HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 22-11 record is tied for the second-best 33-game start in club history (also: 2008), behind 23-10 in 2000...their best 34-game starts are 24-10 in 2000 and 22-12 in 2002, '08.
- ♦ The D-backs boast the best record in the NL (22-11, .667) and third best in the Majors behind the Red Sox (24-9; .727) and Yankees (23-10, .697).
 - HOME: Red Sox (11-4, .733), Yankees (13-5, .722), Phillies (11-5, .688), Cardinals (11-5, .688), **D-backs (12-6, .667)**, Pirates (10-5, .667)
 - ROAD: Angels (12-3, .800), Red Sox (13-5, .722), Astros (11-5, .688), **D-backs (10-5, .667)**, Mets (10-5, .667), Yankees (10-5, .667)
- ♦ **Matt Koch**, in 3 starts (team is 2-1) this season, is 1-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER in 17.0 IP), .200 opp. average, 7 walks, 11 strikeouts.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 4-3, vs. Astros as **A.J. Pollock's** walk-off, bases-loaded, 2-out single to left field scored **Deven Marrero**.
 - It was Pollock's second career walk-off hit...the other was a walk-off homer on May 26, 2014 vs. Padres.
- ♦ **David Peralta** had a second-inning solo homer and fifth-inning RBI single.
- ♦ **Brad Boxberger** got his first win as a D-back.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** tossed 1.1 scoreless frames and stranded 2 inherited runners.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** allowed 1 run over 5.2 frames...the D-backs are 6-0 in his home Interleague starts and his team has won his last 8 home Interleague games.

- ♦ **Matt Koch** goes again Justin Verlander today after facing Clayton Kershaw in his last start on May 1.
- ♦ Courtesy STATS LLC: Koch is the first pitcher to face different MVPs in consecutive starts since the White Sox's Ed Lopat in 1947, who faced the Tigers' Hal Newhouser on September 23 (4-1 loss; CG, 9.0 IP, 9 H, 4 R-3 ER, 4 BB, 4 K) and St. Louis Browns' Dizzy Dean on September 28 (5-2 win on the road; CG, 9.0 IP,).
- ♦ In the latter of Lopat's 2 starts, Dizzy Dean, who had been retired since 1941 and was a radio broadcaster for the Browns, was critical of the 59-95 club and was quoted as saying "Dog-gone it, I can pitch better than 9 out of the 10 guys on this staff!"...Browns GM Bill DeWitt called Dean on his bluff for the final game of the season, and he threw 4.0 shutout innings.

ASTROS & INTERLEAGUE

- ♦ The D-backs split the 4-game home-and-road series vs. Astros last season.
- ♦ The D-backs went 12-8 (.600) in Interleague in 2017, tied with the Cubs for second in the NL behind the Dodgers (16-4; .800).
- ♦ The D-backs had a club-record 12 Interleague wins last season, besting their 11 wins in 2002, '03, '13, '15.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .313 (31-for-99) hitter with 9 doubles, 6 home runs and 16 RBI in 29 games vs. Astros.
 - Over his last 25 Interleague games, is hitting .318 (28-for-88)/.406 OBP/.523 SLG with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 13 RBI and 13 walks.
- ♦ **David Peralta**, in his last 12 Interleague games, is hitting .326 (14-for-43), 3 doubles, 3 homers, 7 RBI and 3 walks.

EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** was named NL Player of the Month for April (his first monthly honors) after ranking among NL leaders in March/April in home runs (T-1st, 9), slugging pct. (2nd, .670), OPS (2nd, 1.021) extra-base hits (2nd, 19) and RBI (3rd, 24).
- ♦ In his last 16 games, is hitting .333 (21-for-63)/1.107 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7 homers, 15 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders in slugging pct. (1st, .653), extra-base hits (2nd, 21), total bases (2nd, 79), RBI (3rd, 27), home runs (T-3rd, 10), stolen bases (T-4th, 8) and OPS (5th, 1.004).

BOXBERGER LOCKING DOWN THE BACK END

- ♦ **Brad Boxberger** is a perfect 10-for-10 in save opportunities as his 10 saves are third in the Majors behind Edwin Díaz/SEA (13) and Wade Davis/CHI (13).
- ♦ Boxberger is the lone reliever with 10+ save opps who has been perfect (5 other relievers of 5+ saves have been perfect).
- ♦ Has held the Astros scoreless in 10 of 13 career games, going 2-1 with 3 saves, a 1.46 ERA (2 ER in 12.1 IP), .167 opponent average with 17 strikeouts.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

- ♦ **David Peralta** is hitting .563 (9-for-16) with 3 doubles, 11 RBI and 3 walks with runners in scoring position.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed**, with runners in scoring position, is hitting .381 (8-for-21) with 3 homers, 14 RBI and 2 walks.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is hitting .333 (9-for-27) with 4 doubles, 15 RBI and 5 walks with runners in scoring position.

SNAKEBITES

- ♦ The D-backs' 106 extra-base hits are third in the NL behind the Braves (120) and Dodgers (107).
- ♦ The D-backs' 34 go-ahead RBI are third in the NL behind the Brewers (40) and Pirates (35).
- ♦ D-backs leadoff hitters are batting .288 (38-for-132) with 9 hits, 1 triple, 6 homers, 21 RBI and 16 walks...among NL teams, they rank second in average (.288), third in slugging pct. (.508), fourth in on-base pct. (.371) and extra-base hits (16)

#BRINGINTHEBEARD

- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has held opponents scoreless in 8 straight games (8.0 IP) with a .077 opponent average and 9 strikeouts.
- ♦ Has held opponents scoreless in 9 of 10 home games with 0.79 ERA (1 ER in 11.1 IP), .132 opponent average and 13 strikeouts.
- ♦ Among NL relievers at home since 2017 (min. 25 G), ranks fifth with 50.1 innings and 0.85 WHIP, seventh with a 5.20 K/BB ratio (52 K:10 BB), ninth with a 1.43 ERA, 13th with 52 strikeouts.

FOUR SCORE AND MANY WINS AGO

- ♦ The D-backs are 17-1 (.944) this season when scoring 4+ runs, the best mark in the Majors ahead of the Angels (16-2, .889), Yankees (22-3, .875), Giants (16-3, .842), Mets (14-3, .824) and Phillies (14-3, .824).
- ♦ The D-backs have won 12 straight games when scoring 4+ runs, 20 of its last 21 games (since Sept. 26, 2017), 24 of its last 26 (since Sept. 13, 2017) and 34 of its last 39 (since Aug. 22, 2017).

- ♦ The D-backs were the first team in the Majors to win their first 9 series since the 2001 Mariners (won 9) and the 1978 Tigers before that as well as the first NL club to do so since the 1907 Cubs (won a Major League-record 11 series) [Source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- ♦ The 9 straight series wins tied a club record for the third time (also: Sept. 3-Oct. 3, 1999 and July 20-Aug. 19, 2007).

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GODLEY (4-2, 3.41)

- ♦ His 4 wins are tied with teammate Patrick Corbin and 7 others for the second most in the NL (Max Scherzer/WSH, 6).
- ♦ In his most recent start, on May 2, suffered a 2-1 loss vs. Dodgers, allowing 1 run in 6.0 innings.
- ♦ In 7 career starts vs. Dodgers, is 2-3 with a 3.92 ERA (18 ER in 41.1 IP), a .232 opponent average and 32 strikeouts.
- ♦ In 5 starts vs. NL West opponents this season, is 3-2 with a 2.76 ERA (9 ER in 29.1 IP), a .231 opponent average and 29 strikeouts.
