BALTIMORE ORIOLES (41-104) vs. OAKLAND ATHLETICS (89-57)

RHP Dylan Bundy (7-14, 5.58) vs. LHP Brett Anderson (3-4, 4.02)

FRESH FACES: With his first appearance on Wednesday night, OF DJ Stewart became the 14th Oriole to make his Major League debut this season...The 14 debuts matched the most in a season in Orioles history (since 1954)...According to STATS, LLC., the mark for most Orioles to debut in a season was set in 1955 (the club's second year in Baltimore) with 14.

PLAYERS CLUB: With his debut on Wednesday night, OF DJ Stewart became the 55th player to appear in a game for the Orioles this season...The 55 players mark the most in Orioles history (since 1954), surpassing the 54 players used during the 1955 season...The Orioles have also used 28 pitchers this season, marking the most in O's history (2007, 2009, 2011, and 2016 teams each used 27 pitchers).

BROTHERS GOTTA HUG: On Tuesday night against the A's, INF Corban Joseph pinch-hit for brother C Caleb Joseph in the bottom of the eighth inning...According to STATS, LLC., Tuesday night marked the first time that a brother pinch-hit for his brother since September 16, 2009 when Adrian Gonzalez pinch-hit for Edgar Gonzalez for the San Diego Padres against the Arizona Diamondbacks...According to Baseball-Reference.com, Tuesday night's Joseph-for-Joseph swap marked the 72nd time in Major League history that a brother pinch-hit for his brother...According to STATS, LLC., on June 19, C Caleb Joseph and INF Corban Joseph became the first set of brothers as teammates since Melvin Upton, Jr. and Justin Upton appeared on the roster together for the 2015 San Diego Padres...Cal Ripken, Jr. and Billy Ripken are the only other set of brothers as teammates in Orioles history (since 1954)...Brothers Dick Brown and Larry Brown also played for the Orioles, but did not appear on the O's roster at the same time.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE MONTH: Class A-Advanced Frederick LHP Alex Wells was named the Orioles Minor League Pitcher of the Month for August...Wells went 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (7 ER/32.0 IP) in five August starts...He struck out 29 batters, while issuing only four walks, and held opponents to a .188 (22-for-117) batting average...It was Wells' second career Orioles Pitcher of the Month award, also taking home the honors in July 2017...Short-Season A Aberdeen INF Adam Hall was named the Orioles Minor League Player of the Month for August...Hall hit .390 (32-for-82) with four doubles, two triples, a home run, 20 runs scored, 12 RBI, nine walks, and 15 stolen bases in 23 August games...He recorded a career-high 19-game hitting streak during the month (August 4-28), and hit safely in 20-of-23 games overall...Hall was also named Player of the Month for August for the New York-Penn League by Minor League Baseball...Hall led the league in average (.390), on-base percentage (.462), OPS (.987), and stolen bases (15)...He was second in runs scored (20) and third in slugging (.524)...Hall, 19, was selected in the second round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of A.B. Lucas Secondary School in London, Ontario, Canada...Hall will receive an award from Minor League Baseball in recognition of the honor.

EASTERN LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR: Double-A Bowie LHP Keegan Akin has been named the 2018 Eastern League Pitcher of the Year...Akin is the first Bowie pitcher to win the award since 2008, when RHP Brad Bergesen earned the honor...Akin pitched to a record of 14-7 with 142 strikeouts and a 3.27 ERA (50 ER/137.2 IP) in 25 starts with Bowie this season...He gave up three earned runs or less in 20 of his 25 starts...Akin led the Eastern League in wins (14), strikeouts (142), batting average against (.225), and led all starting pitchers in strikeouts per nine innings (9.28)...He was named to the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Team and was the winner of the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week Award for August 13-19...Akin was a member of the Western Division roster for the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Game in Trenton and struck out two over 1.0 scoreless inning...Akin is rated by *MLB.com* as the 12th-best prospect in the O's organization, and was selected by the Orioles in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Western Michigan University.

CALIFORNIA LEAGUE HONORS: Despite being traded on July 18, INF Rylan Bannon was named the California League's Most Valuable Player and Rookie of the Year for his efforts with Class A-Advanced Rancho Cucamonga...At the time of the trade, Bannon led the league in home runs (20) and walks (59)...He was tied for second in RBI (61) and was a two-time Player of the Week before being named a mid-season All-Star...Bannon finished the season with Double-A Bowie.

BREAKING NEWS: The Orioles rank among league leaders in several major offensive categories since the All-Star break, including ranking fourth in the AL and eighth in the majors in batting average at .261 (429-for-1645)...They have recorded 429 hits in 48 games since the All-Star break, ranking tied for fourth in the AL and tied for 11th in the majors...The O's have hit 62 home runs since the break to rank tied for seventh in the AL and tied for 12th in the majors...The O's .416 slugging percentage ranks 10th in the AL since the break.

LEADING MAN-CINI: Trey Mancini hit a lead-off home run in the eighth inning on Sept. 1, his 21st homer of the season...He is hitting .323 (50-for-155) when leading off an inning...In 48 games since the All-Star break, he is hitting .278 (52-for-187) with nine home runs and 25 RBI.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Alex Cobb tossed the Orioles 59th Quality Start of the season on Tuesday...The O's 59 Quality Starts this season rank eighth in the AL and 18th in the majors...Cobb leads the club with 15 Quality Starts...O's starters have received 327 runs of support this season, which ranks second-fewest in the majors...Overall, O's pitchers have received 556 runs of support this season, which ranks third-fewest in the majors and ranks second-fewest in the AL.

CEDRIC THE ENTERTAINER: Since making his Major League debut on August 10, OF Cedric Mullins is batting .240 (24-for-100) and 10 of his 24 hits are extra-base hits...Since his debut, Mullins' .240 batting average ranks 12th among AL rookies and ranks 16th in the majors among rookies...His seven doubles since August 10 are tied for fifth in the majors among rookies.

VS. OAKLAND: The Orioles and Athletics play the final game of six matchups between the two clubs this season...The A's lead the season series, 5-0...The Orioles visited Oakland, May 4-6...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 4-3...Baltimore trails Oakland (since 1968) in the all-time series, 265-268, with the Orioles going 130-132 at home and 135-136 in Oakland...From 1954-67, the Orioles owned a 161-116 record against the Philadelphia/Kansas City Athletics.

TRADE WINDS: On July 31, the Orioles acquired RHP Evan Phillips, INF Jean Carlos Encarnación, C Brett Cumberland, LHP Bruce Zimmermann, and International Signing Bonus Slot Money from the Atlanta Braves in exchange for RHP Kevin Gausman and RHP Darren O'Day...Also on July 31, the Orioles acquired INF Jonathan Villar, RHP Luis Ortiz, and INF Jean Carmona from the Milwaukee Brewers in exchange for INF Jonathan Schoop...On July 29, the Orioles traded RHP Brad Brach to the Atlanta Braves in exchange for International Signing Bonus Slot Money...On July 24, the Orioles acquired RHP Dillon Tate, LHP Josh Rogers, and RHP Cody Carroll from the New York Yankees in exchange for LHP Zach Britton...On July 18, the Orioles acquired OF Yusniel Díaz, INF Rylan Bannon, INF Breyvic Valera, RHP Dean Kremer, and RHP Zach Pop from the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for INF Manny Machado.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1971, Frank Robinson hit his 499th home run in Game 1 of a doubleheader against the Tigers...He also homered with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning of Game 2 for his 500th career home run...Robinson became the 11th player in Major League history to amass 500 home runs.

DISABLED LIST: Four O's are currently on the disabled list...RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), RHP Pedro Araujo (right elbow strain, since 6/11), LHP Richard Bleier (left shoulder latissimus strain, retroactive to 6/14), and OF/DH Mark Trumbo (right knee inflammation, since 8/20) are on the 60-day DL.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268-1, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (663-673, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,545 career wins rank 24th all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy, Mike Scioscia, and Terry Francona...His 663 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Will be making his 28th start of the 2018 season, tying his career-high...Made the start in the postponed contest against Boston on July 25; no statistics counted for the game... Made a career-high 28 starts last season and won a career-high 13 games...The Orioles went 16-12 in his starts, the only Orioles starter with a winning record in their starts (min. two starts)... Threw 90-or-more pitches in 26 of his 28 starts (threw 89 and 76 in his last two starts respectively)...Made 19 Quality Starts last season, tied for the eighth-most in the AL and tied for 16th-most in MLB.

LAST START: Bundy suffered his 14th loss of the season on September 7 at Tampa Bay after he allowed six runs on four hits, two home runs, with a career-high five walks and three strikeouts over 4.0 innings of work...Has surrendered 10 home runs in his last six starts, allowing six-or-more runs in four of those six starts...Has allowed at least one home run in 11-straight starts... Fifth start receiving zero runs of support... Threw 84 pitches, 42 strikes.

CAREER VS. OAKLAND: Bundy will be making his third career start (fourth appearance) against the Athletics; he has gone 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (6 ER/14.0 IP) in his first three career games against them...His last start against them came on August 23, 2017 at Oriole Park when he did not factor in the decision after allowing three runs on seven hits with eight strikeouts; the O's won 8-7 in 12 innings...This will be his second home start (third appearance) against Oakland; he has gone 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA (3 ER/8.0 IP) against them at Oriole Park.

VS. AL WEST: This will be Bundy's fourth start of the season against an AL West opponent; he has gone 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA (7 ER/16.1 IP) in these three games...Making his 11th career start (18th appearance) against the division...He is 5-3, 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) with 20 walks and 82 strikeouts in his first 17 games...His 9.75 SO/9 is the highest against any division for his career (min. 15 games)...He has struck out eight-or-more batters in five of his last seven starts against the AL West, including 10-or-more punchouts in three of those games...His only career complete game came against the AL West (August 29, 2017 vs. SEA)...In five career home starts (seven games), he has gone 3-0 with a 3.05 ERA (13 ER/38.1 IP), eight walks, 39 strikeouts, and four Quality Starts...He has made five career starts (10 appearances) against the division on the road, going 2-3 with a 4.10 ERA (17 ER/37.1 IP), 12 walks, 43 strikeouts, and four Quality Starts.

HURT BY THE LONG BALL: Bundy has surrendered 37 home runs this season, surpassing his previous career-high of 26 set last season...With 37 home runs, Bundy has set the Orioles record for home runs allowed in a season...**The 37 home runs allowed are the most in the majors this season**...15 of his home runs came in a seven start stretch (April 26-May 29)...He surrendered a career-high four home runs on May 8 vs. KC; all of which came in the first inning... He has given up three home runs in five other starts this season...For his career, he has eight games in which he has surrendered at least three homers...He has allowed four of the Orioles' opponents' back-to-back home runs this season...He is allowing 2.22 HR/9 this season and 1.69 HR/9 for his career.

DAYMAN, FIGHTER OF THE NIGHTMAN: Bundy has made nine day starts on the season... He has gone 6-1 with a 2.07 ERA (14 ER/61.0 IP) in these nine day games as opposed to being 1-13 with a 7.99 ERA (79 ER/89.0 IP) in 18 night games this season...**His daytime ERA is the second-lowest in the majors (min. 60.0 IP), while his nighttime ERA is the highest in the majors (min. 70.0 IP)**...For his career, Bundy has gone 11-6 with a 4.33 ERA (69 ER/143.1 IP) in 30 career day time games (22 starts) and 19-23 with a 4.79 ERA (153 ER/287.2 IP) in 63 career night time games (47 starts).

SLOW OUT OF THE GATE: Bundy's first inning ERA sits at 7.62 (22 ER/26.0 IP), compared to a 5.15 ERA (71 ER/124.0 IP) in innings two through nine...Nine of his 37 home runs allowed have come in the first frame, and eight have come in both the fourth and fifth innings...Opponents SLG and OPS percentages off Bundy in the first inning are .563 and .919 respectively.

IT TAKES TWO TO TANGO: When Bundy induces an 0-2 count, batters are only hitting .149 (14-for-94) with one home run and four RBI...In 0-1 counts, however, batters have found greater success, boasting an average of .426 (23-for-54)...**Bundy is holding right-handed hitters to a .227 (66-for-291) average, the 13th-lowest in the AL.**
