MEDICAL MATTERS—The Rays have reinstated tonight's starter **Chris Archer** (left abdominal strain) from the 10-day DL and optioned RH **Andrew Kittredge** to Triple-A Durham...INF **Christian Arroyo** (left oblique strain) is scheduled to play 6 innings at second base tonight for Class-A Charlotte in their 6:35 game against St. Lucie (Mets).

D.C. BOUND—Last night Major League Baseball announced that **Wilson Ramos** won the AL catcher ballot with 2,359,726 votes, nearly a million votes more than 2nd-place **Brian McCann** (Astros)...Ramos will become the fifth different Ray to start the All-Star game, joining LH **David Price**, LF **Carl Crawford** and 3B **Evan Longoria** in 2010 and DH **Corey Dickerson** in 2017...in addition, DH **José Canseco** in 1999 and Longoria in 2009 won fan elections but did not play...Ramos is the second Rays catcher to ever make the AL All-Star Team, joining **Dioner Navarro** in 2008 (reserve)...it is the second selection and first election of his career, as he was a reserve for the NL All-Star Team while with the Nationals in 2016.

- + Ramos is the only Rays player on the All-Star roster...while the Rays hold the 4th-best ERA in the majors as well as the AL ERA leader in **Blake Snell** (2.09), they had no pitchers selected...the Rays had at least one pitcher named to the All-Star Team in the previous eight seasons, which was the 2nd-longest active streak in the AL.
- + **Kevin Cash** was selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for a second consecutive year...before Cash last season, **Larry Rothschild** in 2000 and **Joe Maddon** and his coaching staff in 2009 were the only Rays managers or coaches to go.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are coming off a 3-3 road trip against the Marlins (1-2) and Mets (2-1), with back-to-back shutout wins to end the trip...they are 11-4 in their last 15 games to improve from 6 games under .500 (34-40) to 45-44, one game shy of their high-water mark of the season.

- + The Rays are 4-1 in their last 5 series since June 22-24 vs. NYY.
- + Since April 18, the Rays have gone 41-31 (.569) to improve from 4-13, which tied for the worst 17-game start in franchise history...their plus-46 run differential over this stretch is 5th in the AL.
- + Despite this recent stretch, the Rays are still 11 GB of the Mariners, who are on pace to win 101 games, for the second AL Wild Card.
- + Yesterday the Rays hit 3 HR, their most in a game since June 25 vs. WAS (3) and most on the road since May 29 at OAK (4)...the 3 HR matched their total from the previous 10 games combined.

DOMESWEET DOME—Since June 11, the Rays are 11-1 at home and have outscored opponents, 49-19, over this stretch...the Rays have allowed 2 runs or fewer in 10 of their last 12 games here...they have also allowed 1 run or fewer in seven of these 12 games, including four shutouts.

- + The Rays went 8-1 on their last homestand against the Yankees (3-0), Nationals (2-0) and Astros (3-1), the 2nd-best 3-series homestand in club history, behind July 5-14, 2013 vs. CWS/MIN/HOU (9-1)...it was the first time in club history the Rays won three consecutive series over teams who made the postseason the year prior.
- + The Rays haven't lost by more than 1 run at home since May 25.

THROWING BLANKS—Rays pitchers are on a scoreless streak of 18 IP, having pitched back-to-back shutouts for the second time this season (also June 25-26 vs. WAS)...in addition, this was the sixth time in club history the Rays recorded back-to-back shutouts on the road, first since Sep 13-14, 2013 at MIN...four times this season an AL team has thrown back-to-back shutouts—the Rays have done it twice and the other 14 AL teams have combined to do it twice...the Brewers and Giants are the only other teams in the majors to twice throw back-to-back shutouts this season.

- + The Rays have recorded 8 shutouts this season, tied for most in the AL...all 8 shutouts have come over the last 38 games since May 28, while they didn't have a shutout through the first 51 games and were the second-to-last team with one this season...the 8 shutouts since May 28 are the most in majors, ahead of the Giants (6).
- + The Rays have a 1.82 ERA (143.2-IP, 31-R/29-ER) over their last 15 games...the 31 runs are their fewest in a 15-game span since June 30-July 14, 2013 (30)...they have allowed 3 runs or fewer in 12 of their last 15 games and 2 runs or fewer in 10 of these 15 games.
- + Since the debut of the "opener" on May 19 vs. LAA, Rays pitchers lead the majors with a 2.68 ERA (419-IP, 125-ER), ahead of the Yankees (3.16)...prior to this, they ranked 22nd in the majors (4.43).

PITCHING ODDS & ENDS—The Rays are coming off a 3-game series in which they didn't allow a run in 25 of 27 frames nor an earned run in 26 of 27 frames, the only exception being **José Bautista's** walk-off grand slam.

- + The Rays haven't allowed a hit with runner(s) on base since Bautista's 9th-inning grand slam on Fri at NYM...opponents are 0-for-23 with runner(s) on base since then, including 0-for-9 with RISP.
- + Yesterday at NYM, they faced the minimum through 8 IP.
- + The Rays have pitched to a 2.63 ERA (89-IP, 26-ER) in the 1st inning of games, the best in the AL and 2nd-best in the majors to the Nationals (2.12)...they haven't allowed a run in the 1st inning since June 11 vs. TOR, having played 24 games since then.
- + The Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers, most in the majors, and 27 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Angels (29)...they have used a rookie starting pitcher in 29 games, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (41).

FLIRTING WITH PERFECTION—Yesterday at NYM, RH **Nathan Eovaldi** retired his first 18 BF until a **Brandon Nimmo** single leading off the 7th inning...it tied **Matt Garza** on April 30, 2009 vs. BOS for the 2nd-longest perfect game bid in club history, behind **Chris Archer** (6.1 IP) on July 29, 2015 vs. DET...it was the longest perfect game bid of his career, and matched the longest no-hit bid of his career (3rd time, last May 30 at OAK)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Eovaldi became the first Rays starter with multiple no-hit bids of 6 IP within the same season.

ON THE OFFENSIVE—The Rays are 12-5 over their last 17 games despite 3.71 runs per game...they have recorded wins while scoring 11, 9, 9 and 7 runs, but have scored 3 runs or fewer in 11 of the other 13 games.

- + Eight of the club's last 14 wins have come on 3 runs or fewer, while only three of their first 31 wins of the season came in this fashion.
- + The Rays are 29-1 (.967) when scoring at least 5 runs this season.

RAYS vs. TIGERS—The Rays went 1-2 at Comerica Park from April 30-May 2, losing the rubber match on a walk-off bunt RBI single by **John Hicks** in the 12th inning...tonight is the fourth of six meetings between the clubs this season...the Rays went 5-2 against the Tigers last year, including a 3-game sweep at home, just the second time in the past seven seasons they won the season series over the Tigers (4-3 in 2014).

- + The Rays are 9-3 (.750) against the AL Central this season, compared to 36-41 (.467) against all other opponents.

LIGHTEN UP—The Rays are 3-3 thus far in a stretch of 16 consecutive games from July 2-22 against teams currently under .500, as well as 29 of 35 games through Aug 12...this season, the Rays are 24-12 (.667) against teams currently below .500 and 21-32 (.396) against teams currently .500 or better...the Rays have played 41 games against the 10 teams currently positioned to make the postseason, and they are 13-28 in these games.

CLOSE SHAVES—41.6 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.7 pct. of games in the majors...the Rays are 16-21 (.432) in 1-run games, including 6-2 in their last eight 1-run games...the 37 1-run games are tied with the Mariners for most in the majors and the 21 1-run losses are most in the majors, ahead of the White Sox (19)...74.2 pct. of Rays games have either been wins or 1-run losses...47.7 pct. of their losses have come by one run, 2nd-highest rate in the majors (Astros, 51.6 pct.).

- + The Rays have played six 1-0 games this season, most in the majors and already tied for their 2nd-most in a single season (2014, 10).
- + The Rays are on pace for 38 1-run losses, which hasn't been done by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a single season is 30 (2015).

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On July 9, 2005, **Jonny Gomes** hit a 2-run, walk-off homer in the 9th inning off Tigers closer **Troy Percival** to give the Rays a 5-4 win and snap their 10-game losing streak...at 474 feet, it still stands as the 3rd-longest homer in Tropicana Field history.

WELCOME BACK—Was reinstated from the 10-day DL (left abdominal strain) prior to tonight's game, ending his first career stint on the disabled list...threw bullpen sessions on June 22 and June 25 and a 3-inning simulated game on June 28...most recently made a rehab-start with Class-A Charlotte on Tues vs. Fort Myers (Twins), and did not allow a run or hit over 4 IP...the only baserunners against him reached consecutively in the 1st (walk, error)...after that, retired his last 10 BF.

- + Hasn't won at home since Sep 30, 2017 vs. BAL...has made 5 starts at home since then (0-1), the 3rd-longest home winless drought of his career.

BETTER OF LATE—Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in four consecutive starts and in six of his last 7 starts, and his ERA is currently a season-low 4.24...is 1-1 with a 1.14 ERA (23.2-IP, 3-ER) and .213 opp avg. (17-for-80) over his last 4 starts and 1-3 with a 2.47 ERA (43.2-IP, 12-ER) and .223 opp avg. in 7 starts since the beginning of May.

- + Hasn't allowed a homer in six of his last 7 starts, including four in a row, his longest streak since April 2-19, 2017 (4)...yielded at least 1 HR in each of his first 6 starts this season, 3rd-longest streak to start a season in club history.
- + Prior to leaving his last start after 5 IP due to injury, he went at least 6 IP in six consecutive starts, while four of his first 6 starts were less than 6 IP.

vs. DETROIT—Is 2-3 with a 3.48 ERA (51.2-IP, 20-ER) in 9 starts against the Tigers, including 0-1 with a 2.54 ERA (28.1-IP, 8-ER) in 5 starts at home...last faced them on May 1 at Comerica Park, and took the loss opposite **Matthew Boyd**, yielding RBI doubles to **Nicholas Castellanos** (3rd inning) and **Leonys Martín** (5th inning).

- + Has yielded 3 ER or fewer in four of his 5 starts against the Tigers at Tropicana Field, including 2 starts without an earned run.

WHEN HE'S OFF—Has yielded 4 runs or more in 6 of his 13 starts this season (46.2 pct.), compared to 10 times in 34 starts last season (29.4 pct.)...despite his stint on the disabled list, his 6 starts of 4 runs or more are still the most on the team—no other Rays pitcher has made more than 3 starts of this type...he has also allowed at least 6 ER in 2 starts this season after doing so twice all of last year.

ODDS & ENDS—Is 1 win shy of tying **Scott Kazmir** (55) for 3rd in franchise history, while his 1,120 SO are 2nd in club history to **James Shields** (1,250).

- + According to StatCast, has gotten 106 swings-and-misses on his slider, 6th in the majors and 4th in the AL...has 56 SO this season with the slider, 6th-most in the AL, after leading the majors in strikeouts on the slider in 2015 (179), 2016 (152) and 2017 (179).
- + Has thrown his changeup for 10.1 pct. of his total pitches, 2nd-highest rate of his career and up from 8.0 pct. last season.
- + Has made 27 starts in his career with double-digit strikeouts, most in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** (23)...has not allowed a walk in eight of those 27 starts, tying Price for most in club history and as many as Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** compiled in his 27-year career.

MR. DURABLE—Despite his stint on the disabled list, he still ranks 2nd in the majors with 169 starts since June 1, 2013—the date he was recalled to the majors for good—behind major league leader DET/WAS **Max Scherzer** (171)...has made at least 30 starts in each of the previous four straight seasons, one of two Rays pitchers all-time to do that (also **James Shields**, six, 2007-12)...became the third Ray with three straight years of 200 IP, joining Shields (six, 2007-12) and Price (three, 2010-12)...is one of five pitchers to throw at least 200 IP in each of the previous three seasons.

K'S FOR KIDS—Every strikeout he records this season will benefit the local nonprofit Starting Right, Now...its mission is to combat youth homelessness through a variety of personal development programs...for every strikeout, Archer, the Rays Baseball Foundation—a 501(c)(3) organization—and Crown Automotive Group will each donate \$25...this is the fourth consecutive year Archer has conducted the strikeout campaign.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
