NATIONALS NEWS

LAST HOMESTAND

Following a day off on Wednesday, the Washington Nationals open their final homestand of the 2018 season on Thursday...The Nationals will welcome the New York Mets for four games this weekend before capping the 2018 home slate with a three-game series against the Miami Marlins beginning Monday.

- The Nationals enter this homestand having won eight of their last 11 games since sweeping the Sept. 8th doubleheader against the Chicago Cubs.

HE'S STREAKING

Anthony Rendon has reached base safely in a career-high 27 straight games dating to Aug. 21...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and is tied for the fifth-longest streak in the National League this season with **Paul Goldschmidt** (7/23-8/22)...**Cesar Hernandez** is fourth on the list with a 28-game streak from April 22 to May 25.

- During the streak, Rendon is hitting .352 with a .432 on-base percentage and a .593 slugging.
- Rendon enters Thursday having posted multi-hit/multi-RBI efforts in four straight games...He is 10-for-16 (.625) with a double, two homers, eight RBI, two walks and 10 runs scored during this stretch.
- On the season, Rendon ranks in the NL in doubles (T2nd, 40), average (6th, .305), slugging percentage (9th, .519), extra-base hits (T10, 62) and OPS (12th, .888).
- Since 2016, his 119 doubles rank second in the National League behind **Nick Markakis** (120) and are fourth in all of Major League Baseball behind **Jose Ramirez** (138), **Mookie Betts** (130) and Markakis.

MAX'S MILESTONES

Max Scherzer enters Thursday with 277 strikeouts this season, the most in Major League Baseball and the second-most in a season in his career...As the 2018 regular season winds down, Scherzer is approaching more milestones:

- 284 — Career-high and Nationals record (2005-pres.) set in 2016
- 300 — Would become the 17th pitcher since 1900 (35x) and the fifth pitcher since 2000 (6x) to record a 300+ strikeout season

EVERYDAY TREA

Trea Turner has played in each of Washington's 152 games this season, making 148 starts and four appearances off the bench...The only player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to appear in all 162 games in a season was **Ryan Zimmerman**, who started all 162 games in 2007.

- If Turner starts each of the 10 games left on the schedule, he will tie **Alfonso Soriano** (158 in 2006) for second on the list behind Zimmerman's 162 starts in 2007.
- Turner enters Thursday riding a 19-game on-base streak dating to Aug. 29...It is the second-longest streak of his career behind a 21-game run from Aug. 10 to Sept. 2, 2016.
- With one more stolen base, Turner will tie **Ian Desmond** (122) for the most stolen bases as a National (2005-pres).

CHASING 100-100-100

Bryce Harper enters Thursday with 97 runs scored, 97 RBI and 123 walks in 2018...He is looking to become the sixth player since 2014 to record at least 100 runs, RBI and walks in a season...He would join **Joey Votto** (2017), **Aaron Judge** (2017), **Mike Trout** (2016), **Paul Goldschmidt** (2015) and **Jose Bautista** (2015, 2014).

- On the season, he ranks in the National League in homers (T2nd, 34), OBP (5th, .394), RBI (6th, 97) and OPS (7th, .894).
- His 123 walks lead MLB and are one short of his career-high (124 in 2015).

NATIONALS HISTORY

September 20 (5-6 on this date)

2012 — **Drew Storen** struck out the side in order in the ninth to close out the Nationals' 4-1 victory over the Los Angeles Dodgers and secure D.C.'s first Postseason baseball berth since 1933. **Ross Detwiler** earned his 10th win, allowing just one run on three hits in 6.0 stellar innings. **Ryan Zimmerman**, fittingly, posted the game-winning RBI via a third-inning double. After the game, the Nationals celebrated clinching their first Postseason berth with a private champagne toast.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#31 - MAX SCHERZER - RHP

Polished veteran right-hander, three-time Cy Young Award Winner and five-time consecutive All-Star signed a historic seven-year contract with Washington on Jan. 21, 2015...Joined the Nationals after seven Major League seasons with Detroit (2010-14) and Arizona (2008-09)...Is one of just 10 pitchers in Major League history to take home the Cy Young Award three or more times.

AGAINST THE METS: Faces the Mets for just the second time this season...Allowed three earned runs on five hits in 7.0 innings on July 12 at New York... Since joining the Nationals in 2015, is 7-4 with a 2.21 ERA and 111 strikeouts in 12 starts against the Mets.

LAST START: Allowed a season-high six earned runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings in his shortest start of the year, Sept. 14 at Atlanta.

- Has 33 strikeouts against just three walks in his last four starts.
- Leads NL pitchers in SO (279), SO/9.0 IP (12.06), H/9.0 IP (6.10), WHIP (0.91), SO/BB (5.65), opp. AVG (.188), opp. OBP (.248) and wins (17)...Ranks in the NL in ERA (2nd, 2.53), opp. OPS (3rd, .579) and opp. SLG (4th, .331).
- Tossed 20.0 consecutive scoreless innings from Aug. 7-23...It is the longest streak by a Nationals pitcher in 2018.
- Had a six-game winning streak in eight from July 7- Aug. 17...Posted a 2.00 ERA (13 ER/54.0 IP) and 60 SO.
- Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 17 starts, the third-most in MLB and second-most in the National League.
- Recorded his 200th strikeout of the season on July 27 at MIA (Bour)...Per *Elias*, his streak of seven 200+ strikeout seasons is tied for second in MLB history behind **Tom Seaver** (NYM, 9, 1968-1976), and with **Roger Clemens** (BOS, 7, 1986-1992) and **Walter Johnson** (WSH, 7, 1910-1916).
- Recorded his 1,000th strikeout w/WSH on July 2 vs. BOS, becoming the 11th pitcher in MLB history to collect at least 1,000 strikeouts with two different clubs...The list, according to *Elias*: **Jim Bunning** (DET/PHI), **Roger Clemens** (BOS/NYY), **Randy Johnson** (ARI/SEA), **Mark Langston** (ANA/SEA), **Greg Maddux** (CHI/ATL), **Mike Mussina** (BAL/NYY), **Nolan Ryan** (CAL/HOU), **CC Sabathia** (CLE/NYY), **Luis Tiant** (BOS/CLE) and **Cy Young** (BOS/CLE)
- Recorded a nine-game winning streak from (4/9-6/5) which tied the second-longest streak of his career (13 G; 4/6-7/3/13 and 9 G; 8/20/16-4/7/17)...It is the longest winning streak in Major League Baseball in 2018.
- Did not earn the win, but struck out a season-high 15 batters on May 6 vs. PHI...It was his fifth career 15+ strikeout game...He became the first pitcher in Major League history (since 1913) to strike out at least 15 batters in no more than 6.1 IP according to Baseball-Reference.com.
- Was named National League Pitcher of the Month for April (5-0, 1.62 ERA, 57 SO, 9 BB, .165 opp. AVG) and May (4-0, 2.21 ERA, 63 SO, 10 BB).
- Was named National League Player of the Week for the week of April 9 through 15 (2-0, 1.13 ERA, 21 SO, BB, 3 H).

CAREER NOTES

- His 80 games of 10+ SO rank eighth in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...H.O.F. **Steve Carlton** (7th, 84).
- His 41 games of 10+ SO and one ER or fewer rank seventh in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...**Curt Schilling** (6th, 47).
- His 23 games of 10+ SO and zero ER rank seventh in MLB history (since 1913) and second-most among active pitchers...**Clayton Kershaw** (6th, 23)
- Scherzer's five career games with 15 or more strikeouts are the most among active players and tied for seventh-most all-time.
- Leads all active starters and ranks second in MLB history with a career 10.38 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (**Randy Johnson** - 10.61).
- His career .197 opp. AVG vs. right-handed batters is fourth-best all-time and second among starting pitchers (**J.R. Richard** - .186).

According to FanGraphs.com's offensive metric Weighted Runs Created Plus (wRC+), **Juan Soto** is in the process of putting together the most productive offensive season by a teenager in Major League history...At 148 wRC+, he ranks first ahead of **Mel Ott** (140 in 1928), **Tony Conigliaro** (138 in 1964) and **Bryce Harper** (121 in 2012), among others (min. 400 PA).

- Also according to FanGraphs.com, his Win Probability Added of 3.02 is the best mark among teenagers in Major League history ahead of **Bryce Harper** in 2012 (1.87) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** in 1989 (1.22).

NEXT MILESTONES

With 277 strikeouts in hand, **Max Scherzer** is heading towards more milestones:

- 284 — Career high and Nationals record (2005-pres.) set in 2016
- 300 — Would become the 17th pitcher since 1900 (35x) and the fifth pitcher since 2000 (6x) to record a 300+ strikeout season
- 313 — **Walter Johnson's** D.C. baseball record for single-season strikeouts set in 1910

MOVIN' ON UP

As the 2018 season progressed, so too did **Max Scherzer's** place on both the all-time and active strikeout lists...He began the season 66th all-time and seventh among active pitchers with 2,149 strikeouts...As of Sept. 20, he ranks 43rd all-time and fifth among active pitchers with 2,426 strikeouts.

10 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

Max Scherzer's penchant for 10+ strikeout games is on display yet again in 2018... He has recorded 16 games of at least 10 strikeouts in 2018, the most in Major League Baseball and the most over any National League pitcher by six games (**Jacob deGrom**, 10).

KEEPING IT 1,000x2

Max Scherzer recorded his 1,000th strikeout with Washington on July 2 vs. BOS., becoming the 11th pitcher in MLB history to collect at least 1,000 strikeouts with two different clubs...The list, according to *Elias*: **Jim Bunning** (DET/PHI), **Roger Clemens** (BOS/NYY), **Randy Johnson** (ARI/SEA), **Mark Langston** (ANA/SEA), **Greg Maddux** (CHI/ATL), **Mike Mussina** (BAL/NYY), **Nolan Ryan** (CAL/HOU), **CC Sabathia** (CLE/NYY), **Luis Tiant** (BOS/CLE) and **Cy Young** (BOS/CLE)

HARDWARE

Max Scherzer was named National League Pitcher of the Month in both April and May joining **Chris Sale** as the only players to take home the award twice this season.

- In April, he went 5-1 with a 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts and just nine walks...In three starts from April 9-20, he allowed just seven hits in 71 at-bats, yielding an opponent slash line of .099/.169/.183...He struck out 30 batters and issued just four walks during this stretch of games...On April 9 against Atlanta, he tossed his ninth career complete game (fifth career shut-out) to end Washington's five-game losing streak
- In May, he went 4-0 with a 2.21 ERA (10 ER/40.2 IP) and 63 strikeouts against just 10 walks...He led the NL in strikeouts (63) and SO/9.0 IP (13.9)...He also ranked in the top three in the NL in opp. OBP (2nd, .238), WHIP (2nd, 0.89), SO/BB (3rd, 6.30), opp. AVG (3rd, .176), and H/9.0 IP (3rd, 5.75).

NOTES OF NOTE

Some of **Max Scherzer's** other notable accomplishments this season include:

- Recorded an MLB best nine-game winning streak from April 9 to June 5.
- In the month of April, he was called upon to help snap five-game (4/9 vs. ATL), three-game (4/14 vs. COL) and four-game (4/25 at SFG) losing streaks...He earned the victory in each start, pitching to a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP) with 31 strikeouts against just three walks.
- Did not earn the win, but struck out a season-high 15 batters on May 6 vs. Philadelphia...It was his fifth career 15+ strikeout game...He became the first pitcher in Major League history (since 1913) to strike out at least 15 batters in no more than 6.1 IP according to Baseball-Reference.com.
- He tossed 20.0 consecutive scoreless innings from Aug. 7 to Aug. 23...It is the longest streak by a Nationals pitcher in 2018.
