2016 SUMMARY

- Spent entire season with Triple-A Syracuse in Washington's system, batting .253 (57x225) in 62 games.
- Best month was July, when he batted .304 (24x79) in 22 games, with 12 runs scored, two doubles, and a triple.
- Had four consecutive multi-hit games from July 7-10, going 9x17 (.529); also had longest hitting streak of the season that month, a seven-game run from July 21-30 (.435/10x23).

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Began 2015 with Triple-A Indianapolis before being recalled by the Pirates on May 6; went 0x4 over six games before being optioned to Indianapolis on May 16.
- Recalled by Pittsburgh on June 28, going 0x6 in six games before being designated for assignment on July 23 and outrighted to Indianapolis on July 27.
- Made Baltimore's 2014 Opening Day roster and hit safely in each of his first four games.
- Recorded seven multi-hit games in 20 outings for the O's.
- Optioned to Triple-A Norfolk on May 1, recalled by Baltimore on May 24, and optioned back to Norfolk on May 25, for remainder of season.
- Played second full season in Majors in 2013 with Washington, appearing in 48 games (38 starts) at second base, 23 (20) in left field and four (two) at third base.
- Batted .273 (21x77) from the right side of the plate and .254 (54x213) from the left side.
- Hit .293 (39x133) at Nationals Park, compared to a .229 (36x157) on the road.
- Went 13x44 (.295) as a pinch-hitter; ranked second in the Majors in pinch hits.
- Recorded three straight multi-hit efforts from April 15-17 at Miami (.429/6x14).
- Connected on his first career pinch-hit home run on August 30 vs. New York-NL (off Dillon Gee).
- Spent his first full season at Major League level in 2012 with Washington, making his first career Opening Day roster.
- Ranked eighth among National League rookies in hits (105), 10th in total bases (136) and tied for 10th in runs scored (40).
- Appeared in 51 games (43 starts) at second base, 41 (29) in left field, 13 (10) at third base and one at shortstop.
- Batted .287 (84x293) with three home runs and 21 RBI vs. right-handers, .293 (24x82) with RISP, and .600 (6x10) with the bases loaded.
- Recorded a career-high four hits on April 16 vs. Houston, August 10 at Arizona, and Aug. 15 at San Francisco.
- Hit first career home run on June 3 vs. Atlanta, a solo shot off Tommy Hanson.

- Compiled a career-high 13-game hitting streak from June 29 to July 20, batting .340 (18x53) during that span.
- Went 1x3 (.333) in three games of the NLDS vs. St. Louis.
- Had contract selected by Washington on September 6, 2011 and made Major League debut that night as a pinch-hitter.
- Made first Major League start (second base) on Sept. 8 vs. the Dodgers.
- Recorded first career hit and RBI on Sept. 12 at New York-NL, a game-winning single off R.A. Dickey in the seventh inning.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2015 with Triple-A Indianapolis, hit .282 (100x355) in 97 games, with 15 doubles, 37 RBI, and 14 steals.
- Opened the season batting .375 (27x72) in 20 games in April; also topped .300 for a month with a .302 (26x86) mark in June.
- Batted .336 (42x125) against left-handers, compared to .252



(58x230) vs. right-handers.

- Spent majority of **2014** with Triple-A Norfolk after opening season with Baltimore (20 games).
- Optioned to Norfolk on May 1; recalled by Orioles briefly from May 24-25 before being optioned back to Tides for remainder of season.
- Was named Washington's Minor League Player of the Year in **2011** after hitting a combined .309 (172x556) with 25 doubles, nine triples, eight home runs, 52 RBI and 30 stolen bases between Double-A Harrisburg and Triple-A Syracuse.
- Named a Rawlings Minor League Gold Glove winner at second base.
- Earned Eastern League Player of the Week honors for June 6-12, hitting .538 (14x26).
- Promoted to Triple-A Syracuse and made debut on June 21.
- Opened stint with Chiefs with an 11-game hitting streak (.431/22x51), including seven multi-hit games, four doubles, and three RBI.
- Matched that hitting streak from Aug. 1-12, batting .358 (19x53) with two doubles, two triples, a homer, and six RBI.
- In **2010**, combined to hit .294 (160x545) with 35 doubles, 11 triples, six home runs, 49 RBI, and 24 stolen bases over 137 games between Single-A Potomac and Double-A Harrisburg.
- Played for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League and won

the Darnell Stenson Award for unselfishness, hard work, and leadership.

- Named to the **2009** South Atlantic League postseason All-Star team with Single-A Hagerstown.
- Earned South Atlantic League Player of the Week honors for July 6-12 after batting .448 (13x29).
- Reached base in 22 straight games from May 9-30.
- Appeared in 48 games in **2008** with the Gulf Coast League Nationals in his first professional season.

- Stephen Anthony Paul Lombardozi...born in Edina, MN, but was raised in Fulton, MD...attended St. Petersburg (Fla.) College... hit .380 (84x281) as a freshman in 2008...is a 2007 graduate of Atholton High School in Columbia, Md...his father, Steve, played in six major-league seasons with Minnesota (1985-88) and Houston (1989-90), winning the World Series with the Twins in 1987, batting .412 (7x17) in the Fall Classic...also served as Pittsburgh's minor-league infield coordinator in 2010.
