TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 7-day, 7-game homestand with the first of three games vs. the Los Angeles Angels...will also welcome the Red Sox to the Emerald City for a four-game set beginning on Thursday...Seattle recently wrapped a 6-day, 6-game road trip going 4-2 vs. the Astros (1-1) and Rays (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 8 of their last 10 games, 12 of their last 16, 17 of their last 22 and 19 of their last 26...Seattle is 27-13 in its last 40 games, 32-16 over its last 48 games and 37-20 in its last 57 games...Seattle is 13-11 during the day and 29-12 at night...Seattle is 20-12 at Safeco Field, 21-12 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...tied with Texas (6-1) and trail only Toronto (7-1) for the ML-lead in extra-inning wins.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** leads the Major Leagues with 29 multi-hit games, ranking ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (27) and Nicholas Castellanos-DET (26)...Segura leads the Majors with 12 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (11).
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 29-8 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-16 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Scoreless** - RH **Chasen Bradford** has an active 8.2 scoreless innings streak over his last 8 games (5/17-c)...his scoreless streak is currently the 11th-longest active streak in the American League.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 19 of their first 22 series, posting a series record of 14-3-5.
- **It's a Dee Thing** - the Mariners are 11-1 when **Dee Gordon** starts at second base this season.
- **Quest for 300** - **Dee Gordon** has recorded 297 career stolen bases...among players currently on a 25-man roster, Gordon's 297 career stolen bases trail only Jose Reyes (514) and Rajai Davis (405).

HOT START...Seattle is 41-24 (.631) through its first 65 games of the season, its 3rd-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (51-14/.785) and 2003 (44-21/.677)...the Mariners currently tied with the Astros for the lead in the American League West...prior to this season, the last time the Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES...since May 16, the Mariners starters are 12-2 (team is 17-7 overall) with a 2.57 ERA (44 ER, 154.0 IP) with 117 strikeouts and 32 walks in 24 games...Seattle **starters** lead the Major Leagues in ERA during that span, ranking ahead of Chicago-NL (2.69/38 ER, 127.1) and New York-NL (2.69/42 ER, 134.0 IP)...the 154.0 innings pitched by Mariners **starters** are the most in the Majors since May 16...during this same stretch, Mariners relievers are 5-5 with 10 saves and a 2.74 ERA (21 ER, 69.0 IP).

IN A GROOVE...dating back to May 16, **Ben Gamel** has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games (with AB), including at least 1 hit in 15 of his 16 starts...during this stretch, he is batting .386 (22x57) with 8 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks and 3 stolen bases...during this stretch his .386 batting average is the 2nd-highest in the American League (min. 50 AB), trailing only Jose Altuve-HOU (.400/38x95) and ahead of teammate **Jean Segura**-SEA (.378/34x90).

CALLING ALL ANGELS...**Jean Segura** has reached base safely in 20 of 23 games in his career vs. the Angels, including hits in 18 games...overall he is batting .354 (34x96) with 18 runs scored, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI, 2 HBP, 6 walks and 6 stolen bases...since 2017, Segura's .373 batting average vs. the Angels is the 3rd-highest, trailing only J.D. Martinez-BOS (.469/15x32) and Russell Martin-TOR (.385/31x83).

CROSS ANOTHER ONE OFF THE LIST...starter **Wade LeBlanc** is making his first career start vs. the Angels...LeBlanc has appeared in parts of 13 Major League seasons, appearing in 188 games, 86 starts, with San Diego (2008-11), Miami (2012-13), Houston (2013), Los Angeles-AL (2014), New York-AL (2014), Seattle (2016 & 2018-c) and Pittsburgh (2016-17)...after tonight's start vs. the Angels will have faced every Major League team, except Kansas City...the Mariners will face the Royals once more this season: June 29-July 1 at Safeco Field.

HOMER HAPPY...**Mike Zunino** hit his 10th home run this season yesterday vs. the Rays...Seattle currently has 4 different players with at least 10 home runs this season: **Nelson Cruz** - 13, **Mitch Haniger** - 13, **Kyle Seager** - 12 and **Zunino** - 10...the Mariners are 1 of 6 teams in the Major Leagues with at least 4 players with 10-or-more home runs this season...Seattle joins Cleveland (5), New York-AL (5), Boston (4), Colorado (4) and Los Angeles-NL (4)...**Ryon Healy** currently has 9 home runs for the Mariners this season.

ONE RUN...the Mariners are 21-9 (.700) in 1-run games, and their 21 wins and 30 games decided by 1 run are both the most in the Majors...their 21 one-run wins are the most through 65 games since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ranking ahead of the 1993 Royals, the 1989 Astros, 1984 Blue Jays, the 1978 Giants and the 1938 Pirates, which each had 20 wins...they have won their last 5 games decided by 1 run, are 8-1 in 1-run games since May 25 and 12-2 in 1-run games dating back to May 19.

LEFT IS RIGHT...since 2012, **Kyle Seager** leads all active left-handed batters in home runs vs. left-handed pitchers with 57...during that span, he ranks ahead of Chris Davis (54), Jay Bruce (46), Anthony Rizzo (45) and Joey Votto (42)...since 2012, **Nelson Cruz** is tied for the lead among all players in home runs off lefties with 64 (also: Giancarlo Stanton-NYY, 64), ranking ahead of Mark Trumbo (58), Seager (57), Josh Donaldson (56) and Todd Frazier (56).

GETTING SERIES-OUS...the Mariners have won or tied 19 of their first 22 series, posting a series record of 14-3-5, including going 6-0-3 in their last 9 series dating back to the one-game series win against the Twins on May 14...the Mariners 9 consecutive series without a loss is currently T3rd-longest in franchise history (also: 3x, 5/22-6/18/01, 4/2-5/3/01 & 8/30-9/24/97), trailing only a 15 game stretch from July 27-Sept, 20, 2001 and an 11-game streak from June 2-July 9, 2000.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Wade LeBlanc** is 4-0 with a 3.73 ERA (41 ER, 99.0 IP) in 23 games, including going 4-0 with a 3.49 ERA (31 ER, 80.0 IP) in 15 starts over 2 stints with the Mariners (June 24-Aug, 24, 2016 & March 29-current)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...dating back to 1920, LeBlanc's streak of 15 consecutive starts without a loss by a pitcher to start his tenure with a team is currently the 6th-longest in the live-ball era?...LeBlanc trails only Whitey Ford-NYY (22, 7/6/50-6/12/53), Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94), Brooks Lawrence-CIN (18, 4/22/56-7/17/56), Jim Coates-NYY (17, 8/22/59-7/4/60) and Noah Lowry-SF (16, 6/12/04-4/15/05).

ABOUT LEBLANC...

- 33-year-old left-hander is making his 13th appearance and 8th start of the season, his 189th career appearance, 87th career start and 1st start (1st appearance) vs. the Angels tonight.
- Signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
- Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L,4,0,8,5,3,1,HR-2).
- Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (*Baseball America*) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
- Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
- Is 3-7 with a 5.33 ERA (46 ER, 77.2 IP) in 28 career G/12 GS in June.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 5-7 Mariners loss on June 6 at Houston...allowed 3 runs (a season high as a starter) on 7 hits and a season-high 3 walks while striking out 3 batters across 4.0 innings pitched...the Mariners are 5-2 in LeBlanc's starts this season.

START IT UP...in 15 career starts with the Mariners, is 4-0 with a 3.49 ERA (31 ER, 80.0 IP) with 60 strikeouts and 18 walks...the Mariners are 12-3 in his 15 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

HE'S A WINNER...has made 15 career starts with the Mariners without suffering a loss...only 2 American League pitchers in the live-ball era have had longer such streaks to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53 and Jim Coates-NYY, 17, 8/22/59-7/4/60)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc trails only Ford, Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94), Brooks Lawrence-CIN (18, 4/22/56-7/17/56), Coates and Noah Lowry-SF (16, 6/12/04-4/15/05) (STATS).

AS A RELIEVER...is 0-0 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances this season...tossed a season-high 4.2 innings of relief in a 4-10 Mariners loss on April 23 at Chicago-AL...limited the White Sox to 2 runs on 6 hits while striking out 6 after entering the game with the Mariners trailing 0-8 in the 4th inning.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

SPRING TRAINING...was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) and 10 strikeouts and 1 walk in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...held opponents to 1 earned run or fewer in 5 of his 7 appearances, including 2 outings with 0 earned runs.

2017 SEASON...went 5-2 with 1 save and 4 holds in 50 appearances (0 starts) with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP), 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...held right-handed batters to a .217 (38x175) batting average against with a .270 on-base percentage and a .389 slugging percentage (.658 OPS against).

LAST TIME AROUND...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...was 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and 5 quality starts in 8 starts with the Mariners...held opponents scoreless in 2 of his 3 relief appearances...went 0-0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER, 5.1 IP) with 7 strikeouts in 3 relief appearances.

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE...in his Mariners debut on June 24, 2016, LeBlanc made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 28, 2014 at Seattle with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 634 days between appearances...LeBlanc made his first ML start since Sept. 23, 2014 at Oakland with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 639 days between starts.

FIRST SEATTLE WIN...earned his first win with Seattle on July 1, 2016, vs. Baltimore (6,0,3,2,2,1,5,HR-1), his first Major League win since Sept. 23, 2014, with the Angels at the A's, a span of 646 days between Major League wins.

IN JAPAN...spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League...went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...tossed his second career complete game on April 2, 2015 at Rakuten Golden Eagles, allowing 2 earned runs on 2 hits 9.0 innings (also: 4/25/14 at Reno w/Salt Lake).

CAREER...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 31-35-3 with a 4.29 ERA (298 ER, 625.2 IP) in 188 career appearances/86 starts...in 86 career starts, is 23-31 with a 4.38 ERA (226 ER, 464.1 IP) with 320 strikeouts and 156 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks.

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL...is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA (13 ER, 42.0 IP), 24 strikeouts and 2 walks over his last 6 games...W#6 in his last start, a 5-4 Mariners win at TB on 6/7 (8,0,8,2,2,1,3,HR-1)...**SPRING TRAINING:** went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (14 ER, 23.1 IP) in 6 starts during Spring Training...**2017:** Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...**CAREER:** In 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c), is 89-80 with a 4.01 ERA (679 ER, 1527.0 IP) with 1,035 strikeouts and 359 walks in 251 career games (246 starts)...is 1 of 4 pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17 (also: Ian Kennedy, Jon Lester and Max Scherzer)...originally signed by Cincinnati with the 8th overall pick of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University...vs. LAA: Is 2-1 with a 2.79 ERA (6 ER, 19.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 5 walks in 3 career starts vs. the Angels...took the loss in his last start against the Angels, a 0-5 Mariners loss on May 4 at Safeco Field (5,1,7,3,3,4,4).
