THE TWINS: The Twins completed their nine-game roadtrip with a record of 1-8, going 1-2 against the White Sox, 0-3 against the Cubs, and 0-3 against the Brewers...tonight they will begin an 11-game homestand leading up to the All-Star Break, with four games against Baltimore, three against Kansas City, and four against Tampa Bay...the Twins have gone 20-20 at home this season.

TWINS CAN'T WRAP TRIP THE RIGHT WAY: The Twins lost to the Brewers yesterday afternoon but a score of 3-2 at Miller Park, suffering their fifth sweep this season, second on the roadtrip...José Berrios (8-7) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched, all three runs being solo homers...the offense recorded six hits, two from both Eduardo Escobar and Jorge Polanco...the Twins went 1-for-8 with runners in scoring position and left four men on base.

MAUER DOUBLES UP: Joe Mauer hit his 414th career double yesterday, needing just one to pass Kirby Puckett and move into first place on the Twins all-time list (since 1961)...below that list are the rankings among actives:

TWINS AND BIRDS: The Twins last played the Orioles March 29-April 1 at Camden Yards in three games to open the season, winning the second two games...the Twins are 8-3 in their last 11 against the O's and 16-8 in their last 24, dating back to September of 2014...the Twins last hosted the Orioles from July 6-9, 2017, splitting the four-game series.

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in nine of 10 career games against the Orioles, hitting .395 (15-for-38) with five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 12 RBI, six walks, a .477 OBP and a 1.293 OPS.

☞ Joe Mauer is a career .342 (96-for-281) hitter against the Orioles, with 20 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 43 RBI, 46 runs scored and a .408 on-base percentage in 74 games...he has multiple hits in five of his last nine vs. the O's.

☞ Robbie Grossman is hitting .358 (19-for-53) with six doubles, nine RBI, six walks and a .424 on-base percentage in 16 career games against the Orioles.

☞ Eduardo Escobar is hitting .341 (15-for-44) with nine RBI in his last 11 games vs. the O's.

☞ Orioles Coordinator of Public Relations Kailey Adams was an intern for the Twins Communications staff in 2015...O's Coordinator of Baseball Information Adam Esselman was a Twins Communications intern in 2016.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced yesterday that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Aaron Slegers from Triple-A Rochester...Slegers, who made one start earlier this season for the Twins, will face the Orioles tonight...over 14 starts for the Red Wings, Slegers has gone 5-6, 3.55 ERA (83.2 IP, 33 ER), 55 strikeouts and 19 walks...to make room on the 25-man roster for Slegers, the Twins have optioned left-handed pitcher Gabriel Moya to Triple-A Rochester.

GET EDDIE TO THE CAPITAL: It was announced on Monday that Eddie Rosario ranked ninth among AL outfielders in American League All-Star voting with 666,108 votes...voting ended today at 11 (CT)...last year's Twins All-Stars in Miami were third baseman Miguel Sanó, closer Brandon Kintzler and starting pitcher Ervin Santana...the last outfielder to represent the Twins in the All-Star Game was Michael Cuddyer in 2011...Rosario's rankings among AL players on the season: fifth in multi-hit games (32), sixth in hits (101), ninth in AVG (.308), SLG (.555) and OPS (.904), and 10th in runs (57).

AND BRING ESKY WITH YOU: Eduardo Escobar has 34 doubles, the most in baseball and seven more than the next five players (Abreu, Albies, Bregman, Lindor and Markakis each with 27)...he also is tied with José Ramírez for second in baseball in extra-base hits (49), trailing Francisco Lindor (50)...15 of his 34 doubles have been with two strikes.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, JORGE!: Infielder Jorge Polanco is celebrating his 25th birthday today...he has played just one career games on his birthday, coming last season vs. Los Angeles-AL, going 0-for-3 with a walk...he shares a birthday with former Twin Jesse Crain (37) and Angels star Shohei Otani (24).
