PITTSBURGH PIRATES (32-33) vs. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (35-29)

June 11, 2018 at Chase Field, Phoenix, AZ --- GAME #66/ROAD #33

RHP JOE MUSGROVE (2-1, 1.89 ERA) vs. LHP PATRICK CORBIN (6-2, 2.87 ERA)

THE PIRATES... snapped their three-game losing streak with a 7-1 win at Wrigley Field Sunday afternoon...Have dropped six of their last eight games and 11 of their last 15...Have gone 6-16 in their last 22 games after their record was a season-high nine games over .500 on 5/17 (26-17)...Won a season-high five straight games on two occasions (4/25-29 & 5/6-12)...Were 30-35 after 65 games in 2017 (30-36 after 66).

LOOKING FOR TWO: With a victory tonight the Pirates would have back-to-back wins for the first time since winning three in a row from May 15-17...It would also give the Bucs consecutive road wins for the first time since May 8-9.

HOT IN ARIZONA: In nine career games at Chase Field, **Starling Marte** has gone 15-for-40 (.375) with six RBI...He has hit safely in eight of the nine games, including a four-hit performance last year on 4/24...**Gregory Polanco** is hitting .345 (20-for-58) with two home runs and seven RBI in 14 career games at Chase Field while **Josh Harrison** has reached base safely in 14 of his last 15 games played here, going 21-for-61 (.344) with nine doubles, a triple, homer and a .949 OPS.

LEADING THE WAY: Yesterday afternoon in Chicago, **Josh Harrison** connected off Kyle Hendricks for his seventh career home run leading off the first inning...Harrison now ranks fifth in club history in leadoff homers behind **Barry Bonds** (20), **Al Martin** (10), **Bob Bailey** (8) and **Andrew McCutchen** (8). ..The Pirates have now hit five leadoff home runs this season, the most by the club since smacking five such homers in 2009.

ON THE BUMP: **Joe Musgrove** began the 2018 season on the D.L. due to a right shoulder muscle strain...He went 7-8 with a 4.77 ERA in 38 games (15 starts) for the World Champion Astros last season; began the campaign in the starting rotation, but finished the season posting a 1.44 ERA in 23 relief appearances...Musgrove was one of the four players acquired by the Pirates on 1/13/18 in exchange for pitcher Gerrit Cole (the Bucs also picked up **Colin Moran**, **Michael Feliz** and minor league outfielder **Jason Martin** in the deal)...Joe threw just 67 pitches in 7.0 scoreless innings and won his debut with the Bucs on 5/25 vs. St. Louis; he also allowed one run in 7.0 innings while winning a 2-1 decision over the Cubs on 5/30 before suffering a loss to the Dodgers in his last start Tuesday night.

SNAKE CHARMERS: The Pirates went 2-2 in Arizona last year, winning the last two games after dropping the first two during a four-game series in mid-May...The Pirates have gone 7-3 at Chase Field over the last three seasons and are 13-6 in their last 19 games played here, dating back to 4/17/12.

ROLLING MEADOWS: Beginning with the date of his first Major League game on 5/18, **Austin Meadows** ranks sixth among all National League players with a 1.056 OPS...He has hit safely in each of his last seven starts and in 15 of his first 18 big league starts overall, going 26-for-70 (.371) with four doubles, two triples, five homers and eight RBI...Meadows was named the N.L. Rookie-of-the-Month in May after hitting .409 with four HR in 13 games.

FEAST OR FAMINE: The Pirates are hitting .296 (331-for-1119) with 209 runs scored in their 32 wins (6.5 runs per game), while posting a 2.70 team ERA (297.0ip/89er)...In the team's 33 setbacks, the club has posted a .207 average (224-for-1084) with 88 runs scored (2.6 runs per game)...The pitching staff has a 5.79 ERA (281.1ip/181er) in the losses.

ROAD TRIP: Pittsburgh has gone 1-2 thus far on this six-game road trip after losing two-of-three at Wrigley Field over the weekend...The Bucs have lost seven of their last 10 games played on the road after winning three straight between May 6-9...Overall the Pirates have produced a 14-18 record on the road this season.

GUNNING THEM DOWN: **Francisco Cervelli** has caught 10 runners attempting to steal this season; he had a total of nine last year...Among N.L. catchers, only Philadelphia's Jorge Alfaro has gunned down more runners this season (11).

THE HIT MACHINE: **Corey Dickerson** currently ranks seventh among the National League leaders with a .317 batting average and is sixth with 73 hits...Dickerson is batting .368 (14-for-38) during his current nine-game hitting streak and has produced a .367 (22-for-60) average in his last 16 games, dating back to 5/23.

ALL-STAR WORTHY: **Francisco Cervelli** enters today ranked first among all Major League catchers in OPS (.890), on-base percentage (.386) and he is second in slugging percentage (.503) behind Miami's J.T. Realmuto (.506)...Cervelli is currently fourth in the All-Star voting for National League catcher.

WHY DON'T WE STEAL AWAY: **Starling Marte** has swiped three bases in the last four games and has gone 13-for-16 in stolen base attempts this season...Marte enters today's action with 194 career stolen bases...Since 1900, only seven Pittsburgh players have recorded at least 200 career steals; **Frank Taveras** is seventh on the list with 206.

CATCH THIS: **Francisco Cervelli** and **Elias Díaz** have combined to hit 12 home runs this season from the catching position, which are tied with the Dodgers for the most among National League catching tandems and the most hit by Pittsburgh catchers since 2014 (13)...They combined to hit six in 2017, three in 2016 and seven in 2015.

OFFENSIVE OUTFIELD: Pittsburgh outfielders have combined to produce the best OPS among National League teams (.818) and the third-best among all Major League teams behind Boston (.893) and the New York Yankees (.824)...The Pirates outfielders also lead the N.L. in total bases (370), batting average (.280) and RBI (108).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 11, 1981: Bucco Pitching Coach, Ray Searage, made his Major League debut with the New York Mets. Searage came out of the pen and faced nine batters in 2.0 scoreless innings of work. He gave up three hits and struck out two batters, including Dave Concepcion for his first big league strikeout. It was also the final game before the 1981 MLB strike took place the following day, forcing the cancellation of 713 games.

TREVOR WILLIAMS: The 26-year-old righthander will be making his 14th start of the season tomorrow... Allowed four runs in 3.0 innings, but had a no-decision in his last start Wednesday night vs. Los Angeles in an 11-9 win...Began the season with three straight wins before suffering his first loss on 4/17 vs. Colorado...Is 0-1 with an 8.50 ERA (18.0ip/17er) in his last four starts since winning a 7-0 decision against the White Sox at PNC Park on 5/15...Has gone 2-1 with a 4.01 ERA in six starts on the road this season; 0-1 with a 6.89 ERA (15.2ip/12er) in his last three after going 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in the first three.

vs. ARIZONA: 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA in two career starts (both in 2017)...Won a 4-3 decision over Taijuan Walker at Chase Field on 5/13 (5.0ip/1er)...Retired each of the last 12 batters he faced after surrendering a solo homer to Nick Ahmed and a double to Jeff Mathis in the second inning...Also pitched 6.0 innings and allowed one run but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-3 walkoff win at PNC Park on 5/29.
