METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 1-9 in their last 10 games... New York has lost 14 of its last 17 games...New York is 15-14 on the road this season, including 0-1 on this road trip...The Mets are 8-13 in day games.

IN THE ATL: New York is 21-11 in its last 32 games in Atlanta, but 3-5 this year...Today is the last game this season in Atlanta.

HR IN SUNTRUST: The Mets have hit 18 home runs in their first 18 games at SunTrust Park (seven in eight games this year).

NL EAST: The Mets are 14-13 vs. the NL East.

METS OFFENSE: The Mets have scored 10 runs in their last 78.0 innings...The Mets have scored three runs or fewer in eight straight games.

HOMERS: New York has 18 homers in its last 17 games, but, 14 have been solo blasts...The Mets have 27 two-strike homers this year, tied for the second-most in the National League.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has 13 extra-base hits (five doubles, two triples, six homers) and 10 RBI in his last 19 games dating to May 23...Nimmo has a career-high eight homers after hitting six combined home runs in his first two years in the majors (250 at-bats)...He has three homers in his last 10 games and six home runs in his last 19 games...Nimmo has five triples, tied for the fourth-most in the majors...Nimmo has been hit by a pitch 10 times, tied for the second-most in the majors.

ON-BASE MACHINE: Nimmo has reached base safely in 28 of his 35 starts and is fifth in the majors with a .410 on-base percentage (min. 170 PA)...He owns a .954 OPS, ranking eighth in the majors and is seventh in the NL with a .544 slugging percentage (min. 170 PA).

TODD FRAZIER: Has homered in two of his last three games...Frazier has nine go-ahead RBI this year, including Sunday's two-run homer, the most on the team...Has hit safely in four of his first five games since returning from the Disabled List on June 5.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Is 9-35 (.257) with five doubles, nine walks, four runs scored, a .413 OBP and three RBI since joining the Mets (18 games)...He played in 12 games for Atlanta this season.

STARTERS: Over its last 22 games, New York starters have a 2.67 ERA (37 earned runs/124.2 innings), the lowest in the majors during that span...Overall, the Mets are 11th in the majors with a 3.82 ERA from their starters.

BULLPEN: In its last 17 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-10 with a 6.67 ERA (45 ER/60.2 IP)...Overall, the pen has 13 wins, tied for the ninth-most in the majors and 18 losses, the most in the majors.

ROBERT GSELLMAN: Is tied for first among all major league relievers with five wins...He has allowed four runs over his last 19.0 innings (1.89 ERA), including 6.0 scoreless innings dating to May 30.

METS-BRAVES NOTES: The Mets are 10-8 at SunTrust Park after going 67-106 at Turner Field.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom has allowed one run or less in eight of his last nine starts...He had a franchise-record eight straight starts allowing one or fewer runs from April 21-June 2... He has allowed one run or less in 55 of his 120 career starts (46 percent).

RANKINGS: DeGrom leads the National League and ranks second in the majors with a 1.57 ERA...He leads the majors in ERA since April 21 (0.81 ERA - five earned runs/55.1 innings)... Justin Verlander is first (1.45 ERA)...DeGrom is third in the NL and ninth in the majors with 106 strikeouts, fifth in the NL in WHIP (1.01) and third in the majors with a .530 OPS.

deGROM IN deDAY: Jacob deGrom is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA (three earned runs/19.2 innings) in four starts during the day this year... DeGrom is 19-8 with a 1.95 ERA (58 earned runs/268.0 innings) in 42 career starts during the day...His 1.95 ERA is the lowest by any pitcher since 1913 (min. 200 innings).

KEVIN PLawecki: Has reached base safely in 13 of his 15 games this season (.383 on-base percentage).

WILMER FLORES: Went 1-3 with a double and played 5.0 innings at third base last night for St. Lucie (A) in his first minor league rehabilitation game...Flores has been on the 10-Day Disabled List since May 28 with a sore lower back.

FSL HALL OF FAME: The Florida State League announced that Brian Cole, who tragically died in an auto accident in 2001, will be inducted into the League's Hall of Fame on November 13, 2018...Cole hit .312, with 26 doubles, 15 homers, 61 RBI and 54 stolen bases in 91 games for St. Lucie in 2000.

LAST START: DeGrom today makes his 14th start of the season...Suffered his first loss of the season in his last start, June 8 vs. the Yankees...Tossed 8.0 innings, allowing three runs, two earned, on four hits while walking two and striking out eight...Yielded a go-ahead, two-run homer to Brett Gardner in the eighth inning...Ended his franchise-record streak of eight-straight starts allowing one or no runs...Was tied for the longest in the last 50 seasons (t-third-longest since 1908)...Surpassed the century mark in strikeouts in the third inning of his last start, his 76th inning of work this season, marking the quickest in his career he's reached 100 punchouts (did so in 81.0 innings last year).

VS. ATLANTA: DeGrom today faces Atlanta for the fourth this season and makes his 15th-career appearance against the club overall...Last pitched vs. the Braves on May 28 at SunTrust Park, taking a no-decision after tossing 7.0 innings of one-run ball...Is 5-3 with a 1.84 ERA (18 earned runs/88.0 innings) in 14-career starts against the Braves, including a 0.50 ERA (one earned run/18.0 innings) in three starts vs. the team this season...His 1.84 ERA is the second-best all-time vs. the Braves (min. 75.0 innings), trailing only Whit Wyatt's 1.64 ERA against the Braves...Has pitched 7.0 innings and allowed one or no runs in each of his last three starts in Atlanta...Only Tom Seaver (July 23, 1968-May 21, 1969) has a matching streak at the Braves in club history.

deGROMINANT RUN: Since April 21, deGrom is 2-1 with an MLB-best 0.81 ERA (five earned runs/55.1 innings) in nine starts...During that time, has struck out 76 and walked 17...His 35 percent strikeout rate ranks third in the majors in that span and his 0.33 HR/9 rate during the run is the lowest in the majors.

UNDER deSUN: Will make his fifth daytime start of the season this afternoon...Is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA (three earned runs/19.2 innings) during the day this season...His 1.95 career daytime ERA (58 earned runs/268.0 innings) in 42 starts is the lowest in the majors since at least 1913 (min 200 innings).

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the NL (second in majors) with a 1.57 ERA (14 earned runs/80.1 innings)...His 106 strikeouts this season are third-most in the NL and ninth-most in the majors...Ranks second in the league with a .535 opponent OPS and paces the majors with a 0.45 HR/9 rate...Ranks second in the NL in strikeout rate (33.3 percent) and FIP (2.08).

ESCAPE ARTIST: Has held opponents to a .118 (6-51) batting average with RISP this season, second-lowest in the majors and lowest in the NL...That includes a 2-26 (.077) mark with RISP and two outs...Opponents are 2-37 (.054) with 22 strikeouts with RISP in his last nine starts overall...Opponents are hitless in 12 at-bats with one sac fly and nine strikeouts with the bases loaded vs. deGrom this year.

NOTHING EXTRA...: Ten of the 58 hits deGrom has allowed this season have gone for extra bases (six doubles, four homers)...His .264 opponent slugging percentage leads the NL and is second in the majors...His 10 extra-base hits allowed are the fewest among the 105 pitchers with at least 60.0 innings pitched this season...Every other pitcher with 60.0 or more IP has allowed at least 14 XBH this season.

ESPECIALLY TO RIGHTIES: Has allowed only two XBH to the 158 righthanded hitters he has faced this season, the fewest among all pitchers who have faced at least 100 RHB this season...Opposing righties are 26-143 (.182), with one double, one home run, 56 strikeouts and an MLB-best .210 slugging percentage against deGrom...In his last seven starts, righthanded batters have gone 8-65 (.123) with a homer, six walks, 30 strikeouts and a .364 OPS.

PUNCH 'EM OUT: Has eight games with at least eight strikeouts this season, second-most in the NL...His 24 double-digit strikeout outings are tied for second-most in the NL (tied for fourth-most in the majors) within a pitcher's first 120 career games...80 of his 106 strikeouts this season are of the swinging variety (76 percent), third-most in the NL.

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in nine of his 13 starts this season, tied with Justin Verlander for the most such starts in the majors...In his 120-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 55 times (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 120-career games...Has 18-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, fourth-most in the majors since his debut...Only Jake Arrieta (25), Clayton Kershaw (22) and Chris Sale (20) have more.

TOMMOROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (2-4, 3.53)

LAST START: Took a no-decision in his last start vs. the Yankees on June 9 at Citi Field...The southpaw pitched 6.0 innings, giving up three runs, earned, on five hits, including two home runs, with four walks and six strikeouts...Was the third time in his last four starts pitching a quality start...Threw a season-high 105 pitches in the start, his most since making 112 offerings on July 3 of last season.

RECENT MATZ: Since beginning the season 1-2 with a 4.98 ERA (12 earned runs/21.2 innings) in five April starts, Matz has posted a 2.68 ERA (11 earned runs/37.0 innings) in seven starts in May and June, including a 2.05 ERA (five earned runs/22.0 innings) in his last four outings.
