LEADING OFF: PLEASE NOTE – TOMORROW'S GAME (1:10 PM PT) WILL AIR EXCLUSIVELY ON FACEBOOK WATCH (MLB LIVE)... Tonight the Angels play the fifth game of a nine-game (2-2) road trip to Minnesota (June 8-10; 2-1), Seattle (June 11-13; 0-1) and Oakland (June 15-17)...LAA is 15-8 vs. A.L. West foes in 2018...Halos have won six of eight affairs (six-game win streak snapped Sunday)...Club is a season-high 5.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (6th time)...Angels are 24-27 since a club-record 13-3 start...14 of next 20 games are on road...LAA is 12-7-2 in 21 series (7-2-1 in 10 road series)...Following the road trip, Angels will host Arizona (June 18-19) and Toronto (June 21-24).

BARRIA IS BALLIN' Jaime Barria is the first Angel pitcher to win four consecutive decisions in 2018...Tied for MLB-lead among rookies in wins (5)...Leads all MLB rookies (min. 7 GS) with a 2.48 ERA...Is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (29.1 IP – 7 ER) and 26 strikeouts over his last five starts.

RICHARDS TOMORROW: Since 2014, Garrett Richards is 8-2 with a 2.44 ERA (81 IP – 22 ER) in the month of June...He has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last seven overall starts posting a 2.09 ERA (38.2 IP – 9 ER)...In same span, has received one victory (1-3, 3 no-decisions).

FAST FACTS: Angels' starters have allowed *more* than three earned runs in consecutive games for first time since April 24-25 at Houston...Mike Trout and Albert Pujols each homered in the first inning last night for the ninth time with the Club, **most of any teammates in Major League history.**

SOMETHING FISHY: With HRs #20 and #21 last night, Mike Trout became the first player in Angels' history with 20+ HRs in seven straight seasons...Joins Alex Rodriguez and Mickey Mantle as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 season...Marked 11th career multi-HR game, fourth against Mariners.

JUNE BOOM: Ian Kinsler has homered in three of last five games (streak of three straight games snapped Sunday)...Over his last 13 contests, he is batting .352 (19/54) with 12 runs, four doubles, six home runs and 11 RBI.

OHTANI TO D.L. On June 8th, Shohei Ohtani was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a Grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection last Thursday with Dr. Steve Yoon in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks...His 61 Ks are a club record through the first nine career starts & lead A.L. rookies.

BABY BOOMERS: Youngest players with 10+ HRs in 2018 across all minor league levels: JO ADELL - (19 y, 64 d) 11 HR, levels A, A+; Vladimir Guerrero Jr. - (19 y, 87 d) 11 HR, level AA; Fernando Tatis Jr. - (19 y, 160 d) 11 HR, level AA (courtesy of Alex Mayer – Louisville Bats PR).

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 32 of last 39 games...LAA starting pitchers have fashioned a 2.90 ERA (223.1 IP – 72 ER) since May 1, tops in A.L. and third in MLB in span...Angels are only team in MLB to boast five starters with 3.70 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts).

MVP x 3? Mike Trout is tied for MLB lead with 21 HRs...On pace for a career-best 51 HRs...Also leads MLB with 156 total bases, 54 runs and a .435 OBP.

HOT HALOS: Justin Upton has opened June 12-for-34 (.353) with four home runs and five RBI (4 HR his last 8 G)...He is the first Angel with 15 home runs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) in a season since Vernon Wells (25 HRs) in 2011...Martin Maldonado has hits in 14 of last 17 games...12 RBI his last 17 games...Hitting .317 (32/101) with eight doubles and three HRs since May 1.

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? Andrelton Simmons (10-day DL) has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...He has struck out just twice since May 1 (139 PA)...Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fourth in A.L. batting .330.

WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 35 of 67 games on season and in 19 of last 31 contests...Held to two runs or less nine times in May...LAA has six 10+ hit efforts in last 29 games...Angels hitting .236 (74/314) with RISP since May 1 (35 G).

PUJOLS POINTS: Albert Pujols has 3,030 career hits – good for 27th all-time...Rod Carew is next on the hit list at 3,053...Pujols collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just fourth player to log 600 HRs and 3,000 hits (Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez)...Ranks sixth all-time in RBI with 1,955; source Baseball-Reference.com...Lou Gehrig is sixth all-time with 1,995...Pujols sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (David Ortiz, 632).

GLOVE STORY: Angels have committed just one error across last 10 games...LAA has gone errorless in 46 of 67 contests on season...Club has just 25 errors thru 67 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .990 fielding pct...Halo outfielders are tied for MLB lead with 15 OF assists.

@ SEATTLE: Halos took two of three at SAFECO in first meeting (May 4-6)...LAA is 10-6 in last 16 games at SAFECO...Teams have split last four season series...Angels are 100-75 over M's since 2009...Trout has eight career HRs in 1st inning at Safeco Field, 7th-most in history of ballpark (also: Ken Griffey Jr. and Raul Ibañez)...He has hit 18 HRs at SAFECO, more than any other road ballpark in his career.

ATHLETICS ON DECK: Angels are 10-3 in last 13 games vs. Oakland (5-2 in last 7 G in Oakland)...Halos lead 2018 series 5-2...March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)...Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .321 (115/358) with 25 HR & 61 RBI in 93 games vs. Oakland.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

(1977) Joe Rudi drove in five runs with a pair of home runs in an 11-4 victory over Cleveland...Following an off-day, Rudi put up the same numbers (2 HR, 5 RBI) in a 12-9 victory at Minnesota.

June 13
(2006) Jered Weaver joined Bo Belinsky as the only two players in club history to win their first four Major League starts...Belinsky won his first five starts, 4/18/62 - 5/11/62...Weaver ended up winning his first seven ML starts; **(2015) Albert Pujols** becomes the sixth player in Angels history to homer at least 10 times in a 15-game span, first since **Mo Vaughn** did it from May 8-25, 2000.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

5-1, 2.48 ERA

In last five outings for Angels, is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (29.1 IP – 7 ER)

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Making eighth start of the season for Angels and fourth on the road...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to tonight's game for fifth stint of season with Angels.
- **GENERATION GAP:** The 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history when they faced off on June 1.
- **LAST TIME OUT (AAA):** Pitched three innings in start on Thursday for Salt Lake vs. Round Rock and allowed one earned run on four hits with one walk and three strikeouts.
- **LAST TIME OUT (with Angels):** Earned the win in last outing for Halos on June 1 at Texas after tossing six scoreless innings and allowing four hits and one walk with six strikeouts.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Is tied for A.L. lead among rookies in wins and ranks second (min. 30 IP) in batting average against (.215) behind teammate **Shohei Ohtani** (.202)...Also ranks third among A.L. rookies in ERA and seventh in strikeouts.
- **STREAKING:** With a winning decision tonight, would become first Angels pitcher to win five consecutive decisions since **Parker Bridwell** (July 5 – Aug. 13, 2017).
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **VS. SEATTLE:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Mariners...In three starts vs. A.L. West opponents, is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (18 IP – 2 ER).
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Safeco Field...Is 3-0 with a 2.93 ERA (15.1 IP – 5 ER) on the road this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP – 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and is the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** is ranked #1)...He is also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.

Making 14th start of the season and eighth on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Mariners...Did not factor in decision in last start on Friday at Minnesota after working 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with three walks and seven strikeouts...In last seven starts, is pitching to a 2.09 ERA (38.2 IP – 9 ER), but has a 1-3 record in those games and Angels are 3-4 in those contests...In 19 career games (11 starts) vs. Mariners, is 6-4 with a 2.91 ERA (86.2 IP – 28 ER)...Earned the win in start vs. Seattle on May 4 at Safeco Field after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings allowing four hits and one walk with eight strikeouts...Is 3-3 with a 3.12 ERA (43.1 IP – 15 ER) in career at Safeco Field.
