THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

1941 - Detroit pitcher Al Benton collects two sacrifices in one inning, establishing a Major League record.

1984 - The Tigers and Red Sox split a doubleheader with Detroit winning the opener, 9-7, and Boston taking the nightcap, 10-2. Aurelio Lopez improves to 8-0 as he earns the victory in relief in game 1, while Chet Lemon and Lance Parrish each homer and drive in three runs.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers were unable to avoid a sweep in Oakland as they dropped the series finale, 6-0, on Sunday afternoon. Francisco Liriano started for Detroit and took the loss, giving up two runs on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings. Offensively, Mike Gerber had a pair of hits, while Jim Adduci, Nicholas Castellanos and Niko Goodrum each had one hit. The Tigers continue their six-game road trip tonight as they begin a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL). Following the series against the Angels and an off day on Thursday, the Tigers return home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Minnesota (August 10-12) and three games vs. Chicago (AL) (August 13-15).

TIGERS ACQUIRE TWO PLAYERS TO BE NAMED LATER OR CASH CONSIDERATIONS FROM OAKLAND IN EXCHANGE FOR MIKE FIERS: The Detroit Tigers announced today that they have acquired two players to be named later or cash considerations from the Oakland Athletics in exchange for RHP Mike Fiers.

Fiers, 33, has made 21 starts for the Tigers this season, posting a 7-6 record with a 3.48 ERA (119.0IP/46ER) and 87 strikeouts. He currently ranks eighth in the American League with 1.97 walks per nine innings.

START ME UP: Francisco Liriano threw 5.0 innings in yesterday's game, allowing two runs on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts. The start marked the fifth straight game where a Tigers starting pitcher has allowed two runs-or-less. Over the five-game stretch, Detroit starting pitchers have posted a 1.27 ERA (28.1IP/4ER). Since the All-Star break, Tigers starters have compiled a 3.11 ERA (72.1IP/25ER), which is the third-lowest ERA in the Majors over that stretch, trailing only Boston (1.74 ERA) and Houston (2.96 ERA).

HAIL TO THE VICTOR: Victor Alcántara worked a scoreless inning with one strikeout in yesterday's game. Alcántara has not allowed a run in eight-of-nine appearances this season, posting a 0.84 ERA (10.2IP/1ER) and limiting opponents to a .205 (8x39) batting average.

ZIP, ZERO, ZILCH, NADA: The Tigers suffered their Major League leading 15th shutout of the season yesterday at Oakland. Detroit's 15 shutouts are the most the team has had in a season since 2003, when the Tigers were blanked 17 times.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Mike Gerber recorded the first multi-hit game of his Major League career yesterday, leading off the game with a single and adding another base knock in the eighth inning. Gerber has hit safely in all three games he has played in since being recalled from Triple A Toledo on July 31...Francisco Liriano struck out three batters in yesterday's game and now has 1,715 punchouts in his career, which is the sixth-most by a Dominican-born pitcher in Major League history. He is five strikeouts away from tying Ubaldo Jiménez for fifth.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-3 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (0-3) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8). Detroit is 18-38 on the road this season and has lost 18 of its last 23 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .229 (441x1927) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.68 ERA (477.1IP/248ER).

CALLING ALL ANGELS: The Tigers and Angels continue their seven-game season series tonight. Detroit is 3-1

against the Angels this season after winning three-of-four games at Comerica Park from May 28-31. The Tigers are looking for their first season series win over Los Angeles (AL) since 2010. Detroit has lost 28 of its last 40 games vs. the Angels (.300 since September, 2012), their worst winning percentage vs. any team in that time frame. Detroit has not won a series at Angel Stadium since 2009, going 0-6-2 in that stretch. Since 2010, Detroit is 7-21 against the Angels in Anaheim.

WEST SIDE STORY: Detroit is 10-18 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 33 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-80, .370).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 47-65 (.420) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,115-1,104 (.502) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks tied for 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 22nd start of the season tonight in the series opener at Los Angeles (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd picked up his sixth win of the season on Tuesday vs. Cincinnati, throwing 8.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and seven strikeouts.

VS. LOS ANGELES (AL): Boyd's only career start against the Angels came earlier this season on May 28 at Comerica Park, when he earned the win after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Boyd has pitched in 40 games, including 38 as a starter, on the road in his career, compiling an 8-18 record with a 5.97 ERA (194.1IP/129ER) and 177 strikeouts. In 11 road starts this season, Boyd is 2-6 with a 5.49 ERA (59.0IP/36ER) and 59 strikeouts.

AT ANGEL STADIUM OF ANAHEIM: Boyd will be making his first career appearance at Angel Stadium of Anaheim tonight.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Boyd has made 14 appearances, including 13 starts, against teams from the American League West in his career, compiling a 5-5 record with a 5.25 ERA (72.0IP/42ER) and 63 strikeouts. In four starts vs. AL West opponents this season, Boyd is 2-1 with a 4.71 ERA (21.0IP/11ER) and 22 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST: Boyd has made 18 appearances, including 15 starts, in his career during the month of August, posting a 4-6 record with a 5.44 ERA (82.2IP/50ER) and 69 strikeouts. In six outings, including five starts, in August last season, Boyd went 0-3 with an 8.75 ERA (23.2IP/23ER) and 27 strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT BOYD'S JULY: Boyd made five starts during July, going 2-3 with a 4.34 ERA (29.0IP/14ER) and 31 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .266 (86x323) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .268 (336x1256) clip. In 21 starts this season, lefties are hitting .245 (26x106) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .215 (71x330).

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

His last start against Los Angeles (AL) was on July 17, 2016, when he gave up eight runs on seven hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 4.0 innings. The start in 2016 was also his only career appearance at Angel Stadium of Anaheim.

AT TOLEDO: Turner has made 11 starts with Triple A Toledo this season, compiling a 2-4 record with a 4.01 ERA (58.1IP/26ER) and 41 strikeouts.
