WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost three of the last four games and 12 of the last 17 as they continue a season-long, 10-game trip tonight with the series opener at Cincinnati.
- RHP James Shields is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are looking to win consecutive road games for the first time since 6/5-2-6 at Minnesota.
- The Sox won yesterday's finale at Texas, 10-5, after losing the first two games of the series by a combined 24-7 margin.
- Following this three-game series at Great American Ball Park, the White Sox will conclude the trip with four games at Houston before ending the first half with a five-game, six-day homestand vs. St. Louis (7/10-11) and Kansas City (7/13-15).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) from 6/22-28 and 0-3 on their last trip to Cleveland from 6/18-20.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has lost five of its last six road games by a combined 53-22 margin, allowing 41 runs in the last four.
- The White Sox are 1-6 in their seven interleague road games this season, scoring two runs or less five times.
- The Sox are 8-42 (.190) with RISP and have left 31 runners on base over the last four games.
- James Shields tonight will pitch in the 35th different ballpark of his career, and 29th among the active MLB parks.
- Avisail García owns a career-high matching, 11-game hitting streak ... he is hitting .354 (17-48) with two doubles, two triples, three home runs, seven RBI and four multihit efforts.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox snapped a 2-2 tie by scoring five runs on five hits in the fifth inning en route to a 10-5 victory at Texas.
- Adam Engel reached first base on a strikeout with one out in the fifth to start the five-run frame ... Tim Anderson (double), Avisail García (single), Matt Davidson (double) and Kevan Smith all recorded RBI hits to give the Sox a five-run lead.
- Reynaldo López earned his fourth win after allowing two runs on seven hits with three walks and six strikeouts over 6.1 IP ... he earned consecutive wins for the first time this season.
- Joakim Soria (1.2 scoreless IP) earned his 12th save in his 14th consecutive scoreless appearance dating back to 5/30.
- García recorded four hits, including two doubles and a triple ... Chicago's 1-4 hitters combined to go 11-18 with four doubles, two triples, eight RBI and eight runs scored.

UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY

- James Shields tonight is making his first career appearance at Great American Ball Park ... it marks his 29th active ballpark to pitch in (missing Atlanta's SunTrust Park), and 35th of his career.
- He is one of seven active pitchers to appear in at least 34 different ballparks ... the others: Bartolo Colon (45), Jon Lester (35), Anibal Sánchez (35), Johnny Cueto (34), Cole Hamels (34) and Jason Hammel (34).
- In addition to the 28 active ballparks, Shields has pitched at the Ballpark at Disney (Orlando; with Tampa Bay), Metrodome (Minnesota), old Yankee Stadium, RFK Stadium (Washington), Sun Life Stadium (Miami) and Turner Field (Atlanta).

BIG GAME JAMES

- James Shields has worked 6.0-plus IP in 12 of his last 13 starts, including 7.0-plus IP six times ... nine of the outings have been quality, and he has allowed three runs or less nine times.
- Shields is allowing 1.01 home runs per 9.0 IP in 2018, down from 2.08 in 2017 ... he has lowered his opponents average from .253 to .228, and his WHIP from 1.44 to 1.24.
- He needs four strikeouts to pass Tim Wakefield (2,156) for sole possession of 67th place on the all-time list.

JOSÉ GOES STREAKING

- José Abreu owns a 19-game, interleague hitting streak, the second-longest by a White Sox behind Paul Konerko (20).
- His streak is the longest active in MLB during IL play, and the longest since Joe Mauer and Mike Trout from 2013-14 (20).
- Abreu is batting .400/.418/.773 (30-75) with eight doubles, one triple, six home runs, 15 RBI and nine multihit efforts during the hitting streak ... the streak started on 7/26/17 at the Cubs.

INTERNATIONAL SIGNINGS

- The White Sox today announced the following international signings: Cuba natives 1B/DH Alberto Bernal, INF Harold Diaz and INF Bryan Ramos, and Venezuela native C Luis Pineda.
- Diaz will spend the 2018 season with the Dominican Summer League White Sox ... the other three players are signed for 2019.

WHITE SOX VS. CINCINNATI REDS

- The White Sox and Reds are meeting for the first time since 2015, and first at Great American Ball Park since 2009.
- Chicago has won four of the last five games and 13 of the last 15 ... it won nine straight from 6/5/00-6/18/06.
- The Sox won two of three vs. the Reds in the last meeting from 5/9-10 in Chicago, and earned a series victory in the last matchup in Cincinnati from 6/19-21/09.
- Chicago leads the all-time series, 16-4, going 6-2 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 10-2 in Cincinnati (5-1 at GABP).

WINDY AND QUEEN CITY CONNECTIONS

- White Sox OF Adam Engel (1991) and first-base coach Daryl Boston (1963) were both born in Cincinnati.
- Reds interim pitching coach Danny Darwin pitched for the Sox in 1997 (4-8, 4.13 ERA).
- Chicago and Cincinnati played in the first ever Civil Rights Game during the regular season on 6/20/09 at Great American Ball Park ... the White Sox earned a 10-8 win.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 3-9 during interleague play, winning three of the last six after losing each of the first six contests ... they have been held to two runs or less six times this season.
- Chicago has lost nine of the last 10 games and 17 of 20 IL games on the road ... the club has not won consecutive road IL games since 8/12-13/16 at Miami.
- The Sox went 6-14 during IL play last season and have not recorded a winning record since 2014 (11-9).
- The Sox are 209-186 (.529) all-time during IL play (since 1997).

AND THE WINNER IS...

- Class AAA Charlotte RHP Donny Roach has been named International League Player of the Month for June.
- Roach went 5-0 with a 0.98 ERA (4 ER/36.2 IP), 28 strikeouts and a .248 opp. average (33-133) in six appearances (five starts).
- An International League All-Star, Roach is 9-2 with a 2.65 ERA (28 ER/95.0 IP) in 16 games this season (15 starts) ... he ranks among the IL pitching leaders in 2018 in winning pct. (1st, .818), wins (1st, 9), IP (2nd, 95.0), starts (2nd, 15) and ERA (3rd, 2.65).

BULLPEN RELIEF

- Despite allowing 10 earned runs in the last two games, the bullpen owns a 3.26 ERA (55 ER/151.2 IP) since 5/13 (47 G).
- Joakim Soria has made 14 straight scoreless appearances (14.1 IP), converting all eight save chances with just seven hits allowed, two walks and 16 strikeouts.
- Rookie Jace Fry owns a 2.49 ERA (7 ER/25.1 IP) with 32 strikeouts and a .144 (13-90) opp. average in 25 games in 2018.
- Xavier Cedeño has allowed just one earned run over 12 relief appearances (13 SO/9.2 IP) since joining the White Sox on 6/7.

STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox are tied for second in MLB with 64 steals ... the Sox are on pace to steal 125 bases, which would be their most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB in steals since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 17 steals in 2018.

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox rank second in the major leagues this season with 25 triples, and are on pace for 49 ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their most since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez is tied for the major-league lead with eight triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- Reynaldo López (T11th, 11) and James Shields (T14th, 10) rank in the Top 15 in the American League in quality starts this season ... Chicago ranks eighth with 34 QS in 2018.
- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,349 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, two more than the second-place New York Mets (1,347) and 42 more than Oakland (1,307), the next-closest American League team.

PITO STILL FIRST AT FIRST

- José Abreu continues to lead American League first basemen in fan balloting for the MLB All-Star Game ... All-Star starters and reserves will be announced on Sunday, 7/8 on the ASG Selection Show presented by Camping World starting at 6:00 p.m. CT.
- Abreu is the first White Sox to lead at any point in the balloting process since Frank Thomas won the fan election at 1B in 1996.
- He would be the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan-elected as a starter to the All-Star Team, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 19th appearance (18th start), seventh on the road and fourth during interleague play ... is looking for his second road win of the season (first on Opening Day/3/29 at Kansas City).
- Is tied for second in MLB with nine losses in 2018.
- Surrendered three earned runs or less in each of his last four starts, going 2-2 with a 2.19 ERA (6 ER/24.2 IP) and .204 opponents average ... three of the starts have been quality.
- Has worked at least 6.0 IP in 12 of his last 13 starts since 4/25 vs. Seattle ... is 2-7 with a 3.76 ERA (35 ER/83.2 IP), 1.11 WHIP and .210 opponents average during the 13-start span.
- Ranks 68th all-time in major-league history with 2,153 strikeouts, three behind Tim Lincecum (2,156) for 67th all-time (see chart at right).
- Is 12-28 with a 5.45 ERA (205 ER/338.1 IP), 254 strikeouts, 70 home runs allowed and a 1.47 WHIP over 61 appearances (60 GS/27 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
- Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in games started (2nd, 368), IP (2nd, 2,393.2), pitches thrown (2nd, 37,678), quality starts (T4th, 226), shutouts (5th, 9), opponents GIDP (5th, 195), complete games (T5th, 22), strikeouts (8th, 2,049) and wins (11th, 135).

LAST START

- Earned the win on 6/27 vs. Minnesota, allowing just four hits with two walks and five strikeouts over 7.0 scoreless IP ... surrendered three singles and one double ... retired 10 of 11 from the second to the sixth inning.
- Worked at least 7.0 scoreless IP for the first time since 7/26/16 vs. the Cubs (7.2 scoreless IP).
- Marked his second victory over his last four starts after recording just one in his first 13 starts.
- Departed the game with the White Sox leading, 5-1, after throwing 100 pitches (64 strikes) ... marked his sixth outing in his last nine working 7.0-plus IP.

WINS DON'T TELL THE STORY

- Is 2-6 with a 3.59 ERA (31 ER/77.2 IP), .207 opponents average and 1.07 WHIP over his 12 starts (nine QS) since 5/1 ... has worked 7.0-plus IP six times and allowed three earned runs or less in 10 outings.
- Ranked among the MLB May leaders in opponents SLG (5th, .252), opponents average (6th, .173), hits per 9.0 IP (6th, 5.40), opponents OPS (6th, .500), WHIP (T10th, 0.93) and opponents OBP (11th, .248).

LOW AND SLOW

- Opponents are hitting just .207 (59-285) since 5/1, tied with Houston's Lance McCullers Jr. and Philadelphia's Aaron Nola for the 12th-lowest in the major leagues ... his .173 opp. average in May was the fourth-lowest in the AL behind Seattle's James Paxton (.144) and Houston's Justin Verlander (.153) and Gerrit Cole (.164).
- Is limiting opponents to the following averages: .187 (26-139) at night, .195 vs. left-handers (39-200), .238 (29-122) on the road and .224 average (63-281) at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- Has picked off three baserunners, and attempted basestealers are 4-9 (44.4 percent) this season.

HELP WANTED

- Owns a 3.30 run support average in 2018, sixth-lowest in the American League and eighth-lowest in MLB ... received two runs or less of support in 10 of his last 12 starts (one or less seven times) and three or less in 13 of last 15 (2.08 RSA; 22 RS/95.1 IP) since 4/11 ... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
- His 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support from 4/11-6/7 was his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13 consecutive starts; 1.90 RSA, 16 RS).
- His 3.22 RSA in 2016 was the lowest in baseball and the lowest of his career.
- Owns a 4.29 RSA (161 RS/337.2 IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (60 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (16x), one (10x), two (10x), three (7x), four (4x), five (5x) and six-plus (8x) ... has received one run or less of support in 43.3 percent (26-60) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 12 home runs this season, including eight in his last six starts ... allowed three homers in each outing on 6/2 vs. Milwaukee and 6/7 at Minnesota after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
- Has allowed 79 homers since 2016 and 112 since 2015 ... his 112 homers allowed since 2015 are the second-most in MLB behind Kansas City's Ian Kennedy (115).
- Allowed 27 home runs last season, his fewest since 2014 (23) ... surrendered a major-league leading 40 home runs in 2016 after leading baseball with 33 in 2015 ... became the first pitcher to lead MLB in homers allowed in consecutive seasons since Tom Browning in 1988-89.
- Has allowed 1.66 homers per 9.0 IP since 2015 (608.0 IP), the fourth-highest mark in MLB.

OPENING DAY HONORS

- His season debut marked his eighth career Opening Day start following four with Tampa Bay (2008-10, '12), two with Kansas City (2013-14) and one with San Diego (2015).
- Is 2-2 with a 4.98 ERA (26 ER/47.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts in the eight OD outings.
- Tied the Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw for the fourth-most Opening Day starts among active pitchers ... joined Edinson Vólquez as the only active pitchers to start season openers for four different teams (STATS).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has made 20-plus starts in every MLB season, joining Cole Hamels and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers since 2006 to accomplish the feat ... recorded at least 10 victories, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts each season from 2007-15 ... was an AL All-Star with Tampa Bay in 2011.
- Is 3-6 with a 5.46 ERA (36 ER/59.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts over 11 career postseason starts (four quality starts) ... pitched in the postseason with Tampa Bay (2008, 2010-11) and Kansas City (2014) ... made three World Series starts with the Rays (2008) and Royals (2014).

VS. CINCINNATI REDS

- Is scheduled to make his third career start vs. Cincinnati, and first at Great American Ball Park ... his two starts vs. the Reds are tied for the fewest vs. any MLB opponent (also Milwaukee and San Diego).
- Has gone 0-2 with a 6.08 ERA (9 ER/13.1 IP), six walks, .255 opponents average, 1.43 WHIP and 17 strikeouts lifetime.
- Suffered the loss in each of his first two career outings on 6/29/11 at Tropicana Field with Tampa Bay (4 ER/7.0 IP) and 8/12/15 at Petco Park with San Diego (5 ER/6.1 IP).
- Great American Ball Park marks the 35th baseball stadium he has pitched in, and the 29th of the 30 active parks ... he has not pitched at Atlanta's SunTrust Park.
