PITTSBURGH PIRATES (71-73) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (81-64)

September 12, 2018 at Busch Stadium, St. Louis, MO --- GAME #145/ROAD #71

RHP JAMESON TAILLON (12-9, 3.40 ERA) vs. RHP DANIEL PONCEDELEON (0-1, 2.67 ERA)

THE PIRATES... have lost each of their last two games after winning their previous five games from 9/3-8...Have gone 18-24 in their last 42 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced a 31-26 record since July 7 and have gone 35-32 in their last 67 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 67-77 after 144 games in 2017 (68-77 after 145).

A SHOT OF JAMESON: Jameson Taillon has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last 18 starts...He is one of just three pitchers in MLB this season to make at least 18 straight starts while allowing three earned runs or less...The other two pitchers to accomplish that this year are New York's Jacob deGrom (26 straight) and Tampa Bay's Ryne Stanek (25 straight)...The last Bucco hurler to be charged with three earned runs or fewer in 18 straight starts in the same season was **Jeff Karstens** in 2011 (18)...Prior to Karstens, the last Pirate to make more than 18 straight starts of allowing three earned runs or less in a single season was **Bob Friend**, who did so in a Pirates single-season record 23 straight starts in 1963...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

NOTES ON JAMO: In his last 10 starts, Jameson Taillon has surrendered a total of 17 runs in 64.0 innings of work while winning seven-of-nine decisions...Dating back to June 1, Taillon has produced a 2.79 ERA (106.1ip/33er), which ranks ninth in the National League...Jameson is 12-1 this season when he has received three runs of support or more when he is in the game...He is tied with **Trevor Williams** for the team lead with 12 wins apiece...The last time Pittsburgh had at least two pitchers win 12 games was 2012 (**A.J. Burnett** had 16 and **Kevin Correia** and **James McDonald** won 12 games apiece).

THIS AND THAT: Jameson Taillon is 7-2 with a 2.45 ERA (66.0ip/18er) in his last 10 starts on the road...In his last road outing on August 31 in Atlanta, he allowed two runs over 7.0 innings while winning a 3-2 decision...Taillon has recorded a National League-leading two complete games this year along with Washington's Max Scherzer and Atlanta's Mike Foltynewicz...He picked up his second complete game in his start at Coors Field in Colorado on August 7.

WHAT'S BREWING: Friday night the Pirates will begin a stretch of playing the Brewers six times over a nine-game stretch...Pittsburgh's 9-4 record against the Crew is the best by any team in MLB this year...The Bucs have posted a 2.96 ERA (121.2ip/40er), including two shutouts, this season against Milwaukee...The Pirates have outscored the Brewers 68-42 on the season.

UNTIL WE MEET AGAIN: This afternoon the Bucs and Cards play each other for the final time in 2018...The next time the two teams face each other will be on April 1 at PNC Park in Pittsburgh's Home Opener...It will mark the second time in four seasons and third time in PNC Park history Pittsburgh will face the Cardinals in its Home Opener.

GET IN THE GAME: Tuesday night **Ryan Lavarney** and **Nick Burdi** became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game this season for Pittsburgh...The 47 players used are tied with St. Louis for the fifth-fewest among all teams in MLB this season (the Astros have had a league-low 40 players appear in a game)...Last year the Pirates also had 47 players appear in a game.

THIS MONTH: The Pirates are batting .264 this month, which ranks fifth in all of MLB...The only four teams with a higher batting average this month are the Rays (.289), Rockies (.287), Reds (.268) and Tigers (.265)...Individually, **Adam Frazier** leads the team with a .343 average this month.

SELECT COMPANY: With 19 home runs and 30 stolen bases, **Starling Marte** is one homer shy of becoming just the third player in team history to produce at least 20 home runs and 30 steals in the same season...**Barry Bonds** accomplished the feat four times (1987, 1990-92) and **Andy Van Slyke** did it twice (1987-88).

BELL OF LATE: **Josh Bell** has gone 7-for-14 with two doubles, two home runs and four RBI overall in his last four games, including a 2-for-4 performance Tuesday night...Bell has now recorded an extra base hit in four straight games for the second time this season (also from August 9-12).

SAVING THE DAY: All-Star closer **Felipe Vázquez** has converted each of his last 21 save opportunities, which is tied with Kenley Jansen for the longest streak in the National League this season...Vázquez is one of eight pitchers - and the only lefthander - to earn 31 or more saves in a single season with the Pirates...His 52 saves in a Pittsburgh uniform rank 10th all time (since saves became official in 1969); **Bill Landrum** is ninth on the list with 56.

CAPTAIN RED BEARD: **Colin Moran** enters today's action ranked fourth among all rookies in the Majors with 107 hits...Tuesday night Moran made his 100th start of the season at third base...Prior to Moran, the last Pirate rookie to make at least 100 starts at the hot corner was **Richie Hebner** in 1969 (120).

FRAZIER EN FUEGO: **Adam Frazier** is hitting .344 (44-for-128) with 16 doubles, five home runs and 22 RBI in 39 games since being recalled on July 25...Since July 25, his .344 average ranks sixth in all of MLB, trailing only Justin Turner (.374), Ben Zobrist (.354), Paul Goldschmidt (.350), J.D. Martinez (.348) and Malle Smith (.347)...Frazier has hit safely in six of his last seven games coming into today's action, going 11-for-27 (.407) with four doubles, a home run and five RBI.

September 12, 1979: The Pirates shut out the St. Louis Cardinals 2-0 at Three Rivers Stadium behind John Candelaria's 8.1 shutout innings. Bill Madlock singled, stole second and scored on Ed Ott's single in the second inning. Ott later tripled in the fifth and scored on Phil Garner's RBI single to give the Pirates their 2-0 lead. Kent Tekulve secured his 27th save of the season.

CHRIS ARCHER: The 29-year-old righthander will be making his 25th start of the season and his eighth with the Pirates Friday night against the Brewers at Miller Park...Allowed three runs in 6.0 innings but had a no-decision in his last start Friday night vs. Miami at PNC Park in a 5-3 comeback win; he also doubled in his second at bat for his first career extra base hit...Is 0-1 in his last five starts since picking up his first win with the Pirates on 8/8 at Colorado (5.0ip/2er)...Was acquired from Tampa Bay on 7/31...Went 3-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 17 starts with the Rays, posting a 2.70 ERA (43.1ip/13er) in his last eight.

vs. MILWAUKEE: 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0ip/7er) in two career starts... He allowed six runs in 4.0 innings and lost a 7-4 decision against Chase Anderson on 8/26 at Miller Park...He also won a 2-1 decision over Jimmy Nelson while pitching for the Rays at Tropicana Field last year on 8/6 (6.0ip/3h/1r/1er/2bb/7so).
