RAY MATTER—The Rays are 6-1 in their last 7 games and 15-4 in their last 19 games, and with last night's win returned to a season-high-tying 19 games over .500...this 15-4 stretch coincides with the start of September, best winning pct. in the majors this month...the Rays are 24-6 (.800) since Aug 19, also the best in the majors—and this matches the best 30-game stretch in franchise history...they are 37-20 (.649) since the All-Star break, 3rd-best in the majors behind the Athletics (.667) and Red Sox (.661)...they have gone 82-54 (.603) since April 18 following a 4-13 start.

- + This is only the fifth season in franchise history the Rays have ever been as many as 19 games over .500 (2008, 2010, 2011, 2013), and they made the postseason in each of these previous four seasons.
- + The Rays are 8-0-1 in their last nine series and 11-1-1 in their last 13 series, with the only loss in the last 13 series coming at Boston.
- + Any combination of three Oakland wins or Rays losses will eliminate the club from postseason contention...the Rays are on pace for 91 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only team to win that many games and miss the postseason is the 2013 Rangers (91, lost tiebreaker game against the Rays).
- + The Rays would need to go 4-5 or better in the remaining 9 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays haven't lost back-to-back games in over a month.

HIT PARADE—Last night the Rays bounced back from a 9-8 loss with a 11-3 win...it was the 11th time this season they scored double-digit runs, their most since 2012 (12), and it was the 27th time they scored 8 runs (or more), their most since 2011 (27)...the Rays have totaled 28 runs in the last 3 games, and they have scored at least 8 runs in three straight games for the second time this month (Sep 7-9 vs. BAL) and third time this season (April 20-26 vs. MIN, at BAL, club-record five straight)...in comparison, in the previous seven seasons (2011-17) they scored 8 runs or more in three consecutive games only twice...this is the first time the Rays have done that in three straight, all on the road, since Aug 17-19, 2012 at LAA.

- + Last night was the 13th time in franchise history and sixth time on the road the Rays scored at least 11 runs without the benefit of a home run...it was the first time since July 20, 2016 at COL (11).
- + Eleven different Rays recorded a hit last night, matching July 3 at MIA (16 innings) for a season high...it was the seventh time in franchise history at least 11 players recorded a hit, and was one shy of tying the club record (Sep 2, 2012 at TOR, Sep 22, 2011 at NYY).
- + **Austin Meadows** became the third player in franchise history to record 3 hits in a game he didn't start, following **Sam Fuld** on Aug 28, 2012 at TEX and **Aaron Ledesma** on Aug 29, 1998 vs. DET (G1)...he was the first Ray ever with 3 hits and 3 RBI off the bench.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—With last night's win, the Rays clinched the season series over the Blue Jays for the ninth time in the last 11 years...they are 10-4 against them this season (5-1 at home, 5-3 on the road) and 195-171 (.533) all-time, their most wins against any opponent...the Rays have outscored the Blue Jays, 69-38, through 14 games this season—they have scored at least 5 runs in seven of 14 games and allowed 2 runs or fewer in nine of 14 games, and allowed 1 run or fewer in six of 14 games.

- + The Rays have won all four series against the Blue Jays this season, and the last five series dating back to Aug 22-24, 2017 at home.
- + This is the third of three straight trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays next weekend...this continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

OFFENSE EN FUEGO—Since the start of September, the Rays have scored 114 runs, averaging 6.00 runs per game...only twice in club history have the Rays averaged more runs per game over an entire calendar month: April 2010 (6.26) and May 2009 (6.13)...the Rays this month lead the majors with 195 hits, 12 3B, 79 XBH, a .296 avg., .377 OBP and .504 SLG, and they rank 2nd in the majors with 114 runs and 20 SB and 3rd in the majors with 44 2B...they have also hit 23 HR in 19 games this month, compared to 18 HR over 27 games in August...11 of the club's last 17 HR have come with runner(s) on base, including five with 2 runner(s) or more on base.

- + The Rays have scored at least 3 runs in 17 of 19 games this month, and at least 5 runs in 12 of 19 games...they have recorded double-digit hits in four straight games and in 10 of 19 games this month.

FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS—Since the start of August, the Rays are a majors-best 32-14 (.696), and they lead the majors since then with 53 SB,

a .272 avg., .353 OBP, 2.93 ERA, 1.04 WHIP and .210 opp avg. ...they also rank 5th over this stretch with a .990 fielding pct. ...they Rays have scored at least 5 runs in 23 of 46 games (50.0 pct.) since the start of August, while they have recorded double-digit hits in 21 games (45.7 pct.), allowed 3 runs or fewer in 31 games (67.4 pct.) and played 32 errorless games (69.6 pct.).

CUSTOM BUILT—The start of this series began a stretch of 11 consecutive games against the Blue Jays (7) and Yankees (4) to end the season... last night **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** became the 11th Blue Jay with double-digit home runs this season, tied with the 2017 Astros, 2016 Twins, 2015 Astros and 2004 Tigers for 2nd-most for a team all-time behind this season's Yankees (12)...in contrast, the Rays have only four players with double-digit homers, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors, and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...Rays with double-digit homers this season are **C.J. Cron** (27), **Wilson Ramos** (14), **Jake Bauers** (11) and **Willy Adames** (10)—next is **Daniel Robertson** (9, DL) and **Carlos Gómez** (9)...while **Tommy Pham** (19) and **Ji-Man Choi** (10) both have reached double digits, they have come between two organizations.

- + The Rays have totaled 141 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 149 HR, which would be 79 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 32-6 (.842) when hitting multiple homers in a game.

PITCHING POINTS—The Rays rank 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.62 ERA—only three times in franchise history have they finished a season with a lower ERA: 2011 (3.58), 2012 (3.19) and 2014 (3.56)...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 3.31 ERA, behind the Dodgers (3.21)—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays have pitched to a AL-best 3.35 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 44-36 with traditional starters and 42-31 otherwise.
- + 24 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays, most in the majors and a single-season club record ahead of 2017 (20).

STAY THIRSTY, MY FRIENDS—The Rays have not thrown a complete game since **Matt Andriese** on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...they have played 443 games since then, the longest drought in AL history and 2nd-longest in major league history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, behind the Marlins (480) from June 4, 2014—June 2, 2017...since then:

- + the longest outing for a Rays starting pitcher is 8 IP (eight times)
- + a Rays starter has pitched into the 9th inning only once: **Alex Cobb** on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX (double, homer and was replaced)
- + the Rays have had 10 CG thrown against them
- + the Indians have recorded a majors-most 16 CG, while six pitchers have thrown at least 5 CG, led by CLE **Corey Kluber** (9)

LEFTOVERS—Rays pitchers have allowed 7 HR in the last 2 games, and 6 HR in their last 9.2 IP...this is the second time this season they have yielded at least 3 HR in back-to-back games, following May 11-12 at BAL...they haven't done this in three consecutive games since May 5-7, 2013.

- + The Rays are 26-30 (.464) in 1-run games...the 56 1-run games are tied with 2010 and 2015 for the single-season club record, and the 30 1-run losses are tied with 2015 for the club record.

LAST START—On Mon at TEX, did not allow a hit until **Isiah Kiner-Falefa** singled with 2 outs in the 5th inning...both hits allowed in 6 IP were infield singles, and it marked the longest scoreless outing of his career...recorded his first win with the Rays, and it was his second win this season and fourth of his career...got out of 2-on, 2-out jams in both the 1st and 6th innings, and the bullpen finished off the last 3 IP in a 3-0 shutout win...his line: W, 6 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 6 SO, 1 HBP, 86 pit, 49 str.

SINCE THE TRADE—Is 1-4 with a 4.06 ERA (44.1-IP, 20-ER) and 49 SO in 9 starts with the Rays...yielded 7 R/ER in 0.2 IP in his start on Sep 5 at TOR, but has pitched to a 2.68 ERA (43.2-IP, 13-ER) in his other 8 starts...has a 2.84 BB/9 IP ratio with the Rays, down from a 5.46 BB/9 IP ratio in 34 apps with the Pirates...min. 40 IP, since Aug 1 his 9.95 SO/9 IP ratio ranks 11th in the AL and his .184 opp. avg. ranks 4th in the AL.

- + Has received a combined 9 runs of support in his 9 starts...min. 40 IP, his 1.83 R/9 IP of support is 2nd-lowest in the majors since Aug 1, behind **CWS Dylan Covey** (1.31)...has received 3 runs or fewer of support in all 9 starts, 2 runs or fewer in 8 starts, 1 run or fewer in 6 starts and no run support in 4 starts.
- + Has allowed 1 run or fewer in five of his 9 starts with the Rays...has yielded 3 hits or fewer in 6 starts with the club and 2 hits or fewer in 5 starts.
- + His max velocity with the Rays is 100.2 mph, in his start on Aug 7 vs. BAL...his max velocity this season is 100.4 mph, in relief on May 24 at CIN (with PIT).
- + Has allowed 18 SB in 23 attempts between the Rays and Pirates this season, and 10 SB in 12 attempts since the trade...his 10 SB allowed since Aug 1 are 5th-most in the majors and 3rd-most in the AL.

STANDING TALL—Is the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by Baseball Reference at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

THE NEW GUY—Acquired from the Pirates on July 31 in the **Chris Archer** trade, with the Rays also receiving outfielder **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named (minor league right-handed pitcher **Shane Baz**—the No. 95 prospect in the minors, according to MLB.com)...at the time of the trade, his 72 SO ranked 3rd among NL relievers behind **MIL Josh Hader** (99) and **COL Adam Ottavino** (77), and his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP were most in the majors.

MAKING THE LEAP—Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons.

- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the Int'l. League.

ON THE CLOCK—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Ray and 2011 All-Star **James Shields** and Indians All-Star **Trevor Bauer** (signed with UCLA).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (20-5, 1.97 ERA)

LAST START—On Tues at TEX, his only hit allowed in 5 IP was a 2nd-inning, 2-out single by **Robinson Chirinos**...did allow at least one baserunner in every inning but the 3rd, on a E6 (1st inning), single (2nd), walk (4th) and walk (5th)...his pitch count by inning was 20-22-14-17-19, and his 5 IP were his fewest since Aug 16 at NYY, his third start back from the disabled list...handed a 3-0 lead to the bullpen, and the Rays went on to win, 4-0, for his 20th win...his line: W, 5 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 5 SO, 92/58.

THE WIN COLUMN—Leads the majors with 20 wins, ahead of **CLE Corey Kluber** (19), and is the majors' first 20-game winner since 2016...joins **David Price** (20) in 2012 as the only 20-game winners in Rays history...Price earned his 20th win in his final start, his 31st of the season, and won the AL Cy Young Award that season—Snell earned his 20th in his

29th start...has won eight consecutive decisions, tied for the 2nd-longest streak in franchise history behind **Matt Moore** (9) from Sep 29, 2012-May 19, 2013...has won a club-record eight straight starts (without a no-decision in between), the only pitcher to do that in the majors this season.

- + Also leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 1.97 ERA, behind **NYM Jacob deGrom** (1.77)...his 1.97 ERA would set a club record among qualifiers, ahead of **Price** (2.56) in 2012.

vs. TORONTO—Is 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA (30.1-IP, 13-ER) in 6 starts in his career against the Blue Jays, and is 2-1 with a 4.08 ERA (17.2-IP, 8-ER) in 4 starts at Rogers Centre...has faced them once this season, and was removed after five perfect innings on Aug 10 at TOR, his second start back from the DL...threw only 47 pitches (33 strikes) in those 5 IP.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Has hit safely in seven consecutive games dating back to Sep 14, matching Aug 7-14 for the longest hitting streak of his career.
- + Batting .322/.420/.458 (19-for-59) since the start of September, and has reached multiple times in 11 of his last 17 games (14 starts) this month.
- + His avg. was below .200 as late as July 29 (.196)...since then, is batting .320/.401/.493 (48-for-150) with 5 2B, 7 HR and 22 RBI in 44 games (41 starts).
- + Min. 75 PA, since the start of August, ranks among AL rookie leaders in avg. (.320, 3rd) and on-base pct. (.399, 2nd)...also ranks 3rd with 47 hits.
- + Eight of his 10 HR have come with the bases empty, and seven of his 10 HR have come at home...is one of four Rays with double-digit homers.
- + Has appeared in 77 games and made 73 starts (65-SS, 8-2B)...his 14 errors lead the team, and his 13 errors at shortstop are tied for 5th in the AL.

- + Has recorded 5 XBH and 7 RBI in his last 6 games...batting .273/.381/.576 (9-for-33) with 2 HR, 10 RBI and 7 BB in his last 11 games (all starts).
- + Batting .161/.283/.315 (27-for-168) with 6 HR and 28 RBI in 53 games (49 starts) since the All-Star break, after .252/.368/.496 in the first half.
- + Min. 150 AB, his .161 avg. since the break is the lowest in the majors...next is NYM/PHI José Bautista (.181), and in the AL is BAL Chris Davis (.191).
