The Mariners have not committed an error in 12 consecutive games (5/23-c)...during this span, the Mariners have successfully converted 471 total chances (342 putouts, 129 assists).

On Sunday vs. the Rays, Félix Hernández recorded 66th career start tossing in at least 8.0 innings and allowing 1 or fewer runs, but it was his first such start since Sept. 10, 2015 vs. Texas (8.0,5.1,1,1,7,2HB)...dating back to 2005, his 66 starts with at least 8.0 innings and 1-or-fewer runs are the most in the Majors, ranking ahead of Clayton Kershaw-LAD (58).

VS. HOUSTON

The Mariners and Astros meet for the 5th of 19 games this season (1-3)...these two clubs will meet 10 times at Safeco Field this season and 9 times at Minute Maid Park...since 2013, the Mariners are 31-14 (.689) when scoring at least 4 runs vs. the Astros.

TONIGHT'S TILT...following an off day yesterday, the Mariners begin a 6-day, 6-game road trip covering over 5,600 miles that includes stops in Houston (2 games) and Tampa Bay (4 games) before returning home to Seattle on June 11...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 4 straight...have also won 8 of their last 10 games, 13 of their last 16 games, and 15 of their last 20...Seattle is 23-11 in its last 34 games, 28-14 over its last 42 games and 33-18 in its last 51 games...Seattle is 12-10 during the day and 25-12 at night...Seattle is 20-12 at Safeco Field, 17-10 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...tied with Texas (6) for the ML lead in extra-inning wins.
- **Walk it Off** - the Mariners have 5 walk-off wins this season, tied with the Yankees for 3rd-most in the ML, trailing only the Cardinals (7) and Braves (6)...each of the Mariners 5 walk-off wins have come during extra innings.
- **Bullpen Bully** - over his last 6 outings (5/18-c), **Juan Nicasio** has retired 25-of-28 batters faced...during that span, he has allowed only 3 hits (.107/3x28) while striking out 16 without issuing a walk...he has struck out 16 of the 28 batters he has faced, including 14-of-the-last-19, dating back to May 26.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** is tied for the Major League lead with 25 multi-hit games, along with Nicholas Castellanos-DET and Nick Markakis-ATL...Segura is also tied for the ML lead with 11 games of 3+ hits (also: Nicholas Castellanos-DET).
- **Jean, Jean the Hit Collector** - since May 9, **Jean Segura** is batting .409 (38x93) with 20 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 13 RBI and 7 stolen bases...during that span, he leads the Major Leagues in hits, while also ranking 3rd in average, T3rd in stolen bases and T4th in runs scored.
- **Seventh Heaven** - **Ben Gamel** has hit safely in a season-high 7 games (5/24-c), batting .458 (11x24) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 HBP, 1 walks and 2 stolen bases.
- **Welcome to Seattle** - Since joining the Mariners on May 27, **Alex Colomé** has appeared in 4 of the Mariners 7 games, including recording the save in his Mariners debut on April 27 vs. MIN...overall he has retired 13 of the 15 batters faced (1 H, 1 HBP) while striking out 4 over 4.0 scoreless innings.
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 25-7 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-15 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 15 games over .500 at 37-22...with a win tonight, Seattle would be 16 games over .500 for the first time since being 73-57 (.562) after game #130 of the 2007 season...marks the 8th season in club history to be at least 15 games over .500 at any point in a season.

HOT START...Seattle is 37-22 (.627) through its first 59 games of the season, its T3rd-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (47-12/.797), 2003 (40-19/.678) and tied with 2002 (37-21/.627)...the Mariners currently have a +1.0 lead over the Astros in the American League West...the last time the Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...beginning tonight the Mariners will play 16 of the next 23 games and 22 of the final 38 games before the All-Star break on the road...since April 24, the Mariners have won 11 of their last 16 road games...during this stretch the Mariners .688 winning percentage is the 3rd-highest in the Major Leagues, trailing only the Washington Nationals (14-5/.737) and the New York Yankees (12-5/.688)...overall this season the Mariners are 17-10 (.630) on the road, trailing only the Boston Red Sox (21-11/.656), the Washington Nationals (21-11/.656), the Los Angeles Angels (18-10/.643), the New York Yankees (16-9/.640) and the Houston Astros (19-11/.640) for best road winning percentage in the Majors.

RIBBIES...Seattle boasts 3 of the top-9 players in the American League in RBI on the road this season...**Kyle Seager** ranks 4th in the American League with 22 road RBI, while **Mitch Haniger** ranks T9th with 20 road RBI...**Jean Segura** ranks T19th with 18 road RBI.

THAT WAS CLOSE...the Mariners are 18-9 (.667) in one-run games this season, the most one-run wins and one-run decisions in the Majors...their .667 winning percentage in one-run games is T5th-highest in Majors this season (along with Colorado, 15-10/.667), trailing New York-AL (10-3/.769), Milwaukee (15-5/.750), Atlanta (10-4/.714) and Boston (17-12/.706)...**Edwin Díaz** has saved 13 one-run decisions this season, tops in the Majors (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 9, and Shane Greene-DET, 8).

DRAFTY...the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft continues today with the 3rd-10th rounds (rounds 11-40 on Wednesday)...Mariners selected RHP **Logan Gilbert** (Stetson University) with the 14th overall (1st round) pick and OF **Josh Stowers** (University of Louisville) with the 54th overall (2nd round) pick yesterday.

NO FREE PASSES...**James Pazos** has not issued a walk since his first appearance of the season on April 4, a span of 22 appearances without a walk...Pazos' streak of 22 consecutive games without issuing a walk is the 2nd-longest streak of games without a walk among Major League **relievers** this season...Kansas City's Kelvin Herrera has an active streak of 24 straight games without issuing a walk, dating back to the beginning of the season...Pazos' streak is the 2nd-longest by a **reliever** in club history, trailing only Charlie Furbush, who did not walk a batter in 26 straight outings, May 20 - July 29, 2014.

ALL-STAR AT SHORTSTOP...two of the most productive shortstops this year are sharing the field this series: **Jean Segura** and Houston's Carlos Correa...Segura leads all American League shortstops in average (.331) and hits (78), while also ranking 2nd in runs scored (43) and RBI (37), T2nd in triples (2), 3rd in on-base percentage (.351), 4th in doubles (17), 5th in slugging percentage (.470) and OPS (.821) and T10th in home runs (4)...Correa leads all AL shortstops in RBI (39) and walks (28)...here's a look at some comparative numbers this season:

AS YOU KNOW...**James Paxton** has struck out 95 batters in 74.2 innings this season, ranking 3rd in the American League in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (11.45) and 6th in strikeouts (95), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...if Paxton strikes out at least 5 batters in less than 5.1 innings he would become only the 3rd pitcher in club history to record 100 strikeouts in less than 80.0 innings?...he would join Randy Johnson (3x; 1995-69.1 IP, 1998-72.0 IP & 1997-78.0 IP) and J.J. Putz (2006-76.2 IP)...Paxton struck out 100 batters in 87.1 innings in 2017, which is the 5th-fastest in club history.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 13th start of 2018, his 87th career MLB start, and 10th career start vs. the Astros tonight.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game...named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
- Is 2-6 with a 5.43 ERA (36 ER, 59.2 IP) in 11 career starts in the month of June.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 6-7 loss to Texas on May 30...allowed 2 runs on 4 hits and 4 walks while striking out 5 batters across 5.0 innings pitched and left with a 4-2 lead...limited the Rangers to just 2 base runners in his first 3.0 innings before allowing 2 runs with 2 outs in the 4th inning...worked out of a no-outs, bases-loaded jam in the 5th inning.

RACE TO 100...has recorded 95 strikeouts in 74.2 innings pitched this season...only 2 pitchers (done 4x) in club history have reached 100 strikeouts in 80.0 innings pitched: Randy Johnson (3x, 1995 - 69.1 IP, 1997 - 78.0 IP and 1998 - 72.0 IP) and J.J. Putz (2006 - 76.2 IP)...with 5 strikeouts in 5.1 or fewer innings, Paxton would become the 3rd pitcher to reach the 100-strikeout plateau in fewer than 80.0 inning pitched.

HEATING UP...since May 1, leads the Majors with 0.70 WHIP and has held opponents to a .144 batting average against, the lowest mark in the Majors...went 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (8 ER, 43.0 IP) with 51 strikeouts in the month of May.

LEADERBOARD...ranks 6th in the Majors with an 11.45 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ratio (95 K, 74.2 IP)...Paxton ranks 6th in the American League (9th in MLB) with 95 strikeouts, trailing Gerrit Cole-HOU (116), Chris Sale-BOS (110), Justin Verlander-HOU (104), Luis Severino-NYY (102) and Trevor Bauer-CLE (97).

THE RIGHT STUFF...has held right-handed hitters to a .152 batting average (33x217), including a .119 mark (12x101) in his last 5 outings, while lefties have batted .346 (18x52) with 3 home runs against Paxton this season.

NO-NO...pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
- Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.
- Marks the Mariners 4th no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span.
- Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK...recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 batters on Aug. 8, 1997, vs. CWS...became the first Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

WHIFF...recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernández (1) and Paxton (1).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...placed on the 10-day DL on May 5 (retro to May 3) with a left forearm strain...activated on May 30 after making one rehab start (5/26 w/AA Arkansas)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL starting Aug. 11 with a strained left pectoral muscle...activated on Sept. 15.

2017 AWARDS...named the **2017 MARINERS PITCHER OF THE YEAR** by the Seattle BBWAA...earlier in the season, earned two American League awards in the span of three days...**AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH**...named American League Pitcher of the Month for July on Aug. 2...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July...**CO-AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK**...named co-American League Player of the Week on July 31...marked his 2nd such honor of the season (also: April 10-16)...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH...in 6 starts in the month of July, went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 6 wins in a calendar month...his 1.37 ERA for July was the lowest in calendar month by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández posted a 1.22 ERA (6 ER, 44.1 IP) in June of 2014...Paxton's 1.37 ERA in July was 7th-lowest in club history by a Mariners left-hander in a calendar month and the lowest since Jamie Moyer posted a 1.01 ERA (4 ER, 35.2 IP) in June of 2002...earned the win in 7 consecutive starts, July 2, 2017-Aug. 4, 2017...equaled the club record for wins in consecutive starts (also: Jamie Moyer, 5/6-6/8/03, and Scott Bankhead, 6/18-7/20/89).

CAREER...is 34-21 with a 3.26 ERA (180 ER, 496.2 IP) with 504 strikeouts in 86 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.

33-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 6th start of the season... has allowed just 6 earned runs across his 6 starts this season and boasts a 1.72 ERA (6 ER, 31.1 IP) as a starter...W#1 in his last start, a 6-1 Mariners win on 5/31 vs TEX (5.0,4,1,1,2,4,HR-1)...recorded a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts and 3 walks in 5 relief appearances this season...signed with the Mariners on March 25 after being released by the Yankees at his request...**SPRING TRAINING:** Was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...**2017 SEASON:** Went 5-2-1 in 50 appearances with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP) with 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...**CAREER:** 10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...overall, is 30-35-3 with a 4.29 ERA (294 ER, 616.2 IP) in 186 career appearances/84 starts...in 84 career starts, is 22-31 with a 4.39 ERA (222 ER, 455.1 IP), 313 strikeouts and 151 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...**vs. HOU:** Will make his 7th career appearance (3rd start) against the Astros...is 0-0 with a 5.00 ERA (10 ER, 18.0 IP) in 6 career appearances vs the Astros.
