AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play a split doubleheader in Detroit (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15)...are 2-0 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore that included postponements on Thursday and Sunday...tomorrow will begin a two-game series in Toronto (through Wednesday), followed by an off day on Thursday and a three-game Subway Series at the Mets from Friday-Sunday...went 4-2 on their recent homestand (2-1 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 2-1 vs. Houston).

- At 37-17 (.685), have the Majors' best winning pct....is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's
- best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).

  Trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 24-17, the Yankees are 28-8).
- Are a season-high 20G over .500...did not reach 20G over .500 in 2017 until their 158th game (89-69)...reached a season-best 21G over .500 just once last season (91-70 after their 161st game on 9/30/17)...never reached 20G over at any point from 2013-16.
- Is the 11th season in franchise history and the second season over the last 60 years (since 1959) that they have reached 20G over within their first 54 decisions of a season (first went 20G over in 1998 after 38G, starting 29-9)...made the World Series in all 10 previous instances, winning seven times (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '58, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55).
- Marks the 10th time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 37 wins over their first 54 results...each of the other nine Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55)...joins the 1998 team (41-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 54G start over the last 63 seasons (since 1956).
- Have won 11 of their last 12 completed series since 4/19.
- Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 6-2 so far.
- Are 13-9 vs. the AL East and 24-8 vs. all other divisions.
- Are a Major League-best 25-2 (.926) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees won their fourth straight game, defeating the Orioles, 8-5, at Camden Yards on Saturday after a pregame delay of 1hr., 44 min....**Yankees batters** tallied 7XBH (5 doubles, 2HR)...**RHP Masahiro** Tanaka (5.1IP, 8H, 4ER, 1BB, 7K, 3HR) started and improved to 7-2 on the season...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4, 3RBI) had a two-run HR in the second and an RBI double in the eighth... DH Giancarlo Stanton (2-for-4, 1BB) had a two-run HR in the third...**CF Aaron Hicks** (3-for-4, 2R, 1SB) had a pair of RBI singles in the sixth and eighth and matched his season high in hits (also went 3-for-4 on 5/18 at Kansas City)... Yankees relievers (3H, 1BB, 5K, 1BB) allowed 1ER in 3.2IP.

RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY: The Yankees have had 14 games impacted by weather this season (seven postponements, four delayed before starting, two delayed in-game and one delayed in-game before being suspended)...had 14 games total affected by weather in 2017 (five ppd., nine delayed at

LET'S PLAY TWO: Today is the Yankees' first doubleheader of the season...played three doubleheaders in 2017.

- ▶ Are 1-4-3 over their last eight doubleheaders since 2014, but are 6-4-11 in twin bills since the start of 2009...have not swept any of their last seven doubleheaders, their longest such streak since the start of 1980...their last sweep was on 4/16/14 vs. Chicago-NL.
- The Yankees last faced the Tigers in a doubleheader on 5/12/10 in Detroit (Game 1 L, 0-2; Game 2 W, 8-0).
- Since the start of 2014, the Yankees have played eight doubleheaders...over that same span, LF Brett Gardner has appeared in 14G that are part of DHs (all except G1 on 9/12/14 and G2 on 10/3/15, both at Baltimore), hitting .373 (19-for-51) with 9R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 12RBI, 5BB, 1SB and 3HP...has reached safely in all 14G.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 14-1 in their last 15G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...had a 12-game winning streak vs. AL Central teams from 9/18/17-5/6/18...was their longest winning streak over AL Central teams since a 12G run from 9/15/02-5/30/03...are 8-3 at Comerica Park since 2015.

- Are 10-1 vs. the AL Central this season.
- Are 70-40 (.636) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, the highest win. pct. by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 22-8-3 in 33 series over the span (min. 2G).

FEELING A DRAFT: The 2018 First-Year Player Draft begins tonight, with former OF/current Yankees Special Advisor Nick Swisher and Yankees Manager of International Operations Victor Roldan representing the Yankees at MLB Network studios...in tonight's portion of the draft, the Yankees hold the 23rd overall pick (first round) and the 61st selection (second rd.).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 12-4 in their last 16 completed road games and 15-8 (.652) away from home in 2018...are 24-14 in 38 road games since 8/22/17.

▶ Are 5-2-1 in their first eight road series this year and 9-3-1 in 13 road series since 8/22/17.

**RISP MANAGEMENT: Yankees pitchers** have limited opponents to a .176 BA (29-for-165) with RISP over the last 20 games (since 5/9)...their .205 opp. BA with RISP this season leads all AL staffs and is second to Washington (.191)...their .639 OPS allowed with RISP is second in MLB (Houston, .622).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.65), HR (90), HR per game (1.64), SLG (.470) and OPS (.808) and rank second in runs (311), walks (219), OBP (.338) and XBHs (212)...are third in total bases (889)...have played just 55G, tied for fewest in the Majors.

Have homered in 43 of their 55 games, trailing only Texas, Toronto and Boston (44 each) for most in the Majors

ROWING ALONG: C Austin Romine is batting .483 (14-for-29) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR and 10RBI during his career-high 10game hitting streak (since 4/30), tied for the AL's third-longest active hitting streak...is the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season (Judge, 12G from 4/1-16)...is one of four players with a double-digit hitting streak at catcher in 2018 (also the Rays' Wilson Ramos-17G, the Marlins' J.T. Realmuto-11G and the Dodgers' Yasmani Grandal-11G).

Has reached in 12-of-20PA w/ RISP this season (.600 OBP), batting 8-for-16 (.500) with 2 doubles, 11RBI and 4BB...his .50 AB/RBI ratio (56AB/16RBI) leads the Majors (min. 50AB).

JUST FOR HICKS: OF Aaron Hicks has hit .340 (17-for-50) w/9R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 8RBI and 6BB in 13G since 5/18, raising his season slash lines from .208/.319/.365 to .253/.353/.432.

- Has played in 499 career games...his next will be his 500th.
- Is hitting .352 (25-for-71) with 10XBH (4 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR) and 13RBI in 19 road games in 2018.

THE GLEY-HEY KID: Since his debut on 4/22, 2B Gleyber Torres leads MLB rookies with a .317 BA (38-for-120) and 27RBI and is tied for the lead with 9HR.

Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for May, hitting .317/.374/.659 (26-for-82) with 13R, 1 double, 9HR and 24RBI in 24G...led all rookies in BA, HR and RBI (min. 75AB).

YOUTH BEING SERVED: Yankees rookie batters lead the Majors in hits (116), doubles (29) and RBI (71) and are tied for most runs scored (60)...are one of two teams with more than 10HR from rookies (SD-28, NYY-23)...rank second with a .282 batting average (116-for-412)...rookies in MLB are hitting .233.

> 3B Miguel Andújar leads all rookies with 18 doubles and is tied for seventh among all Major Leaguers...has 20 doubles through his first 51 career games, the secondhighest such total in franchise history (DiMaggio-24) and tied for the fourth-highest total among all Major Leaguers since at least 1908 (Roy Weatherly-25, DiMaggio-24, Roy Johnson-22, Gibby Brack-20, Jorge Cantu-20).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 4, 2007: Former Yankees 3B Clete Boyer passes away at the age of 70. A member of the Yankees from 1959 through 1966, Boyer won World Series titles with the club in 1961 and 1962.

June 4, 1933: Yankees starter Johnny Allen allows a first-inning single to Philadelphia's Ed Coleman, then holds the A's hitless the rest of the way, notching a one-hit shutout in a 6-0 Yankees victory.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 5, 2006: The Yankees rout the Boston Red Sox and RHP Josh Beckett (1.1IP, 7ER), 13-5. The Bombers posted a seven-run second inning that featured a pair of three-run home runs by Jason Giambi and Andy Phillips.

June 5, 1874: Hall of Fame RHP Jack Chesbro is born in North Adams, Mass. An original member of the franchise's first team in 1903, Chesbro went 128-93 in 269 games (227 starts) with the Yankees from 1903-09. His 41-win campaign in 1904 still stands as the AL single-season record.

### YANKEES at DETROIT TIGERS

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 1-0 through the first of 7G vs. the Tigers in 2018 (one game at Comerica Park in April, a doubleheader today in Detroit and a four-game set at Yankee Stadium from 8/30-9/2)...are 4-5 in the last nine meetings but are 19-12 in 31 games since 4/7/13...Yankees pitchers have allowed more than 4R just five times in their last 28 games vs. Detroit...IN 2017: Went 3-3 against Detroit, going 1-2 at home and 2-1 at Comerica Park... scored 30R in the three wins and a total of 9R in the three losses...IN SEASON SERIES: Are 16-4-6 in the last 26 season series between the clubs (since 1992)...have not lost a season series to Detroit since going 3-4 in 2011... AT COMERICA PARK: Are 1-0 at Comerica Park in 2018... have visited Detroit in April in four of the last six seasons (2013, '15-16, '18)... are 8-2 in their last 10 games at Comerica Park and are 36-35 all-time there... have won three straight season series in Detroit for the first time since 1992-98... IN THE POSTSEASON: Are 0-3 all-time in postseason series against the Tigers (2012 ALCS, 0-4; 2011 ALDS, 2-3; 2006 ALDS, 1-3)... Detroit is one of three franchises to defeat the Yankees in three postseason series, joining the Dodgers (three wins in 11 postseason series) and Cardinals (three wins in five postseason series).
