LEADING OFF: HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!!!
 Angels play the fourth contest (1-2) of an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (May 10-13; 1-2), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20)...**Halos are on Day #6 of playing 29 games in 30 days (off day on May 21)**...Club is now 2-3 in extra-inning games...**LAA is 7-4 this month to move one game behind Astros in A.L. West (after 39 games in 2017, LAA trailed Houston by eight games)**...Halos are 10-13 since a club-record 13-3 start...**LAA holds an MLB-best 14-4 road record, best 18-game away start season in club history**...Halos are 8-3-1 in 12 series completed...Next road trip is an 11-day, 10-game swing to **Toronto** (May 22-24), **New York Yankees** (May 25-27) and **Detroit** (May 28-31).



ON THE LINE TODAY: Shohei Ohtani needs six strikeouts today to match Angels' record of 38 strikeouts through a player's first six career games - held by **Bo Belinsky** (1962)...Is 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (19 IP – 5 ER) and 24 strikeouts in day games (3 GS).

HEY GUYS, OVER HERE: LAA went 1-for-10 with RISP last night...Club stranded 16 runners, most since August 9, 2014 vs. Boston (19 innings).

MOVIN' ON UPTON: Justin Upton homered in a career-best four straight games (May 8-11) and has HRs in five of his last seven games (six HRs last 10 contests)...Has hits in 11 of last 12 games (.333; 17/51) with 17 RBI (currently riding seven-game hit streak)...**Leads Majors with 17 RBI this month.**

HERE'S WHAT'S LEFT: Upton is the first Angel **left fielder** with 10+ HRs since **Josh Hamilton** (21) in 2013.

MORE THAN GLOVE: Andrelton Simmons has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games, reaching base safely in 19 straight...Reached base safely in 36-of-last-77 PA (.468 OBP) and is hitting .397 (27/68) with two home runs, seven doubles, two triples and 15 RBI...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 17.2 (155/9) and ranks second in A.L. batting .345.**

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Shohei Ohtani has a hit in 15 of 17 of his starts at DH and is batting .471 (8 for 17) in his last six contests...His five home runs are tied for A.L. lead among **rookies (Tyler Austin)**...Has registered a quality start in three of five outings on the mound...Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April...Became just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...Tied club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...**As a DH, batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS**...In four starts, **went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.**

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- *Has matched Stan Musial and Alex Rodriguez as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.*
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).

CLOSE TO COBB: Albert Pujols enters tonight's game with 1,939 career RBI to rank ninth all-time...Next up on the all-time list is **Ty Cobb** with 1,944 RBI (*source Baseball Reference*).

MORE ON ALBERT: Pujols connected for his 628th career two-bagger Thursday (11th all-time) to move within four of Top 10 all-time (**David Ortiz**, 632).

WALK IN THE PARK: Mike Trout logged his second career four-walk game last night (also May 1 vs. BAL)...Just third Angel to record multiple four-walk games in a season (**Fred Lynn** in 1984 and **Chris Iannetta** in 2013)...**Trout has 21 walks across his last 19 games**...With his 600th walk May 8, became 5th player with 600 walks/200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining **Mickey Mantle, Eddie Mathews, Mel Ott & Jimmie Foxx**.

MUY BIEN! Martin Maldonado is hitting .545 (12/22) this month after a .156 clip in March/April...Has collected three 3-hit games his last six games and already has five 3-hit games in 2018 - **first Angels catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009.**

FLYIN' FISH: Mike Trout's HR May 2nd was hit 116.8 mph; **Angels' hardest HR hit since Statcast started tracking in 2015**...Has a long ball in nine of 12 completed series this season...**9 HRs in April equaled club record set by Albert Pujols (2014) & Brian Downing (1987).**

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout scored his 700th career run on April 8th...Eight players have hit 200 HRs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season: **Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx**...Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign - Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).**

THIS N' THAT: Angel pitchers have surrendered just seven HRs this month, **second-fewest in MLB to Houston (5)**. **Albert Pujols** currently has an eight game streak; in that span, is batting .303 (10/33) with four doubles, one HR and seven RBI...LAA pitchers have 18 games this season with 10+ SO (franchise record through first 38 games of season)...**Halos' average home attendance of 38,872 leads A.L.**...Club boasts seven sellouts already...**LAA has committed just 15 errors thru 39 games (second fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .990 fielding pct.**...Halos hurlers have issued 150 free passes, **second-most in A.L.**...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 161.1 IP to rank 2nd in MLB (average 4.1 IP per game).**

Park**...**Albert Pujols' 57 HRs are most by any player all-time vs. Houston (regular season).**

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

May 13

(2007) **Gary Matthews Jr.** connects for home runs from each side of the plate at Texas with two-run shots in the first inning (left-handed) and fifth innings (right handed).

May 14

(2004) **Chone Figgins** enjoyed one of the best offensive performances in Angels' history, going 5-for-6 with a triple, a grand slam (his first ML HR) and six RBI...Figgins would also drive in the game winning run in the 10th inning in the 10-9 win at Baltimore...He is one of two Angels who's first ML HR was a grand slam (**Buck Rogers** in 1961) and just the fourth Angel to collect five hits and six RBI in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

3-1, 4.10 ERA

Leads A.L. rookies with 32 strikeouts this season

- **WELCOME TO THE SHO:** Making sixth start as a pitcher and third at home...Made Major League debut with Angels on Opening Day (March 29 at Oakland) as the starting designated hitter and made pitching debut April 1 at OAK...Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017 and had contract selected by Angels on March 27.
- **ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:** Was named the American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 innings pitched and also batting .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...Became the fifth Angels player to win the award, joining **Robb Quinlan** (July 2004), **Mike Trout** (May, June, July & Aug. 2012), **Matt Shoemaker** (Aug. 2014) and **Andrew Heaney** (July 2015)...He also joined **Babe Ruth** (June 1919) and **Walter Johnson** (July 1918) as the only players in the last 100 years (min. 40 PA) with multiple wins and a batting average of at least .359 in a calendar month. (STATS LLC)
- **ON THE LINE TODAY:** Needs six strikeouts today to match Angels record of 38 strikeouts through a player's first six career games as a pitcher; the mark is currently held by **Bo Belinsky** (1962).
- **LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Earned the win in last start on May 6 at Seattle after tossing 6+ innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts; carried a shutout into the 7th inning before allowing a two-run home run to **Ryon Healey**...Has registered a quality start in three of five outings on the mound this season.
- **GOOD DAY:** Is 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (19 IP – 5 ER) and 24 strikeouts in day games this season (3 GS) compared with a 0-1 record and 8.59 ERA (7.1 IP – 7 ER) and eight strikeouts in night games (2 GS).
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** First career pitching appearance vs. Minnesota...In two games vs. Twins as a DH, batted .375 (3/8) with one double, one HR and two RBI.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Today marks third start as a pitcher at The Big A...Is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9 IP – 3 ER) with three walks and 13 strikeouts across the two home outings...Allowed three runs in just two innings of work in last appearance on the mound at Angel Stadium.
- **HISTORIC HOME DEBUT:** Earned the win on April 8 vs. A's at Angel Stadium after tossing seven scoreless innings and allowing one hit and one walk with 12 strikeouts...*Retired each of his first 19 batters faced*...Became third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (**Steve Woodard**, MIL in 1997 and **Juan Marichal**, SF in 1960)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since **Jim Shaw** for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).
- **PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** On April 9, was named by Major League Baseball as the American League Player of the Week...In addition to tossing seven shutout innings with one hit allowed and 12 strikeouts in his start, also slashed .462/.500/1.154 with four runs scored, six hits, three home runs and seven RBI as a hitter.
- **NEARLY PERFECT:** After allowing HR to Matt Chapman in first start of year (April 1 at OAK), retired 35 of 38 batters faced (one hit & two walks) from 2nd inning on April 1 through the end of his second start on April 8...**Had a stretch of 27 consecutive batters retired** between 4th inning of first start and 7th inning of second start.
- **SWING AND A MISS:** 30 of 32 strikeouts this season have come on a swinging strike three ...The 94% strikeout swinging rate is tops in the A.L. (min. 20 IP).
- **ROOKIE LEADER:** Leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (32) and ranks second in wins (3) and opponent batting average (min. 20 IP) (.213)...As a hitter (min. 20 PA), ranks tied for first among A.L. rookies in HR (5) and RBI (16), and leads all A.L. rookies in batting average (.348) & OPS (1.044).
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** Ranks second in Majors this season (min. 20 IP) with an average fastball velocity of 97.3 MPH, behind only Yankees' **Luis Severino** (97.8 MPH)...*On April 27, Ohtani homered on a 97.2 MPH fastball from Severino.*
- **PITCHING DEBUT:** Earned the win in first career start on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum after working six innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts; all three runs allowed came on three-run HR by **Matt Chapman** in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced...Became second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' **Masato Yoshii** (4/5/98 vs. PIT)...Yoshii was Ohtani's pitching coach the last two seasons with the Nippon-Ham Fighters.
- **THE BABE AND I:** With his start on April 1 in Oakland, become first player to *start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher* within his team's first 10 games since **Babe Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC)...Last week, Ohtani became the first A.L. player to homer in 3 straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Ruth**, who did it in five seasons (1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1930). (STATS LLC)
- **TWO WAY COMPANY:** Ohtani is the third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (**Ken Brett** in 1973 and **Babe Ruth** in 1916)...The last time any player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher at any point within the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).
- **TOPPING THE RANKINGS:** Enters 2018 ranked by *MLB.com* as the #1 prospect in all of baseball...Is rated as top Angels prospect by *Baseball America* and #2 overall in baseball.
- **HALOS FROM JAPAN:** This season, joins **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only two Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.
- **AT THE PLATE:** For additional batting notes, please see Ohtani's section in the Angels hitters section of the game notes.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made five starts as a pitcher in 2017 for Nippon-Ham Fighters of Japanese Pacific League, and went 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (25.1 IP - 9 ER) with 29 strikeouts...Was limited to five games pitching last season, due to an ankle injury...In his 65 games as a batter, hit .332 with 16 doubles, eight home runs and 31 RBI.

CAREER NOTES:

- In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
- Earned a "Best Nine Award" as a pitcher for the Fighters in 2015 & 2016 after leading the Pacific League in ERA each season (2.24 in 2015 & 1.86 in 2016)...
- In 2016, was named Pacific League MVP...In 21 games (20 starts) as a pitcher, went 10-4 with a 1.86 ERA (140 IP - 29 ER) with 174 strikeouts...Also appeared in 104 games as a hitter and batted .322 with 18 doubles, 22 HR and 67 RBI.
- Native of Ōshū, Japan...Made Pacific League debut with Fighters at age 18.

- Charged with first blown save last Saturday at Seattle after allowing all three batters faced to score...Yielded go-ahead HR to Mike Zunino in 8th inning.
- Opened career with 6.1 shutout frames across first six outings for Angels.
- Made Major League debut April 23 in hometown of Houston...Recorded first career strikeout vs. **Carlos Correa** with two on and two out in the 8th inning.
- In six total minor league games between Double-A Mobile and Triple-A Salt Lake, has worked 8.2 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts.
- Opened the year with Mobile and pitched in three games before being promoted to Salt Lake on April 14.
