TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 9, 1996: Derek Jeter hits a controversial home run in Game 1 of the ALCS at Yankee Stadium, as a young fan reaches over the wall and deflects the ball. Jeter's home run ties the game at 4-4 in the eighth inning, and Bernie Williams later leads off the 11th with a "walk-off" homer.

Oct. 9, 1977: The Yankees rally for one run in the eighth inning and three in the ninth for a 5-3, series-clinching win in the decisive Game 5 of the ALCS at Kansas City.

Oct. 9, 1961: Hector Lopez homers and drives in five runs during a 13-5 win at Cincinnati, wrapping up a 4-games-to-1 victory for the Yankees' 19th World Series title.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 10, 2012: In Game 3 of the ALDS vs. Baltimore, Raul Ibanez becomes the first player in MLB history to hit two home runs in a game he did not start, tying the score at 2-2 in the bottom of the ninth with a solo homer before giving the Yankees a "walk-off" victory in the 12th.

Oct. 10, 1964: Mickey Mantle leads off the bottom of the ninth inning with a "walk-off" home run that caps off a 2-1 victory over the Cardinals and gives New York a 2-games-to-1 lead in the World Series.

ON TO THE NEXT ONE: The Yankees trail Boston in the best-of-five ALDS, 2-games-to-1...are 2-2 in their 54th postseason in club history.

▶ Marks their 20th appearance in the ALDS, their 19th in 24 postseasons since the playoffs were expanded to eight teams in 1995 (for full list, see p. 145 of Yankees' 2018 Postseason Media Guide or p. 326 of 2018 Media Guide)...are 12-7 in 19 series in the ALDS.

BOUNCING BACK: In Division Series history (all best-of-five), teams trailing, 2-games-to-1, are 32-32 in Game 4 and have gone on to win 17-of-64 series (26.6%)...the Yankees have trailed an ALDS, 2-games-to-1, eight times...are 4-3 in Game 4, and have won 2-of-7 series (wins in 2017 vs. Cleveland and 2001 vs. Oakland).

▶ With Monday's loss, dropped to 6-5 in ALDS Game 3 when entering tied 1-1...lost the series following each of the first four losses.

▶ Are 12-7 in potential elimination games in the ALDS (7-2 at home)...are 5-1 in all potential elimination games since the start of the 2017 postseason (4-0 at home).

▶ During the regular season, went 43-18 (.705) in games following a loss...are 1-0 this postseason (ALDS Game 2).

▶ Game 3 marked the seventh time they allowed at least 13R in a postseason game, and are 4-2 in the following game (each ensuing game occurred in the same series).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost to the Red Sox in Game 3 of the ALDS on Monday, 16-1...RHP Luis Severino (3.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, 2K) started and took the loss...DH Giancarlo Stanton (2-for-4) had two of the Yankees' five hits...RHP Austin Romine (1.0IP, 1H, 2ER, 1BB, 1HR) made his first career pitching appearance, pitching the ninth.

▶ Set a franchise record for runs allowed and margin of defeat in a postseason game (previously a 15-2 loss in 2001 Game 6 at Arizona)...was the largest defeat by a home team in Major League postseason history.

SEEING RED: The ALDS marks only the fourth time that the Yankees will face the Red Sox in a postseason series (won 1999 ALCS, won 2003 ALCS, lost 2004 ALCS)...the Yankees are 12-10 in 22 postseason games (6-5 at home, 6-5 in Boston).

▶ Is the first postseason meeting of 100-win teams prior to the World Series since 1977, when the Yankees defeated Kansas City in the ALCS...is the second consecutive postseason with a matchup of 100-win teams, following the 2017 World Series between Houston and Los Angeles-NL.

▶ The Red Sox have not won multiple games in six of their last seven regular-season series at Yankee Stadium since 9/27/16 (Boston won 2-of-3 from 8/11-13/17).

RICKETY SPLIT: The Yankees have defeated the Red Sox in each of Rick Porcello's last three starts at Yankee Stadium (since 2016), hitting .301/.361/.521 (22-for-73) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 7BB/1BBB, 1HP and 5SB...Porcello is 0-2 with a 6.27 ERA (18.2IP, 14R/13ER) in those starts.

HOME COOKING: The Yankees had their seven-game postseason home winning streak snapped in ALDS Game 3...tied for the third-longest postseason home winning streak in club history (10 straight from 1998-2000, eight straight from 1927-36, seven straight from 1937-41)...are 19-10 in 29 postseason games at the current Yankee Stadium, including 7-1 the last two postseasons (2017-18).

▶ Had allowed 4R-or-fewer in a postseason club-record-tying nine straight home games before Monday's 16-1 loss.

▶ With a 53-28 (.654) record at Yankee Stadium, the Yankees had the second-best home record in the Majors in 2018 (Boston, 57-24, .704)...was their second-best record in a season at the current Yankee Stadium (57-24 in 2009).

▶ During the 2018 regular season, went 18-5 (.783) at home when losing at home in their previous game...lost consecutive games at home just five times in 2018 (did not lose three consecutive home games at any point).

STANTON ISLAND: Of Giancarlo Stanton has hit safely in all 4G of his first postseason, batting .294 (5-for-17) with 4R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB and 1SB...is the third Yankee since 2000 to hit safely in at least his first four career postseason games (Aaron Hicks, first 6G in 2017; Robinson Canó, first 4G in 2005)...is playing in his first postseason after 1,144 career regular season games...were second-most among active players who had never reached the postseason (Seattle's Kyle Seager-1,155G).

▶ Including both the regular and postseason, is hitting .357/.402/.631 (30-for-84) with 15R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR and 17RBI in 21G vs. Boston in 2018.

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge has hit safely in all 4G this postseason, batting .500/.556/1.125 (8-for-16) with 5R, 1 double, 3HR, 4RBI and 2BB...leads the Majors in the 2018 postseason in hits and XBHs (four) and is tied for the lead in HRs (with George Springer) and runs scored (with Alex Bregman).

▶ Homered in each of the first 3G this postseason, joining Hank Bauer (1958 World Series Games 1-3) as the only Yankees to homer in each of the team's first three postseason games in a year (note: Johnny Mize homered in 1952 World Series Games 3-5 after missing the first 2G of the Series)...was the eighth postseason HR streak of at least 3G in Yankees history, and the first since Alex Rodriguez in 2009 ALCS Games 2-4 (3G)...has homered in five of his last eight postseason games (since 2017 ALCS Game 4)...hit just 1HR in his final 17 regular season games (since 7/23).

▶ Is batting .266/.373/.656 (17-for-64) with 14R, 4 doubles, 7HR, 15RBI and 11BB in 17 postseason games...his 1.030 OPS is the fourth-highest among active players (min. 50PA), behind Chris Young (1.138), A.J. Ellis (1.065) and Albert Pujols (1.030)...is tied for the sixth-most HRs by any player through 17 postseason games (9HR-Carlos Beltrán, 8HR-Troy Glaus/Juan González/Bernie Williams).

▶ In seven postseason games at Yankee Stadium, is hitting .357/.471/.929 (10-for-28) with 9R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 12RBI and 6BB...is tied with Robinson Canó (4HR in 20G) for the most postseason HRs at the current Yankee Stadium.

ROOKIE MOVES: 2B Gleyber Torres is the fourth Yankee, age-21 or younger, to hit safely in at least three straight postseason games, joining Mickey Mantle (6G: 4G in 1952 at age-20, 2G in 1953 at age-21), Tony Kubek (3G at age-21) and Joe DiMaggio (3G at age-21)...at 21 years, 294 days for the AL Wild Card Game, became the youngest position player to appear in a postseason game for the Yankees since INF Tom Carroll (age 19y, 15d) in World Series Game 5 on 10/2/55.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit 6HR in 4G this postseason...broke the single-season Major League home run record with 267HR in 2018, surpassing the 1997 Mariners (264HR)...also broke the Yankees' previous club record of 245HR in 2012.

▶ Had homered in each game during their seven-game postseason home winning streak before going homerless in ALDS Game 3 on Monday...have still hit 11HR in eight postseason home games in 2017-18...hit a Yankees-record 144HR at home in 2018 (81G), tied for the fifth-highest home HR total in Major League history.

▶ Hit 19HR in 9G vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium in 2018.

CC THE STOPPER: In eight postseason games (seven starts) at Yankee Stadium, LHP CC Sabathia is 5-1 with a 1.76 ERA (46.0IP, 9ER), never once allowing more than 2R...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (3H, 4BB, 5K) to earn the win in 2017 ALCS Game 3 vs. Houston.

▶ Over the last two seasons (2017-18), was 14-1 with a 2.91 ERA (139.1IP, 45ER) in 25 regular season starts following a Yankees loss (20-5 team record)...does not include his loss on 5/18/18 at Kansas City (5.0IP, 4ER), at which time the Yankees had not yet lost the completion of their suspended game on 5/15 at Washington.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (9-7, 3.65 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia will make his 24th career postseason appearance (23rd start) in tonight's ALDS Game 4 vs. Boston...the 38-year-old will start on extended 11 days' rest...last pitched on 9/27 at Tampa Bay and earned the win, allowing only 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings before being ejected in the sixth (0BB, 5K, 2HP)...with his 3.65 ERA during the regular season, recorded his lowest ERA since 2012 (3.38)...also marked his third straight season with a sub-4.00 ERA after recording ERAs above 4.50 in all three seasons from 2013-15...leads active Major League pitchers in career regular season strikeouts (2,986), innings pitched (3,470.0) and quality starts (313)...ranks second in wins (246) and starts (538) to Bartolo Colon (247 wins, 552 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,986), third all-time among left-handers...his 2,858 regular season strikeouts in the AL are fifth-most in AL history (most among left-handers)...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer.

LAST START: Earned the win on 9/27 at Tampa Bay, allowing only 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings (0BB, 5K, 2HP)...marked his fourth scoreless start this season, his second with 1H allowed (6.0IP, 1H on 8/12 vs. Texas)...became the eighth pitcher (and first Yankee) since 1908, age-38 or older, to record multiple scoreless starts of at least 5.0IP with 1H-or-fewer in a single season, joining Nolan Ryan (3x in 1986, 3x in 1990, 2x in 1991), Randy Johnson (2007), Greg Maddux (2006), Tom Glavine (2004), Mike Cuellar (1975), Sal Maglie (1956) and Cy Young (1908).

CC THE STOPPER: Over the last two seasons (2017-18), went 14-1 with a 2.91 ERA (139.1IP, 45ER) in 25 regular season starts following a Yankees loss (20-5 team record)... does not include his loss on 5/18/18 at Kansas City (5.0IP, 4ER), at which time the Yankees had not yet lost the completion of their suspended game on 5/15 at Washington.

VS. BOSTON: Is 18-13 with a 4.14 ERA (263.0IP, 121ER) in 42 career starts against the Red Sox...his 18 career wins vs. Boston are the most among active pitchers...is 16-9 with a 4.19 ERA (214.2IP, 100ER) in 35 starts against them since joining the Yankees in 2009...has the second-most wins vs. Boston by a Yankee since 1970 (Andy Pettitte, 20-11).

- ✦ Is 6-0 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1IP, 11ER) in his last eight starts vs. Boston (since 9/29/16)...is the first pitcher from either side in this series to win six consecutive decisions since the Yankees' Ron Guidry went 6-0 vs. Boston from 9/13/77-9/13/79
- ✦ Went 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (14.0IP, 7ER) in three starts vs. Boston this season.
- ✦ Has allowed one-or-zero runs in seven of his last 12 starts against the Red Sox...in his last 14 starts vs. the Red Sox (since 4/24/14) is 8-1 with a 2.79 ERA (80.2IP, 25ER), allowing 2R-or-fewer in 11 of those starts.
- ✦ Is unbeaten in his last nine starts vs. Boston, tied for the second-longest unbeaten run by a starter against the Red Sox in the last 10 years behind teammate J.A. Happ (nine starts from 5/15/15-4/24/18).
- ✦ Is 10-5 with a 3.24 ERA (125.0IP, 45ER) in 19 career starts vs. the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium.
- ✦ Faced the Red Sox in the 2007 ALCS with Cleveland, going 0-2 with a 10.45 ERA (10.1IP 12ER).

2018: Ranked second in the AL and seventh in the Majors with a .193 opponents' BA (28-for-145) with RISP (Gerrit Cole-.179)...his .180 opponents' BA vs. left-handed hitters was the lowest full-season mark of his career (previously .186 in 2015)...was the seventh-lowest mark by an AL starter (min. 100AB)...retired 121-of-162 batters leading off innings (.253 opp. OBP).

- ✦ Made two stints on the 10-day D.L.: from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain and from 8/13-22 with right knee inflammation.
- ✦ Went 6-3 with a 3.12 ERA (80.2IP, 28ER) in 15 home starts.
- ✦ Opponents hit .248 (59-for-238) the first time through the lineup, .208 (47-for-226) the second time and .328 (42-for-128) the third time through.
- ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his last 11 starts and 13 of his last 19 starts (since 6/5).
- ✦ His loss on 9/3 at Oakland was his first loss following a Yankees loss since the beginning of 2017 (had been 12-0 in 22 starts).

PITCCH IN: Is the Yankees' nominee for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award...through his PitCch In Foundation, he and his wife, Amber, have hosted a number of events and made sizable donations on an annual basis since establishing the foundation in 2009...is seeking to become the first Yankee to win the award since Derek Jeter in 2009...the winner will be announced during this year's World Series.

POSTSEASON CAREER: Is 10-6 with a 4.20 ERA (126.1IP, 59ER) in 23 career postseason games (22 starts)...is tied for the most postseason starts among active pitchers and ranks second in wins to Justin Verlander (12-6), fourth in innings pitched and strikeouts...in 12 career games (11 starts) in the Division Series, is 6-1 with a 3.84 ERA (63.1IP, 27ER) and 69K...is tied for third all-time in Division Series in starts, fourth in wins and strikeouts, and ninth in innings pitched...is 4-0 with a 3.14 ERA (48.2IP, 17ER) in nine ALDS appearances (eight starts) with the Yankees.

- ✦ As a Yankee in the postseason (since 2009), is 8-3 with a 3.29 ERA (101.1IP, 37ER) in 18 games (17 starts)...in home playoff contests at Yankee Stadium, is 5-1 with a 1.76 ERA (46.0IP, 9ER) in eight games (seven starts)...has never allowed more than 2R in a home postseason start as a Yankee...ranks among Yankees postseason leaders in starts (fourth), wins (tied for fourth), innings (sixth) and strikeouts (fifth, 96)...the Yankees are 12-5 in his 17 starts.
- ✦ Went undefeated over eight consecutive postseason starts with the Yankees from 11/1/09 (World Series Game 4 at Philadelphia) through 10/12/12 (ALDS Game 5 vs. Baltimore)...was the fifth-longest stretch of undefeated playoff starts by a Yankee in franchise history.
- ✦ Is 2-2 with a 3.90 ERA (27.2IP, 12ER) in six career postseason games (five starts) with his team facing elimination...as a starter, is 2-2 with a 3.76 ERA (26.1IP, 11ER) in those games...all were with the Yankees, who went 3-2 in those starts.

- Made 44 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K from 5/29-9/24...was the longest by a reliever in AL history and was the third-longest in Baseball history behind Aroldis Chapman (49) and Corey Knebel (46)...had at least 1K in 63-of-66 appearances this season.
- Was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

#53 ZACH BRITTON—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the third time in his career (2014, '16 and '18).
- His 91.6% save percentage (142-for-155) is the highest among active pitchers (min. 100 saves)...since the start of 2014, leads all Major League pitchers (min. 200.0IP) with a 1.82 ERA (287.0IP, 58ER).
- Combined to go 2-0 with seven saves (in 10 chances), a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 14ER) and 34K in 41 relief appearances with Baltimore and the Yankees...was acquired by the Yankees from Baltimore for RHP Dillon Tate, RHP Cody Carroll and LHP Josh Rogers on 7/24.
- Began the season on the 60-day disabled list recovering from right Achilles surgery...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the D.L. on 6/11.

#54 AROLDIS CHAPMAN—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the sixth time in his career (2010, '12 and '13 w/ the Reds, '16 w/ the Cubs, '17-18 w/ the Yankees)...won the 2016 World Series w/ the Cubs...has a 0.90 ERA (10.0IP, 1ER) with 19K in eight postseason games as a Yankee.
- Had 23K over his final 10.1IP in the regular season (25K in last 11.1IP)...led all relievers with a 16.31 K/9.0IP ratio (93K, 51.1IP).
- Was named to his fifth career All-Star team and first in the AL (NL: 2012-15, AL: '18).
- Joins Craig Kimbrel and Kenley Jansen as the only pitchers to reach the 20-saves plateau each season since 2012...is one of two pitchers to record 30 saves at least six times in the last seven years (since 2012), joining Kimbrel, who has at least 30 saves in each of the last eight seasons (since 2011).
- Has averaged 15.00 K/9.0IP in his career (478.2IP, 798K), the best ratio in the Major Leagues since at least 1900 (min. 300.0IP).

#57 CHAD GREEN—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the second time in his career (also 2017)...made his playoff debut in 2017 AL Wild Card Game win (2.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 2BB, 4K)...became the first Yankee to strike out his first four playoff batters faced and first Major League pitcher to do so since Colorado's Jeff Francis in 2007 NLDS Game 1 at Philadelphia.
- Posted a career-long 17.1-inning scoreless streak (over 13G) from 5/25-7/8/18.
- With his 1.95 ERA (152.0IP, 33ER) as a reliever, is one of four active pitchers with at least 100 relief appearances have a career relief ERA under 2.00: Zach Britton (1.79), Craig Kimbrel (1.91) and Richard Bleier (1.97).

#56 JONATHAN HOLDER—RHP

- Made his postseason debut in Monday's ALDS Game 3 loss vs. Boston, allowing 1ER in 2.0IP (2H, 1BB, 1K).
- Had 60 apps. (1GS) w/ the Yankees, spending nearly the entire season in the Majors.
- Did not allow an earned run over 23 relief apps. from 4/21-6/27 (27.2IP), the AL's second-longest such streak of the season, and tied for third-longest in the Majors.
- In his first 35 appearances after being recalled (from 4/21-8/1), posted a 0.88 ERA (41.0IP, 7R/4ER), holding opponents without an earned run 31 times.
- In 4G/1GS with Scranton/WB, was 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (6.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR).

#36 LANCE LYNN—LHP

- Has made his sixth trip to the postseason (also 2011-15 w/ St. Louis).
- Has made 19 career postseason relief appearances (two in 2018)...pitched in the inaugural NL Wild Card Game in 2012...earned the win in relief in 2011 World Series Game 3 (2.1IP, 1ER).
- Earned 10 wins between the Twins (20GS) and Yankees (11G/9GS)...went 3-2 w/ a 4.14 ERA (54.1IP, 25ER) for the Yankees...was 1-0 w/ a 1.23 ERA (7.1IP, 1ER) in relief.
- Allowed just 14HR in 156.2IP...his 0.80 HR/9.0IP ratio was fifth-lowest in the AL (min. 150.0IP)...had a 0.33 HR/9.0IP ratio (2HR/54.1IP) after joining the Yankees on 8/1, the lowest mark among Major Leaguers over that span (min. 50.0IP).
- Has reached 10 wins and 150K in each of his six full MLB seasons (2012-15, '17-18).
- Was acquired from the Minnesota Twins with cash considerations in exchange for INF Tyler Austin and RHP Luis Rijo on July 30, 2018.

#30 DAVID ROBERTSON—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the sixth time in his career, all with the Yankees (2009-12, '17-18)...has held opponents scoreless in 23-of-29 career playoff relief apps.
- Is the only pitcher in Baseball history to record at least 10.00 K/9.0IP in each of his first 11 Major League seasons (2008-18)...the previous record was held by four pitchers, who each accomplished the feat in their first three Major League seasons—Dick Radatz, Troy Percival, Mark Prior and Takashi Saito.
- His 11.97 K/9.0IP (874K, 657.0IP) career mark is best in MLB history (min. 600.0IP).
- Ranks third on the Yankees' all-time games pitched list (501) behind Mariano Rivera (1,115) and Dave Righetti (522)...surpassed Andy Pettitte (447), Mike Stanton (456) and Whitey Ford (498) in 2018...has the second-most strikeouts by a reliever in Yankees history (666), trailing only Mariano Rivera (1,135).
- Was originally selected by the Yankees in the 17th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...is one of two current Yankees to appear with the club in both the current and original Yankee Stadiums (also Brett Gardner).

#71 STEPHEN TARPLEY—LHP

- Is making a postseason roster for the first time in his career...made his postseason debut in Monday's ALDS Game 3 loss vs. Boston (1.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 1BB, 1K, 1WP).
- Made his Major League debut in 2018, holding opponents scoreless over his final nine appearances (8.0IP, 12K) following his MLB debut...did not allow a hit over his last six regular season appearances (5.0IP, 10K).
- Also pitched in 2018 for Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.
- Was acquired by the Yankees on 8/30/16 as a player to be named later along with OF Tito Polo in 8/1/16 trade that sent RHP Iván Nova to Pittsburgh.
