- ♦ The D-backs are 5-1 in their last 6 home games vs. Marlin 12-6 in their last 18.
- ♦ Over the last 4 games since May 28, the D-backs lead the NL in runs (30), home runs (12), RBI (29) and slugging pct. (.593).
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (7 ER in 37.1 IP) and .184 opponent average in 6 starts at home...his home ERA ranks fifth in the NL, while his opponent average ranks sixth.
- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is tied for the NL lead in home runs by a catcher (8) with Francisco Cervelli/PIT and Yasmani Grandal/LAD, ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** is batting .301 (28-for-93)/.398 OBP/1.000 OPS with 9 doubles, 2 triples, 5 homers, 19 RBI and 15 walks in his last 33 games.

- ♦ The D-backs won the series opener vs. Marlins, 9-1.
- ♦ Arizona matched a franchise record with 6 home runs.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** was 2-for-4 with a home run from each side of the plate, the sixth player in team history to do so (more below)... **John Ryan Murphy** homered for the third consecutive game and was 2-for-4 with 2 RBI...**Daniel Descalso**, **David Peralta** and **Jake Lamb** each also added home runs.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** earned the win after allowing 1 run in 7.0 innings...**Jorge De La Rosa** (1.1 IP) and **Fernando Salas** (0.2) each logged scoreless outings.

- ♦ The 20th annual D-backs Inter-Tribal Youth Baseball and Softball Tournament began Thursday, with more than 1,170 participants, including 78 teams, from 6 different states (Arizona, New Mexico, California, Oklahoma, Utah and Mississippi) from more than 27 different tribes playing games in venues around the Valley...the top 4 teams in each division will be recognized in a special pregame recognition at Chase Field on Sunday at Native American Recognition Day.

## CHEWIE, WE'RE HOME

- ♦ Over the last 4 games since May 28, the D-backs lead the NL in runs (30), home runs (12), RBI (29) and slugging pct. (.593).

## GREAT KID, DON'T GET COCKY

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is tied for the NL lead in home runs by a catcher (8) with Francisco Cervelli/PIT and Yasmani Grandal/LAD, ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ In 15 starts this season, is batting .328 (20-for-61) with 4 doubles, 8 homers, 17 RBI and 3 walks
- ♦ Is averaging a home run every 9.88 at-bats (7 HR/75 AB), the highest rate in baseball (min. 75 PA), ahead of Mookie Betts/BOS (10.82), Bryce Harper/WSH (10.89), J.D. Martinez (11.11) and Mike Trout/LAA (11.28) [source: STATS LLC].
- ♦ Has recorded an extra-base hit (2 doubles, 5 home runs) and a RBI (10 total) in 6 consecutive starts...homered in 3 straight games overall and 4 in a row as a catcher, tying a club mark at that position (also: Jarrod Saltalamacchia, Sept. 8-16, 2013).

## HELP ME, YOSHI-WAN. YOU'RE MY ONLY HOPE

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** boasts an 11-game scoreless streak (10.0 IP) since May 6, allowing just 5 hits and 2 walks (1 intentional), 11 strikeouts and a .152 (5-for-33) opponent average.
- ♦ Right-handers are hitting .095 (4-for-42) since April 3.

**GREINKE AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

**SNAKEBITES**

- ◆ In his last 6 starts, has a 2.70 ERA (11 ER in 36.2 IP), .206 opponent average (28-for-136) and 40 strikeouts (7 walks).
- ◆ In 6 starts at home, is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (7 ER in 37.1 IP) and .184 opponent average...his home ERA ranks fifth in the NL, while his opponent average ranks sixth.
- ◆ Among NL starters in May (min. 3 GS), he was tied for eighth with a 0.98 WHIP and ninth with 5.00 strikeouts-to-walk ratio (30:6).
- ◆ His 2,308 career strikeouts are 51st on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Juan Marichal (2,303)...next up list is Rube Waddell (2,316).
- ◆ In last 4 games, has held righties to a .203 average (12-for-59) with 16 strikeouts (1 walk).

**LAST START**

- ◆ Had his third quality start (2 ER in 6.0 IP) in his last 4 starts but suffered a 2-1 loss @ A's.

**VS. MARLINS**

- ◆ In 10 career games (9 starts), is 5-0 with a 3.77 ERA (25 ER in 59.2 IP), .268 opponent average and 52 strikeouts.

**CLIMBING THE K CHARTS**

- ◆ His 2,308 career strikeouts are 51st on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Juan Marichal (2,303)...next up are Rube Waddell (50th, 2,316), Early Wynn (49th, 2,334), Robin Roberts (48th, 2,357), Charlie Hough (47th, 2,362), Felix Hernandez (46th, 2,393) and Sandy Koufax (45th, 2,396).
- ◆ His 2,308 career strikeouts are fifth among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,884), Justin Verlander (2,514), Bartolo Colon (2,498) and Felix Hernandez (2,397).

**PLAYER PROFILE**

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

- ◆ Has allowed 1 run in 5 of 6 home outings and 2 runs in the other...overall, is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (7 ER in 37.1 IP), .184 opponent average and 37 strikeouts (5 walks).
- ◆ In 37 home starts as a D-back, is 20-6 with a 3.34 ERA, .229 opponent average and 223 strikeouts.
- ◆ Since 2016, his 22 home games of 2 runs or less are tied for seventh among all starters with Michael Wacha/STL, J.A. Happ/TOR and Gio Gonzalez/WSH [leader: Justin Verlander/HOU, 28].

**JUNE NUMBERS**

- ◆ In 11 June starts as a D-back, is 7-1 with a 2.10 (16 ER in 68.2 IP), .216 opponent average and 63 strikeouts (15 walks).
- ◆ Among all pitchers in June since 2016 (min. 8 GS), he is fourth in ERA (2.10), 12th in WHIP (1.03) and 14th in opponent average (.216).

**FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM**

- ◆ His 10 walks are tied for 11th fewest by NL starter (min. 5 GS) [leader is Ross Stripling/LAD, 5].
- ◆ Since 2017, his 55 walks are tied for 11th fewest by a starter (min. 35 GS) [leader is Clayton Kershaw/LAD, 41].
- ◆ Has 7.20 strikeout-to-walk ratio (72 strikeouts:10 walks) is second in the Majors, behind Corey Kluber (8.80, 88:10) and ahead of Miles Mikolas/STL (6.63, 53:8).

- ◆ Among NL pitchers with runners on base, is tied for third with a .227 opponents on-base pct. and 13th with a .185 opponents average.
