MANAGERIAL CAREER: David Bell is in his first season as Reds manager...was named to the position on 10/22/18 as the 63rd manager in franchise history, the 53rd since 1900...David and his father, Buddy, is the fourth father-son duo to serve as Major League managers, joining George & Dick Sisler, Bob & Joel Skinner and Bob & Aaron Boone...Buddy managed the Tigers (1996-1998), Rockies (2000-2002) and Royals (2005-2007)...

David previously spent 4 seasons in the Reds organization's player development department as a manager, at Class AA Carolina from 2009-2011 and at Class AAA Louisville in 2012...following the 2009 campaign, he managed the Peoria Saguaros of the prestigious Arizona Fall League.

FRONT OFFICE/COACHING CAREER: Following his 4-year tenure as a manager in the Reds' minor league system, in 2013 Bell worked for the Cubs as third base coach...the next year, he joined manager Mike Matheny's staff in St. Louis as assistant hitting coach before spending the 2015-2017 seasons as the Cardinals' bench coach...prior to joining the Reds as field manager in October 2018, Bell spent that season as Vice President of Player Development for the Giants.

PLAYING CAREER: The former infielder was selected by the Indians in the seventh round of the June 1990 free agent draft...played in 12 seasons in the Major Leagues with the Indians, Cardinals, Mariners, Giants, Phillies and Brewers...appeared in 35 Postseason games, reaching the American League Championship Series in 2000 and 2001 with the Mariners and the 2002 World Series with the National League Champion Giants...following that run to the World Series in 2002, was named San Francisco's Most Inspirational Player... on 6/28/04 vs Montreal became the first Phillies batter in 9 years to hit for the cycle...his grandfather, Gus Bell, hit for the cycle in 1951...they are the only grandfather and grandson in baseball history to hit for the cycle.

PERSONAL: The Bells are one of Major League Baseball's five 3-generation families, along with the Boones, Colemans, Hairstons and Schofield/Werths...David is the son of former third baseman and current Reds front office executive Buddy Bell and the grandson of Reds Hall of Famer Gus Bell...brothers Mike and Rick Bell also played professional baseball...Mike made 19 appearances for the Reds in 2000...David grew up in Cincinnati and helped lead Moeller High School to the 1989 state baseball championship.

PLAYING CAREER: Over the 2015 and 2016 seasons made 35 Major League apps, all in relief for the Yankees and Reds...was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2009 first-year player draft...in December 2015 was traded to the Reds, along with RHP Rookie Davis, 3B Eric Jagielo and 2B Tony Renda, in exchange for LHP Aroldis Chapman...during the 2016 season made just 23 relief apps for the Reds because of inflammation in his right shoulder and a torn lateral meniscus in his right knee...following a pair of rehabilitation apps in June and July, on 8/2/16 had season-ending microfracture surgery on his knee...in February 2017 was signed by the Mariners to a minor league contract but during spring training voluntarily retired...in a 5-2 Yankees loss at Tex 7/29/15, threw 1.2 scoreless innings in his big league debut (2h, 0bb, 4k)...became only the 11th Yankees pitcher since 1914 to record at least 4 strikeouts in his big league debut and only the sixth Yankee with 4 strikeouts and no runs in his debut.

PLAYING CAREER: The former infielder played in 1,615 games over 13 seasons in the Major Leagues with the Expos, Dodgers, Cardinals, Orioles and Cubs...was Montreal's first-round draft pick in 1987, the 12th overall selection...3 years later made his Major League debut with the Expos and finished second to Atlanta's David Justice in the 1990 National League Rookie of the Year voting of the Baseball Writers' Association of America...finished his Major League career with a .268 batting average...his 463 career stolen bases rank 31st on Major League Baseball's all-time list since 1898, when the current stolen base rule was implemented.

PERSONAL: In 1987 graduated from Seaford (DE) High School, where he was first team All-State in football, baseball and basketball...was voted Delaware's Athlete of the Decade for the 1990s...wife's name is Michelle... they have 5 children: Delino Jr., Diamond, D'Angelo, Denim and Delaney...son Delino Jr. was selected by the Astros in the first round (8th overall) of the June 2010 first-year player draft...in December 2014 he was selected by the Rangers in the Rule 5 Draft and made his Major League debut in 2015...over his 4 Major League seasons, all with the Rangers, Delino Jr. has hit .244 with 82 stolen bases...daughter Diamond was selected by the Chicago Sky in the first round (3rd overall) of the 2018 WNBA Draft...she was a unanimous first team WNBA All-Rookie selection.

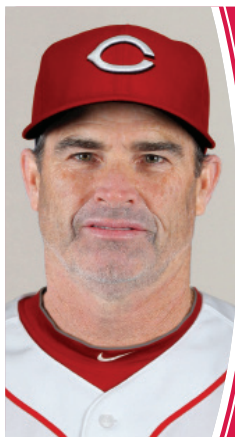
