FISH BITES

Left-hander **Caleb Smith** will be making his second start of the season and first ever against the Phillies in the first game of this three-game series. Marlins are opposing the Phillies in their home opener for the first time since 2012 (a 6-2 win). Have scored 17 runs in 17.2 innings over four starts against today's Phillies starter, RHP Nick Pivetta. Miami went 2-4 on their season-opening homestand vs. the Cubs (2-2) and Boston (0-2). Following this series, the Marlins will return home and open a six-game homestand against the New York Mets and Pittsburgh Pirates on Monday.

TUESDAY'S RECAP

The Marlins battled the Red Sox for 13 innings in a 4-2 loss at Marlins Park. RHP **José Ureña** allowed just four hits and one run over 7.0 innings and tied his career high with seven strikeouts in his first career start against Boston. RF **Cameron Maybin** was 3x4 and tied the game in the bottom of the 11th with an RBI single, plating 3B **Brian Anderson** (1B **Justin Bour** was thrown out at home on the play). Boston, however, scored two in the 13th to come away with the win.

VS. PHILADELPHIA

Miami went 8-11 against the Phillies last season, 3-6 at Citizens Bank Park, 5-5 in Miami. The Marlins are 187-229 all-time against the Phils, dropping each of the last nine season series against Philadelphia (went 10-8 in 2008). All-time in Philadelphia, the Marlins have gone 80-128, including a 54-77 mark at Citizens Bank (26-51 at Veterans Stadium). The team hasn't had a winning record at Citizens Bank since 2009 (7-2).

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

The Marlins today placed OF **Garrett Cooper** on 10-day DL (retro to 4/2) with right wrist contusion, and recalled OF **Braxton Lee** from Triple-A New Orleans. In addition, RHP Severino González and C Austin Nola cleared waivers and were outrighted to New Orleans.

SPRING HAS YET TO SPRING

With temperatures expected around the mid-40s at gametime, here is a look at the coldest temps at the start of a game in Club history: 29 degrees on April 8, 1997 at Wrigley, and 34 on April 10, 2000 at Milwaukee. The coldest-ever start in Philadelphia was 43 degrees on three separate occasions; April 17, 2003, April 7, 2002 and April 5, 2002. - *Stats LLC*

EXTRA BASEBALL

The Marlins have played a total of 67 innings over their first six games of the season - including a 17-inning win on 3/30 vs. the Cubs, a 10-inning loss on 3/31 vs. the Cubs and a 13-inning loss on 4/3 vs. Boston. Marks the most innings played by a team over their first six games since the 1982 Oakland Athletics (70 innings) and the most by a National League squad since the 1968 Houston Astros and New York Mets (69 innings). *See chart at right.*

PUTTING IN WORK

Miami's pitching staff has logged those second-most innings in the Majors, and since 1969, only the 1982 Oakland Athletics tossed more innings over the first six games to begin a season. The '69 Boston Red Sox also recorded 67.0 innings over its first six contests (*Stats LLC*). The Los Angeles Angels lead the Majors in innings pitched with 68.1 over seven games.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER

Through the first six games of the season, Miami's bullpen has worked a Major League-high 35.1 innings, ahead of the Angels (30.1). Marlins relievers rank second in strikeouts (32), behind only the Angels (34).

GOING STREAKING

Marlins rookie third baseman **Brian Anderson** has hit safely in each of his first six games to start the season. His streak is tied with Scott Pose and Marcell Ozuna for the third-longest season-opening hitting streak by a rookie in Franchise history, behind eight-game runs from Hanley Ramirez and Alejandro De Aza (*see chart at bottom right*). In six career games against the Phillies, he has posted a .333 average (7x21).

TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami will have the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. Over the first month plus, the Marlins are facing the Cubs, Boston, Philadelphia, the Mets, Pittsburgh, the Yankees, Milwaukee, the Dodgers, and Colorado in that stretch. However, from May through September, the Marlins have the third-easiest schedule, with opponents combining on a .485 record. - *Stats LLC*

ROSTER ODDS AND ENDS

According to *Elías*, Miami's Opening Day roster was the third-youngest in Baseball, with an average age of 27 years, 351 days. The Phillies featured the youngest OD roster in the Majors, with an average age of 26.334, followed by Cincinnati at 27.196.

- Had 12 players on the OD roster born outside the U.S., most among all NL teams and third most in the Majors (Texas-14, White Sox-13). The Marlins OD roster consisted of players from seven countries and territories outside of the US, tied with Atlanta and Seattle, behind the Dodgers, who had eight.
- Miami came into the 2018 season with 12 players making their first Opening Day roster.
- The Marlins have added 27 new players to the organization via trade acquisition, beginning with the Marlins trading for OF and 2017 Southern League batting champion Braxton Lee from Tampa Bay last June.

TUNING IN

Viewership on FOX Sports Florida of Miami's Opening Day game vs. the Cubs grew by +10% over last year's afternoon opener, and live streaming of Marlins baseball on FOX Sports GO during the opening series was up +40% from last year's average. This spring, Miami drew 58,696 fans to 15 home dates at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium in Jupiter. That surpassed 2017's total (58,449 in 18 home dates), and represented a 20.5% increase per game. FOX Sports Florida saw its average viewership rise 25% over last spring, and grew by +42% among Hispanic households in the South Florida market.

Made first career Opening Day roster after going 0-2 with 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip/11 er) in six Spring outings (two starts). Acquired by Miami this offseason, along with INF Garrett Cooper on November 20, from Yankees.

In first start of season, March 30 vs. Cubs, allowed just one run and four hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over 5.1 innings. Established single-game career highs in innings and strikeouts. Contest went 17 innings, tied for third-longest game by inning in Marlins history.

Is making first career start and appearance against Philadelphia, getting the ball in the opener of this three-game set at Citizens Bank Park.

In fifth professional season, made combined 28 appearances between three levels in Yankees organization, going 9-2 with 3.24 ERA (119.1 ip/43 er). Opened season with one relief appearance for Double-A Trenton, on April 9, allowing one run and three walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings.

Promoted to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on April 13. Entered rotation for RailRiders and went 8-0 with a 2.07 ERA (87.0 ip/20 er) in 16 appearances (15 starts), including a 7.0-inning complete-game shutout on June 18 at Buffalo, allowing just one hit and two walks, with seven strikeouts.

Earned International League Midseason All-Star honors after leading International League starters in average against (.205), ranking second in ERA (2.20), and third in WHIP (1.02) in first half.

Took loss in Triple-A ASG in Tacoma on July 12, allowing four earned runs on five hits over 1.0 inning.

Won five consecutive starts from June 13-July 4, posting 0.91 ERA (29.2/3) and in turn earned first selection to Major League roster on July 16.

Made MLB debut with Yankees on July 17, taking loss in relief (3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

Made first MLB start in second outing, on July 23 at Seattle (ND, 3.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so).

Optioned to Scranton/WB on July 30 after three outings (two starts); would make six more relief appearances for Yankees over course of three more call-ups (August 13-14; Aug. 15-31; September 3-16).

Placed on 10-day disabled list on Sept. 16 for remainder of season with viral infection.

Named to first career Opening Day roster after finishing Spring season with 1-0 record and 4.70 ERA (7.2 ip/4 er) in five appearances (three starts). Was optioned to Triple-A New Orleans on March 16 before being recalled by Miami on March 29.

Making third career start and appearance against Philadelphia with no record and 1.38 ERA (13.0/2). Last faced Phillies on September 12, 2017 at Citizens Bank Park. Allowed two runs on six hits and four walks, with four strikeouts, over 6.0 innings. Made Major League debut against Phillies on September 1 and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with just three hits allowed, three walks and career high eight strikeouts.

Made first start of season on April 1 against Cubs, tossing 6.0 shutout innings. Allowed six hits and walked one, while striking out two.
