**AT A GLANCE:** Today the Yankees play the first game of a two-game series in Toronto (through Wed.)...are 3-1 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore that included postponements on Thurs. and Sun., followed by a split doubleheader in Detroit on Mon. (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15)...will have an off day on Thurs., followed by a three-game Subway Series at the Mets from Fri.-Sun.

- ▶ At 38-18 (.679), have the Majors' second-best winning pct.
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 24-17, the Yankees are 29-9).
- ▶ Are 20G over .500, one game shy of their season-high (21G over after Game 1 of Monday's doubleheader)...reached a season-best 21G over .500 just once last season (91-70 after their 161st game on 9/30/17)...never reached 21G over at any point from 2013-16.
- ▶ Is the 12th season in franchise history and the second season over the last 60 years (since 1959) that they have reached 20G over within their first 56 decisions of a season (first went 20G over in 1998 after 38G, starting 29-9)...made the World Series in all 11 previous instances, winning eight times (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '58, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55).
- ▶ Marks the 11th time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 38 wins over their first 56 results...each of the other 10 Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55)...joins the 1998 team (43-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 56G start over the last 63 seasons (since 1956).
- ▶ Over their last 13 completed series (since 4/19), are 11-1-1.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 7-3 so far.
- ▶ Are 13-9 vs. the AL East and 25-9 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 26-3 (.897) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.

**CC THE STOPPER:** Since the start of 2017, LHP CC Sabathia is 9-0 with a 2.72 ERA (86.0IP, 26ER) in 15 regular season starts following a Yankees loss.

- ▶ Has faced the Blue Jays twice this season (3/31 at Rogers Centre and 4/19 at Yankee Stadium), posting a 0.96 ERA (9.1IP, 1ER) without recording a decision.
- ▶ Since the start of 2016, has gone 6-3 with a 2.45 ERA (88.0IP, 24ER) in 16 road starts against the AL East.

**SEVY SEASON:** RHP Luis Severino earned his ninth win in Game 1 on Monday, tied with Washington's Max Scherzer for most in the Majors...did not reach nine wins in 2017 until 8/6 (his 22nd start)...the Yankees are 12-1 in his starts in 2018, the most team wins in a pitcher's starts this season.

- ▶ Is 7-0 in his last 10 starts with a 1.85 ERA (68.0IP, 14ER).

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** Yankees pitchers have limited opponents to a .180 BA (33-for-183) with RISP over the last 22G (since 5/9)...their .206 opp. BA with RISP this season leads all AL staffs and is second to Washington (.191)...their .642 OPS allowed with RISP is second in MLB (Houston, .622).

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.61), HR (94), HR per game (1.65), SLG (.469), OPS (.807) and walks (229), are tied for the lead in runs (320), and rank second in OBP (.338), XBHs (219) and total bases (919)...have played just 57G, tied for fourth-fewest in the Majors.

- ▶ Have homered in 45 of their 57 games, most in the Majors.

**EARLY BIRDS:** The Yankees are 28-4 (.875) when scoring first in 2018, the Majors' second-best winning pct. (Boston, .897, 26-3).

**FOUR KEEPS:** The Yankees are a Major League-best 29-2 (.935) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season...no other team in the Majors has fewer than six losses when allowing 4R-or-less...the best mark over a full season since 1901 belongs to the 1931 Philadelphia Athletics (84-7, .923).

**ROWING ALONG:** C Austin Romine is batting .469 (15-for-32) with 10R, 4 doubles, 4HR and 13RBI during his career-high 11-game hitting streak (since 4/30), tied for the AL's longest active hitting streak...is the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season (Judge, 12G from 4/1-16)...is tied for the second-longest hitting streak at catcher in 2018 (Tampa Bay's Wilson Ramos-17G, Miami's J.T. Realmuto-11G and Los Angeles-NL's Yasmani Grandal-11G).

- ▶ Has 4HR over his last seven games after hitting 4HR over his previous 132 games (6/4/16-5/11/18)...has tied his single-season career high in home runs (4HR in 2016).
- ▶ Has reached in 13-of-21PA w/ RISP in 2018 (.619 OBP), hitting 9-for-17 (.529) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI and 4BB...his 3.11 AB/RBI ratio (59AB/19RBI) leads the Majors (min. 50AB).

**THE GLEY-HEY KID:** Since his debut on 4/22, 2B Gleyber Torres leads MLB rookies 10HR and 28RBI and ranks third with a .307 (39-for-127) batting average.

- ▶ Each of his 10HR have come in the ninth spot in the lineup, the second-most by a Yankee in the No. 9 slot (credit: YES Network), trailing only Alfonso Soriano (11HR in 2001).
- ▶ Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for May, hitting .317/.374/.659 (26-for-82) with 13R, 1 double, 9HR and 24RBI in 24G...led all rookies in BA, HR and RBI (min. 75AB).

**MIGGY, MIGGY, MIGGY:** INF Miguel Andujar has 30XBH (22 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR) in 53 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 53 games (Joe DiMaggio-42XBH; Gary Sanchez-32)...six of his last 7H have gone for extra bases (5 doubles, 1HR).

- ▶ Leads all Major League rookies in batting average (.299), slugging pct. (.524) and extra-base hits (28), is tied for most multi-hit games (19) and ranks second in hits (56).
- ▶ Is hitting .354 (23-for-65) with 11R, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 9RBI, 4BB and 1SB in his last 17 games (since 5/12).
- ▶ Leads all rookies with 20 doubles and is tied for second among all Major Leaguers...has 22 doubles through his first 53 career games, the second-highest such total in franchise history (DiMaggio-25) and tied for the third-highest total among all Major Leaguers since at least 1908 (Roy Weatherly-25, DiMaggio-25, Roy Johnson-22).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees split their doubleheader in Detroit on Monday...are 1-4-4 over their last nine doubleheaders since 2014.

- ▶ **IN GAME 1,** the Yankees defeated the Tigers, 7-4...RHP Luis Severino (8.0IP, 4H, 2R/1ER, 0BB, 10K) earned the win, improving to 9-1 this season...marked his fourth career start with at least 10K and 0BB...Yankees batters scored 6R on 6H in the fourth inning...2B Gleyber Torres (1-for-3, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the third, his 10th homer of the season...C Austin Romine (1-for-3, 1BB) extended his career-long hitting streak to 11 games with a three-run HR in the fourth...was his fourth HR in his last 7G...1B Greg Bird (1-for-3, 1BB, 1HP) also homered...CF Aaron Hicks (0-for-4, 1BB) played in his 500th career game.
- ▶ **IN GAME 2,** the Yankees had their five-game winning streak snapped, falling to the Tigers, 4-2...RHP Domingo Germán (6.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 2BB, 3K) recorded his fourth loss in his longest career start...DH Giancarlo Stanton (1-for-3, 1HP) hit his 13th home run...3B Miguel Andujar (2-for-3, 1BB) doubled twice and was the only Yankee with a multi-hit game...RF Aaron Judge (0-for-5) struck out a career-high five times, matching a single-game franchise record (10th time)...had 8K in 9AB over both games of the DH...RHP Adam Warren (1.1IP, 1H, 3BB, 1K) made his first appearance since 4/20 after being reinstated from the D.L. prior to the game.

**FEELING A DRAFT:** The 2018 First-Year Player Draft began on Monday night, with the Yankees selecting two catchers over the draft's first two rounds...with their first-round selection (23rd overall), the club drafted Cartersville H.S. (Georgia) catcher Anthony Seigler...in the second round, they chose catcher Josh Breaux out of McLennan Community College in Waco, Tex. (61st overall).

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are 13-5 in their last 18 completed road games and 16-9 (.640) away from home in 2018...are 25-15 in 40 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 5-2-2 in their first nine road series this year and 9-3-2 in 14 road series since 8/22/17.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**June 5, 2006:** The Yankees rout the Boston Red Sox and RHP Josh Beckett (1.1IP, 7ER), 13-5. The Bombers posted a seven-run second inning that featured a pair of three-run home runs by Jason Giambi and Andy Phillips.

**June 5, 1874:** Hall of Fame RHP Jack Chesbro is born in North Adams, Mass. An original member of the franchise's first team in 1903, Chesbro went 128-93 in 269 games (227 starts) with the Yankees from 1903-09. His 41-win campaign in 1904 still stands as the AL single-season record.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**June 6, 1967:** With the No. 1 overall pick in the First-Year Player Draft, the Yankees select Ron Blomberg, who will later become Baseball's first designated hitter. The Yankees' only other No. 1 overall pick came in 1991, when they selected pitcher Brien Taylor.

**June 6, 1944:** The Liberation of Europe begins. Yogi Berra mans a missile boat off the Normandy coast.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 5-3 vs. the Blue Jays in 2018...will play the ninth of 19 games vs. Toronto today (10G in the Bronx, 9G at Toronto)...IN 2017: Went 9-10 vs. Toronto in 2017, including 5-4 in the Bronx and 4-6 at Rogers Centre...IN SEASON SERIES: Have lost the last three season series, their first streak of consecutive season series losses to Toronto since 1990-94 (9-10 in 2017, 7-12 in 2016, 6-13 in 2015)...have still won 12 of the last 17 season series since 2001 (also went 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...had double-digit losses vs. the Blue Jays just twice in 38 seasons from 1977-2014...AT YANKEE STADIUM: Are 3-1 at Yankee Stadium in 2018...went 5-4 at home vs. Toronto in 2017...are 10-5 in the last 15 home matchups after going 3-11 in the previous 14...have won three of the last four home series after losing the previous five...are 57-31 vs. Toronto at the current Yankee Stadium, tied for the most wins vs. any opponent at the venue (56-33 vs. Baltimore)...AT ROGERS CENTRE: Are 2-2 at Rogers Centre in 2018...went 4-6 in Toronto in 2017...are 0-6-2 in their last eight series up north, with their last series win coming from 8/14-16/15...are 1-9-2 in 12 series since 6/23/14...have a sub-500 record at Rogers Centre in each of the last eight seasons (2010-17), the club's longest active streak of losing seasons at any park...are 31-47 at Rogers Centre since the start of 2010...IN POSTSEASON: The Blue Jays are one of three AL teams that the Yankees have not faced in the postseason (also Chicago-AL and Tampa Bay).

## YANKEE DOODLES

### #17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 38-18

- Was ejected in the sixth inning of 5/22 loss at Texas (balls and strikes)...was his first career managerial ejection.
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

### #41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 3G/7G (2x)

- Leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (28), is tied for first in multi-hit games (19) and ranks second in hits (56).
- In last 41 games (since 4/13), is hitting .333 (53-for-159) with 27R, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR and 19RBI.
- Was 2-for-3 with 2 doubles and 1BB in Monday's Game 2 loss at Detroit...has 8H in last 21AB...was 1-for-4 with 1R and 1RBI in Monday's Game 1 win at Detroit... **on road trip** is 5-for-11 with 2R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI and 1BB in 3GS at 3B...was 2-for-4 with 3R, 2 doubles and 1BB in 5/29 win vs. Houston, setting a career high in runs scored.
- Has 30XBH through his first 53 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 53G (Joe DiMaggio-42XBH; Gary Sánchez-32).
- Hit "walk-off" RBI single in the ninth and was 2-for-5 with 2R in 5/4 win vs. Cleveland...was his first career "walk-off" hit...at 23y, 63d old, became the second-youngest Yankee with a "walk-off" hit since 2010 (Clint Frazier, 22y, 305d on 7/8/17 v. Milwaukee)...Gleyber Torres (2y, 144d) hit a "walk-off" HR on 5/6.
- Is in his first stint with the Yankees this season (4/1-present).
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

### #26 TYLER AUSTIN—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/5G

- Among Major League rookies, ranks third with 8HR (2nd in AL) and is sixth with 23RBI (3rd in AL).
- Was 1-for-4 in Monday's Game 2 loss at Detroit...his sixth-inning single snapped an 0-for-20 stretch.
- Hit two two-run HRs (#7/8) and was 2-for-4 with a career-high-tying 4RBI in 5/20 win at Kansas City...was his second career multi-HR game (also 3/31 at Toronto)...was his career-high third straight multi-hit game...hit two-run HR (#6) and was 2-for-2 with 3RBI and 1SF in 5/15 suspended game at Washington...snapped an 0-for-23 stretch with a second-inning single.
- Was ejected in the top of the seventh inning of 4/11 win at Boston...served a four-game suspension for the incident from 4/27-30.
- Of his 15 career HR, 11 have tied the game (3) or given the Yankees the lead (8).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

### #33 GREG BIRD—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 6G/6G

- Did not play in Monday's Game 2 loss at Detroit...hit solo-HR (#2) and was 1-for-3 with 1BB and 1HP in Monday's Game 1 win at Detroit... **on road trip** is 3-for-13 with 1R, 1 double, 1 triple, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB and 1HP in 3GS at 1B...made his season debut and went 0-for-4 in 5/26 loss vs. Los Angeles-AL.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/29 (retro. to 3/26) - 5/25 recovering from right ankle surgery (missed the Yankees' first 47 games of the season)...surgery was performed by Dr. Martin O'Malley at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan on 3/27 to remove a small broken spur on the outside aspect of his right ankle...in 12 rehab games with Single-A Tampa, Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB hit .205/.367/.436 (8-for-39) with 9R, 3HR, 8RBI and 10BB.
- Hit .190 (28-for-147) with 2OR, 7 doubles, 9HR and 28RBI in 48 games with the Yankees in 2017...missed nearly four months of the season on the disabled list with a right ankle bruise (103 team games)...underwent surgery to remove the os trigonum, a bone in his right ankle, on 7/18/17...had 14R, 8HR and 25RBI in 29 games after returning from the D.L. on 8/26...reached safely in 12 of his 13 postseason games, hitting 3HR...hit a solo HR off Andrew Miller in the seventh inning of ALDS Game 3 vs. Cleveland, accounting for the only run of the game.
- Was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.
