Javier Báez this season led the Cubs with 160 games played, the most by a Chicago middle infielder since Starlin Castro played 161 games in 2013 ... Baez actually played on all but one game date (May 1) ... his two other missed games were the nightcap of a split doubleheader in Cincinnati on May 19 (he played the early game) and August 29 vs. the Mets, although he finished a suspended game prior to the originally scheduled contest.	

**LET'S GET WILD:** The Chicago Cubs tonight play the Colorado Rockies in the National League Wild Card game ... Chicago yesterday fell to the Brewers, 3-1, in a tie-breaker game No. 163 to determine the N.L. Central Division title winner ... Chicago finished the regular season with a 95-68 record, second-best in the National League (Milwaukee, 96-67).

© This marks a franchise-record fourth-straight post-season appearance for Chicago dating to 2015 ... the Cubs had advanced to the postseason three-consecutive seasons from 1906-08.

© The Cubs were last in the Wild Card game in 2015 when the team defeated the Pittsburgh Pirates at PNC Park, 4-0 ... Chicago went on to defeat the Cardinals in the NLDS, three-games-to-one, before falling to the Mets in NLCS, 4-0.

© Starting with 2015's post-season run, the Cubs have won 19 post-season games and six post-season series, including the 2016 World Series ... in 105 years prior, from 1909-2014, the franchise won 18 post-season games and just one post-season series.

**JON ON THE BUMP:** Jon Lester tonight makes the start for Chicago, and already ranks first in franchise history with 64.0 career innings in the postseason while he'll tonight tie Kyle Hendricks for the franchise record with his 10th post-season start.

© Lester is 9-7 with a 2.55 ERA (42 ER/148.0 IP) in 25 career post-season games with Boston, Oakland and the Cubs, including 21 starts ... tonight's start will tie Lester with CC Sabathia for the most career post-season starts among active pitchers ... Lester's 148.0 career post-season innings lead active pitchers while his nine victories are third (Verlander has 11 and Sabathia has 10).

© Beginning with Chicago's 2016 postseason, Lester is 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA (11 ER/50.0 IP) in nine playoff games, including two relief appearances.

**RESPECT 90:** The Cubs reached 90 wins for the fourth season in a row starting in 2015, achieving that feat for the first time in more than 100 years since a nine-year run of 90 or more wins from 1904-1912 ... the Cubs and Dodgers are the only teams in all of baseball to reach 90 wins in each of the last four seasons.

© Taking it a step further, the Cubs reached 95 wins for the third time in the last four years ... the Cubs had reached 95 wins only three times in its previous 79 seasons from 1936-2014 prior to the start of this remarkable run in 2015.

**43 DAYS AND 43 NIGHTS:** Including yesterday's tie-breaker and tonight's Wild Card game, the Cubs will now have 42 scheduled games in 43 days dating to August 21 ... the lone day Chicago has not reported to the ballpark in this stretch was an off day September 20 ... the Cubs closed out the regular season with 11 wins in their final 18 games, also going 24-15 (.600) in the final six weeks of the season starting August 22.

**FEELING 100 101:** Anthony Rizzo yesterday belted a solo homer to record his 101st RBI of the season ... he is the first left-handed hitter in franchise history to reach 100 RBI in four different seasons, let alone consecutive seasons as Rizzo has done ... Billy Williams reached 100 RBI three times with the Cubs (1965, 1970, 1972) ... overall, Rizzo is the first Cub with 100 RBI in four-straight years since Sammy Sosa did so in nine-straight seasons (1995-2003).

**THAT'S EITHER HERE OR THERE:** The Cubs reached 50 wins at Wrigley Field for the 14th time in franchise history and second time in the last three years, as the club set a Wrigley Field record with 57 home wins in 2016 ... the Cubs have won 50 home games twice in a three-season span for the first time since doing so in back-to-back season in 1935 and 1936.

© With their 51-31 record at Wrigley, the Cubs .622 home winning percentage was second-best in the National League behind Milwaukee (51-30/.630) and fifth in the majors.

© The Cubs went 44-37 on the road this year, posting a winning road record for the fourth season in a row ... this marks the first time in more than 100 years that the Cubs have had a winning record on the road at least four years in a row ... the last time? ... an 11-season run of winning road records from 1902-1912.

**OUR BAE:** Javier Báez became the first player in franchise history to reach 40 doubles, 30 homers and 20 stolen bases in the same season ... he led the N.L. with 111 RBI, and is only the third middle infielder in club history to reach 111 RBI, the first since Ernie Banks drove in 117 runs in 1960 ... Banks reached 111 RBI four times as a middle infielder, while Rogers Hornsby owns the club record for a middle infielder with 149 RBI in 1929.

© Báez is the first Cub to be the N.L. RBI champ since Sammy Sosa had 160 RBI in 2001 ... Báez finished third in the N.L. with 336 total bases ... the last Cub to lead the N.L. was Derrek Lee with 393 total bases in 2005 ... Javy finished with 83 extra-base hits, two shy of the league lead (Trevor Story, 85) ... Derrek Lee is the last Cub to lead the N.L. with 99 extra-base hits in 2005.

© Baez's season totals landed on 40 doubles, nine triples, 34 homers, 111 RBI and 21 stolen bases ... Báez is the **first player in major league history** to reach those totals in a single season ... Hank Aaron was close in 1961 with the Milwaukee Braves but did not reach 40 doubles (39 2B, 10 3B, 34 HR, 120 RBI, 21 SB) ... that season only earned Aaron an eighth-place finish in N.L. MVP voting.

**PUTTIN' ON THE RIZ:** Anthony Rizzo posted a .985 OPS in his final 73 games starting July 13, the fourth-best mark in the N.L. in that span, trailing only Milwaukee's Christian Yelich (1.196), Los Angeles' Justin Turner (1.066) and Atlanta's Ronald Acuna (1.001) ... Rizzo ranked fifth in the N.L. with a .425 on-base percentage in that span and has turned in a .337 batting average (88-for-261), third-best in the N.L.

© Including another game-winning RBI Sunday against St. Louis, his second in a three-game span, Rizzo finished leading the National League with 19 game-winning RBI and is the first Cub to lead the league in this category since Sammy Sosa tied for the league lead with 21 game-winning RBI in 2003.

**WELL ABOVE AVERAGE:** Ben Zobrist finished sixth in the National League with a .305 batting average this season ... a Cub last finished as high in the N.L. batting race in 2011 when Starlin Castro was sixth with a .309 average ... Zobrist is just the second qualifying Cub ever to finish with at least a .305 average in his age 37 or older season ... he joins Cap Anson who turned the trick six times in his age 37, 38, 41, 42, 43 and 44 seasons from 1889-1896.

**IS 406 WINS A LOT? IT SEEMS LIKE A LOT:** Including the playoffs, skipper Joe Maddon has guided the Cubs to 406 wins since joining the club prior to the 2015 campaign ... the Cubs have 387 regular season wins, by far the most in all of baseball in that span and a Cubs franchise record for most wins in a manager's first four years with the club, and 19 playoff wins, with the Cubs making three-straight NLCS appearances and winning the 2016 World Series, the only team in all of baseball to make the "Final Four" each of the last three years.

© Under Maddon, the Cubs have posted a 189-103 record after the All-Star Break, 86 games above .500, and the team's .647 winning percentage is best in all of baseball by a very wide margin ... Cleveland is a distant second with a .608 mark (175-113) in that span, which would represent a 11.5-game deficit in the mythical standings ... the Los Angeles Dodgers are the next closest N.L. team with a 163-119 record, a whopping 21.0 games behind the Cubs in those same mythical standings.

**THE MIGHTY PEN:** The Cubs bullpen recorded a 3.35 ERA this season, the lowest bullpen ERA in the N.L. ... Milwaukee was next closest with a 3.47 ERA ... the Cubs pen limited foes to a .658 OPS, also lowest in the N.L., and their .341 opponent slugging percentage was the lowest in the majors, ahead of Houston's .353 team mark.

Jon made 32 starts in the regular season and finished tied for the most wins in the N.L., going 18-6 with a 3.32 ERA (67 ER/181.2) ... the Cubs were 24-8 in his 32 starts ... finished 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (9 ER/47.1 IP) in his last eight starts.

- Was named the N.L. Pitcher of the Month for June after going 5-0 with a 1.13 ERA (4 ER/32.0 IP) in five starts, leading the N.L. in ERA and opponents' batting average (.155) and tied for the most wins ... tied his most wins in a calendar month in his career.
- His 18 wins led all lefties in the N.L., was the first Cub with 12 wins prior to the All-Star Break since Jake Arrieta in 2016 ... the 12 wins were the most ever by a Cubs southpaw prior to the All-Star Break.
- Went 7-0 with a 2.09 ERA (10 ER/43.0 IP) in seven starts from May 29-July 1, his most-consecutive starts with a win.
- Had a 2.25 ERA (25 ER/100.0 IP) in his first 17 starts ... posted an 8.65 ERA (33 ER/34.1 IP) in his next seven starts ... had a 1.71 ERA (9 ER/47.1 IP) in his final eight starts.
- Allowed one or zero earned runs in 15 starts ... allowed five or fewer hits in 15 starts, including two or fewer hits in five games.
- Pitched a season-high 7.0 innings six times, April 25 (at CLE) and May 23 (vs. CLE), June 3 (at NYM), June 9 (vs. PIT), June 20 (vs. LAD) and September 15 (vs. CIN)
- Hit his second-career homer, July 1 vs. Minnesota ... had a career-high nine RBI this season, the second-most among all N.L. pitchers (Michael Lorenzen, 10).
- Made his third Opening Day start for the Cubs (also, 2015 and 2017) ... was his seventh Opening Day start overall (four times with Boston) ... joined Hippo Vaughn (1915, 1917, 1919) as the only Cubs lefties to make three Opening Day starts.

### Career Notes

- Jon tonight makes his 12th postseason appearance and 10th start with the Cubs ... ranks first in Cubs postseason history with 64.0 innings pitched and his nine starts ranked tied for second ... ranks first among all active pitchers with 148.0 innings pitched in the postseason ... ranks third among active pitchers with 124 postseason strikeouts.
- Ranks seventh in Cubs history with 129 career regular season starts, the seventh-most starts by a southpaw in franchise history ... his 61 wins are the eighth-most by a lefty (Paul Minner is seventh with 62).
- Made 32 starts in the regular season ... his 11th-straight season reaching at least 30 starts, the only pitcher in the majors to accomplish that feat.
- Went 45-25 with a 3.33 ERA (225 ER/608.2 IP) in his first 100 starts with the Cubs ... his 602 strikeouts ranked fifth-most in Cubs history (since 1913) by a pitcher in their first 100 starts with the team (and the most by a left-handed pitcher) ... his 45 wins tied for the third-most by a Cubs southpaw in their first 100 starts (since 1913).
- A five-time All-Star (including this season) and three-time World Series Champion, Jon is in his fourth season with Chicago after he signed with the Cubs on December 15, 2014 ... is one of four Cubs lefties all-time with four seasons of 32 games started.
- Has 39 starts of at least 6.0 innings and one or fewer runs allowed since the start of 2016, the second-most in the majors in that span behind Justin Verlander (40).
- Ranks second among active left-handed pitchers in wins (177) and fourth in strikeouts (2,190) ... is one of only 14 active pitchers with at least 2,000 innings pitched.
