## NEW YORK YANKEES (56-29) at TORONTO BLUE JAYS (41-46)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will play the second game of their three-game set vs. the Blue Jays today after dropping the series opener...are 0-1 on their 11-game road trip to finish the "first half", which also includes four games at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and four games at Cleveland (7/12-15)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ At 56-29 (.659), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (60-29, .674).
- ▶ Are 27G over .500, 1G shy of their season high...were 28G over at the end of play on 6/21 (50-22) and 7/4 (56-28).
- ▶ Are 2.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East... have been in second place for five straight days...the lead alternated on five straight days from 6/28-7/2 and has changed hands 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (*at least a share of*) the two best records in the Majors on 64 of the last 65 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 43-27, the Yankees are 47-20).
- ▶ Are 19-3-2 over their last 24 series (since 4/19), winning three straight and six of their last seven...are 47-20 in their last 67G...are 40-5 (.889) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 36-5 (.878) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 20-15 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees dropped the first game of their three-game series at Toronto, 6-2, on Friday...**RHP Sonny Gray** (2.0IP, 6H, 5ER, 2BB, 4K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP) took his third straight loss...was tied for the second-shortest start of his career (tossed 1.0IP on 9/28/16 after being reinstated from the D.L.)...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) drove in both runs, hitting a solo HR in the third and drawing a bases-loaded walk in the fifth...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5, 1SB) recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game... also recorded his 249th career stolen base, tying Hal Chase (249) for fourth place on the Yankees' all-time stolen bases list...**RHP David Hale** allowed 1ER in 5.2IP of relief (5H, 1BB, 1K), the longest appearance by a Yankees reliever since David Huff on 9/2/13 vs. Chicago-AL (5.2IP).

**ALL THAT'S LEFT:** The Yankees will face a left-handed starter tonight for the fifth time in their last 8G (since 6/29)...are 9-1 in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers since 5/25...are a Major League-best 21-6 (.778) when they face a left-handed starter in 2018.

- ▶ **Yankees batters** are hitting .255/.342/.488 vs. left-handers in 2018...their .830 OPS vs. southpaws leads the Majors, ahead of Atlanta (.796)...have an MLB-best 47HR and 17.21 AB/HR ratio against lefties.
- ▶ **DH Giancarlo Stanton** is batting .345/.404/.759 (30-for-87) with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 10HR vs. left-handed pitchers this season...is 9-for-23 (.391) since 6/16...his AL-high 10HR vs. LHP are tied for the second-most in the Majors (Christian Villanueva-11HR, Nolan Arenado-10HR), while his 1.163 OPS is fifth-highest...since 1961, his .644 career SLG vs. left-handers is tops in the Majors (min. 1,000PA).

**NORTH OF THE BORDER:** This series marks the Yankees final of three trips to Toronto this season...have gone 4-3 at Rogers Centre in 2018, matching their highest single-season win total in Toronto over the last eight seasons (2010-17)...last had more than four wins at Rogers Centre in 2009 (6-3).

**FAN FAVORITES:** The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 34,115 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

- ▶ Through 46 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

**SEVY SEASON:** **RHP Luis Severino** leads the Majors with 13 wins...his 1.98 ERA is the best in the AL and the second-lowest in the Majors (Jacob deGrom-1.79)...rank sixth in the AL and ninth in the Majors with 138K...his 4.4 WAR is the fourth-highest among Major League pitchers (FanGraphs).

- ▶ Needs 10K to reach 500 career strikeouts...would be only the third Yankees pitcher to record 500K with the club before his 25th birthday, joining Al Downing (644K) and Lefty Gomez (511K)...his nine starts with at least 10K since the beginning of 2017 are tied for the third-most in the AL in that span.
- ▶ With a win today, would become the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record 14 wins prior to the All-Star break, joining Mel Stottlemire (14-7 in 24GS in 1969), Whitey Ford (16-2 in 21GS in 1961) and Lefty Gomez (14-2 in 19G/17GS in 1934)...would also be only the fourth pitcher in the Majors to record at least 14 wins prior to the All-Star break in the last 16 seasons (since 2003), joining Los Angeles-NL's Clayton Kershaw (14-2 in 19GS in 2017), Chicago-AL's Chris Sale (14-3 in 18GS in 2016) and Colorado's Ubaldo Jimenez (15-1 in 18GS in 2010).
- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 straight starts, tied for the longest active streak in the Majors and the tied for the second-longest streak by a Yankees starter in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 20 start streak from 8/9/1910-5/27/1911.

**JUST FOR HICKS:** **CF Aaron Hicks** hit his 16th HR of the season on Friday at Toronto, setting a new career high in HR (previous: 15HR in 2017)...has 5HR in his last 5G, 6HR in his last 9G and 9HR in his last 16G...has 10HR in his last 19G (since 6/14) and after hitting 6HR in his first 49G of the season (3/29-6/13)...his 10HR since 6/14 are tied with Colorado's Nolan Arenado for the most in the Majors in that span.

**PEN PALS:** **Yankees relievers** allowed only 1ER in 6.0IP on Friday (5H, 1BB, 1K)...their 2.70 ERA is the third-lowest bullpen ERA in the Majors (Arizona-2.51; Houston-2.64)...since 4/21, have posted a 2.16 ERA, the best in the Majors in that span (next: Houston-2.61).

- ▶ Over his last 12G (since 5/25), **RHP Chad Green** has posted a career-best 15.1-inning scoreless stretch (11H, 3BB, 17K).
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 3H with 28K in 16.2 scoreless innings (11BB, 2HP) over his last 17 appearances (since 5/27)...is his second-longest streak of scoreless appearances, behind an 18-game scoreless stretch from 7/8-8/19/15 (20.1IP).

**ROAD WARRIORS:** Despite Friday's loss, the Yankees are still 20-12 in their last 32 road games...are 23-16 (.590) away from home in 2018, the Majors' fourth-best road mark (Houston-.696, Boston-.653, Seattle-.605).

**STANTON ISLAND:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is the first Yankee to hit at least 20HR before the All-Star break *during his first season with the club* since Mark Teixeira in 2009 (21HR before the break)...is the first Yankee to do so *after being traded to the team* since Alex Rodriguez in 2004 (22HR)...is the only active player with at least 20HR before the break in each of the last five seasons.

**FIRST HALF FRENZY:** The Yankees have five players with at least 15HR prior to the All-Star break for the first time in franchise history (Judge-24HR, Stanton-21HR, Gregorius-15HR, Hicks-16HR and Torres-15HR).

- ▶ The Yankees are the Majors' only club to have five players each with at least 15HR and the first club to do so since the 2008 Florida Marlins...join Boston and Houston as the only three teams to have six players each with at least 40RBI (Gregorius, Hicks, Judge, Sánchez, Stanton and Torres).

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** On Friday, **LHP Justus Sheffield** was named to the 2018 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game...has combined with Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre to go 3-5 with a 2.49 ERA (79.2IP, 22ER) with 88K in 15 games (14 starts) this season.

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 7-4 vs. the Blue Jays in 2018...will play the 12th of 19 games vs. Toronto today (10G in the Bronx, 9G at Toronto)...**IN 2017:** Went 9-10 vs. Toronto in 2017, including 5-4 in the Bronx and 4-6 at Rogers Centre...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost the last three season series, their first streak of consecutive season series losses to Toronto since 1990-94 (9-10 in 2017, 7-12 in 2016, 6-13 in 2015)...have still won 12 of the last 17 season series since 2001 (also went 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...had double-digit losses vs. the Blue Jays just twice in 38 seasons from 1977-2014...**AT ROGERS CENTRE:** Are 4-3 at Rogers Centre in 2018...went 4-6 in Toronto in 2017...are 1-6-2 in their last nine series up north...won a two-game series on 6/5-6/18 their first series win since 8/14-16/15...are 2-9-2 in 13 series since 6/23/14...have a sub-.500 record at Rogers Centre in each of the last eight seasons (2010-17), the club's longest active streak of losing seasons at any park...are 33-48 at Rogers Centre since the start of 2010.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (13-2, 1.98 ERA)

**RHP Luis Severino** will make his 19th start of the season today vs. Toronto...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...**his 13 wins lead the Majors**...needs 10K to reach 500 career strikeouts...his 1.98 ERA is the best in the AL and the second-lowest in the Majors (Jacob deGrom-1.79)...is sixth in the AL and ninth in the Majors with 138K...earned his 13th win of the season with 6.2 scoreless innings on Sunday Night Baseball vs. the Red Sox (2H, 3BB, 9K)...did not earn his 13th win in 2017 until his 29th start (9/15/17 vs. Baltimore)...**has a 13.2 scoreless inning streak**...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 straight starts, tied for the longest active streak in the Majors and the longest streak by a Yankees starter since Ron Guidry's 15GS from 4/8-6/22/78...the only Yankee with a longer streak in franchise history is Russ Ford (20) over two seasons from 1910-11...**the Yankees are 16-2 in his starts, the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018**...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

**LAST START:** On Sunday Night Baseball vs. the Red Sox, tossed 6.2 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 6K) to earn his Major League-leading 13th win...marked his sixth scoreless start of the season, including two straight and three of his last four...has not allowed a run in consecutive starts for the first time in his career, becoming the first Yankee to record back-to-back scoreless starts since Masahiro Tanaka in two starts from 8/19-24/16.

**STRIKEOUT MACHINE:** Has 490 career strikeouts...would be only the third Yankees pitcher to record 500K with the club before his 25th birthday, joining Al Downing (644K) and Lefty Gomez (511K).

**ROAD RULES:** Is 5-2 with a 2.39 ERA (52.2IP, 14ER) in eight road starts this season...has thrown at least 5.0IP in his last 23 regular season road starts since the start of 2017.

- Has at least 6K in 23 consecutive road starts (since the start of 2017), the fourth-longest streak in Major League history (see chart on right)...is triple the length of the next-longest streak in Yankees history (eight by Roger Clemens and Melido Perez).
- Is 9-2 with a 1.74 ERA (93.1IP, 67H, 20R/18ER, 23BB, 111K, 4HR, 2HP) in 14 road starts since the 2017 All-Star break.
- On 4/10 at Boston, had his streak of consecutive road starts with 1R-or-fewer snapped at seven (7/15/17-3/29/18)...was tied for the AL's second-longest streak of road starts with one-or-zero runs since 1908, behind Minnesota's Johan Santana (eight starts from 7/17-9/29/04)...tied Al Downing (5/14-9/14/68) for the longest streak by a Yankee in that span.
- Is 15-8 with a 2.82 ERA (216.2IP, 68ER) in 41 career road appearances (34 starts)...among active pitchers with at least 25 road starts, his 2.82 ERA ranks second behind Clayton Kershaw (2.73)...is 13-8 with a 2.94 ERA (205.0IP, 67ER) in the 34 starts.

**WHAT A RUN:** Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 25-of-49 starts since the start of 2017, the most such starts in the Majors in that span.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Is the first Yankee to win 13 games before the All-Star break since CC Sabathia (13-4) in 2011...is the fourth Yankees pitcher (fifth time) in 60 seasons (since 1959) to win 13 games in the team's first 81 team games, joining Tommy John (13 in 1980), Ron Guidry (13 in 1978) and Whitey Ford (13 in 1963, 16 in 1961).

- Did not earn his 13th win in 2017 until his 29th start (9/15/17 vs. Baltimore)...his 13 wins are one shy of his career high (14-6 in 31GS in 2017).
- With a win today, would become the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record 14 wins prior to the All-Star break, joining Mel Stottlemyre (14-7 in 24GS in 1969), Whitey Ford (16-2 in 21GS in 1961), and Lefty Gomez (14-2 in 19G/17GS in 1934)...would also be only the fourth pitcher in the Majors to record at least 14 wins prior to the All-Star break in the last 16 seasons (since 2003), joining Los Angeles-NL's Clayton Kershaw (14-2 in 19GS in 2017), Chicago-AL's Chris Sale (14-3 in 18GS in 2016) and Colorado's Ubaldo Jimenez (15-1 in 18GS in 2010).
- The Yankees are 16-2 in his starts, the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018
- Has won four straight starts, tying the longest streak of his career (also won four straight from 7/20-8/6/17).

**2018:** Leads the Majors with 13 wins this season...his 1.98 ERA is the best in the AL and the second-lowest in the Majors (Jacob deGrom-1.79)...is sixth in the AL and ninth in the Majors with 138K...his 4.5 WAR is the fourth-highest among Major League pitchers (FanGraphs)...his .195 opponents' BA is the fifth-lowest in the AL and seventh in the Majors...his 0.95 WHIP is fourth in the AL and fifth in the Majors.
