Mitch Haniger has made 156 outfield starts this season, tops in the AL and 2nd-most in the Majors (Nick Markakis-ATL, 159)...Haniger is the 1st Mariners outfielder to make at least 156 starts since Ichiro Suzuki in 2010.

THE SEASON FINALE...the Mariners conclude the 2018 regular season today with the final of 4 games (2-1) vs. Texas...the Mariners opened the homestand with 3 games (1-2) vs. Oakland...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **770 KTTH** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 2 in a row...are 9-7 in their last 16 games, 10-9 in their last 19...are 23-23 in their last 46 games since Aug. 9...are 33-42 in their last 75 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 48-49 in their last 97 games since June 10...Seattle is 74-62 in its last 136 games (4/28-c) and 79-65 over its last 144 games (4/20-c)...Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 64-46 at night...Seattle is 44-36 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road.

- **Milestone Tracker** - **Nelson Cruz** (97 RBI) is 3 RBI shy of 100 this season; with 3 more RBI, he would become the 7th Mariners player in club history with at least 3 seasons of 100+ RBI (last: Raúl Ibáñez, 2006-08)...Cruz (298 2B) is 2 doubles shy of 300 for his career...**Denard Span** (1,498 H) is 2 hits shy of 1,500 for his career...**Cameron Maybin** (497 R) is 3 runs scored shy of 500 for his career.
- **Pitching In** - the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make at least 25 starts each (**Mike Leake**, 31; **Marco Gonzales**, 29; **Félix Hernández**, 28; **James Paxton**, 28; **Wade LeBlanc**, 26)...four clubs (Cleveland, Colorado, Houston & Philadelphia) have 4 pitchers with 25+ starts each.
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 65-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-54 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are the only Major League club with a 1.000 winning percentage (76-0) when leading after 8 innings this season.
- **Rivals** - the Mariners are playing their final of 17 consecutive games vs. AL West foes...are 9-7 in that span.

BEST VS. THE WEST...with a win today, the Mariners would clinch a winning record vs. each of their divisional opponents this season...the Mariners are currently 10-9 vs. Houston, 11-8 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 10-9 vs. Oakland and 9-9 vs. Texas (40-35 overall vs. the AL West)...since Houston joined the AL West in 2013, the Mariners have never had a winning record vs. each of their divisional foes...the last time Seattle had a winning record vs. each team in their division was 2003 (11-8 vs. LAA, 12-7 vs. OAK, 10-10 vs. TEX).

NO FREE PASSES...the Mariners enter play today having issued the fewest walks in the Major Leagues...Seattle pitchers have walked 400, ranking ahead of Cleveland (405), Los Angeles-NL (418), Houston (434) and Oakland (473)...Seattle's 400 walks allowed are fewest in club history in a **full season** (the 1981 Mariners issued 360 walks in 110 games), ranking ahead of the clubs of 2011 (436), 2002 (441) and 2012 (449)...among Mariners pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched in single-season club history, 4-of-the-top-11 marks for fewest walks allowed have come this season: **Marco Gonzales** is T3rd with 32 (also: Doug Fister, 2010, and Carlos Silva, 2008), while **Mike Leake** is 6th with 34, **Wade LeBlanc** is T7th with 40 (also: Taijuan Walker, 2015, and Hisashi Iwakuma, 2013) and **James Paxton** is T9th with 42 (also: Jamie Moyer, 1998).

DIABOLICAL DÍAZ...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his 300th career strikeout with a punchout of Willie Calhoun in the 9th inning last night...**Díaz reached the milestone in 190.2 innings pitched, 4th-fastest by innings pitched in Major League history**...only 3 pitchers have reached 300 career strikeouts in fewer innings: Craig Kimbrel (171.2, 2013), Aroldis Chapman (187.2, 2013) and Dellin Betances (190.1, 2016)...**STATS LLC**.

RING 'EM UP...Mariners pitchers have established a single-season club record for strikeouts with 1,319...with 13 strikeouts last night, the 2018 Mariners surpassed the clubs of 2014 (1,317) and 2016 (1,318)...the Mariners are averaging 8.25 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings (1,319 K, 1,439.2 IP) this season, the top single-season mark in club history (previous: 8.16, 2014)...Mariners pitchers have posted a 3.30 strikeout-to-walk ratio (1,319 K, 400 BB) in 2018, the 5th-best mark in the Majors this season and the best mark in a season ever by the club (previous: 2.87, 2016).

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...**Mitch Haniger** enters today's game batting .285 (170x596) with 90 runs, 38 doubles, 4 triples, 26 home runs, 93 RBI, 10 HBP, 70 walks, a .366 on-base percentage and a .493 slugging percentage (.859 OPS) in 157 games this season...Haniger ranks among the top-20 American League leaders in batting (19th), hits (T8th), runs (T14th), doubles (13th), RBI (10th), walks (T13th), on-base percentage (10th), slugging percentage (17th), OPS (10th) and extra-base hits (12th, 68)...he has recorded 12 outfield assists, tied for the Major League lead (also: Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN)...ranks 6th in the Majors with 15 game-winning RBI...is the 13th player (done 29x) in club history with at least 90 runs and 90 RBI in a season (last: **Nelson Cruz**, 2017) is 1 of 7 Mariners outfielders in club history with at least 25 home runs and 90 RBI in a season and at 27 years of age, is the youngest since Ken Griffey Jr.'s MVP campaign of 1997 (also 27)...Haniger was named to his 1st All-Star Game this season.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** has recorded a Major League-leading 57 saves, tied with Bobby Thigpen-CWS (1990) for 2nd-most in single-season history...is the 14th pitcher in Major League history (done 17x) with at least 50 saves in a season and the youngest ever to reach that milestone...is the 2nd pitcher ever with at least 50 saves and 100 strikeouts in a season (also: Eric Gagne-LAD, 2002 and 2003)...ranks 2nd among all relievers with 124 strikeouts...is 27-for-30 (90.0%) in one-run save opportunities, establishing a single-season Major League record for saves when entering with a one-run lead...is 1 of 18 relievers in Major League history (done 20x) with at least 100 more strikeouts than walks...earned his 1st All-Star Game appearance...has been named AL Reliever of the Month 4 times (April, June, July, August).

LEFTIES ON THE LOOSE...today's start by **Roenis Elías** marks the 89th start by a Mariners left-hander this season - and the 4th in a row following **Marco Gonzales**, **Wade LeBlanc** and **James Paxton**...the 89 starts by lefties are 3rd-most in club history, trailing only the Mariners clubs of 1998 (95) and 1997 (94) - both of which featured Randy Johnson, Jamie Moyer and Jeff Fassero...the Mariners 89 starts by southpaws this season are 2nd-most in the AL/6th-most in the Majors, trailing Boston (105), Los Angeles-NL (95), Chicago-NL (94), San Francisco (92) and San Diego (92)...Gonzales led Mariners **lefties** with 29 starts, followed by Paxton (28), LeBlanc (27), Elías (4, including today) and Ariel Miranda (1)...Seattle southpaws have combined for 38 quality starts, 2nd-most among a club's lefties in the AL/6th-most in the Majors and tied for 9th-most in club history.

COMING IN HOT...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 46 of his last 54 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .327 (73x223) with 38 runs, 21 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 25 RBI, 2 HBP, 19 walks, a .381 on-base percentage and a .547 slugging percentage (.928 OPS)...among Major League leaders since July 31, Haniger ranks T3rd in hits, T3rd in doubles, T4th in extra-base hits (31), 9th in batting, T12th in runs and 14th in OPS.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners are 88-73 with 1 game remaining this season...**AND AS YOU MAY KNOW**...this marks Seattle's 2nd season of at least 85 wins since 2016...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners are 1 of 5 American League teams with multiple 85-win seasons in the last 3 years...they join Boston (3), Cleveland (3), Houston (2) and New York-AL (2).

ABOUT ELÍAS...

- Pronounced: Roenis (roh-EN-ees) Elías (ehl-LEE-us).
29-year-old left-hander is making his 4rd start of season today (23rd appearance)...
Has spent parts of 5 seasons with Seattle (2014-15, 2018-c) and Boston (2016-17)...
Defected from Cuba to Mexico in late 2010 after playing with Guantanamo in Serie Nacional.
Owns a career MiL record of 41-36, 4.24 ERA (282 ER, 599.0 IP) in 114 games/104 starts over 8 seasons.
Made his US professional debut in 2011 with the AZL Mariners...also appeared in games with Pulaski and Clinton during his rookie campaign.

LAST START...tossed 3.2 scoreless innings while allowing only 1 hit and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts in his last start on Sept. 14 at LAA...the Mariners went on to win the game 5-0, recording the clubs 10th shutout win of the season.

OUT OF THE BULLPEN...has made 19 relief appearances for the Mariners this season, going 2-0 with a 2.02 ERA (7 ER, 35.1 IP) with 11 walks and 19 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .238 average (31x130)...11 of his 19 outings have been scoreless...has allowed just 1 home run in 2018...tossed 2.0 scoreless innings (12th & 13th) in the Mariners 4-3 13-inning win vs. Tampa Bay on June 1...pitched 2.0 scoreless innings (8th & 9th) in Seattle's 8-6 comeback win on June 13 vs. Los Angeles-AL...threw a season-high 5.0 innings on Aug. 29 at San Diego (5.0,4,1,1,2,3).

HE'S BACK...recalled from a rehab assignment with AAA Tacoma and reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Aug. 9...appeared in 3 games, including 1 start, on a rehab assignment with the Rainiers, tossing 2.2 scoreless innings and striking out 4 while walking 3.

FRESH START...prior to his start vs. San Francisco on July 24, had not started a game since taking the loss vs. Seattle (with Boston) on June 17, 2016 (4.0,7,7,3,2,HR-2), a span of 767 days and 15 appearances between starts.

TACOMA RECAP...went 2-4 with a 4.94 ERA (17 ER, 31.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 12 walks in 7 games (6 starts) with AAA Tacoma before being recalled on June 1.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...was acquired from the Red Sox on April 23 in exchange for cash considerations or a player to be named later...Seattle sent cash considerations on June 15.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN...became the 44th player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

LAST TIME AROUND...was 15-20 with a 3.97 ERA (123 ER, 279.0 IP) with 108 walks and 240 strikeouts in 51 appearances (49 starts) with the Mariners in 2014-15...threw his first career complete-game shutout on June 1, 2014 vs. Detroit (9.0,3,0,0,1,8)...has collected 10 strikeouts twice (5/1/14 at NYY, 6/19/15 vs. HOU)...made his Major League debut on April 3, 2014 at Oakland; did not allow a hit through his first 4.2 innings pitched (5.0,2,1,1,3,3).

2017 RECAP...made just 1 Major League appearance last season, striking out 1 and walking 1 in 0.1 IP on Sept. 4 vs. Toronto with Boston...spent the majority of the 2017 season on the disabled list with Boston...began the season on the 10-day DL with a right oblique strain; transferred to the 60-day DL on June 15.

QUITE THE STREAK...allowed 3 runs or fewer in 16 consecutive starts from July 21, 2014 to May 25, 2015...marks the 3rd-longest such streak in club history behind Erik Bedard (20, 6/8/08-7/25/09) and Félix Hernández (18, 5/18/14-8/22/14).

CAREER...is 17-22 with a 4.03 ERA (149 ER, 333.0 IP) with 274 strikeouts in 77 career appearances (53 starts)...as a starter, is 15-22 with a 4.22 ERA (137 ER, 292.0 IP)...has spent parts of 5 seasons with Seattle (2014-15, 2018-c) and Boston (2016-17)...originally signed with the Mariners as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011...made MLB debut on April 3, 2014 at Oakland.

NEED TO GET TO 4...Seattle lost 2-0 vs. the Rangers on Thursday night...was the 77th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-54 in those games...77 team games with 3 or fewer runs are T4th-most in the AL (also: KC and CWS), trailing only BAL (91), DET (81) and LAA (80) and ranks T8th in MLB...Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer is T1st in the Majors, with the Cubs (23-51) and ahead of the Giants (21-68), Rockies (21-42) and A's (21-40).

OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season – **Dee Gordon** (99 games), **Mitch Haniger** (45 games), **Jean Segura** (14 games), **Guillermo Heredia** (2 games) and **Denard Span** (1 game) – have combined to hit .348 leading off a game this year, going 54-for-155 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .351 average leads MLB.

IN THE BLACK...at 88-73, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

FOR STARTERS...**Matt Festa** (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 16th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (**Mike Leake**, **Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández**, **James Paxton**, **Wade LeBlanc**) have combined for 142 starts, with each making at least 26, and **Erasmus Ramirez** has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Elias, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.

THE ROTATION...**Mike Leake** (31 GS), **Marco Gonzales** (29 GS), **Félix Hernández** (28 GS), **James Paxton** (28 GS) and **Wade LeBlanc** (27 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make 25+ starts apiece...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (**Hernández**, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, Garcia, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).

DON'T WALK...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Rangers batter last night, marking the 23rd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 23 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (16), Oakland (15) and San Diego (14)...the 23 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.

GOOD TO BE HOME...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 21 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is tied for the most all-time at Safeco Field, along with Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martinez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 21 home runs at home are 5th-most in the American League, trailing only J.D. Martinez-BOS (25), Khris Davis-OAK (23), Joey Gallo-TEX (23) and Justin Upton-LAA (22).

40/100...**Nelson Cruz** has 37 home runs and 97 RBI this season in 161 team games; that puts him on pace for 38 home runs and 98 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have averaged more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 203 home runs (40.6 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 560, & Edwin Encarnación, 550) with 522 RBI (104.0 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 7th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37), Colorado (44-37), Milwaukee (44-37) and St. Louis (44-35), while trailing Houston (55-23), Boston (51-30), Atlanta (47-32), Oakland (46-33), New York-AL (46-33) and Los Angeles-NL (45-34)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).

HOME ON THE ROAD...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).

MR. CONSISTENT...**Mike Leake** made 31 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake is just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.

THE OCHO...**Edwin Díaz** had 8 saves vs. both Oakland and Houston this season; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...Fernando Rodney (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
