HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 5-1 start matches the best 6-game start in franchise history (also: 2000, '12, '13, '17...they have started 6-1 twice ('00, '17).
- ♦ Arizona went 3-4 vs. Cardinals in 2017, including 2-2 @ Busch Stadium.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** a 7-decision winning streak since Aug. 24, 2017, the longest of his career...is making his first appearance @ Busch Stadium since being struck in the head with a line drive from Luke Voit on July 28, 2017.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has 8 career home runs and 22 RBI in 37 games vs. Cardinals...his .786 slugging pct. vs. Adam Wainwright is the fourth highest all-time among [min. 15 PA], behind Charlie Blackmon (.933), Ryan Sweeney (.846) and Lucas Duda (.813).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won their ninth straight regular-season game vs. Dodgers, 3-0, and matched their best 6-game start in franchise history (also: 2000, '12-13, '17).
- ♦ Four Arizona pitchers combined to limit Los Angeles to 1 hit, marking the 12th time in club history the D-backs have allowed 1 or fewer hits.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** struck out a career-high 12 batters in earning his first win vs. Dodgers since 2013, giving up just 1 hit in 7.1 scoreless innings...he also moved into sole possession of fourth place on Arizona's all-time strikeout list (671) and went 2-for-2 with a double and a run scored.

BIG DAY FOR CORBIN

- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** also accomplished the following yesterday in his start vs. Dodgers:
 - Fourth D-back to throw 7.0+ innings with 12+ strikeouts and no more than 1 hit and 1 walk allowed (also: Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 vs. Rockies & May 18, 2004 @ Braves; Ian Kennedy on Sept. 19, 2011; Robbie Ray on Aug. 20, 2016 @ Padres).
 - Was the third player in the last 100 years with 12+ strikeouts as a pitcher and 2+ hits as a batter against the Dodgers, joining Dwight Gooden (June 4, 1985) and Curt Schilling (Aug. 22, 1997) [source: STATS LLC].

- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** has 98 career wins in 168 regular season games as D-backs manager and is looking to be the fastest manager in team history to 100 wins:

ROAD TRIPPIN'

- ♦ Today, the D-backs kick off their road portion of the schedule with a 9-game, 11-day trip to St. Louis (April 5-8), San Francisco (April 9-1) and Los Angeles (April 13-15).
- ♦ The D-backs will travel 36,460 miles this season, the seventh most in the Majors behind the Mariners (40,783), A's (39,906), Angels (39,125), Astros (39,080), Padres (38,759) and Marlins (36,484)...the Reds fly the fewest (20,738) [source: MLB.com].

HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

- ♦ The D-backs have drawn 181,049 in attendance in 6 games @ Chase Field in 2018, 18 pct. higher than this time in 2017 (149,257).

OPENING DAY

- ♦ Best of luck to all the D-backs' full-season Minor League affiliates that are having their Opening Day (Triple-A Reno, Double-A Jackson, Single-A Adv. Visalia and Single-A Kane County).

IT'S RAY DAY

- ♦ **Robbie Ray** has a 7-decision winning streak since Aug. 24 of last season, the longest of his career...has posted a 3.17 ERA (17 ER in 48.1 IP) with 75 strikeouts in that 9 start span.
- ♦ Has earned a win in each of his last 7 road decisions since May 20, 2017, posting a 1.98 ERA (15 ER in 68.1 IP) with 91 strikeouts in 12 starts.
- ♦ Making his first appearance @ Busch Stadium since being struck in the head with a line drive from Luke Voit on July 28, 2017.

BACK WHERE IT ALL STARTED

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso's** career began with the Cardinals spanning 5 seasons from 2010-14, highlighted by a pair of trips to the World Series (2011 champions, 2013 runner-up).
- ♦ In his last 9 games against his former team, he is hitting .333 (11-for-33) with a .421 on-base pct., .936 OPS, 3 doubles 1 homer, 6 RBI and 5 walks.
- ♦ **Fernando Salas** (2007-13) and **David Peralta** (2005-09) each pitched in the Cardinals' organization and **Dave McKay** was St. Louis' first base coach from 1996-2011.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE

- ♦ The D-backs rank second in the Majors with 31 walks, behind the Nationals (36) and ahead of the Marlins (29) and Astros (28).
- ♦ Arizona's .354 team on-base pct. ranks fourth in the NL and fifth in the Majors behind the Mets (.384), Braves (.376), Nationals (.372) and Astros (.354).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is tied with Bryce Harper/WSH for second in the Majors with 9 walks, trailing Freddie Freeman/ATL (10).

- ♦ Arizona's starters have combined to go 4-0 with a 3.28 ERA (13 ER in 35.2 IP), tied for the most wins (also: Nationals) and the second best ERA in the NL (Dodgers, 1.99).

HIT, RUN, SCORE

- ♦ Arizona is averaging 5.83 runs per game (35 runs/6 games), the fourth-highest mark in the NL behind the Atlanta (8.00), Pittsburgh (6.00) and Washington (6.00).
- ♦ The D-backs 54 hits are tied for fourth most in the NL (also: Cardinals) behind Braves (63), Brewers (58) and Marlins (57).

EARLY BIRD GETS THE WORM

- ♦ Arizona has scored 10 of their 35 runs in the first inning this season, the second most in the Majors, behind Washington (11).

- ◆ Born in Brentwood, Tenn.
- ◆ Won a gold medal with USA Baseball's 18U National Championship Team that participated in the 2009 Pan-American Championships in Venezuela...was teammates with Cory Hahn, D-backs Coordination, Professional Scouting.
- ◆ Had committed to pitch at the University of Arkansas before signing with the Nationals.
- ◆ Wears a protective cap insert on the left side of his head after being struck by a 108-mph line drive on July 28, 2017 @ Cardinals...was on the disabled list from July 29-Aug. 24.

- ◆ Established a career high in wins and ERA, going 15-5 with a 2.89 ERA in 28 starts...matched his career high with 218 strikeouts (also: 2016).

LAD Series: 1-1 SV, 0 ER/2.0 IP, 3 K

- ◆ Has a 10-game scoreless streak (10.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Save on March 30 vs. Rockies was his first since Oct. 1, 2015.
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

- ◆ Last season, held NL Central opponents scoreless in 12 of 13 outings (0.63 ERA, 1 ER in 14.1 IP) with .122 opponent average (6 H, 2 BB) and 12 strikeouts.
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).

- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).
- ◆ Has lived in a RV during the season since 2016.

- ◆ Has an 8-game scoreless streak (5.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 22, 2017.
- ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
- ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017, his first as primarily a reliever since 2006 with the Brewers and Royals...lefties hit .194/.253 OBP/.292 SLG.
