PLAY BALL DAY—This morning, OF **Johnny Field**, INF **Daniel Robertson** and INF **Joey Wendle** participated in the Rays Play Ball Day baseball clinic at the newly-renovated Northwest Little League Complex in Tampa... they provided instruction to over 200 youth baseball and softball players as part of the free clinic, which is aimed to teach kids the joy of playing baseball and softball through a day of instruction and fun activities.

ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have optioned RH **Chih-Wei Hu** to Triple-A Durham and recalled RH **Ryne Stanek** from Durham...Stanek went 0-1 with a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) and 17 SO in 10 apps for the Bulls.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are 10-3 over their last 13 games, including an 8-game winning streak—tied for 3rd-longest in franchise history—from April 18-28...they have come from behind in 7 of these 10 wins...over this 13-game stretch, the Rays have a plus-31 run differential (78-47) and have outthit opponents, 141-104, including 9 games with double-digit hits...their 6 runs yesterday vs. TOR matched their total from their previous 3 games combined, but it was the seventh time in these 13 games they scored 6 runs or more...they have improved from 4-13 (.235)—the worst record in the AL East and the 3rd-worst winning pct. in the majors—to 14-16 (.467) over this stretch.

- + The Rays have won the opening game of their last six series...with a win today or tomorrow, the Rays would improve to 5-1-0 in their last 6 series, compared to 1-4-0 in their first 5 series.
- + The Rays rank 3rd in the majors with a .264 avg. to the Braves (.275) and Red Sox (.269), and rank 5th in the majors with a .333 OBP.

TURN AROUND, BRIGHT RAYS—The Rays were a major-league-worst 1-8 through April 8 at BOS, tied for the worst 9-game start in club history...through that date, they were tied for 28th in the majors with 3.00 runs per game, ranked 29th with a .201 avg. and 28th with a .272 OBP... since then, the Rays are 13-8 (.619), 4th-best winning pct. in the majors behind the Yankees (.773), Cardinals (.667) and Red Sox (.652)...they are averaging 5.19 runs per game, tied for 5th in the majors, and lead the majors with a .289 avg. (Indians, .278) and .358 OBP (Yankees, .340).

HOME COOKIN'—The Rays have won their last five home games, dating back to April 18 vs. TEX...they have outscored opponents, 36-18, over these 5 games...before this streak, they were 2-7 at Tropicana Field and were outscored, 42-28...the 5-game home winning streak is one shy of matching the longest under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash**...they won 6 straight from April 7-20, 2017 and April 22-May 1, 2015.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—Today is the second of 19 meetings between the two clubs this season (9 at Tropicana Field, 10 at Rogers Centre)...the two teams meet only six times before the All-Star break, compared to 13 times after (and 10 times in September)...the Rays went 9-10 last season (6-4 at home, 3-6 on the road), just the second time they've lost a season series to the Blue Jays in the Rays era (8-11 in 2014)...the Rays are 186-167 (.527) all-time, their most wins against any opponent.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN—This is the second of six consecutive series against teams that finished last season below .500...the Rays don't face another postseason team from last year until May 22-24 vs. BOS...so far this season, the Rays are 6-9 (.400) against teams that made last year's playoffs and 8-7 (.533) against teams that missed the postseason.

CLOSE SHAVES—Four of the Rays last 5 games have been decided by 1-run margins...the Rays have played a major-league-most 15 games decided by 1 run, the most by an AL team within their first 30 games since the 2005 White Sox (15)...the Rays are 5-10 (.333) in 1-run games, tied for 6th-lowest winning pct. in the majors, but are 5-5 after an 0-5 start...since 2016, the Rays are 39-61 (.390) in 1-run games, 3rd-worst winning pct. in the majors and 2nd-worst in the AL over that span.

CONSIDER THIS—The Rays haven't been .500 since they were 1-1, and have failed in two attempts to return to .500 since then...they are currently 2 games under .500 despite a wide range of obstacles:

- + Their 8-game losing streak tied for the 4th-longest of the "Rays" era and remains tied for the 2nd-longest in the majors this season.
- + They opened the season with three regular members of the starting rotation following the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, and used a "bullpen day" as needed as the fourth and fifth starters.
- + They placed two-time Gold Glove winner and 2015 AL Platinum Glove winner **Kevin Kiermaier** on the disabled list in mid-April, the third consecutive season he has missed significant time.
- + They have totaled 12 games against the Red Sox (3-7) and Yankees (0-2), who own the two best records in the majors this season.

FIELD DAY—Yesterday vs. TOR, **Johnny Field** became the first Rays rookie with 3 XBH in a game since **Steven Souza Jr.** on May 31, 2015 at BAL...he became the first player in franchise history with a 3-XBH game within the first 12 games of his career, and was the first player to do this in the majors since BOS **Travis Shaw** on Aug 1, 2015 vs. TB (1-2B, 2-HR)...he was the second rookie in club history with 3 XBH in a game out of the No. 9 spot in the batting order, joining **Reid Brignac** on Sep 14, 2009 at BAL.

DO YOU EVEN YARBROUGH?—Last night, **Ryan Yarbrough's** only hit allowed was a 3rd-inning single by **Dalton Pompey**, his first batter faced...after that, he retired his last 15 BF...his 5 IP matched **Austin Pruitt** on April 14 vs. PHI for the most by a Rays reliever this season...it was the second time in franchise history a reliever went at least 5 IP and allowed 1 hit or fewer, joining **Esteban Yan** on April 13, 1998 vs. MIN.

AROUND THE LEAGUE—Last night LAA **Albert Pujols** became the 32nd member of baseball's 3,000-hit club with a single off SEA **Mike Leake**, then singled again in the 9th for his 3,001st hit to pass **Roberto Clemente** for No. 31 on the career hits list...the Rays yielded only 46 of those 3,001 hits, and only five other clubs have yielded fewer to Pujols: the Orioles (42), White Sox (39), Indians (37) and Pujols' own Angels (7) and Cardinals (4)...19 of them have come at Tropicana Field...the pitcher who allowed the most hits to Pujols as a Ray was **Alex Cobb** (7), followed by **Chris Archer** (6)...the only current Rays pitchers who have allowed hits to Pujols are Archer, **Alex Colomé** (2), **Blake Snell** (1) and **Jake Faria** (1)...C.J. Cron was teammates with Pujols with the Angels from 2014-17, and **Daniel Robertson** worked out with him at UC-Irvine this past offseason.

MINOR MATTERS—Yesterday RH **Nathan Eovaldi** made a rehab start for Class-A Charlotte vs. Bradenton...his line: 1 IP, 2 H, 1 R/ER, 17 pit, 13 str.

- + The Rays have named Class-A Charlotte 1B **Nate Lowe** as their Minor League Player of the Month for April, and Class-A Bowling Green LH **Brendan McKay** their Minor League Pitcher of the Month...Lowe, 22, who also earned Florida State League Player of the Month honors, hit .393/.460/.640 (35-for-89) with 7 2B, 5 HR and 24 RBI...McKay, 22, went 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (14-IP, 3-ER), .146 opp avg. (7-for-48) and 24/1 SO/BB ratio in 4 starts.
- + Yesterday at Burlington, McKay did not allow a hit in 4.2 IP, with 1 BB and a career-high-tying 9 SO...the Hot Rods did not allow a hit until the 9th inning of a 5-3, 12-inning win.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On May 5, 2015, **Evan Longoria** singles in the 4th inning off **Rick Porcello** for his 1,000th career hit...he does it in his 986th game, 3 games faster than it took Hall of Fame 3B **Brooks Robinson** to reach 1,000 hits (989 games).

LAST START—On Mon at DET, became the first Ray with a start of at least 8 IP since **Alex Cobb** on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX, and the first Ray with a scoreless start of at least 8 IP since Cobb on June 27, 2017 at PIT...it was the first scoreless start of his career, and the longest start of his career (prev. 7.1 IP on July 25, 2017 vs. BAL)...faced the minimum in the 1st, 2nd, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th innings...only allowed two runners to reach scoring position: a 1-out double in the 3rd inning and 1-out double and wild pitch in the 4th...recorded the win following the Rays 3-run 9th inning, on homers from **C.J. Cron** and **Brad Miller**...his line: W, 8 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 112 pit, 74 str.

- + Recorded his first win on the road since June 18, 2017 at DET...snapped a streak of yielding 3 runs or more in six consecutive road starts.
- + His start matched the longest of his professional career, following Aug 28, 2015 at Mobile (with Double-A Montgomery) and June 1, 2015 at Palm Beach (with Class-A Charlotte).

HOMEBODY—Has allowed 1 run (or fewer) in all 3 starts at home this season, going 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA (15.1-IP, 3-ER), which ranks 7th in the AL...for his career, is 4-2 with a 2.73 ERA (56-IP, 17-ER) in 10 apps (9 starts) at Tropicana Field...in his 9 starts here, he has yielded 3 runs or fewer eight times and 1 run (or fewer) six times...in comparison, he is 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA (14-IP, 12-ER) on the road this season and 3-3 with a 4.65 ERA (60-IP, 31-ER) on the road in his career.

vs. TORONTO—Is 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2-IP, 4-ER) in 2 starts against the Blue Jays, both at Rogers Centre last season...faced them in the second start of his career on June 13, 2017 (W, 6.1-IP, 1-ER)...on Aug 16, 2017, took the loss (5.1-IP, 3-ER) and ended up missing the next month with a left abdominal strain.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in 4 of his 6 starts so far this season, pitching to a 1.03 ERA (23.1-IP, 3-ER) in those 4 starts...he joins **Blake Snell** as Rays pitchers with at least 4 starts of 1 run or fewer—Snell has done this four times in 7 starts, while the rest of the rotation has combined to do it four times in their 17 starts...has yielded more than 3 runs only four times in his 20 career starts.

- + Twice this year, has allowed 1 run or fewer and not gotten the win...only four AL pitchers have done that more frequently: DET **Matthew Boyd** (3), KC **Ian Kennedy** (3), CWS **Reynaldo Lopez** (3) and BOS **Chris Sale** (3).

THE WIN COLUMN—Has won consecutive decisions on the heels of a winless streak (0-4) of 10 apps (8 starts) from July 30, 2017–April 13, 2018...is attempting to win three consecutive decisions for the first time since June 7–July 6, 2017 (4)...in 13 apps (11 starts) dating back to July 30, 2017 at NYY, he has gone less than 6 IP in all but 4 starts, and only once over this span has he gone longer than 6 IP (Mon at DET, 8 IP).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS—Last season he was named the club's Outstanding Rookie by the Tampa Bay Chapter of the BBWAA...min. 75 IP, he led AL rookies with a 3.43 ERA, .225 opp avg., .387 opp SLG, 8.72 SO/9 IP ratio and 1.18 WHIP...ranked 4th among AL rookies with 84 SO, and ranked 2nd to NYY **Jordan Montgomery** (91) after his June 7 recall...achieved this despite spending 25 games on the disabled list from Aug 17–Sep 14.

REDEFINING QUALITY—He was the first pitcher to begin his career with 7 consecutive quality starts since NYY **Masahiro Tanaka** (16) in 2014, and one of only nine pitchers since 1913 to begin his career in this fashion...he became the fifth pitcher since 1913 to go 6 IP or more, allow 1 run or fewer and earn the win in his first 3 apps, joining STL **Andy Rincon** (1980), CIN **Wayne Simpson** (1970), STL **Stu Miller** (1952) and DET **Alex Main** (1914)...he also became the second pitcher since 1913 with at least 35 SO and 5 BB or fewer in his first 5 starts, with no relief apps in between, joining SEA **Félix Hernández** in 2005...was the second Ray to win his first 4 decisions, all as a starter, joining **James Shields** in 2006.

LUCKY DUCK—While playing scout ball in 2010, he was turned away by an overbooked hotel...to apologize, the hotel provided a gift bag with treats and a rubber duck...the duck found its way to his equipment bag, where it was forgotten...after a strong first season as a professional, he was frustrated by a poor 2012 campaign...the next spring began poorly as well, until Jake realized a new equipment bag had separated him from the duck...when his father shipped Jake's car, he placed the duck inside...an outstanding 2013 campaign followed and the duck has traveled with him to the ballpark ever since.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH CHRIS ARCHER (2-2, 6.05 ERA)

LAST START—On Tues at DET, allowed a 3rd-inning RBI double to **Nicholas Castellanos** and 5th-inning RBI double to **Leonys Martín**...three of his 6 hits allowed came in the 5th inning, but stranded two runners after consecutive strikeouts ended the inning...allowed 2 runs, matching his season low (also April 20 vs. MIN), and did not allow a homer for the first time in his 7 starts this season...replaced after 6 IP and 90 pitches in a 2-1 loss: his line: L, 6 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 90 pit, 57 str.

- + Became the third pitcher to throw 1,000 innings for the Rays, following **James Shields** (1,454.2 IP) and **David Price** (1,143.2 IP).

SEEKING LENGTH—Has totaled 38.2 IP in his 7 starts this season, averaging just over 5.1 IP per start...hasn't completed 6 IP in nine of his last

12 starts dating back to last Sep 2, after doing so in 18 of his previous 19 starts...doesn't have a start of at least 7 IP since Aug 27, 2017 at STL (7 IP) and hasn't gone 8 IP since May 10, 2017 vs. KC (8 IP).

vs. TORONTO—Will be making his 25th start against the Blue Jays, his most frequent opponent (Red Sox, 20)...has gone 7-4 with a 3.09 ERA (148.1-IP, 51-ER) in 24 starts against them and 4-2 with a 3.11 ERA (81-IP, 28-ER) in 13 starts at Tropicana Field...last season, went 1-0 with a 2.65 ERA (34-IP, 10-ER) in 5 starts and 1-0 with a 2.75 ERA (19.2-IP, 6-ER) in 3 starts at home...has yielded 3 runs or fewer in 21 of 24 starts against the Blue Jays, including 10 straight dating back to Oct 3, 2015...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 17 starts and 1 run or fewer in 9 starts.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
