REDBIRD RUNDOWN: The Cardinals continue play on their first homestand post All-Star Break with seven games. Tonight, the Cardinals play the second of four games against the Colorado Rockies...this is the ninth and final game the Cardinals have played at Busch Stadium in July and they sold out the first seven...the Cardinals are 6-6 post All-Star Break and 7-6 under interim manager **Mike Shildt** since he took the post on July 15.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central, 7.5 games out of first place and 4.0 games out of the second Wild Card position. St. Louis has 56 games remaining on their schedule with 21 against N.L. Central opponents.

TRADE WINDS: St. Louis made a pair of trades today, first sending outfielder **Tommy Pham**, a 12-year veteran in the Cardinals organization, and International Cap Space to the Tampa Bay Rays this morning in exchange for OF **Justin Williams**, LHP **Genesis Cabrera** and RHP **Roel Ramirez**...Williams reports to Memphis, while Cabrera and Ramirez report to Springfield (AA). This afternoon, the Cardinals acquired minor league outfielders **Conner Capel** and **Jhon Torres** from the Cleveland Indians in exchange for Memphis (AAA) outfielder **Oscar Mercado**, who was the Cardinals 2nd round draft selection in 2013.

ROSTER CHURN: RHP **Carlos Martínez** was placed on the 10-day disabled list with a right shoulder strain after exiting last night's game in the 5th inning. Martínez struck out nine in 4.2 innings, allowing two runs after being activated off the 10-day D.L. for last night's start from a previous oblique injury. In counter moves, Canadian-born slugger OF **Tyler O'Neill** (.311, 26 HR, 61 RBI) and LHP **Tyler Webb** were recalled from Memphis (AAA) to join St. Louis' active roster tonight.

WALK-OFF WONDERS: Last night, **Marcell Ozuna** hit his first career walk-off home run and recorded his 5th career walk-off RBI in the process. Ozuna's heroics marked the eighth walk-off win for the Cardinals this season and their first since June 2 vs. the Pirates when **Kolten Wong** hit a walk-off home run. The Cardinals have hit seven walk-off home runs this season with **Kolten Wong** (2), **Matt Carpenter** (2), **Dexter Fowler** and **Yairo Muñoz** also on the list.

SECOND IS A FIRST: **Dakota Hudson** earned his first Major League victory last night in his second career appearance. The last Cardinals relief pitcher to earn his first MLB win in his second appearance was **Mike Mayers**, who made a start on July 24, 2016 vs. Los Angeles and earned a win in relief at Pittsburgh on Sept. 6, 2016. The last Cardinals relief pitcher to earn his first MLB win in one of his first two relief appearances was **Alex Reyes** at Chicago (Aug. 13, 2016) after making his MLB debut in relief four days earlier vs. Cincinnati.

LATE DATES: The Cardinals are playing the Colorado Rockies for the first time during the 2018 season and July 30 is the latest they have begun a season series with their Rocky Mountains western 1-70 opponent since the club's inception in 1993. The previous latest date for a first game between the two clubs was July 6, 2010. The Cardinals latest opponent this season is the Los Angeles Dodgers with the Cardinals first game scheduled for August 20 at Dodger Stadium.

THIS BEAR EATS HOME COOKING: **Marcell Ozuna** has homered in three straight games for the second time this season (also June 13-16). The "Big Bear" homered in a career-best in four straight games Sept. 11-14, 2014, while with Miami. Ozuna leads St. Louis with a .316 batting average at home (7th N.L.), and leads the team with 34 home RBI (10th NL) and is tied for the team lead with nine home round-trippers with **Matt Carpenter**. The Cardinals lead the National League with 80 home runs hit on the road (Dodgers, 2nd, 70) as opposed to 54 at home.

SECOND HALF SURGES: Since the beginning of the new century in 2001, the Cardinals .569 winning percentage post All-Star Break is the best in the National League trailing only the **New York Yankees** (.594) in MLB.

SECRET SALSA: **Matt Carpenter** is tied for 2nd in the National League in home runs with 25 (**Nolan Arenado**, COL, 28). Carpenter is three shy of his career high of 28 home runs in 2015. He's five shy of becoming the 15th Cardinals left-handed hitter to whack 30 home runs in a single season and the first since **Jim Edmonds** hit 42 in 2004. Carpenter's 16 home runs hit on the road this season are tied for the most in the National League with **Paul Goldschmidt**. Carpenter's 10 home runs in July are the most in MLB with one day to play.

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first General Manager from 1991-99...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

Cardinals Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in a combined 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Cardinals infielder **Greg Garcia** served as a Rockies bat boy in 2001...his grandfather, **Dave Garcia**, was a bench coach with the Rockies from 2000-02 working under manager **Buddy Bell**.

Cardinals outfielder **Dexter Fowler** played six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13) and made his Major League debut...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...later traded by Colorado with cash to the Astros for outfielder **Brandon Barnes** and pitcher **Jordan Lyles** (December 3, 2013).

Cardinals infielder **Paul DeJong** made his Major League debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th player in Cardinals history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Cardinals outfielder **Harrison Bader** (July 25, 2017) and pitcher **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Rockies pitcher **Seung-hwan Oh** and Korean Interpreter **Eugene Koo** spent two seasons with the Cardinals (2016-17).

Rockies pitcher **Adam Ottavino** was selected by St. Louis in the first round (30th overall) in the 2006 MLB Draft...pitched in five games for St. Louis in 2010...selected off waivers by Colorado Rockies (April 3, 2012).

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed Cardinals infielder **Jedd Gyorko** (2013-15) and pitchers **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) and **Luke Gregerson** (2009-13) while in San Diego...all three made their MLB debuts under Black.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Gould** is originally from nearby Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...previously worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist writer **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

FOX Sports Midwest reporter **Erica Weston** is originally from Highlands Ranch, Colo...attended Colorado State University.

Rockies Vice President Ticket Sales, Operations & Services **Sue Ann McClaren** worked 15 seasons (1978-92) in the Cardinals sales department before joining the Rockies in 1992.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his 17th start of the season and 23rd career appearance (22nd start) tonight.
- Has worked 5.0 innings in each of his last three starts (7/14 vs. CIN, 7/20 at CHI & 7/25 at CIN), allowing a total of just 8 hits, but three of those eight hits were HR's.
- Since May 20, has struck out 90 in 13 starts, 4th-most among NL pitchers, trailing Max Scherzer (96), Jacob deGrom (95) and Aaron Nola (91).
- His 124 strikeouts in his first 22 career games are the most ever by a Cardinal.
- Ranks 2nd among National League rookies in batting average against (.209) and T1st in strikeouts (104), 4th in ERA (3.28), 4th in innings pitched (85.0) and T4th in starts (16).
- Among NL starting pitchers, ranks 6th in average against (.209), 8th in WHIP (1.12), and 5th in K/9 IP (11.01).
- Ranks T6th among National League pitchers with eight hit batsmen, including four Cubs batters
- Has limited opposition to one run or less in 9-of-16 starts this season.
- St. Louis is just 6-10 in his 16 starts, and have lost 6 of his last 7 games started.
- Received just seven runs of support in his six winless starts from 6/17-7/14.
- Is 2-2 with 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) & 47 strikeouts in 7 home starts this season.

LAST TIME OUT

- Came away with a loss in last Wednesday's (7/25) road trip finale at Cincinnati, a 7-3 defeat at Great American Ball Park.
- All three runs allowed came on home runs by Eugenio Suarez and Adam Duvall.

- Recorded his 100th career strikeout on Ketel Marte (swinging) at ARI (7/3).
- Is one of just 6 pitchers in MLB history to have two or more 13+ strikeout performances in their first 17 career games: Kerry Wood (4-1998), Hideo Nomo (4-1995), Don Wilson (2-1967), Bob Turley (1953-54) & Bob Feller (2-1936).
- Finished June ranked T5th in the NL in strikeouts (37) and 6th in opponent BA (.194).
- Carried a no-hitter for first 6.1 innings on 6/22 at MIL, before allowing Jesus Aguilar solo HR. Matched his own STL rookie single-game record with 13 strikeouts
- Had a no-decision, but worked 5.0 scoreless frames to lead St. Louis to a 5-0 shutout win over the Cubs on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball on Father's Day (6/17) at Busch.
- Became the 3rd Cardinals starting pitcher 22 years or younger to throw at least 5.0 shutout innings in a start against the Cubs since 1963, joining Andy Rincon (9.0 IP, 4/21/1981) and Shelby Miller (5.0, IP, 6/17/13).
