ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have optioned RH **Andrew Kittredge** to Triple-A Durham and recalled RH **Hunter Wood** for his second stint with the Rays this season...the Rays have added LH **Anthony Banda** to the taxi squad and he will be active for tomorrow's game.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are 1-6 in their last 7 games, 3-8 in their last 11 games and 4-9 in their last 13 games...they are 8-12 on the road this year, are 1-5 in their last 6 road games and 2-6 in their last 8 road games.

- + With yesterday's loss at BAL, the Rays fell to 1-3 in their last 4 series after a stretch of four consecutive series wins (April 16-29).
- + The Rays need a win today to avoid dropping to 7 games under .500 for the first time since April 20 (6-13)...the Rays have only been over .500 once this season (1-0)...they started 1-8 this season and have lost all three attempts to return to .500 since then.
- + The Rays have held a lead in 27 of their 38 games (71.1 pct.) yet are 6 games under .500...the have lost 11 games after holding a lead, tied with the Marlins and Nationals for 4th-most in the majors behind the Royals (15), White Sox (13) and Orioles (12).

CROOKED NUMBERS—Yesterday at BAL, the Rays allowed:

- + **17 runs**, their most since Aug 7, 2010 at TOR (17)
- + **19 hits**, their most since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS (21), their most in a 9-inning game since June 16, 2015 vs. WAS (23) and their most in any road game since Aug 7, 2010 at TOR (20)
- + **8 XBH**, their most since July 31, 2017 at HOU (9)
- + **4 HR**, matching their season high (also May 11 at BAL)
- + **7 runs in the 7th inning**, their most in a single frame since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS (7-run 15th inning) and their most in a single frame of a road game since Aug 23, 2015 (7-run 7th inning)
- + The 17-1 final was the Rays most lopsided loss since July 22, 2007 at NYY (21-4)...with an 8th-inning run to cut the deficit from 17-0 to 17-1, the Rays avoided the largest shutout loss in franchise history (14-0 on July 1, 2004 vs. TOR).

SERIES TO FORGET—The Rays went 1-3 in the 3-day, 4-game series at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...they split a traditional, single-admission doubleheader on Sat at BAL...though both teams collected 40 hits, the Rays were outscored, 35-18...they allowed 12 HR, their most ever for a single series, regardless of length—passing the 3-game series from June 7-9, 2005 at CIN (11), the 4-game series from July 20-22, 2007 at NYY (11) and the 4-game series from Sep 26-28, 2008 at DET (11).

- + The 35 runs were the most allowed by the Rays since the 4-game series from July 20-22, 2007 at NYY (club-record 49).
- + The Rays allowed multi-HR games to **Joey Rickard**, **Jonathan Schoop** and **Manny Machado** during the series...the last time they allowed multi-HR games to three batters in a single series was Aug 29-Sep 1, 2005 at BOS (**David Ortiz**, **Kevin Millar**, **John Olerud**).

FIELD DAY—In the 8th inning of yesterday's loss at BAL, **Johnny Field** became the ninth positional player in franchise history to pitch and second this season, following **Daniel Robertson** on April 7 at BOS...he pitched around a 1-out walk for a scoreless inning, with three flyouts—and was the only Rays pitcher of the game to not allow a run...this is the second time in club history multiple positional players have pitched in the same season, and the first time was June 16, 2015 vs. WAS (**Jake Elmore**, **Nick Franklin** in the same game)...prior to Robertson and Field, the earliest in the season any Rays position player had been used as a pitcher was **Josh Wilson** on June 8, 2007 at FLA.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN—This is the third of four consecutive 3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in franchise history the Rays have ever had four consecutive three-city trips...this 11-game jaunt to Baltimore (1-3), Kansas City (3 games) and Anaheim (4 games) is the Rays first trip of 11 games or more since September 2016, when they went 5-6 visiting NYY (1-3), TOR (1-2) and BAL (2-2)...the Rays welcomed new hitting coach **Chad Mottola** at the onset of that trip...the last time the Rays had a road trip to three different time zones was June 3-11 2008, when they went 3-6 in Boston (0-3), Texas (2-1) and Anaheim (1-2)—including the famous **James Shields-Coco Crisp** brawl at Fenway Park.

- + Tonight's game is the fourth of a stretch of 7 games with seven different start times (EDT)...this road trip was the beginning of a stretch of 24 games in 24 days and 40 games in 41 days.

RAYS vs. ROYALS—The Rays are 76-77 all-time against the Royals (47-35 at home, 29-42 on the road)...since the start of 2012, the Rays are 11-29 against them (8-13 at home, 3-16 on the road)...they are 1-9-1 in 11 series since 2012 and 1-7-1 in nine series at Kauffman Stadium since 2010...they took two of 3 games at "The K" last Aug 28-30, their first series win over the Royals since Aug 20-22, 2012 at home and first on the road since July 17-19, 2009...the Rays are attempting to win consecutive series over the Royals for the first time since June 2-Aug 3, 2009 (3) and back-to-back series at Kauffman Stadium for the first time in club history...the Rays are 2-9 in their last 11 games at "The K" and 3-16 in their last 19 games here.

- + The Rays will face **Jason Hammel** on Wed at KC, which will be the eighth time in the first 41 games the club will face a former Ray.

SEASON IN "THIRDS"—This 4-9 stretch comes on the heels of an 8-game winning streak and 10-2 stretch from April 16-30...below is a closer look at the "ups and downs" of the Rays season thus far:

NOT THE RAYS WAY—The Rays have allowed 185 runs this season, their most through 38 games since 2009 (187)...in the last turn through the rotation, Rays starters have allowed 24 R/ER in 24.1 IP for a 8.88 ERA:

- + Tonight's start by **Ryan Yarbrough** will be the Rays 599th straight game started by a pitcher under the age of 30, the longest current streak in the majors...35-year-old **Erik Bedard** on July 3, 2014 at DET was the last 30-plus pitcher to start a game for the Rays.

BATTLING THE ELEMENTS—With rain in the forecast, it's worth noting that five of the Rays 20 road games have been impacted by weather:

- + April 2 at NYY (PPD, snow; made up the following day);
- + April 4 at NYY (1 hour, 32 minute rain delay);
- + April 9 at CWS (start time moved up; 21 minute snow delay);
- + April 24 at BAL (PPD, rain; made up with doubleheader);
- + May 12 (G2) at BAL (1 hour, 19 minute rain delay during game)

ODDS & ENDS—Yesterday at BAL, **Wilson Ramos** snapped an 18-game hitting streak, tied for 2nd-longest in franchise history behind **Jason Bartlett** (19) in 2009...**Denard Span** recorded his 25th RBI, which he didn't reach until Aug 14 last season in the Giants 120th game.

MINOR MATTERS—1B/LH **Brendan McKay**, who was promoted from Class-A Bowling Green to Class-A Advanced Charlotte over the weekend, is scheduled to play first base in his Stone Crabs debut tonight and make his first start on the mound on Friday vs. Jupiter...McKay, 22, was the fourth overall selection in the 2017 June Draft...he hit .254/.484/.333 (16-for-63) with 1 HR, 16 RBI, 28 BB and 13 SO for Bowling Green and went 2-0 with a 1.09 ERA (24.2-IP, 3-ER) and 40/2 SO/BB ratio in 6 starts.

- + Double-A Montgomery's **Zach Lee** has been named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week for May 7-13.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On May 14, 2016, **Matt Andriese** throws a complete-game shutout in a 6-0 win over the A's...he becomes the fourth different Rays pitcher to throw a shutout while allowing no more than 2 hits and 0 BB...this remains the last complete-game thrown by the Rays, having gone 328 games since then...every other team in the majors has at least one over that span, and the Indians (15) lead the majors.

LAST START—On Wed vs. ATL, yielded a career-high-tying 5 runs and career-high 5 ER, including 4 runs over a stretch of 10 pitches in the 3rd inning on a single, single, hit batter, sacrifice fly and 3-run homer by **Nick Markakis**...was his third homer allowed this season, all coming against left-handed batters...the single allowed to Markakis leading off the 2nd inning snapped a streak of 18 consecutive batters retired since May 4 vs. TOR...his line: L, 5 IP, 6 H, 5 R, 0 BB, 7 SO, 1 HR, 79 pit, 52 str.

- + His 7 SO marked a career high, and the only other Ray with a start of at least 7 SO and 0 BB this season is **Blake Snell** on April 16 vs. TEX (9 SO)...generated a career-high 11 swings and misses, including six on his changeup.

AS A STARTER—Is 0-2 with a 6.52 ERA (9.2-IP, 10-R, 7-ER) in his 2 starts this season, both against NL East opponents at home (Phillies, Braves)—and both have included a 4-run 3rd inning against him...three of his runs allowed in his first start were unearned, all scoring on a **Scott Kingery** bases-clearing double...in comparison, is 2-0 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2-IP, 7-ER) in his 7 relief apps.

REDEFINING RELIEF—Has totaled 19.2 IP in his 7 apps out of the bullpen, averaging just under 3 IP per relief appearance...he has made 4 relief apps of at least 4 IP, the only reliever in the majors who can make that claim this season...he joined **Carlos Reyes** in 2003 as the only Rays to do that in a single season...also became the first pitcher to make 4 apps of this type within his team's first 30 games of the season since **SEA Bryan Clark** (4) in 1983...has made 2 relief apps ending at 73 pitches—prior to this year, no Rays reliever threw that many pitches since **Chris Archer** in 2012.

- + He also became the first player since pitch count data is available (1999) to throw at least 70 pitches in relief twice within his team's first 9 games.

LEFT ON LEFT—Has allowed 3 HR this season, all coming against left-handed batters (**Max Kepler**, **Rafael Devers**, **Nick Markakis**)...in his last start vs. ATL, allowed more hits to lefties (4) than he did in his first 8 apps (1 start) combined (3)...issued 4 BB vs. LHB within his first 2 apps of the season spanning 4 IP and 8 BF, but since then has allowed 1 BB vs. LHB in 7 apps, 25.1 IP and 29 BF.

OVERVIEW—Will be making the third start of his career, though this will be the first time he makes back-to-back starts without a relief app in between...with his first career start he became the 33rd different starting pitcher used by the Rays since 2008, which remains the fewest in the majors over that span.

- + Is in his second stint with the Rays (Opening Day—April 28, May 1—current)...recorded his first career win on April 28 at BOS, replacing **Yonny Chirinos** with the bases loaded and no outs in the 3rd inn. without allowing a run to score...yielded an RBI single to **Hanley Ramirez** in the 4th and solo homer to **Rafael Devers** in the 5th, but left with a 7-5 lead...optioned postgame and recalled after the injury to Chirinos (right forearm strain).
- + His second win came on May 4 vs. TOR, when he replaced "bullpen day" starter **Andrew Kittredge** to begin the 3rd...allowed a single to **Dalton Pompey** leading off the inning, but after that retired his last 15 BF...his 5 IP matched **Austin Pruitt** on April 14 vs. PHI for the most by a Rays reliever this season...became the second reliever in club history to go at least 5 IP and allow 1 hit or fewer, joining **Esteban Yan** on April 13, 1998 vs. MIN.
- + Tonight's start will extend the Rays streak of games started by a pitcher under the age of 30 to 599 straight, the longest current streak in the majors.
- + Made his first career app on March 31 vs. BOS, and his 73 pitches were the 2nd-most in club history for a reliever making his major league debut, behind **David Price** (87) on Sep 14, 2008 at NYY...his app of 4 IP is tied for the 2nd-longest in club history for a reliever in his debut (Price, 5.1).

LAST SEASON—Spent his first season in the Rays organization with Triple-A Durham after being acquired from the Mariners in a trade involving **Drew Smyly**...his 13 wins, 26 starts, 157.1 IP and 159 SO were all career highs...ranked 2nd among Rays minor leaguers in strikeouts, behind **Brent Honeywell** (172)...tied for 2nd in wins, one shy of **José Mujica** (14)...ranked 3rd in innings and 8th with a 3.43 ERA.

- + Increased his strikeout total from 99 SO (6.94 SO/9 IP) with Double-A Jackson in 2016 to 159 SO (9.10 SO/9 IP) with the Bulls...according to Fan-Graphs, generated swings-and-misses on 14.0 pct. of his pitches, 2nd-highest in the International League behind teammate **Brent Honeywell** (14.3).
- + Led the IL in strikeouts, the second consecutive year and fifth time in seven seasons a Bulls pitcher was the league leader...tied for the IL lead in starts, ranked 2nd in wins, 3rd in innings, 4th in SO/9 IP, 5th in BB/9 IP and 8th in ERA.

LOCAL PRODUCT—Ryan grew up a Rays fan and kept some 2008 World Series gear in his bedroom of his Lakeland home, which he found after he was acquired in a four-player trade from the Mariners...he would often watch games in his bedroom, and his dad followed along as he worked in the garage...the two would sometimes meet in the middle of the house after the game's most pivotal moments.

- + His high school baseball coach encouraged him to find professionals to look up to...he admired **David Price**, **James Shields** and **Scott Kazmir** and still has a Kazmir jersey he received as a 15-year-old hanging in his closet.

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
