FISH BITES

The Marlins wrap up a seven-game road trip with the finale of this four-game series against the Philadelphia Phillies today at 1:35 p.m. RHP **Dan Straily**, making his 18th start of the season, is facing the Phillies for the eighth time in his career, having gone 4-2 with a 5.73 ERA (37.2 ip/24 er); allowed four runs on six hits, with four walks and one strikeout, in April 30 start at Marlins Park. Philadelphia is countering with RHP Aaron Nola, who in nine career starts against the Marlins is 3-4 with a 3.79 ERA (54.2/23); in two starts this season is 1-1 with a 1.35 ERA (13.1/2). The Marlins concluded a 3-3 homestand a week ago today, splitting a two-game series with the Braves and a four-game set against the Nationals. The current road swing began with Miami dropping two games to the Atlanta Braves, with the final game being postponed due to weather. Today's game continues a stretch of 12 straight games (3-8) against NL East opponents. Miami plays 33 of their remaining 49 games (71%) against division foes. Following this afternoon's tilt, the Marlins will return to Miami for a six-game homestand against St. Louis (tomorrow-Wednesday) and the Mets (Friday-Sunday).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

The Phillies came out swinging, scoring all of their runs by way of home run in an 8-5 win over the Marlins. Marlins hitters were retired in order through the first four frames before **Justin Bour** led off the fifth with his 18th home run of the season, his second of the series. Down 8-1 going into the eighth, **Starlin Castro** led off with a single to left, and **Miguel Rojas** deposited his eighth home run of the year into the left-center field stands to make it 8-3. Castro record two of Miami's four total hits in the game. **José Ureña** fell to 3-11 after allowing six runs on eight hits with two walks and three strikeouts over 5.0 innings.

UP NEXT

The Marlins will open a three-game series against the NL Central's St. Louis Cardinals tomorrow night at 7:10 p.m. Miami is in front of the 2018 series, 2-1, after a June 5-7 series at Busch Stadium. Miami hasn't won a three-game series at home since taking two of three from August 11-13, 2014, and it would mark just the fifth at home since 2000. The Marlins are 34-58 all-time at home (7-13 at Marlins Park), and trail the overall series, 77-112.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT

Coming into this season, **Dan Straily** had performed much better at home than on the road, boasting a home record of 18-10 with a 3.76 ERA in 57 appearances (52 starts). In 62 road games (57 starts), he was 19-20 with a 4.69 ERA. This season, he has performed better on the road than at home in terms of ERA, as he is 2-4 with a 4.00 ERA in visiting ballparks, compared to 2-1 with a 4.85 ERA at Marlins Park.

GIVE ME A SECOND

Starlin Castro has recorded 125 hits in 109 games played this season, all at second base. He leads all Major League second basemen in games played, ranks second in hits (Jose Altuve-128) and multi-hit games (36), tied for third in doubles (23), and is fourth in runs scored (63).

HIT TO THE NINES

With five more hits this season, **Starlin Castro** will reach the 130 hit mark for the ninth time in his Major League career. He would join a list of five others who debuted in the last 20 years to record 130+ hits in each of his first nine Major League seasons. See list at right provided by *Stats LLC*.

HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF

Miami began the season with just a .225 team average over its first 28 road games, which ranked 27th in the Majors. Over their last 27 road games since June 1, the Marlins have hit at a .262 clip to rank seventh in the Majors (fourth in the NL). Since 2014, Miami leads the Majors in road average with a .261 mark, ahead of Houston (.258) and Kansas City (.256).

MAKING ADJUSTMENTS

When facing a pitcher for the third time in a game, the Marlins have hit .306, which leads the National League and ranks second in the Majors to only Boston (.326). The .306 average when facing a pitcher for the third time would rank as the second-best mark in Club history, behind a .307 average in 2001. - *Stats LLC*

ROAD WELL TRAVELED

The Marlins have two of the best road hitters in the National League in **Derek Dietrich** and **J.T. Realmuto**, as Dietrich ranks 11th in the NL with a .317 average and Realmuto 16th at .303. Dietrich has hit in 12 of his last 16 road contests, batting .400 (22x55) with five doubles, five home runs, and nine RBI in that span. He has scored 35 runs in visiting ballparks this season, tied for 10th in the NL, while his .391 OBP ranks 11th and .536 SLG ranks 12th. Realmuto has hit in 14 of his last 18 road games with an average of .303 (23x76), seven doubles, three home runs, and 14 RBI. The All-Star catcher ranks ninth in the NL on the road this season with a SLG of .546, and T-14th in runs with 34.

PROVING HIS WORTH

In his final game before the break, **Brian Anderson** recorded his sixth three-hit game of the season to run his season hit total to 109. His hit total prior to the break tied Rocco Baldelli for the second-most by a Major League rookie since 2003, behind only Hideki Matsui (114 in 2003). He is the only Marlins rookie in franchise history to record 100+ hits prior to the break.

- Anderson recorded 101 hits over his first 92 games of the season, becoming the 142nd rookie since 1958 to record 100+ hits in 92-or-fewer games. Of those, 34 went on to win Rookie of the Year honors, including most recently Aaron Judge (2017), Corey Seager (2016), Carlos Correa (2015), José Abreu (2014), Mike Trout (2012) and Buster Posey (2010). - *Stats LLC*
- He leads all MLB rookies in games (111), at-bats (426), hits (122), multi-hit games (36), three+-hit games (7, tied), average with RISP (.404), runs (63), on-base percentage (.366), and RBI (52); ranks second in doubles (25), walks (45), and slugging (.420); ranks third in average (.284); is tied for third in triples (3); and tied for 10th in HR (9).
- He is on pace for 176 hits this season, which would rank as the second-most by a National League rookie since 2010, behind Corey Seager's 193 in 2016, and would tie Ryan Zimmermani for the sixth-most by an NL rookie since 2000. He is also on pace to score 92 runs, which would rank as the ninth-most by a rookie since 2000.

AUGUST 5

Hanley Ramirez went 2x5 in the Marlins 5-4 loss to the Washington Nationals in **2009**. Ramirez would hit in the next 15 consecutive games, setting a career-long 16-game hit streak. Ramirez hit a career-high and Franchise best .342 that season, becoming the first Marlin win the National League batting crown.

YOUNG GUNS

Of the Marlins' 46 wins this season, 23 have been recorded by rookie pitchers (50.0 pct.). Overall, have 10 different rookies own a win. The 10 different rookies to record a win are tied with three teams for fifth-most in a single season in MLB history. The 2017 Reds, '07 Yankees, '03 Tigers and '02 Padres each had 11. - *Stats LLC*
