AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin their nine-game, 10-day road trip today with their first game of a three-game set at Oakland (today-Wed.)...will also play 3G at Seattle (Fri.-Sun.) and 3G at Minnesota (9/10-12)...went 3-4 on their seven-game homestand.

- ▶ Are 11-5 in their last 16G and 18-9 (.667) in 27G since 8/6...are 77-42 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 86-51 (.628), have the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (94-44, .681)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held the Majors' two best records for 25 consecutive days (since the end of play on 8/9), and held (at least a share of) the two best records for 109 of the last 123 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 35G over .500, 1G shy of their season high...have been 36G over .500 three times this season (last: 86-50 at the end of play on Saturday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10.
- ▶ Are 7.5G behind Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Today, the Yankees start a stretch of playing 16-of-25 games on the road.
- ▶ Have lost only 8-of-41 series since 4/19 (25-8-8).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (53-9, .855).
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-best mark when scoring first (60-11, .845), behind Boston (63-11, .851).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to Detroit, 11-7, on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...**Yankees pitchers** allowed 17H, tied for their second-most this season (19H on 8/2 at Boston, 17H on 6/30 vs. Boston)...**RHP Lance Lynn** (3.2IP, 9H, 6ER, 1BB, 6K) started and took the loss...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 2R, 2BB) hit a solo HR in the first inning and **1B Luke Voit** (2-for-5) hit a solo homer in the fourth...**3B Miguel Andújar** (3-for-4, 3R, 1 double, 1RBI) tied a career high with 3R (also 7/21/18 vs. the Mets and 5/29/18 vs. Houston)...**2B/SS Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit a two-run single in the ninth, marking his fourth straight game with at least 2RBI...**RHP Sonny Gray** allowed just a solo HR in 4.0IP (4H, 1ER, 1BB, 3K)...**LHP Stephen Tarpley** (1.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 2BB, 1K) made his Major League debut in the ninth.

JUST DÚ IT: **3B Miguel Andújar** has reached base safely in a career-high 16 consecutive games (since 8/17), batting .348/.380/.591 (23-for-66) with 14R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 17RBI and 4BB over that span.

- ▶ His 38 doubles are the fourth-most by a Yankees rookie in a season, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936), Hideki Matsui (42 in 2003) and Bob Meusel (40 in 1920)...are the most by any Yankee since Robinson Canó had 41 in 2013...has 40 doubles through 131 career games, one of 16 players in Major League history to reach the mark within their first 131G.
- ▶ Leads all Major League rookies in BA (.301), hits (146), doubles (38), SLG (.530), RBI (76) and is tied for the most HR (23)...his 23HR are the fourth-most HRs by a rookie in club history.
- ▶ In 42G since the All-Star break, is batting .343 (57-for-166) with 32R, 11 doubles, 11HR and 37RBI...in that span, is second in the Majors in hits (Milwaukee's Christian Yelich-62).
- ▶ Is tied for 11th in the Majors with 63XBH (38 doubles, 2 triples, 23HR)...are third-most by a Yankees rookie behind Joe DiMaggio (88 in 1936) and Aaron Judge (79 in 2017).
- ▶ Is one of 24 players all-time to record at least 65XBH in his first 131 career games...among Yankees, trails only Joe DiMaggio (88).
- ▶ Since 7/28-G2, is hitting .441/.444/.824 (15-for-34) with 4 doubles, 3HR, 24RBI and 1BB with RISP.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** have hit a Major League-leading 224HR...is the eighth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 265HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

- ▶ Have hit 22HR in the last 11G and 49HR in the last 27G (since 8/6).

SUMMER BREAK: On Sunday, the Yankees completed a stretch of 30-of-37 games against teams currently under .500 (7/26-9/2), going 22-15, including 21-9 vs. teams under .500 and 1-6 vs. teams which are .500-or-better...**rank fourth in the Majors this season with a 55-28 (.663) record vs. teams under .500.**

- ▶ Starting today, the Yankees will play 16 of their final 25 games against teams above .500...13 of their 16 remaining road games are against teams with winning records.

FAN FAVORITES: With a total attendance of 3,104,802 fans through 72 home dates in 2018, the Yankees have surpassed 3,000,000 for the Major League-record 20th consecutive season (1999-2018).

- ▶ Their home attendance through 72 home gates in 2018 has seen an increase of 7.0% over their mark from their first 72 home gates in 2017.
- ▶ The Yankees have also set a record for the current Yankee Stadium with 22 home sellouts in 2018.
- ▶ The Yankees rank second in the Majors with an average home attendance of 43,122 per date (behind Los Angeles-NL, 46,884), and their total home attendance also ranks second to the Dodgers (3,375,618)...also lead the AL in average road attendance at 31,970.

GLEYBER DAY WEEKEND: **INF Gleyber Torres** hit a two-run single in the ninth inning of Sunday's loss vs. Detroit...has 2RBI in four consecutive games, tied for the longest multi-RBI streak by a Yankee this season (also Romine and Gregorius) and tied for the seventh-longest such streak in Yankees history.

- ▶ Has 22HR this season, the third-most among MLB rookies...has homered in 2-of-4, 3-of-7 and 4-of-10.
- ▶ Has reached safely multiple times in 6-of-7 games, batting .478/.571/.870 (11-for-23) with 3R, 3HR, 10RBI, 5BB and 1SB.
- ▶ Is 6-for-12 with 13RBI with the bases loaded.
- ▶ Has multiple hits in 3-of-5, 5-of-10 and 8-of-15...is batting .407/.492/.630 (22-for-54) with 9R, 4HR, 13RBI, 9BB and 2SB in his last 15G (since 8/18).

BEST OF THE WEST: The Yankees are a Major League-best 19-7 (.731) vs. the AL West this season...is tied for the second-best record by an AL team vs. an AL division this season (Oakland, 24-7, .774 vs. AL Central; Houston, 19-7, .731 vs. AL Central).

- ▶ This series is the third in a stretch of five straight vs. AL Central and AL West opponents...will finish the season with five consecutive series vs. AL East teams.

CC THE STOPPER: Since the start of 2017, **LHP CC Sabathia** is 12-0 with a 2.81 ERA (125.0IP, 39ER) in 22 regular season starts following a Yankees loss (18-4 team record)...this does not include his start on 5/18 at Kansas City (L, 5.0IP, 4ER); at the time, the Yankees had not yet lost the completion of their suspended game on 5/15 at Washington.

HICKSIE STICKS: **CF Aaron Hicks** hit a solo HR in the first inning on Sunday...has a career-high 24HR this season (408AB) after hitting just 23HR in his first two seasons as a Yankee (628AB).

- ▶ Has homered in 2-of-3, 3-of-6 and 4-of-10.
- ▶ Drew 2BB on Sunday, giving him 76BB this season and a Major League-leading 35BB since the All-Star break.

SAINT 'LOUIS': **1B Luke Voit** hit a solo HR in the fourth inning on Sunday, his fifth HR as a Yankee...since making his Yankees debut on 8/2, is batting .333/.404/.627 (17-for-51) with 10R, 5HR, 12RBI and 6BB.

GOT YOUR NUMBER: **RF Andrew McCutchen** has reached base safely in 12-of-21 PA vs. Trevor Cahill, batting .429/.571/.857 (6-for-14) with 3 doubles, 1HR, 5BB, 1HP and 1SF.

LABOR OF LOVE: The Yankees have gone 38-28 on Labor Day in the Expansion Era (since 1969)...the Yankees will be playing on the road on Labor Day for the second straight season, third time in the last 10 seasons (since 2009) and sixth time in the last 17 years (since 2002).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 3, 1995: Tony Fernandez becomes the 10th Yankee to hit for the cycle in a 10-9, 10-inning loss vs. Oakland. Fernandez completes the cycle with a leadoff double in the bottom of the ninth and comes around to score the tying run.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 4, 1993: Jim Abbott becomes just the third Yankees left-hander to throw a no-hitter, beating the Indians 4-0 at Yankee Stadium. It marked only the fourth no-hitter in Yankee Stadium history and was the club's seventh overall.

Sept. 4, 1923: "Sad" Sam Jones throws the second no-hitter in franchise history during a 2-0 win at the Philadelphia Athletics' Shibe Park (9.0IP, 1BB, 0K).

YANKEE DOODLES

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 86-51

- Was ejected in the fifth inning of 8/31 win vs. Detroit by HP Umpire Nic Lentz (arguing balls and strikes during Torres at-bat)...served a one-game suspension for the incident on Sunday vs. Detroit...was his third career managerial ejection (also 5/22 at Texas, balls and strikes and 7/14 at Cleveland, balls and strikes).
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/7G (3x)

- Leads all rookies with a .301 BA, 146H, 38 doubles, 76RBI, 63XBH and 45 multi-hit games, is tied for the lead with 23HR and is second with 74R.
- Of his 23HR, 11 have tied the game (4) or given the Yankees the lead (7)...seven of his HRs have come in the seventh inning or later.
- Over his last 50G, has hit .339 (65-for-192) with 37R, 13 doubles, 11HR and 37RBI.
- Tied a career high with 3R and was 3-for-4 with 1 double, 1RBI and 1BB in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit...has 12H in last 33AB and 35RBI in last 35G...**on homestand** was 7-for-26 (.269) with 7R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI and 3BB in 7GS (6-3B/1-DH).
- Hit game-winning two-run HR (#17) in the seventh and was 2-for-4 with 2R on 8/11 vs. Texas...was his fourth career go-ahead hit in the seventh inning or later and second in a week (also an RBI single in the 13th on 8/7 at Chicago-AL).
- Has 63XBH this season, third-most in a season by a rookie in Yankees history behind Joe DiMaggio (88 in 1936) and Aaron Judge (79 in 2017)...has 65XBH in 131G, the second-most XBH through 131G in Yankees history (Joe DiMaggio-88XBH)...is one of seven players in Baseball history with 14G with at least 2XBH within his first 131G and trails only Joe DiMaggio (20), Johnny Frederick (19), Ted Williams (17) and Evan Longoria (16).
- Hit 12HR before the All-Star break, becoming the fifth Yankees rookie with at least 10HR before the break, joining Aaron Judge (30HR, 2017), Gleyber Torres (15HR, 2018), Joe DiMaggio (11HR, 1936) and Nick Johnson (11HR, 2002)—credit: *Elias*.
- Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for June, his first career monthly award.

#33 GREG BIRD—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/8G

- Of his 51H this season, 26 have gone for extra bases (14 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR)...of his 11HR, four have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.
- Was 0-for-1 in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit, pinch-hitting in the eighth...has 3H in last 39AB...**on homestand** was 1-for-8 with 1 double in 3G/2GS at 1B...was 1-for-3 with 1 double in Wednesday's loss vs. Chicago-AL, snapping an 0-for-21 stretch with a third-inning double.
- Hit grand slam (#11)—his second career grand slam (also 7/11/18 at Baltimore) and second homer in as many games—in 8/19 win vs. Toronto.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/29 (retro. to 3/26) - 5/25 recovering from right ankle surgery (missed the Yankees' first 47G of the season).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G (2x)

- Six of his 12HR this season and 12-of-20HR since 6/23/17 have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead...since 2017, the Yankees are 24-4 when he homers.
- Has 254SB, the third-most in franchise history...has 3SB in his last 15G after stealing just one base over his prior 30G (7/12-8/17)...stole his 252nd base on 8/18 vs. Toronto, surpassing Willie Randolph (251).
- Was 0-for-4 in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit and has 7H in last 37AB...**on homestand** was 4-for-23 (.174) with 3R, 1 double, 1 triple, 1HR, 2RBI and 1BB in 7G/6GS in LF.
- Has 14 career leadoff HR, tied with Frank Crosetti for sixth most in franchise history...has three leadoff HR this season (last on 7/7 at Toronto).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#29 ADEINY HECHAVARRIA—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/9G

- Started at SS and was 0-for-3 in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit before being removed for PH (Bird) in the eighth...made his Yankees debut as ninth-inning defensive replacement in RF in Saturday's win vs. Detroit...was added to the Yankees' active roster prior to the game.
- Was acquired by the Yankees along with cash considerations from Pittsburgh in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations on Friday.
- Hit .254 (66-for-260) with 31R, 11 doubles, 4HR and 29RBI in 76 combined games with Tampa Bay (61G) and Pittsburgh (15G) this season...played all 76G/69GS at SS...was acquired by the Pirates from the Rays on 8/6/18 with cash considerations in exchange for RHP Matt Seelinger...is signed through 2018.
- In his career, has played for the Blue Jays (2012), Marlins (2013-17), Rays (2017-18), Pirates (2018) and Yankees (2018)...has appeared at SS, 3B and 2B.
- Was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by Toronto in 2010.

#31 AARON HICKS—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 4G/6G

- Has set career highs with 24HR, 42XBH and 65RBI this season (previous: 15HR, 33XBH, 52RBI in 2017)...has 10HR in 30G as a leadoff hitter and 14HR in 86G in all other spots this season...has 18HR in his last 67G (hit 6HR in his first 49G).
- Has 35BB in 40G since the All-Star break...has reached safely in 68 of his last 157PA (.433 OBP -- 35H, 32BB, 1HP).
- Hit solo-HR (#24) in the first and was 1-for-3 with 2R and 2BB in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit...has 6H in last 19AB...**on homestand** was 6-for-25 (.240) with 7R, 3HR, 4RBI and 5BB in 7GS in CF...hit eighth-inning game-tying two-run HR (#22) in Tuesday's win vs. Chicago-AL...was his first game-tying HR since 8/17/15 at Yankee Stadium w/ Minnesota.
- Drew 1BB in 10 consecutive starts from 7/15-8/2 (13BB total), the longest such streak by a Yankee since Brett Gardner's 10-start streak from 8/25-9/5/10 (14BB).
- Collected his first career 3HR game in 7/1 win vs. Boston...was the first by a Yankee since Alex Rodriguez on 7/25/15 at Minnesota...was the first Yankees leadoff hitter ever to hit 3HR in a game.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Minnesota for C John Ryan Murphy on 11/11/15.

#66 KYLE HIGASHIOKA—C Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/4G (2x)

- Was ninth-inning defensive replacement at C in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit (did not bat)...is hitless in last 10AB...**on homestand** was 0-for-6 with 1BB in 3G/2GS at C.
- Threw out runner trying to steal second to end 8/21 win at Miami in the bottom of 12th.
- Is his second stint with the Yankees this season (6/25-7/19, 7/24-present).
- With solo HRs on 7/1, 7/3 and 7/4, became the second Yankee in franchise history to have his first three Major League hits go for HRs, joining Alfonso Soriano (from 9/24/99-4/9/00)...was the first Major Leaguer to do so since Colorado's Trevor Story (first 4H were HRs) in April 2016.
- Hit solo HR (#1) off Price—the first hit and HR of his Major League career—and was 1-for-4 in 7/1 win vs. Boston...snapped an 0-for-22 stretch to begin his career, the longest drought by a Yankee to start his career since RHP Hal Reniff (0-for-25 from 1961-64)...was the first Yankee to homer for his first MLB hit since Tyler Austin and Aaron Judge hit back-to-back HRs in their first PAs on 8/13/16 vs. Tampa Bay.
- In 52G with the RailRiders, hit .198 (37-for-187) with 15R, 9 doubles, 5HR and 22RBI.
- The 2008 seventh-round Yankees draft pick made his Major League debut in 2017 (0-for-18) after spending parts of 10 seasons in the minors.

#26 ANDREW McCUTCHEN—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/13G

- Was 0-for-4 with 1R and 1HP in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit...made his Yankees debut in Saturday's win vs. Detroit, starting in RF, leading off and going 0-for-3 with 1HP...was added to the Yankees' active roster prior to the game.
- Was acquired by the Yankees along with cash considerations from San Francisco in exchange for INF Abiatal Avelino and RHP Juan De Paula on Friday.
- Hit .255/.357/.415 (123-for-482) with 65R, 28 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 55RBI, 73BB and 13SB in 130 games in his first season with the Giants...played 128 games (127 starts) in right field, committing just 2E in 255TC (.992)...was acquired by the Giants from Pittsburgh with cash considerations in exchange for RHP Kyle Crick, OF Bryan Reynolds and international bonus pool money on 1/15/18...is under contract through the 2018 season.
- Is a five-time NL All-Star (2011-15) and won the 2013 National League Most Valuable Player Award and 2015 Roberto Clemente Award.
