### STREAKING

The Reds' **5-game winning streak** is their longest of the season...during this streak are hitting **.277** (49-177) with **24 runs scored** (4.80 r/g) and a **1.57 ERA** (46ip, 8er), including a **2.10 ERA** by Reds starters (25.2ip, 6er) and a **0.89 ERA** by the bullpen (20.1ip, 2er).

**TODAY'S GAME:** Is **Game 4** (3-0) of a 4-game series vs **Hannah Burton's Dodgers** and **Game 4** (3-0) of a 7-game West Coast road trip that includes an upcoming visit to SF's **AT&T Park** beginning tomorrow night...following this road trip the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for **7 games** vs the **Cubs** (4g) and **Pirates** (3g), including a day/night DH on **Sat, 5/19**.

**SERIES NOTES:** Regardless of today's outcome, the Reds have **won their first series** vs the Dodgers since a **3-game sweep** at **Great American Ball Park** from **9/6-9/8, 2013**...following that sweep, the Reds had gone **0-6-2** in the **previous 8 series vs LAD**...Cin has won its **first series** at **Dodger Stadium** since a **3-game series sweep** in **June 2011**...since then, the Reds had lost **all 6 series here** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...Thursday's **4-1 Reds win** snapped their **8-game losing streak** to the Dodgers and their **9-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**...in the **previous 6 series** over the **last 3 seasons**, the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...entering this series, Cin had lost **17 of 19 games vs LAD**...this afternoon, the Reds are looking for their **first series sweep** of the Dodgers since **9/6-9/8, 2013** (3g at Cin), their **first series sweep** at **Dodger Stadium** since **6/13-6/15, 2011** (3g) and their **first 4-game series sweep** of LA since **4/14-4/17, 1975** (also at Dodger Stadium)...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

**GIANTS UP NEXT:** The Reds won the first 4 games of the 2017 season series vs SF but lost the last 3 games...the **31 runs scored** in the Reds' 13-3, 14-2 and 4-0 wins from **5/5-5/7** of last season at **Great American Ball Park** was their highest total for any **3-game series** since they scored **32 runs** from **8/19-8/21 vs Ari, 2005**...beginning with the **2008 season** the Reds are **40-27 vs SF** (.597), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50 games) and including **29-19** (.604) over the **last 7 seasons**...**Reds vs Giants** information is on media guide **Page 330**.

**WE LEAVE OUR HEARTS...** Beginning **6/29/12**, including that 2012 season's **National League Division Series**, the Redlegs have won **15** of the last **23** meetings at SF's **AT&T Park**...the Giants' 17-inning, 3-2 win there on **5/12/2016** was the Reds' longest game by inning since a **19-inning**, 5-4 loss on **5/25/2011** at **Phi** and the second-longest game in the history of **AT&T Park** (**5/29/2001**, 1-0 Giants loss vs Diamondbacks in 18 innings)...from **6/26-6/29, 2014**, the Reds outscored the Giants, **20-6**, in the first **4-game series sweep** ever by an opponent at **AT&T Park**.

**FRONT OFFICE NEWS:** Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on Thursday announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to General Manager...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee the organization's entire baseball operations department.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** With a minimum of 35 plate apps with runners in scoring position, **Joey Votto** ranks fifth in the **Major Leagues** and third in the **National League** in **hitting with RISP** at **.417** (15-36)...**Votto** leads all **National League** batters in **on-base percentage with RISP** (.542), second in the majors only to Bal's **Manny Machado** (.553).

**IN A PINCH:** In his **last 5 pinch-hit apps**, **Jesse Winker** walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled...he is the first Reds batter to **reach base safely** in **5 consecutive pinch-hit apps** since **Todd Frazier** did it from **4/20-5/2, 2012** and the first Reds batter to **produce a hit** in **4 straight pinch-hit apps** since **Brayan Pena** from **7/8-8/9, 2014**...**Fred Lewis** was the last Reds batter to **reach base safely** in **6 consecutive pinch-hit plate apps** (**6/13-7/2, 2011**)...**Rick Auerbach** was the last Reds batter with **hits** in **5 straight pinch-hit plate apps** (**8/14-9/13, 1978**)...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

**REHABBING:** RHP **Michael Lorenzen** (right shoulder strain) and RHP **Anthony DeSclafani** (left oblique strain) are scheduled to begin rehabilitation assignments **tomorrow** for Class AA Pensacola...**DeSclafani** will start for the **Blue Wahoos** (4ip, 60-65 pitches), while **Lorenzen** will throw 1.0 inning (20 pitches)...**Lorenzen** on **Thu** threw 1.0 inning (15 pitches) in an extended spring training game at the team's player development complex in **Goodyear**...**DeSclafani** on **Wed** in an extended spring training game in **Goodyear** threw **3.0 innings** (39 pitches) and finished with a **9-pitch bullpen**.

**HOME COOKIN':** In the 9-game homestand completed Wednesday, **Eugenio Suárez** became the first Reds batter to produce **15 RBI** in a homestand since **Jay Bruce** had **15 RBI** in 7 games from **8/8-8/14, 2011**...in his 9 apps vs the **Brewers, Marlins** and **Mets** at **Great American Ball Park**, **Suarez** hit **.313** (10-32, 3 2b, 3hr, .688slg, .395obp).

**25 IN 20:** With a team-high **25 RBI** in his **first 20 apps**, **Eugenio Suárez** tied the franchise record for **most RBI** by a player in his **first 20 games** of a season...he played in his **20th game** on **Tue vs NYM** and produced **4 RBI** to give him **25** on the season...**George Crowe** (1958), **Vada Pinson** (1962) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (2006) each produced **25 RBI** in his **first 20 games** of those respective seasons...courtesy Elias.

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are **10-12** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...later in the year, the team will conduct a thorough managerial search for a permanent replacement...**Price** went **279-387** (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

**7-YEAR ITCH:** The **10-4 Reds victory** on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win** vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...since 1900, he is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at least **5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

# Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Luis Castillo** at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...this afternoon is making his ninth start of the season and his **24th Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **Dodgers**...in Tue's 7-2 win vs NYM, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...left leading, 4-1, but was charged with another run scored off **Amir Garrett**...in the **10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...was charged with 2 more runs scored off **Cody Reed**...in 2017 led National League rookies in ERA and opponents' batting average (.202) while ranking eighth among rookies in strikeouts...the Reds went 7-8 in his 15 starts...with 8 quality starts ranked second on the staff behind **Scott Feldman's** 9 QS...produced all 8 quality starts in his last 12 apps beginning 7/8 (3-6, 2.84), including 6 QS in his last 8 apps beginning 7/30 (2-3, 2.37)...beginning 7/8 and among pitchers with at least 12 starts, his 2.84 ERA ranked seventh in the Major Leagues behind **Corey Kluber** (1.79), **Justin Verlander** (1.92), **Kyle Hendricks** (2.19), **Luis Severino** (2.40), **Jake Arrieta** (2.48) and **Marcus Stroman** (2.73)...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

## RED HOTS

**Sal Romano** at just **24 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tomorrow at SF will make his ninth start of the season and his **25th Major League** appearance and start...will be his **first career appearance** vs the **Giants**...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

# Tuesday at Giants - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...Tue at SF will make his ninth start of the season, the 13th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Giants**...leads the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger**...his career-high **11 strikeouts** on **4/24 vs Atl** are the most by a Reds pitcher this season...leads the staff with **4 quality starts**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scouter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career, then recorded 1 out in the seventh of his next start (4/29 at Min)...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (RHP **Jackson Stephens**, RHP **Zack Weiss**, OF **Phillip Ervin**, OF **Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years, 185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

- Last night produced his first multi-hit game since 4/27 at Min.
- Beginning with the 2016 season is 1 of only 4 Major League players to produce at least 76 doubles, 70 HR and 219 RBI (Manny Machado, Nolan Arenado, Justin Upton).
- Is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 extra-base hits in 3 straight seasons.
- In the ninth inning of Wed's 10-inning, 2-1 win vs NYM entered the game as a defensive replacement in LF, then led off the bottom of the 10th with his first career walkoff HR (off AJ Ramos).
- With Votto off on 4/12 vs StL, started at 1B...was his 35th career appearance at that position and 23rd start...was his second appearance of the season at 1B (4/6 at Pit, played last 2 innings).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award...in 2017, led all Major League outfielders with 15 assists, the most by a Reds outfielder since Pete Rose had 15 assists in 1973.
- Fri at LAD made his 400th career appearance...is approaching 200 career runs (190).

### 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 10-14, 1 2b, 2hr, 6rbi

- Has a 6-game hitting streak, tying his season high and raising his batting average 46 points from .283 to .329 (14-26, .538, 3 2b, 4hr, 10rbi)...is the longest active hitting streak on the team and includes a 2-hit game, two 3-hit games and a 4-hit game.
- Hit safely in 12 of his last 13 starts (25-57, .439, 5 2b, 6hr, 17rbi).
- Is a leading candidate to win his second career National League Player of the Week Award...in 5 apps this week is hitting .591 (13-22, 2 2b, 4hr, 10rbi)...from Tue-Fri, for the first time in his career homered in 4 consecutive games (4hr, 10rbi), 1 shy of the franchise record for consecutive apps with a home run...following his 4-homer game on 6/6/17 vs StL received his first weekly award.
- Played in 39 of the Reds' 40 games, off only on 5/9 vs NYM...from 4/30-5/4 missed 4 starts with inflammation in his right shoulder but pinch hit in each game.
- In the 12-inning, 9-7 win on 4/24 vs Atl produced his third career 2-homer game (off Brandon McCarthy, Max Fried), his first career walkoff HR (2-run off Fried) and a successful suicide squeeze bunt...became the first Major League player to produce in a game a sac bunt and 2 HR, including a walkoff, since LAD's Hee-Seop Choi on 6/20/05 vs Min and the first Reds batter to do it since Reggie Sanders on 5/31/94 vs Montreal.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

### 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 3g, 2gs, 2-9, 1 3b, 1rbi

- Hit safely in 8 of his last 11 apps, raising his batting average from .169 (10-35, .286, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 3rbi).
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, a team-high 22 starts batting ninth and 2 starts batting eighth...has made 12 straight starts batting ninth since he led off on 4/26 vs Atl.
- 6 times this season walked twice, tying his single-game career high...has 24 career 2-walk games, including 6 last season.
- Recorded 4 of his 5 of stolen bases over 4 apps from 4/7-4/10...recorded his most recent stolen base on 4/23 vs Atl...was caught on his most recent attempt (Tue vs Mil).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 248, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- If he reaches 60 stolen bases in 2018 will become the first player in Major League history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first 6 seasons while establishing a career high in each of those 6 years...is tied with Jose Reyes, Cesar Cedeno and Bert Campaneris as the only players to do it in 5 straight years.

### 12 ROSELL HERRERA, inf/of

**Road Trip: 1g as PH, 0-1**

- Name is pronounced row-SELL her-RARE-uh.
- Made 5 of his 8 apps as a pinch hitter (0-5), including each of his last 3 apps (0-3).
- On 5/1 vs Mil made his only start, played 2B...in his first plate appearance singled off Chase Anderson for his only career hit.
- Was promoted from Louisville on 4/26, when 3B Eugenio Suarez came off the 10-day disabled list and OF Phillip Ervin and IF Cliff Pennington were optioned to Louisville.
- In the eighth inning of the 7-4 loss on 4/26 vs Atl made his Major League debut, pinch hit vs Shane Carle and grounded out (4-3)...became the fourth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Tanner Rainey).
- In 15 apps for Louisville hit .311 (5 2b, 2 3b, 3hr, 10rbi, 2sb)...when promoted led the International League in extra-base hits (10) and total bases (37) while ranking second in the IL slugging percentage (.607)...for the Bats played LF (4g), CF (2g), RF (3g), 2B (2g), SS (1g) and 3B (5g).
- As a non-roster invitee to Major League spring training camp hit .267 in 23 apps and 6 starts (1 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 8rbi, 2sb, 7r)...on 3/22 was reassigned to minor league camp...wore uniform #81.

### 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

**Road Trip: 3g, 2gs, 2-11, 1 2b, 1sb**

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- In 12 career apps vs LAD is hitting .432 (19-44, 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- In the eighth and ninth innings Fri at LAD made his first professional apps in RF.
- Among National League shortstops is tied for first in hits and ranks second in hitting.
- Beginning 4/23 has hit safely in 16 of his last 19 apps, including 6 multi-hit games (26-83, .313, 3 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, 3bb, 4sb, 14r).
- Since an 0-for-12 start to the season is hitting .299 (43-144).
- Started at SS in 38 of the Reds' 40 games and has appeared in 39 games.
- In the batting order hit first (5gs, last on 5/8 vs NYM), second (25gs), seventh (6gs) and eighth (2gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit).
- Received consideration for the National League Player of the Week Award for 4/23-4/29, won by teammate Joey Votto...in 7g that week hit .441 with 2 HR and 5 RBI (.618slg, .457obp).

### 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

**Road Trip: 1gs in RF, 1gs in LF, 1-8, 3-run HR**

- In the sixth inning of Sat's 5-3 win at LAD hit a dramatic 3-run HR off J.T. Chargois that gave the Reds a 4-3 lead.
- In 21 apps since he came off the disabled list on 4/20 is hitting .243 (17-70, 3 2b, 3hr, 14rbi).
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- On 4/23 vs Atl made his sixth career start batting leadoff, just his second the last 2 seasons in that spot in the order...in 2017, made his only start batting leadoff on 9/21/17 vs StL.
- Has made 13 starts in RF, 6 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- Made his third straight Opening Day roster.

### 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**Road Trip: 3gs, 2-12, 1rbi**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- In 16 apps since he came off the disabled list on 4/26 is hitting .290, including 5 multi-hit games (18-62, 5 2b, 3hr, 19rbi).
- Hit safely in 5 of his last 6 apps (8-24, .333, 2 2b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when in the fourth inning he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- In the 14-3 loss on 4/6 vs Pit started at 3B but moved to SS in the eighth inning...was his only game at SS since 8/20/17, when he made his only appearance of last season at that position...in his career has made 181 apps and 167 starts at SS.
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**Road Trip: 5-12, 1rbi, 2bb, 3r**

- In 67 career apps vs LAD has hit .336 (82-244, 13hr, 48rbi), including .311 in 31 apps at Dodger Stadium (37-119, 6hr, 19rbi).
- Hit safely in 13 of his last 14 apps at Dodger Stadium (20-54, .370, 3hr, 7rbi), including each of his last 8 games here (11-33, .333, 2hr, 3rbi).
- Beginning 4/15 has reached base safely in 25 of his last 26 apps (28-93, .301, 5 2b, 5hr, 17rbi), including a season-high 16-game on-base streak from 4/15-5/1...his active on-base streak is 9 games (13-35, .371, 3 2b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- From 4/24-4/27 vs the Braves and Twins homered in 4 consecutive apps, a career high and 1 shy of the franchise record.
- In the first inning on 4/16 at Mil singled off Brent Suter for his 1,600th career hit.
- In the first inning on 4/17 at Mil recorded his 1,000th career walk (off Junior Guerra)...is donating to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown the batting helmet he wore for his 1,000th walk.
- Reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history.
- Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,000 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Did not play on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%).
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,469).

### 33 JESSE WINKER, of

**Road Trip: 1gs in LF, 2gs in RF, 3-12, 1 2b, 1rbi**

- Ranks among the National League rookie leaders in every category.
- In 22 apps beginning 4/18 is hitting .276 (21-76), including a career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 that ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- From 4/10-5/6 reached base safely in 22 consecutive apps (21-71, .296, .386obp), the longest on-base streak by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the second-longest active on-base streak in the Major Leagues (Phi's Odubel Herrera, 35g).
- In his last 5 pinch-hit apps walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled.
- Has made 20 starts in RF, 8 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 21 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his first career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
