HOME!

- The Colorado Rockies continue their seven-game homestand with the rubber match of a three-game set vs. Pittsburgh ... host the Los Angeles Dodgers for four games beginning tomorrow.
- Beginning Thursday, the Rockies will play 30 of their final 48 games vs. National League West opponents, including 10 vs. the Dodgers and seven against Arizona.
- Colorado is an stretch of 17 consecutive games before the next off day on Monday in Houston.

ABERRATION

- Colorado gave up 10 runs last night, the first time allowing 10 or more since July 20 at Arizona ... it was the first time an opponent reached double digits at home since the New York Mets plated 12 runs on June 18.

WENT BLANK

- The Rockies recorded their seventh shutout win of the season Monday, their fourth at Coors Field.
- Held the Pirates to two hits on Monday, the second time in the previous five home games that the Rockies allowed two or fewer hits (one hit, July 25 vs. Houston) ... it is the second time in franchise history that they limited a visiting opponent to two or fewer hits twice in the same season.

A LITTLE MORE THAN A FLASH

- The Rockies have gone 22-11 since June 28 (.667), the third-best winning percentage in MLB and the best winning percentage in the National League.
- Since June 28, the Rockies have posted a 3.55 team ERA (294.1 IP, 116 ER), the third-lowest ERA in the NL.
- Rockies starters have a 3.37 ERA (200.1 IP, 75 ER) over that span, the fourth-lowest in MLB and second-lowest mark in the NL.
- The 647.2 innings pitched by the Colorado starters this season are the third-most in the NL.

BEGIN AGAIN

- Prior to Tuesday, Colorado had held their opponents to two or fewer runs in five consecutive home games from July 25-Aug. 6, tying for the longest such streak in franchise history (also: July 30-Aug. 11, 2006) ... since July 2, have held opponents to one run or fewer seven times at home, two runs or fewer in 11 games.
- Last night (4.2 innings, 9 runs) was the first time a Rockies starter had allowed more than three runs in a home start since June 24 vs. Miami.

THE MOUNTAINS WIN AGAIN

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended June 18, the Rockies have gone 17-5 at Coors Field, including 13-3 since July 2.
- The Rockies have posted a 2.73 team ERA (145.0 IP, 44 ER) in 16 home games since July 2, including a 2.31 ERA (101.1 IP, 26 ER) by the starting pitchers ... the 1.71 ERA (89.2 IP, 17 ER) posted by the starters in July was the best at home in a single month in franchise history.
- Held opponents to one run or fewer in six games at home in July, two runs or fewer in 10 ... the six games in which they held opponents to one

or fewer runs is a franchise record for a calendar month (previous: five in July of 2006).

PEDAL DOWN

- After today, of the 15 series remaining in the Rockies' season, all but two are against teams currently at or above .500 (San Diego, Los Angeles-AL).

YO HO HO

- Colorado concludes the season series against the Pirates today ... took two of three in Pittsburgh, April 16-18.
- A win today would give the Rockies their first winning season series against the Bucs since going 4-2 in 2013.
- The Rockies are 99-103 all-time vs. the Pirates, including 55-43 in Denver ... since 2014, the Rockies have gone 11-20 vs. the Pirates, 6-10 at Coors Field.
- Colorado went 1-11 against Pittsburgh from July 27, 2014 through May 20, 2016, including a seven-game losing streak Sept. 21, 2015-April 27, 2016 ... dropped eight straight at home from July 27, 2014 through April 27, 2016.

HOMETOWN KID

- Kyle Freeland's 3.04 ERA (139.0 IP, 47 ER) is the seventh-lowest in the National League and ranks third in MLB (first in the NL) among left-handed starting pitchers ... his 2.18 ERA (62.0 IP, 15 ER) at Coors Field is the fourth-lowest home ERA in the NL.
- Recorded his fourth career game of seven or more shutout innings at Coors Field on Monday vs. Pittsburgh and his second career game in which he went at least seven innings and allowed two or fewer hits ... in 26 career starts at Coors Field, has a 3.08 ERA (146.0 IP, 50 ER).

HERE'S JONNY

- Jon Gray is 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (29.2 IP, 5 ER) in four starts since his July 14 recall from Triple-A Albuquerque ... has pitched 7.0 or more innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in each of his four starts, the first Rockies player to have that long of a streak since Ubaldo Jimenez had a seven-start streak in 2010.

1,000

- Last night Charlie Blackmon became the seventh Rockie to reach 1,000 hits in a Colorado uniform ... he joins Todd Helton (2,519), Larry Walker (1,361), Carlos González (1,295), Dante Bichette (1,278), Vinny Castilla (1,206) and Troy Tulowitzki (1,165) as the only Rockies to reach the mark.

TOLD YOU

- Ian Desmond has batted .293 (51-for-174) with a .366 on-base percentage in his last 48 games since June 10 ... since July 1, has posted a .287 batting average (31-for-108) while reaching base in 24 of 29 games ... had his career-high tying 19-game on-base streak snapped Sunday.

SWEET SWINGIN' LEFTY

- Carlos González has batted .325 (69-for-212) since May 27, the seventh-highest batting average in the NL ... ranks tied for fourth in the NL in runs (45) and is fifth in doubles (19) over that span.
- Is hitting .290 (29-for-100) vs. left-handed pitching this season, including .339 (21-for-62) since May 27 ... since July 2, is 12-for-29 (.414) with three home runs vs. left-handed pitching.

STO SHOW

- Trevor Story ranks third in the NL in extra-base hits (58), is tied for third in total bases (234), tied for fourth in RBI (79), is sixth in slugging percentage (.481) and is tied for seventh in home runs (24).
- Since June 2, Story ranks second in the NL with a .338 batting average (73-for-216) and fourth with a .620 slugging percentage.

SANDBLASTER

- Nolan Arenado is currently second in the NL with 29 home runs and ranks third with 81 RBI ... his .306 batting average ranks seventh in the league.

MAKE YOUR MARQUE

- 23-year-old right-hander was a member of his second career Opening Day roster in 2018 ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
Made his Major League debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
Named to the Topps All-Star Rookie Team last year, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
Pronounced HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z

COAST GUARD

- Has won all three of his career starts against the Pittsburgh Pirates, allowing five runs across 18 innings pitched (2.50 ERA) ... has allowed nine hits with five walks and 17 strikeouts.
Won at PNC Park on April 16, a 6-2 Rockies win ... pitched six innings and allowed two runs on two hits with two strikeouts.
Has faced the Pirates once at Coors Field, July 22, 2017, a 7-3 Rockies win ... pitched seven innings and allowed two runs on three hits with two walks and nine strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT

- Did not factor into the Rockies 5-3 walk-off loss at Milwaukee last Friday ... pitched seven innings and allowed two runs on three hits with two walks and a season-high tying nine strikeouts ... left with a 3-2 lead.

STREAKING THROUGH THE QUAD

- His career-best four-game winning streak since June 30 is tied fourth-longest active string in the National League ... hasn't lost since June 24 at home vs. Miami ... over that span since June 30, ranks among NL leaders in wins (4-T3), ERA (2.95-14th), opponents' batting average against (.194-T5) and strikeouts (45-T4).

HOME AND AWAY

- Has a 6.63 home ERA (55.2 IP, 41 ER) compared to a 3.09 road mark (67.0 IP, 23 ER) ... 12 home runs allowed in Denver, eight on the road.

ROAD WARRIOR

- Has not lost on the road since June 14 at Philadelphia, going 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA (26.0 IP, 9 ER) his past four starts.
His 3.09 road ERA (67.0 IP, 23 ER) this year ranks eighth in the NL ... is tied for eighth in the NL with five road wins ... his .206 (51-for-248) opponents' batting average against is fourth in the league.
Rockies have won seven of his 11 road starts this year ... has made seven of his 10 quality starts on the road ... worked five or more innings in every road game, including six or more frames eight times.
In 28 career starts on the road, is 10-8 with a 3.94 ERA (153.0 IP, 67 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA).

COORS HEAVY

- Is 4-5 with a 6.63 ERA (55.2 IP, 41 ER), 24 walks and 58 strikeouts in 11 starts at home this season.
In 27 career appearances, 26 starts, at Coors Field, is 11-8 with a 5.17 ERA (148.0 IP, 85 ER) ... Rockies are 16-11 when he starts at home.
Has won three of his past four starts in Denver since June 19 (5.09 ERA, 23.0 IP, 13 ER) ... is 4-6 with a 6.38 ERA (67.2 IP, 48 ER) in his past 13 starts at home since Sept. 3, 2017 with the Rockies 5-8.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Allowed 25 of his 69 runs in the first inning (second-most are 10 in the third and fifth) ... given up a run in the first inning in 14 of his 22 starts, including eight of his 11 home starts ... opponents are batting .347 (34-for-98) with six of his 20 home runs allowed in the first.

SILVER SLUGGER

- His .350 (14-for-40) batting average leads all Major League pitchers ... also leads the Majors with 14 hits and a .425 slugging percentage ... tied for third with five RBI.
Is 8-for-17 (.471) over his past seven games with three multi-hit games ... had a season-high tying three-game hit streak from June 30-July 20 (also: April 11-22).

LIKE CHRISTMAS IN JULY

- Went 3-0 with a 3.65 ERA (24.2 IP, 10 ER) in four July starts ... tied for sixth in the NL in wins during the month ... in nine career starts in July, is 7-0 with a 3.57 ERA (58.0 IP, 23 ER) ... made five starts in July 2017, went 4-0 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP, 13 ER).

DEEP SIX

- Allowed six or fewer hits 15 times this year, including nine times on the road ... is 7-0 when allowing five hits or fewer, including three times in July ... five hits or fewer 10 times (7-0, 1.72 ERA).

A DENVER OPENER

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to an 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP TYLER ANDERSON (6-4, 4.05)

Left-hander lost his last start, Aug. 4 at Milwaukee, his first loss since June 23 ... allowed seven runs on seven hits, including a career-high tying three home runs, in four innings pitched ... Is 2-1 with a 2.98 ERA (45.1 IP, 15 ER) over his past seven starts since June 29 ... opponents have hit .172 over that span ... Rockies are 3-4 those seven games, scoring a combined 16 runs while he is in the game ... has gone 2-3 with a 3.65 ERA (66.2 IP, 27 ER) in 11 starts at home this year ... is 1-0 with a 1.32 ERA (27.1 IP, 4 ER) over his last four starts at home ... has a 3.50 ERA (185.0 IP, 72 ER) in 30 career starts at Coors Field, the lowest ERA at Coors Field in franchise history (min. 30 games started) ... has faced the Dodgers twice this year, going 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 IP, 5 ER) ... allowed five runs over five innings at Coors Field on June 1 ... is 3-3 with a 4.09 ERA (50.2 IP, 23 ER) in nine career starts vs. the Dodgers ... in five starts vs. LAD at home, has gone 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA (29.0 IP, 15 ER).

 • Ranks fifth among position players in the NL with 4.6 WAR, third with a 4.3 offensive WAR (Baseball Reference).
 • His .335 career batting average with RISP is second-highest among active MLB players and fourth in the Majors since 1974 behind Tony Gwynn and Rod Carew (STATS).
 • Tied for first in the NL with 23 go-ahead RBI and leads the Majors with 116 go-ahead RBI since 2015.

 • Recorded his 1,000th career hit last night, making him the seventh player in franchise history to achieve 1,000 as a member of the Rockies.
 • Leads the NL with 83 runs scored ... tied for third with 14 road home runs.
 • Had his 13-game hitting streak snapped Wednesday, his longest hitting streak this season and tied for the longest on the Rockies in 2018 ... has 13 career hitting streaks of 10 or more games, tied for third in club history.
