WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost three of the last four games but won seven of the last 13 as they continue a six-game, seven-day homestand this afternoon vs. the Toronto Blue Jays.
- LHP Carlos Rodón is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are looking to win their second series of July (7/13-15 vs. K.C.).
- The Sox have split the first two games vs. Toronto.
- Chicago owns the third-worst record in MLB ahead of Kansas City (31-71, .304) and Baltimore (30-74, .288).
- Following this series vs. the Blue Jays and Monday's off day, Chicago will conclude the homestand vs. Kansas City (7/31-8/2).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last trip from 7/20-26 at Seattle (1-2) and the Angels (2-2) and 3-2 on their last homestand vs. St. Louis (1-1) and the Royals (2-1) from 7/10-15.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has won four of the last six games, seven of the last 11 and eight of 13 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox have scored 76 runs (5.8 R/G) during the 13-game span.
- The White Sox are hitting .306/.353/.492 with 26 homers and 104 runs scored in the last 19 home games vs. Toronto (5.5 R/G).
- Chicago starters own an 8.75 ERA (35 ER/31.2 IP) with 13 homers allowed in the last seven games ... by contrast, the group surrendered just one earned run in the previous three contests.
- Carlos Rodón is 2-0 with a 1.71 ERA (4 ER/21.0 IP), 1.00 WHIP, .141 opponents average (10-71), 21 strikeouts and just one home run allowed over his last three starts (three QS).
- José Abreu is 11-28 (.375) with three home runs, seven RBI, and a 1.237 OPS during his current seven-game hitting streak.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox overcame a 5-1 deficit by scoring two runs in the seventh inning and six in the eighth en route to a 9-5 victory.
- Nicky Delmonico hit a solo homer and Leury García recorded a RBI single in the seventh to cut the deficit to 5-3 ... pinch hitter Daniel Palka hit a game-winning, two-run single in the eighth, and García followed with a bases-clearing triple.
- Lucas Giolito received a ND after allowing five runs on nine hits, including one home run, with three strikeouts in 4.1 IP.
- Four Sox relievers combined to allow just three hits with four strikeouts in 4.2 scoreless IP ... Juan Minaya earned his first win.
- José Abreu (2-4, 2B) extended his hitting streak to seven ... Yolmer Sánchez hit his sixth homer, and first since 6/24.

RODÓN ON A ROLL

- Carlos Rodón has made three straight quality starts, allowing two runs twice and zero once ... he has surrendered three hits or less in each of his last two outings.
- He has allowed two earned runs or less in six of his eight outings in 2018, and is limiting opponents to a .195 average (36-185) and .121 mark (4-33) with RISP in 2018.
- Rodón is 2-0 with a 1.67 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP) in three home starts this season (two quality starts).

HEADED TO THE HALL

- Jim Thome, the White Sox special assistant to the GM, will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame this afternoon.
- Thome's class also includes Vladimir Guerrero, Trevor Hoffman, Chipper Jones, Jack Morris, Jim Thome and Alan Trammell.
- The induction ceremony begins at 12:30 CT on MLB Network.
- Thome hit .265 (469-1,770) with 88 doubles, 134 home runs and 369 RBI over 529 games with the White Sox from 2006-09.

LAND OF LINCOLN

- Toronto starter Ryan Borucki is a native of Highland Park, Ill., and resides in Mundelein ... he graduated from Mundelein H.S.
- Borucki is the fifth Illinois native (seventh time) to face the Sox in 2018, following Minnesota's Jake Odorizzi (three times; Highland), Milwaukee's Brent Suter (Chicago), Kansas City's Jakob Junis (Rock Falls) and the Yankees' J.A. Happ (Peru).
- The Sox are 2-4 in those games this season.

MAJOR MINOR MENTIONS

- Below is a breakdown of notable White Sox prospects:
 - ◆ Class AAA Charlotte OF Eloy Jiménez has hit safely in 14 of last 15 games, going 25-58 (.431) with eight doubles, four HRs and 10 RBI.
 - ◆ Jiménez is hitting .367/.412/.656 with eight doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI and a 1.068 OPS in 24 games with the Knights this season.
 - ◆ Class AA Birmingham OF Luis Basabe is hitting .304 (17-56) with two doubles, three homers and 10 RBI in his last 16 games ... his 15-game hitting streak from 7/9-27 was tied for the longest in the SL in 2018.
 - ◆ Class A Winston-Salem OF Blake Rutherford is batting .353 (18-51) with two doubles and six RBI during his 12-game hitting streak.
 - ◆ Rutherford ranks among the Carolina League leaders in hits (T1st, 108), RBI (2nd, 66), triples (3rd, 6) and average (5th, .309).
 - ◆ Class A Kannapolis INF Nick Madrigal has hit safely in eight of his 10 games with the Intimidators (.389, 14-36; 3 2B, 5 RBI, 0 SO).

WHITE SOX VS. TORONTO

- Toronto leads the season series, 3-2 ... the Blue Jays own a 36-25 edge in runs scored in 2018.
- Chicago is hitting .278/.344/.509 with nine home runs, and owns a 7.12 ERA (34 ER/43.0 IP) with one quality start.
- The White Sox have won five of the last nine games and 13 of 19 ... the club is 14-10 at Guaranteed Rate Field since 2012.
- The Sox and Jays split the 2017 series ... Chicago is 5-0-1 in the last six season series (28-19 overall) ... the six-season unbeaten streak against Toronto is the longest in club history.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 192-206 ... they are 102-94 in Chicago (62-51 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 90-112 in Toronto (57-72 at Rogers Centre).

HE NOT GONE YET

- This afternoon's game marks Ken "Hawk" Harrelson's sixth-to-last broadcast of his 33rd and final season in the Sox TV booth.
- The celebration of his final season in the broadcast booth will include special analysts and surprise guests.
- Former White Sox captain Paul Konerko will serve as the analyst on 8/19 vs. Kansas City (NBCSCH), and A.J. Pierzynski will serve as the analyst on Hawk Day, 9/2 vs. Boston (NBCSCH) ... ESPN's Matt Vasgersian will visit with Hawk on 8/12 (WGN-TV).

EASTERN PROMISES

- The White Sox are 7-8 vs. the American League East this season, going 4-5 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 3-3 on the road ... they have been outscored, 69-63, this season.
- The Sox are hitting .253/.330/.419 with 16 HRs and own a 4.30 ERA (63 ER/132.0 IP) with seven QS against the East in 2018.
- Chicago has won five of the last eight games and nine of the last 17 ... the club has won six of the last 11 at home.

PILING UP CROOKED NUMBERS

- Yoán Moncada has recorded 19 doubles, five triples, 13 home runs and 43 RBI in 96 games this season.
- He joins Javier Báez, Cody Bellinger, Andrew Benintendi, Corey Dickerson, Teoscar Hernández, Jurickson Profar, Trevor Story and Chris Taylor as the only MLB players to record 15+ 2B/5+ 3B/10+ HR/40+ RBI this season.

STOLEN BASE ... STOLEN BASE!

- Tim Anderson (21), Adam Engel (11), Yoán Moncada (11), Leury García (10) and Yolmer Sánchez (10) have all stolen 10 or more bases for the White Sox this season.
- The Sox are the only team in MLB this season with five players to record double-digits in stolen bases ... the last time five or more Chicago players recorded 10-plus stolen bases was 2005 (Dye, Harris, Iguchi, Ozuna, Podsednik, Rowand).
- Chicago ranks fourth in MLB with 75 steals in 2018.

PROVIDING RELIEF

- Xavier Cedeño has not allowed a run in 17 of his 19 games this season (11 of his outings have been hitless) ... opponents are hitting just .154 (8-52) in 2018 (righties are 3-24, .125).
- Jace Fry is limiting lefties to a .089 mark (5-56) with 23 strikeouts in 2018 ... opponents are hitting .165 (19-115) overall.

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (14 HR/career-high 21 SB) is one of five players in MLB this season with 14-plus homers and 20-plus steals (also Mookie Betts, Starling Marte, José Ramírez and Mike Trout).
- Anderson is on pace for 22 homers and 33 steals in 2018 ... he is looking to become the third White Sox to record a 20+ HR/30+ SB season, joining Alex Rios (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .341 (63-185) with nine doubles, three home runs, 26 RBI and 20 multihit efforts in 53 games since 6/1 (hit safely in 42 contests).
- Narváez (1st, .375) and Smith (T3rd, .309) rank among the MLB catching leaders in average since 6/1 (min. 90 plate apps.).
- Narváez owns 12 multihit efforts and has hit safely in 20 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 22 of his 26 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.
- Narváez is 13-35 (.371) with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.132 OPS over his last 10 games.

ON DECK: VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS

- The White Sox lead the season series, 7-3, going 2-1 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 5-2 at Kauffman Stadium.
- The Sox have lost three of the last five games after starting the season series on a five-game winning streak.
- Chicago has hit 21 home runs vs. the Royals this season, and homered in eight of the 10 games (five multihomer efforts).

RODÓN AT A GLANCE

- The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, fourth at home and first against the Toronto Blue Jays.
- Is 3-1 with a 2.88 ERA (11 ER/34.1 IP), 27 strikeouts and a .189 (23-122) opponents average over his last five starts ... has allowed two runs or less in four of the outings.
- His 426 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 74 career games ... is averaging 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (424.1 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus seven times in his career.
- Started the 2018 season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.
- Entered the 2014 draft rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

LAST START

- Earned his second straight win on 7/24 at Los Angeles-AL, allowing two runs on a season-low two hits over 7.2 IP ... struck out a season-high eight ... had his career-high 15.1 scoreless IP streak snapped in the eighth inning.
- Held the Angels hitless through 5.2 IP before allowing a single to Andrelton Simmons in the sixth ... carried a shutout into the eighth ... the two runs were scored after Juan Minaya entered the game, allowing a RBI double to David Fletcher and a bases-loaded walk to Mike Trout.
- Departed with the White Sox leading, 4-0, in the eighth ... threw a season-high 111 pitches (67 strikes) ... Chicago won, 4-2.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Is 2-0 with a 1.85 ERA (5 ER/24.1 IP), 0.90 WHIP and .165 (14-85) opponents average over his last four starts at Guaranteed Rate Field dating back to 9/2/17.
- Has not lost a start at home since 8/26/17 vs. Detroit (5 ER/5.0 IP).
- Has gone 14-11 with a 3.94 ERA (90 ER/205.2 IP), 207 strikeouts and a .248 (194-781) opponents average in 37 career games (36 starts) at home ... has allowed just 1.09 home runs per 9.0 IP at Guaranteed Rate Field, the seventh-lowest mark among major-league starters at the stadium since 2015.

HE GONE!

- Has averaged 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (426 SO/424.1 IP) over his career, the 13th-best mark in the AL since 2015.
- Has recorded 10-plus strikeouts seven times in his career, including a career-high 11 on four occasions: 8/4/17 at Boston, 7/25/17 at the Cubs, 9/25/16 at Cleveland and 8/11/15 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

QUALITY IS KEY

- Four of his last five starts have been quality, going 3-1 with a 2.88 ERA (11 ER/34.1 IP), 27 strikeouts and a .189 (23-122) opponents average during that span.
- Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21/17.
- Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
- Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
- Is 23-9 with a 2.39 ERA (84 ER/315.2 IP) in 48 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (43 QS).

LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES

- Is limiting lefties to a .225 (82-365) average with six home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .261 (324-1,241) with 47 homers.
- Charlie Blackmon, Jackie Bradley Jr., Robinson Canó, Joey Gallo, David Ortiz and Corey Seager are the only lefties to homer off Rodón ... no lefty has homered twice.

CARLOS ON THE MEND

- Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Earned his second win of the season on 7/11 at St. Louis, allowing just three hits over 7.1 scoreless IP ... recorded his second quality start on 7/5 at Houston (ND; 2 ER/6.0 IP) ... collected his first win of 2018 on 6/24 vs. Oakland, allowing two runs on seven hits over a career-high tying 8.0 IP ... allowed just two runs over 5.0 IP in his second start on 6/14 vs. Cleveland ... made his season debut on 6/9 at Boston, suffering the loss after allowing four runs (two earned) over 5.0 IP.

VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS

- Is scheduled to make his second career start against Toronto ... received a no decision in his only start vs. the Blue Jays on 6/24/16 (2 ER/5.2 IP).
- Has gone 0-5 with a 3.51 ERA (20 ER/51.1 IP) over his last nine starts vs. the American League East ... received three runs or less of support in all nine games ... is 1-7 with a 4.69 ERA (37 ER/71.0 IP) in 14 career appearances (13 starts) against the division.

TUESDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- RHP James Shields (4-12, 4.53) is scheduled to make his 24th appearance (23rd start) of the season, 13th at home and third against the Kansas City Royals.
- Is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (18 ER/30.0 IP) and .227 (33-119) opponents average over his last five starts, but 3-3 with a 2.39 ERA (14 ER/52.2 IP) and .207 (40-193) opponents average in his last eight starts at home.
- Suffered his 12th loss of the season in his last start on 7/25 at Los Angeles-AL, allowing six runs on seven hits over 4.0 IP, his shortest start of the season ... the Sox lost 11-3.
- Is 9-2 with a 4.08 ERA (45 ER/99.1 IP), 80 strikeouts and a .249 (94-378) opponents average over 15 career starts against the Royals and 2-0 with a 4.26 ERA (6 ER/12.2 IP) in two starts this season.

RODÓN'S 2018 STATISTICAL BREAKDOWN
