ATLANTA BRAVES (89-70) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (78-81)

Friday, September 28, 2018 – 7:05 p.m. EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 160 – Home 79

RHP Mike Foltynewicz (12-10, 2.88) vs RHP Jerad Eickhoff (0-0, 9.00)

- YESTERDAY'S RECAP:** The Phillies were swept by the Colorado Rockies as they dropped the series finale, 5-3 at Coors Field ... Jake Arrieta (L, 10-11), allowed 3 runs on 6 hits with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts in 6.0 innings ... Carlos Santana and Jose Bautista both went deep for Philadelphia.
- WELCOME BACK, JERAD:** Jerad Eickhoff is making his first start and his first home appearance since 8/30/17, also against the Braves, a span of 394 days between starts ... He left that game with nerve irritation in his right hand, missed the remainder of the season, and was on the disabled list with a right lat strain from the start of 2018 until 9/2 ... **Per Elias, the last two Phillies to go at least 394 games between starts for the club are Raul Valdes (395 days) between his starts on 6/27/12 and 7/27/13 (he made 25 relief appearances in between) and Cliff Lee (548 days) between his starts on 10/1/09 and 4/2/11 (he made 28 starts for other teams between).**
- HOMework:** The Phillies are looking to end 2018 with their third consecutive series win at home ... Over the last two series at Citizens Bank Park (won two of three from Miami and New York), they have clubbed 10 home runs in six games, scored 36 runs (6.00 per game) and posted a .341 OBP ... With 102 homers at home this season, the club needs three more to have the most by a Phillies team at Citizens Bank Park since 2009 (108) ... **On the mound, Philadelphia currently has a 14.0-inning home scoreless streak (since the 5th inning on 9/18), and has allowed just two runs in the last 18.0 innings at home.**
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** Philadelphia's 567 walks are its most in a season since 2009, when the club had 589 ... **Carlos Santana (107), Cesar Hernandez (93) and Rhys Hoskins (85)** are just the third trio of Phillies with 85 or more walks in one season in franchise history and the first to do so since 2006 (Bobby Abreu – 91, Pat Burrell – 98, Ryan Howard – 108) ... The only time Philadelphia had four players with 85 or more walks in a season was in 1993 when the quartet of Darren Daulton (117), Lenny Dykstra (129), Dave Hollins (85) and John Kruk (111) did so ... **The Phils are the only team in MLB that has multiple players with 80 or more walks in 2018, let alone three with 85... There are only four other National League players with 85 walks or more: Bryce Harper (129), Joey Votto (105), Matt Carpenter (102) and Paul Goldschmidt (89)** ... Among all ML teams, the club ranks 2nd in pitches per plate appearance (4.01, best: LAD, 4.03) and 4th in walk rate (9.4%) & walks.
- NOTHING BUT RHYS-PECT:** Yesterday, Rhys Hoskins played in his 200th career game, accruing 51 home runs and 122 walks in those 200 games ... **Per Elias, Hoskins joins NYY's Aaron Judge (61 HR, 152 BB) as the only players in major league history to have at least 50 HR and 120 BB through 200 career games** ... Since he burst onto the scene August 10, 2017, Hoskins' 51 home runs rank T-4th in MLB with CLE's Francisco Lindor, trailing only NYY's Giancarlo Stanton (58 HR), OAK's Khris Davis (59 HR) and BOS' J.D. Martinez (65 HR) for the major league lead in that stretch.
- MR. NO DAYS OFF:** The Phils are in the midst of 17 consecutive games without an off day to finish their season ... This marks the longest stretch this year for the club without an off day ... Per Elias, this is the first time the Phillies have finished a season with at least 17 straight games and no days off since the year 2000 when they also finished with 17 straight from 9/15-10/1.
- CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH:** The Phillies are currently the only team in MLB without a player on the DL ... As it stands, this would be the first time since at least 1994, as far as the Phillies internal records go back, that Philadelphia finished a season without a single player on the disabled list.
- PAUL OWENS AWARD:** Prior to today's game, the Phillies will present first baseman/outfielder **Austin Listi** and left-handed pitcher **David Parkinson** with the 2018 Paul Owens Award, presented annually to the organization's top minor league player and pitcher ... Listi, 24, batted .312 (133-426) with 25 doubles, one triple, 18 home runs, 84 RBI, 63 runs scored, 62 walks, a .412 OBP with a .502 SLG % in 123 combined games between Clearwater (A) and Reading (AA) in 2018 ... He is one of two Phillies minor leaguers since 2000 to slash better than .310/.410/.500 in 500 or more plate appearances in a season (other: Michael Taylor, 2008) ... Parkinson went 11-1 with a 1.45 ERA (20 ER, 124.1 IP), 141 strikeouts, 1.01 WHIP (35 BB, 91 H) and .202 OPP AVG in 22 games (21 starts) between Lakewood (A) and Clearwater ... His ERA was the lowest among all qualifying pitchers in Minor League Baseball during 2018 and he had the second-most strikeouts among all Phillies minor league pitchers ... Both players were selected by the Phillies in the June 2017 draft, Listi in the 17th round and Parkinson in the 12th.
- DALLAS GREEN AWARD:** International Coordinator **Jesús "Chalao" Méndez** has been selected as the 2018 recipient of the Dallas Green Award, and will receive his award on the field prior to tomorrow's game ... Méndez, a native of Caracas, Venezuela, is in his second year as the international coordinator, and his 22nd as a member of the Phillies' international scouting department ... He was hired by the club in 1997 as the Venezuela scouting supervisor, a title he held until his promotion to Latin American crosschecker in 2010 ... He was named to his current position in 2017 ... Mendez was instrumental in signing players such as **Cesar Hernandez, Freddy Galvis, Carlos Carrasco and Carlos Tocci** ... "This really is an honor for me to receive this award," Méndez said. "I never could have imagined it. We have so many people that work so hard for this organization, and for me to be the recipient of the Dallas Green Award is incredibly special to myself and my family."

- We Like Eick:** Eickhoff is making his first start since 8/30/17, also at home against the Braves ... He left that start with nerve irritation in his right hand ... It has been 394 days since he last made a start for the Phillies ... **The last two pitchers to go at least that long between starts for the Phillies are Raul Valdes (395 days) between his starts on 6/27/12- and 7/27/13 (25 relief games between) and Cliff Lee (548 days) between his starts on 10/1/09 and 4/2/11 (28 starts for other teams between)**
- Homework:** Is making his first appearance at home in more than a year (since 8/30/17) ... **Eickhoff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 26 of his 32 career home starts (all at CBP).**
- East Coast Swing:** Has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 26 of 29 career starts against NL East teams, and 1 or 0 ER in 12 of those starts ... **Among all pitchers to make at least 25 starts against the NL East since 2015, Eickhoff's 3.04 ERA ranks 5th, trailing only Zack Greinke (2.57), Jacob deGrom (2.61), Max Scherzer (2.86) and Stephen Strasburg (3.04, percentage points lower than Eickhoff's) ...** Additionally, his 2.91 career ERA (19 ER, 58.2 IP) against Atlanta is 8th-best among qualifying pitchers since 2015
- The Road to Recovery:** Eickhoff made 8 combined rehab starts for Clearwater (A), Reading (AA) and Lehigh Valley (AAA) on his journey back to the major leagues ... In those 8 starts, he combined to post a 2.91 ERA (10 ER, 31.0 IP) with 13 BB, 23 SO, 4 HR
- vs NL East:** 7-11, 3.04 ERA (58 ER, 171.2 IP) in 30 games (29 starts)

- 2017:** 3-3, 4.45 ERA (29 ER, 58.2 IP) in 12 starts

- Posted a 3.27 ERA (8 ER, 22.0 IP) with 25 SO in 4 July starts
- Held opponents to a .218 AVG (29-133) with RISP, the 6th-lowest among all NL pitchers and 9th-lowest in MLB (min. 160 batters faced with RISP)
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/31 (nerve irritation in his right hand) and missed the remainder of the season

- Posted a 3.36 ERA through his first 45 career starts (102 ER, 273.0 IP) ... Per *Elias* he had the lowest ERA of any Phillies starter through his first 45 career starts since Bruce Ruffin posted 3.27 ERA from 1986-87
- Acquired from TEX on 7/30/15 with LHP Matt Harrison, OF Nick Williams, C Jorge Alfaro, RHP Jake Thompson and RHP Alex Asher in exchange for LHP Cole Hamels, LHP Jake Diekman and cash considerations
- Originally drafted by TEX in the 15th round of the June 2011 draft
