senzatela (3-1, 4.44) vs. LHP Wade LeBlanc (4-0, 3.19) TV: AT&T SportsNet • Radio: KOA NewsRadio

### BLACK

- The Colorado Rockies continue their short road trip with the series finale of this three-game set at Seattle's Safeco Field ... head back to Denver postgame, where they have Monday off before a three-game series with Arizona ... then conclude the first half with three vs. the Mariners.
- The Rockies have won five straight, outscoring opponents 26-5 over that span ... have also won eight of the past nine and 12 of the last 17 ... are off to a 5-1 start in July after an 11-16 June.

### BETTER MAN

- Colorado is 153-192 all-time in Interleague play ... the Rockies are 94-80 at home, 59-112 on the road ... Colorado is 13-10 the past 23 road games vs. the AL, including 3-2 this year.
- Last year, the Rockies were .500 or better in Interleague for the first time since going 8-7 in 2011, their last winning season vs. American League clubs.

### YELLOW LEDBETTER

- Colorado has won a three-game series in the Emerald City for the third time ever (2006, 2015) ... yesterday's win gave the Rockies' their first-ever three-game winning streak in Seattle, going back to June 1, 2017 ... prior to Saturday, Colorado had never won two straight at Seattle within one series.
- A win today would give the Rockies their second four-game winning streak vs. the Mariners (July 2, 2006-June 14, 2009) ... a victory on Sunday would also secure only the second Colorado three-game sweep vs. Seattle (June 12-14, 2009 in Denver).

### DO THE EVOLUTION

- The Rockies are 18-22 all-time against the Mariners, going 10-11 on the road and 8-11 in Denver ... Colorado is 6-4 vs. the Mariners the past 10 games after dropping five straight to Seattle.
- Chris Iannetta played one season for Seattle in '16.
- Manager Bud Black was drafted by Seattle in the 17th round of the 1979 draft and made his Major League debut for the Mariners on Sept. 5, 1981 vs. Boston ... he attended Mark Morris High School in Longview, Wash., and Lower Columbia College.

- Rockies Bench Coach Mike Redmond was born in Seattle and attended Gonzaga Prep before attending Gonzaga University in Spokane ... Redmond currently resides in Spokane with his family in the offseason.
- Another Pacific Northwest connection is pitcher Tyler Anderson, who played at the University of Oregon (2009-2011).

### WHY GO

- The Rockies are 3-10 on Sundays ... haven't won on a Sunday since May 27 vs. Cincinnati, a five-game losing streak ... haven't won on a *getaway Sunday* since May 6 at New York-NL.

### STATE OF LOVE AND TRUST

- The Rockies have posted a 2.79 ERA (132.1 IP, 41 ER) their past 15 games ... opponents are hitting .232 that span (114-for-492) ... Colorado starters have notched a 2.55 ERA (91.2 IP, 26 ER) that same time frame, going 8-2 with 10 quality starts.
- The last 11 outings, the starting pitchers have a 1.82 ERA (69.1 IP, 14 ER) with a .175 opponents' batting average (43-for-246) ... a Colorado starter hasn't allowed two homers since June 18 vs. the Mets.

### DISSIDENT

- Rockies starters have allowed two or fewer runs in the past eight starts since June 29 (6-0, 1.21 ERA, 52.0 IP, 7 ER) ... have worked six or more innings six times that span and seven or more five games.
- The Rockies have nine outings of at least seven scoreless innings, including four such outings since June 27 ... that is tied for the third-most starts of that kind in franchise history (also: 2011) behind the 2008 (11) team and the 2010 club (16).
- Since the start of 2017, the Rockies have used eight starting pitchers, the fewest in the Major Leagues.

### EVEN FLOW

- Colorado's bullpen has a 3.19 ERA (48.0 IP, 17 ER) in the past 17 games, notching seven saves in eight opportunities ... the past seven games, the relievers have combined for 18.0 innings and four runs allowed (2.00).

### SIRENS

- Colorado's .989 fielding percentage ranks second in the NL, third in MLB ... the 35 errors are tied for the fewest in the NL with Arizona and tied for the second-fewest in MLB behind Houston (34).
- The Rockies rank second in the Majors with a 10.18 assists per nine innings rate, while their 92 double plays turned rank third (second in the NL).

### JUST BREATHE

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (73) and is tied for second in runs allowed in the first frame (72).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 26 home runs in the first inning, and have allowed 22 (tied for the most in MLB) ... Nolan Arenado's 10 first-inning home runs are the most in MLB, while Trevor Story's five home runs are tied for seventh.

### CANT' DENY ME

- Nolan Arenado leads the National League with 22 home runs and a .587 slugging percentage.
- Arenado also ranks tied for second in the NL with 63 RBI, is sixth with a .389 on-base percentage, and ranks eighth with a .306 batting average.
- In 21 games since he was not in the starting lineup on June 14, Arenado is 26-for-84 (.310) with 16 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs and 26 RBI ... has nine home runs in his past 17 games.

### CORDUROY

- Trevor Story (right foot contusion) didn't play yesterday for the first time this season, ending a consecutive games streak at 139 ... it was the third-longest *active* streak in the Majors.
- Story is fourth in the NL with 60 RBI, tied for second with 44 extra-base hits, and fifth with 176 total bases.
- Batting .346 (45-for-130) since June 1, the third-highest average in the National League that span ... also leads the NL since 6/1 with 14 doubles.
- Has hit .337 (34-for-101) on the road since May 15.

**BACK WHERE YOU BELONG**

- The 23 year-old right-hander was recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque prior his last start, July 3.
- Was a member of his second career Opening Day roster, breaking with the club as a reliever.
- Made 10 relief appearances for the Rockies before being optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque on May 2 ... went 2-1 with a 6.23 ERA (17.1 IP, 12 ER), six walks and 14 strikeouts.
- Was scored upon in five of 10 relief appearances, allowing multiple runs four times ... worked two or more innings five times.

**JUST LIKE OLD TIMES**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque on July 3 and started against the San Francisco Giants that night at Coors Field, his first Major League start since Aug. 28, 2017 ... pitched seven scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and four strikeouts in the 8-1 Rockies win.
- It was his second career start pitching at least seven scoreless innings ... recorded eight scoreless innings vs. St. Louis at Coors Field on May 26, 2017.

**ONE TO REMEMBER**

- In his last relief appearance prior to his option, April 27 at Miami, pitched 3.2 scoreless innings of relief in the 1-0 Rockies win ... entered the game after Tyler Anderson left in the second inning due to lightheadedness ... the 3.2 innings were a career-high in relief.
- Recorded an RBI double in the fifth inning, the only run in the 1-0 win ... according to STATS he became the first relief pitcher in Rockies history and the first in the Major League since Joe Niekro on Aug. 23, 1980 to earn the win and drive in the game's only run in a 1-0 victory ... it was also the first game in Rockies history in which all runs were driven in by a relief pitcher.

**THROW A STONE**

- Is 3-0 with a 4.24 ERA (23.1 IP, 11 ER), three walks and 16 strikeouts in five career appearances, three starts, against San Francisco ... as a starter, is 3-0 with a 4.05 ERA (20.0 IP, 9 ER), one walk and 12 strikeouts.
- Made two starts vs. the Giants at Coors Field in 2017, going 2-0 with a 4.15 ERA (13.0 IP, 6 ER), one walk and nine strikeouts ... has allowed four home runs to Giants hitters at Coors Field, including three in his last start on June 16, 2017.

**HOME COOKING**

- Is 2-0 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 IP, 6 ER) in five appearances, one start, at Coors Field this season ... went 1-0 with a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP, 6 ER) in his four relief appearances at home.
- In 24 career appearances at Coors Field, including 12 starts, has gone 10-3 with a 4.88 ERA (94.0 IP, 51 ER), 29 walks and 60 strikeouts.
- His .769 winning percentage at Coors Field is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 12 starts).
- In his 12 starts at Coors Field, is 9-3 with a 4.63 ERA (72.0 IP, 37 ER), 21 walks and 42 strikeouts ... has allowed 13 home runs.

**ONE FOR THE ROAD**

- Is 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 6 ER) in six relief appearances on the road this season.
- In 23 career road appearances, including nine starts, on the road has gone 3-3 with a 4.29 ERA (65.0 IP, 31 ER), 24 walks and 60 strikeouts ... has only allowed six career home runs on the road.
- As a starter on the road, is 2-2 with a 4.89 ERA (46.0 IP, 25 ER).

**SOMETIMES ALBUQUERQUE**

- Made eight starts with Triple-A Albuquerque, going 3-1 with a 2.15 ERA (37.2 IP, 9 ER), 12 walks and 42 strikeouts ... allowed three runs one time, two runs or less seven times ... logged three quality starts.
- Last started on June 28 vs. Sacramento ... pitched 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

**GOODYEAR, ROOK**

- Made the Rockies Opening Day roster in 2017 and made 20 starts and 16 relief appearances ... went 10-5 with a 5.03 ERA (111.0 IP, 62 ER) across his 20 starts.
- Was named the National League Rookie of the Month for April after going 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (32.0 IP, 10 ER) ... finished the month first among Major League rookie pitchers in ERA and innings pitched, tied for first in wins and tied for fourth in strikeouts ... pitched seven innings in three consecutive starts April 11-22, becoming the first Rockies pitcher since Jhoulys Chacin in 2013 to accomplish the feat.
- Pitched eight shutout innings May 26 vs. St. Louis, his longest career outing, allowing five hits with no walks and three strikeouts.
- Moved to the bullpen in September and went 0-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 IP, 8 ER).

**TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP Tyler Anderson (6-3, 3.90)**

The 28-year-old left-hander will make his 19th start of the season, his 11th on the road, where he is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA (54.1 IP, 21 ER) ... tossed eight scoreless innings for the second consecutive outing in his last start, July 4 vs. the Giants at Coors Field ... is the third pitcher in franchise history to record consecutive outings of at least eight scoreless innings, the first to accomplish that feat while holding the opponent to four or fewer hits ... his 16.0 scoreless streak the longest active streak by a starter in MLB ... has faced Seattle on time in his career; a 10-4 Rockies loss at Coors Field May 30, 2017 ... pitched five innings and allowed six runs on a career-high 11 hits ... in five career Interleague starts, is 1-3 with a 5.22 ERA (29.1 IP, 17 ER), 11 walks and 20 strikeouts.
