**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue on their first road trip of the season, a 5,200-mile, 10-day, 8-game odyssey that includes trips to San Francisco (1-1), Minnesota (3 games) and Kansas City (3 games) before returning home to Seattle...opened the season at Safeco Field taking 2-of-3 game vs. the Cleveland Indians...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners are 3-2 on the season, going 2-2 during the day and 1-0 at night...10 of the Mariners first 18 games will be played at Safeco Field.

- **Bullpen Bullies** - RH **Dan Altavilla** (1.2 IP), RH **Edwin Díaz** (3.0), RH **Casey Lawrence** (2.2 IP) and LH **Marc Rzepczynski** (1.0) have combined to toss 8.1 scoreless innings in relief.
- **vs. the AL Central** - the Mariners face an AL Central opponent in 12 of their first 24 game of the season (2-1)...Seattle went 18-16 vs. the Central in 2017, their first winning season vs. the AL Central since going 19-14 in 2014...since 2001 the Mariners have had 6 winning seasons vs. the AL Central (31-10 in 2001, 32-13 in 2003, 25-16 in 2012, 19-14 in 2014, 23-18 in 2002, 23-20 in 2007).

**BBBBBBBB**...the temperature at first pitch today is forecasted to be in the mid 30's here in Minneapolis...according to available data from Baseball-Reference.com, the Mariners have played only 11 games since 1988 where the first pitch temp was below 40°...the last time was in Chicago-AL April 5, 2013 with first-pitch temperature for the game registering 34°...the 34° game time temp is tied for the coldest first pitch dating back to 1988 (also: April 9, 1996 at Detroit).

**SOME LIKE IT HOT**...**Robinson Canó** (.500/9x18, 6 R, 3 2B, 2 RBI, 2 BB), **Dee Gordon** (.429/9x21, 3 R, HR, RBI, BB, 2 SB) and **Mitch Haniger** (.467/7x15, 3 R, 2B, 2 HR, 5 RBI, HBP, 4 BB) have each hit safely in each of the first 5 games this season...marks the 5th time in Canó's career to hit safely at least 5 straight games to open a season (10 G: 4/4-16/10, 5 G: 3/31-4/6/14, 5 G: 4/2-9/16 & 5 G: 4/2-8/08)...Gordon's and Haniger's 5-game hitting streaks to open the season are career-highs.

**WALKING ON SUNSHINE**...**Robinson Canó** and **Dee Gordon** have each recorded 9 hits in the first five Mariners games this season...the 9 hits rank T6th-most in club history for hits through the first 5 games of the season (done 11x), trailing only Edgar Martinez (11 H in 2001), Richie Zisk (11 H in 1982), **Ichiro Suzuki** (10 H in 2001 & 2005) and Jim Essian (10 H in 1982)...the Mariners franchise record for most hits through 6 games is 11 (done 7x, last: Ichiro in 2005)...Gordon's 9 hits are the 2nd-most in his career through 5 games, trailing his 10 hits in 2016...Canó's 9 hits are a career-high (previous: 8 in 2014, 2010, 2009 & 2007).

**HEAT WAVE**...after going 0-for-4 in the first game of the season, **Jean Segura** has recorded 7 hits over his last 16 at-bats (.438) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 2 walks...overall this season he is batting .350 (7x20) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

**WALKING ON SUNSHINE**...**Mitch Haniger** is 7-for-15 (.467) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 5 RBI 1 HBP and 4 walks in his first five games of the season...dating back to August 30, 2017, Haniger has hit safely in 28 of 34 games, including 15 multi-hit contests, batting .377 (52x138) with 22 runs scored, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 22 RBI, 2 HBP, 7 walks and 2 stolen bases...during this stretch Mitch leads the Majors with a .377 average (min. 75 PA), ranking ahead of teammate **Dee Gordon** (.368/56x152, 25 R, 3 2B, 4 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 3 BB).

**TWINNING**...since 2013, **Robinson Canó** has hit safely in 27 of last 32 games vs. the Twins, including 15 multi-hit contests...during this stretch he is batting .382 (50x131) with 20 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 24 RBI and 11 walks...Canó's .382 average vs. Minnesota is the 5th-highest in the Majors during this stretch (min. 90 PA), trailing only Jose Altuve (.422/54x128), Josh Donaldson (.399/55x38), Xander Bogaerts (.389/44x113) and Dustin Pedroia (.385/55x143).

**YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE**...the Mariners 1-4 batters in the lineup have combined to hit .395 (30x76) with 16 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 8 walks over the first 5 games of the season...the rest of the lineup is batting a combined .184 (16x87) average with 3 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 7 walks.

**THE HEAT IS ON**...**Edwin Díaz** has struck out 8 of the 11 batters he has faced this season (0 H, 2 HB), averaging 24.00 strikeouts per 9.0 innings over his first 3 appearances this season...in his career, **Díaz** has recorded strikeout rate of 13.80 per 9.0 innings, the 4th-highest since making his debut in 2016...trails only Craig Kimbrel-BOS (15.34), Dellin Betances-NYY (15.26) and Andrew Miller-CLE (14.34).

**HOT IN HERRE**...according to MLB Statcast data, this series features two of the highest average sprint speed on max-effort run from 2017: T1st. Byron Buxton-MIN and Billy Hamilton-CIN (30.1 ft/sec), 3. Bradley Zimmer-CLE (29.9 ft/sec), **Dee Gordon**-SEA (29.7 ft/sec) and T5th. Delino DeShields-TEX (29.5 ft/sec), Amed Rosario-NYM (29.5 ft/sec), Franchy Cordero-SD (29.5 ft/sec) and Keon Broxton-MIL (29.5 ft/sec).

**HAPPY MINOR LEAGUE OPENING DAY**...the Mariners 4 full season minor league affiliates begin play today: AAA **Tacoma** hosts Sacramento at Cheney Stadium...AA **Arkansas** opens at home vs. San Antonio...High-A **Modesto** looks to repeat their 2017 California League Championship as the Nuts begin the season at Lancaster...A **Clinton** will open on the road at Kane County.

**ON THE MEND**...OF **Ben Gamel** will begin a rehabilitation assignment when High-A Modesto opens their season today at Lancaster...Gamel (right oblique strain) was placed on the 10-day disabled list on March 28 (retro 3/26).

**AS YOU KNOW**...**Robinson Canó** is one of three second baseman in Major League history with 500 doubles and 300 home runs in his career, along with Jeff Kent (560 2B, 377 HR) and Rogers Hornsby (541 2B, 301 HR)...**BUT, DID YOU KNOW**...Canó is currently tied with Rogers Hornsby with 301 career home runs?...Canó and Hornsby are currently tied 2nd-most by a second baseman in Major League history, trailing only Jeff Kent's 377 career home runs.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his second start of 2018, his 76th career MLB start, and 4th career start vs. the Twins today.
• Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
• Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
• Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
• Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
• Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
• Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
• Is 5-2 with a 3.17 ERA (25 ER, 71.0 IP) in 12 career starts in the month of April.

LAST OUTING...took the loss on March 31 vs. CLE, allowing 6 earned runs on 6 hits and 4 walks in 4.2 innings pitched while striking out 4...tied a career high with 2 home runs allowed, including a grand slam by Yonder Alonso, the first of Paxton's career.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 5 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks...threw 5.0 innings in his final spring start on 3/25 vs. SD, allowing 3 runs (2 earned runs) on 6 hits while walking 1 and striking out 6.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...placed on the 10-day DL on May 5 (retro to May 3) with a left forearm strain...activated on May 30 after making one rehab start (5/26 w/ AA Arkansas)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL starting Aug. 11 with a strained left pectoral muscle...activated on Sept. 15.

2017 AWARDS...named the 2017 MARINERS PITCHER OF THE YEAR by the Seattle BBWAA...earlier in the season, earned two American League awards in the span of three days...AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH...named American League Pitcher of the Month for July on Aug. 2...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July...CO-AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK...named co-American League Player of the Week on July 31...went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 13.0 IP) with 18 strikeouts and 0 walks in 2 starts vs. BOS (7/24) and New York-NL (7/30) for the week of July 24-30...marked his 2nd such honor of the season (also: April 10-16)...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season... shared the honors with Texas' Adrian Beltre.

THE STREAK...earned the win in 7 consecutive starts, July 2, 2017 -Aug. 4, 2017... equalled the club record for wins in consecutive starts (also: Jamie Moyer, 5/6-6/8/03, and Scott Bankhead, 6/18-7/20/89)...fell one win short of becoming the first Mariner in club history to earn the win in 8 consecutive starts.

GOOD RUN...tossed at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer runs in 7 consecutive starts (7/2-8/4)...T4th-longest in club history (also: Félix Hernández, 6/26-8/1/13, Jamie Moyer, 8/14-9/19/01, Dave Fleming, 5/10-6/9/92)...was the longest such streak by a Mariner since Felix posted a Major League-record 16 consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings pitched while allowing 2-or-fewer runs.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH...in 6 starts in the month of July, went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 6 wins in a calendar month...his 1.37 ERA for July was the lowest in calendar month by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández posted a 1.22 ERA (6 ER, 44.1 IP) in June of 2014...Paxton's 1.37 ERA in July was 7th-lowest in club history by a Mariners left-hander in a calendar month and the lowest since Jamie Moyer posted a 1.01 ERA (4 ER, 35.2 IP) in June of 2002.

2017 NOTABLES...Paxton was the first Mariners left-hander with 12 wins in a season since Jason Vargas won 14 games in 2012...Paxton did not allow a home run in 7 consecutive starts (7/2-8/4), working at least 6.0 innings in each of those 7 outings... his streak of 7 straight starts (7/2/17-8/4/17) of 6.0+ IP without allowing a home run was T2nd longest in club history, tied with Doug Fister (6/14-7/21/11)...trailed only Félix Hernández's club record of 9 consecutive such starts, May 7 - June 18, 2014.

RING 'EM UP...recorded 11 outings last season with at least 8 strikeouts...ranked T6th-most such starts in the American League (also: Carlos Carrasco-CLE)... trailed only Chris Sale-BOS (26), Corey Kluber-CLE (22), Chris Archer-TB (18), Luis Severino-NYY (16) & Justin Verlander-DET/HOU (13)...among AL left-handers, Paxton's 11 games with 8+ strikeouts trailed only Sale's 26 such games...is the first Mariner pitcher with 10+ games of at least 8 strikeouts since 2015 when Félix Hernández also recorded 10 such games...Paxton is the 3rd lefty in club history to accomplish this feat, joining Mark Langston (4x, 1984, '86-'88) and Randy Johnson (8x, 1990-95, '97-'98).

INJURIES & REHAB...placed on the 10-day DL with a left forearm strain on May 5, 2017 (retro to May 3)...appeared in 1 game on a rehab assignment with AA Arkansas...started vs. Frisco on May 26, 2017, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits (1 home run) while striking out 5 in 4.0 innings...activated from the 10-day DL on May 31, 2017... was again placed on the 10-day DL on Aug. 11, 2017, with a left pectoral strain...activated on Sept. 15, 2017.

CAREER...is 30-21 with a 3.38 ERA (160 ER, 426.2 IP) with 413 strikeouts in 75 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut with Seattle on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. Tampa Bay.

SATURDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP MIKE LEAKE (1-0, 2.57 ERA)

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 2nd start of the season...W#1 in his last start, a 5-4 Mariners win, on 4/1 vs. CLE (7.0,5,2,2,3,4,HR)... SPRING TRAINING: went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (14 ER, 23.1 IP) in 6 starts during Spring Training...2017: Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...CAREER: In 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c), is 84-77 with a 3.98 ERA (642 ER, 1453.1 IP) with 989 strikeouts and 345 walks in 239 career games (234 starts)...is 1 of 4 pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17 (also: Ian Kennedy, Jon Lester and Max Scherzer)...originally signed by Cincinnati with the 8th overall pick of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University...vs. MIN: Will be making his 3rd career start vs. the Twins...is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (9 ER, 12.0 IP) with 10 strikeouts in 2 starts.
