METSCELLANEOUS: New York is 12-7 on the road this season... The .632 winning percentage away from Citi Field is the 10th-best in the majors...Last night was New York's 11th come-from-behind this year, tied for the fourth-most in the majors...After winning each of its first five series of the season, New York has lost six of its last seven series...The Mets are 11-7 vs. the NL East.

CONGRATS: David Wright and his wife, Molly, welcomed the couple's second child yesterday...Daughter, Madison, was born at 3:15 p.m.

GO-AHEAD HOMER WHEN TRAILING IN 9TH: Michael Conforto slugged a two-run home run in the ninth-inning to give the Mets a lead...The last Met to hit a go-ahead homer while trailing in the ninth-inning or later was Asdrúbal Cabrera, who slugged a three-run walk-off shot vs. the Phillies on September 22, 2016... It was also Conforto's first career go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later.

JUST THE THIRD TIME IN TEAM HISTORY: Michael Conforto became the third player in team history to hit a go-ahead home run in the ninth inning with the Mets trailing 1-0...Daniel Murphy hit a three-run shot in the ninth to beat the Marlins, 3-1, on April 27, 2015 at Miami and Lucas Duda connected on a two-run walk-off blast on September 27, 2014 to beat the Astros, 2-1.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Mets have won 19 of their last 23 series vs. the Phillies...New York is 41-19 vs. Philadelphia since the start of the 2015 campaign...New York has out-homered the Phillies, 105-47 since the start of the 2015 season.

CITIZENS BANK PARK: New York is 41-17 at Citizens Bank Park since 2012...The Mets out-homered the Phillies, 23-10, last year at CBP and have out-homered the Phillies, 62-26, since the beginning of 2015.

FROM ELIAS: The Mets hit 33 home runs against the Phillies last season, their third-highest total against an opponent in one season, behind their 35 homers against the Phillies in 2015 and the 34 they slugged against them in 2016...No major league team has hit as many home runs against one opponent since the start of the 2015 season as the Mets have hit against the Phillies—105.

YO PHILLY: Yoenis Céspedes has 15 homers, 36 RBI and has scored 34 runs in 39 career games vs. Philadelphia...His 15 homers are the second-most vs. any opponent...Céspedes has 18 homers vs. Seattle...His 36 RBI are the third-most vs. any opponent, behind his 39 vs. Seattle and 38 vs. the Angels.

YO IN CBP: Céspedes has hit 10 homers and 24 RBI with 19 runs scored in 19 career at Citizens Bank Park...The 10 homers and 24 RBI are his most in any visiting ballpark.

MORE CES: Céspedes is ninth in the NL with 27 RBI...He is tied for 12th in the NL with seven homers.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has 10 career homers and 27 RBI while hitting .306 (30-98) in 32 career games vs. the Phillies...The 10 homers and 27 RBI are his most vs. any team...Conforto has seven homers and 15 RBI in 20 career games at Citizens Bank Park, both are his highest total in any visiting ballpark.

METS-PHILLIES NOTES: The Mets won the season series from the Phillies in each of the past six seasons...It's the first time the Mets have won a season series from a division opponent in six straight seasons.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



LATE COMEBACK: Prior to last night, the last time the Mets won a game they were trailing in the ninth inning or later was August 22, 2016 vs. Philadelphia...New York trailed 6-4 in the ninth, before winning 9-8 in 11 innings in that game...Last night was also the seventh time the Mets won in their final at-bat, tied for the third-most in the majors.

DEVIN MESORACO: Slugged a solo home run in the ninth inning last night...It was his first hit as a Met after starting 0-8...The last Met to belt a homer as his first hit with the Mets was Jay Bruce on August 4, 2016 at Yankee Stadium.

CABBY VS. THE PHILLIES: Since, Asdrúbal Cabrera joined the Mets in 2016, he has batted .389 (58-149) with 10 home runs and 29 RBI in 39 games vs. Philadelphia, including hitting in 11 straight (.465, 20-43)...Cabrera is hitting .400 (4-10) vs. the Phillies this year...He hit .406 (28-69) with four home runs and 13 RBI in 17 games vs. Philadelphia last year.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is fourth in the National League with a .326 batting average, 10th in the NL with a .551 slugging percentage, is tied for seventh in the NL with 18 extra-base hits, tied for 16th with 23 runs scored and tied for sixth in the NL with 11 doubles...Cabrera is hitting .333 (28-84) with seven doubles, three homers, 17 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 21 games.

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Is batting .296 (8-27) with two homers and three RBI in eight games this month...González has hit 13 home runs and driven in 32 runs in 37 career games at Citizens Bank Park.

JEURYS FAMILIA: Is tied for third in the majors with 11 saves, including three this year vs. the Phillies in three appearances... Familia has 110 saves since 2015, the third-most in the majors during that span.

RUNS SCORED TIX PROMO: For each run scored by the Mets during this road trip, fans will save \$1 off tickets for select seats during the next homestand May 15-23 when the Mets host the Blue Jays, Diamondbacks and Marlins...After the first four games, fans can already save \$13 off Baseline Box and Bud Light Landing seating areas while supplies last...Tickets will be available at mets.com/runs approximately one hour after the game on Sunday, May 13.

LAST TIME OUT: Syndergaard makes his ninth start of the season, and fourth on the road, tonight at Citizens Bank Park...In his last start, May 6 vs. Colorado, left with the score tied after 6.0 innings and ended up without a decision for an MLB-high-tying fifth time this season...Allowed two runs, earned, on six hits while walking a season-high four batters and fanning five...His four walks were the most he'd issued in a start since September 7, 2016 at Cincinnati...The outing was his fourth-consecutive quality start, tied for the third-longest streak of his career...The Mets have lost each of his last two starts by the same score (3-2).

NO BROTHERLY LOVE: Syndergaard tonight makes his second start of the season vs. Philadelphia...The Mets won his previous outing against the Phillies on April 4 at Citi Field...In that start, Syndergaard pitched 4.0 innings, allowing two runs, earned, on four hits with a pair of walks and seven strikeouts...In three starts at Citizens Bank Park, Syndergaard owns a 2-0 record and a 1.93 ERA (three earned runs/14.0 innings)...All told, Syndergaard is 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA (nine earned runs/39.1 innings) in seven-career outings against the Phillies...Among pitchers with at least 35.0 innings pitched against Philadelphia since 2015, his 2.06 ERA is the second-lowest, trailing only Adam Conley's 1.72 ERA vs. the Phils.

SOMETHING'S GOTTA GIVE: Since winning each of Syndergaard's first five starts, the Mets have lost each of the last three times he has toed the rubber, all in one-run games...Syndergaard has posted a quality start in each of those three Mets losses...This current streak is the sixth time in franchise history that the Mets have lost at least three-straight quality starts by the same pitcher, each time falling by one run (first time since the Mets lost three-straight Eric Hillman quality starts in 1993)...The last time the Mets lost at least three-straight quality starts by the same pitcher was in 2016 when New York fell in four-consecutive Jacob deGrom quality outings...In his career, Syndergaard is 22-7 in his 43 quality starts and the Mets are 31-12 (.721 winning percentage) in those games.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets have gone 16-7 Syndergaard's last 23 away starts since starting 1-8 in his first nine career road starts...In those 23 starts, he is 11-4 with a 2.54 ERA (38 earned runs/134.2 innings) and 155 strikeouts...Has allowed one or no earned runs in eight of his previous 10 road starts and has surrendered more than two earned runs only four times in his last 23 starts on the road...In all, he is 11-9 in 32 career road starts with a 3.18 ERA (64 earned runs/181.0 innings).

MAY: Syndergaard's start tonight is the 13th May start (14th game) of his career...His 2.20 May ERA (18 earned runs/73.2 innings) is the fourth-lowest among all pitchers with at least 10 May starts in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920).

THOR ON THE LEADERBOARD: Syndergaard currently ranks in the top 10 in the National League in strikeouts (54, t-fourth), strikeout rate (27.6%, eighth), walk rate (5.1%, sixth) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.40 SO/BB, fourth).

IN GOOD COMPANY...: Among active pitchers with at least 60 career starts, Syndergaard's 2.91 ERA (133 earned runs/410.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 career ERA and is tied with deGrom's 2.91 career ERA...Syndergaard is one of only five active major league hurlers with at least 60 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...Ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.43 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.77) and Max Scherzer (5.82).

...AND ALL BY HIMSELF: Syndergaard leads the Mets' starters and ranks fourth in the NL with a 5.40 SO/BB ratio this season (54 strikeouts/10 walks)...He is the only pitcher in major league history to record a strikeout-to-walk ratio of at least 5.0 in each of his first three major league seasons...Posted a 5.4 SO/BB ratio in his rookie campaign, a 5.1 mark in 2016 and fanned 11.3 batters per walk issued last season.

RAGNAROKSTAR: Excluding his two starts at the tail end of last season as he recovered from a lat injury (2.0 IP vs. Washington on September 23 and 1.0 IP at Philadelphia on October 1), Syndergaard has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 58 of his 67 remaining starts...43 of those 67 starts have been quality outings...Has pitched at least 6.0 innings 48 times and at least 7.0 innings 25 times.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (3-0, 1.87)

PREVIOUS START: DeGrom is scheduled to make his first start since leaving his May 2 outing against Atlanta after the fourth inning with a hyperextended right elbow...Had pitched 4.0-shutout innings to that point, allowing only two hits with six strikeouts...Was placed on the 10-Day Disabled List...His scoreless streak now sits at 18.1 innings, the longest-active scoreless streak in the majors (career-long is 20.0 innings, July 28-August 7, 2016).

deLONG AND WINDING ROAD: Is 2-0 with a 1.71 ERA (five earned runs/26.1 innings) in four road starts this season...His 1.71 road ERA is the second-best in the NL this season...The Mets are undefeated in his five road starts against Philadelphia.

- Hit his sixth homer of the year on May 4 vs. Colorado (29th game)...Didn't hit his sixth homer last season until June 12 (49th game).
- Dating to August 25 of last season, Cabrera is batting .344 (86-250) with 23 doubles, 11 home runs, 46 RBI and 39 runs scored (69 games).
