RAY MATTER—The Rays have won eight of their last 9 games to improve to a season-high 15 games over .500, their most since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71...this is only the sixth season in franchise history the Rays have ever been as many as 15 games over .500 (2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013), and they made the postseason in four of these previous five seasons...they have outscored opponents, 63-33, over this 9-game stretch and 117-62 over their last 20 games since Aug 19 at BOS, going 17-3 over that span for their best 20-game stretch since since July 6-30, 2013 (17-3).

- + The Rays are two shy of 81 wins, which would be their most under Manager **Kevin Cash**...they are three wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 and would need to go 11-8 or better for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays are 8-1 (.889) in September, tied with the Astros for best in the majors, and 25-11 (.694) since the start of August, best in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Cardinals...they are 30-17 (.638) since the All-Star break, 4th in the majors and 3rd in the AL...they are 75-51 (.595) after a 4-13 start to the season, 5th in the majors.
- + With a Red Sox win or Rays loss tonight, the Rays would officially be eliminated from AL East contention.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays have won 12 consecutive home games since Aug 9, longest streak in franchise history, passing April 22-May 13, 2008 (11)...they have outscored opponents, 82-31, in these 12 games...it is the longest home winning streak since the Indians from June 1-July 5, 2016 (13) and is tied for the 5th-longest in the last 10 seasons.

- + The Rays haven't lost here in over a month, since Aug 8 vs. BAL.
- + The Rays are 45-24 (.652) at home this season, 3rd in the majors behind the Red Sox (49-20, .710) and Yankees (48-24, .667)...since June 11, the Rays are 33-8 (.805) at home, best home winning pct. in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (26-9, .743)...four of these 8 losses came over a 5-game stretch from Aug 3-8 vs. CWS/BAL...through June 10, the Rays were 12-16 (.429) at home.
- + The Rays have 45 wins at home, their most since 2013 (51)...they have clinched a winning record at home for a second consecutive season after going .500 or worse in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- + This current run marks the fourth time this season the Rays have gone on a home winning streak of at least 6 games (12, 8, 6, 6).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 47 games at home: 36 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).
- + This is the second series of a 3-series, 9-game homestand against the Orioles (3-0), Indians (1-0) and Athletics...through 4 games of this homestand, the Rays are outscoring opponents, 38-15, have scored in 15 of 33 innings and hit safely in 19 of 33 innings.

WHERE WE STAND—Last night the Rays gained a half-game on the idle Athletics and Mariners in the AL Wild Card standings...the Rays are 7.5 GB of the A's—if they gain a game on them tonight, it will be the closest they've been to the second Wild Card since they were 6.5 GB of Seattle thru June 1...they have a chance to end the night with a better record than the Mariners for the first time all season...through games of June 16, the Rays were 13.5 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card, a season-high deficit to Seattle.

- + The Rays are on pace for 89 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many games and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + With the Rays chasing the Athletics, fans can purchase Lower

DEFYING THE ODDS—Last night **Ji-Man Choi** hit a walk-off, 2-run homer off **Brad Hand** giving the Rays a 6-5 win...the Rays were down to their final strike before **Tommy Pham** singled to extend the inning and bring Choi to the plate...according to FanGraphs, the Rays had a 4.6 pct. of winning the game with 0-on, 2-out and a 9.7 pct. chance entering Choi's at-bat...it was the first walk-off hit of Choi's career, and it was the 15th home run of his career and his first off a left-handed pitcher...was only the 25th PA of his career against a lefty, and he was 1-for-21 with 2 BB, 7 SO and 1 HBP in the previous 24 PA...the only other time he hit safely off a lefty was May 19 at MIN, a 9th-inning single off **Zach Duke** (with MIL).

- + The Rays won in walk-off fashion for the ninth time, breaking a tie with the A's and Blue Jays for most in the AL, and tied for 3rd in the majors...the nine walk-off wins are more than the previous two seasons combined (7) and are their most since a club-record-tying 13 in 2013...this was their fifth walk-off homer, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Cardinals (7)...it is the 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).
- + Choi's walk-off homer was the third in franchise history hit by a left-handed hitter off a left-handed pitcher...he joined **Jake Bauers** on June 24 vs. NYY and **Gabe Gross** on June 1, 2008 vs. CWS.
- + Last night the Rays recorded 5 hits in the 2nd inning, then 1 hit in the 3rd-8th innings before back-to-back hits in the 9th won the game...Rays batters struck out 16 times, matching July 3 at MIA (16 innings) for their most in a win this season...the last time they won a 9-inning game with 16 SO (or more) was July 30, 2017 at NYY.

OFFENSE EN FUEGO—Over their last 18 games, the Rays have scored 114 runs (6.33 R/G), incl. 5 runs or more 13 times and 8 runs or more six times...they have recorded double-digit hits in 13 of these 18 games...the 114 runs are their most over a 18-game span since April 18-May 7, 2010 (117).

- + Only once over this 18-game stretch have the Rays failed to score at least 3 runs: a 3-0 loss against **Corey Kluber** on Aug 31 at CLE.
- + The Rays rank 2nd in the AL with a .259 avg. and 2nd in the AL with a .331 OBP...both their avg. and on-base pct. has increased 14 points over last season, both the best improvement in the majors.

POWER BALL—The Rays have hit 10 HR in their last 5 games since Wed at TOR, including 6 HR with runner(s) on and 4 HR with 2 runners (or more) on base...the 10 HR in these 5 games matches their total from the previous 14 games combined...the Rays have totaled 132 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 150 HR, which would be 78 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 26 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 29-6 (.823) when hitting multiple homers in a game.

- + Last night **Jake Bauers** hit his first homer since Aug 1 vs. LAA and became only the third Rays player to reach 10 HR this season, following **C.J. Cron** (26) and **Wilson Ramos** (14)...the Rays are the only team in the majors without at least four players with 10 HR.

RAYS vs. INDIANS—This series wraps up a stretch of 6 games between the clubs in a 13-day span...the Rays are 61-94 (.394) all-time against the Indians (34-43 at home, 27-51 on the road), their worst mark against any AL opponent...the Rays are a win away from clinching the season series for the first time since 2013 (4-2, excluding AL Wild Card Game)...the Rays went 2-1 at Progressive Field from Aug 31-Sep 2 to win a second consecutive series there for only the third time in franchise history.

MEDICAL MATTERS—This morning RH **José Mujica** underwent Tommy John surgery to repair the ligament in his right elbow...**Dr. James Andrews** performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla.

MINOR MATTERS—Triple-A Durham announced today that Game 3 and Games 4-5 (if necessary) of the Governors' Cup Finals have been moved to Scranton with the threat of inclement weather due to Hurricane Florence, meaning the entirety of the series will be played in Pennsylvania...the Bulls are attempting to win back-to-back titles, and the rematch of last season's Governors' Cup Finals begins tonight...Class-A Bowling Green made the Midwest League Finals for the first time in franchise history, and their best-of-five series against Peoria begins tomorrow.

LAST START—On Wed at TOR, lasted 0.2 IP, the shortest start of his career, and the shortest by a Ray, excluding openers, since **Chris Archer** (0.0 IP, 2 BF) on Sep 2, 2017 at CWS (injury-shortened)...excluding openers and injury-shortened starts, it was the shortest by a Ray since **J.P. Howell** on July 5, 2007 at BOS (0.2 IP)...yielded 7 runs, tying his career high (3rd time), and allowed eight of his 10 BF to reach base...actually recorded the potential third out of the inning, but the batter reached on a third-strike wild pitch...his line: L, 0.2 IP, 5 H, 7 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 2 WP, 39 pit, 23 str.

SINCE THE TRADE—Is 0-3 with a 5.17 ERA (31.1-IP, 18-ER) and 40 SO in 7 starts with the Rays...pitched to a 3.23 ERA (30.2-IP, 11-ER) in his first 6 starts with the Rays and a 94.50 ERA (0.2-IP, 7-ER) in his last start...has a 3.45 BB/9 IP ratio with the Rays, down from a 5.46 BB/9 IP ratio in 34 apps, all in relief, with the Pirates...min. 25 IP, since Aug 1 his 11.49 SO/9 IP ratio ranks 10th in the majors and 5th in the AL.

- + Has allowed 1 run or fewer in four of his 7 starts with the Rays, but has allowed 5, 3 and 7 runs in his other 3 starts...has yielded 3 hits or fewer in five of his 7 starts with the club and 2 hits or fewer in four of his 7 starts.
- + His max velocity with the Rays is 100.2 mph, in his start on Aug 7 vs. BAL...his max velocity this season is 100.4 mph, in relief on May 24 at CIN (with PIT).
- + Has allowed 17 SB in 22 attempts between the Rays and Pirates this season, and 9 SB in 11 attempts since the trade to the Rays...his 9 SB allowed since then are tied for 2nd in the majors behind NYM **Noah Syndergaard** (15).

STANDING TALL—Is the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by Baseball Reference at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

THE NEW GUY—Was acquired from the Pirates on July 31, along with outfielder **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named, for righthander **Chris Archer**...on Aug 14, the Rays acquired minor league right-handed pitcher **Shane Baz**, the No. 95 prospect in the minors, according to MLB.com, to complete the trade...at the time of the trade, his 72 SO were 3rd among NL relievers to MIL **Josh Hader** (99) and COL **Adam Ottavino** (77), and his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP were most in the majors.

vs. CLEVELAND—Has faced the Indians once in his career, less than two weeks ago on Aug 31 at CLE, and his only run allowed in a career-high 7 IP was a solo homer by **Edwin Encarnacion** in the 7th inning...faced the minimum through 4 IP and did not allow a hit until a 2-out, 5th-inning single (**Melky Cabrera**)...averaged 11.3 pitches per inning, and never threw more than 13 pitches in a frame...became the fifth Rays pitcher (6th time) to lose a start of 7 IP (or more) and 2 hits or fewer, first since **Jake Odorizzi** on May 29, 2016 vs. NYY (7-IP, 1-H, 2-R/ER)...he was the first Rays starter to do this when allowing 1 run or fewer since **James Shields** on Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL (9-IP, 2-H, 1-R/ER)...his line: L, 7 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 79 pit, 56 str.

MAKING THE LEAP—Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons.

- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the Int'l. League.

ON THE CLOCK—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Ray and 2011 All-Star **James Shields** and Indians All-Star **Trevor Bauer** (signed with UCLA).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (18-5, 2.06 ERA)

LAST START—On Fri vs. BAL, both runs allowed came on a 2-run homer by **Joey Rickard**, his 104th and final pitch of his outing...snapped a streak allowing 1 ER or fewer in 14 consecutive home starts, his most allowed here since Sep 6, 2017 vs. MIN (6)...his 104 pitches were his most since July 7 at NYM (112), making 7 starts in between...was the fourth time in his career he recorded at least 9 SO without a walk and third time this season...his line: W, 5.1 IP, 5 H, 2 R/ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR, 104 pit, 72 str.

THE WIN COLUMN—Has won six straight decisions, longest streak of his career and tied with **Ryan Yarbrough**'s current streak for the longest

by a Ray since **Jake Odorizzi** (6) from July 17–Aug 25, 2016...tied the club record by winning a sixth consecutive start (without a ND in between), joining **David Price** from June 25–July 25, 2014, **Matt Moore** (June 20–July 22, 2013, Sep 29, 2012–April 27, 2013) and **Scott Kazmir** (May 10–June 6, 2008)...his 18 wins are tied with CLE **Corey Kluber** for the major league lead and are 3rd in club history behind Price in 2012 (20) and 2010 (19).

vs. CLEVELAND—Is 1-1 with a 1.83 ERA (19.2-IP, 6-R/4-ER) in 3 starts against the Indians, including 2 R/1 ER in 6.2 IP on Sep 1 at CLE...has faced them once at home, yielding 1 R/ER in 6.1 IP on Aug 10, 2017.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Yesterday vs. CLE, hit his first homer since Aug 1 vs. LAA, snapping a 92 AB homerless drought...is 2-for-his-last-21 and 4-for-his-last-57.
- + Batting .142/.265/.277 (20-for-141) with 5 HR and 21 RBI in 44 games (40 starts) since the All-Star break, after .252/.368/.496 in the first half.
- + Since his June 7 recall, ranks among ML rookies in doubles (17, tied for 2nd), RBI (39, 5th), extra-base hits (29, tied for 4th) and walks (47, 2nd).
