2018 NATIONAL LEAGUE DIVISION SERIES, GAME 3 COLORADO ROCKIES (0-2) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (2-0)

CIRCUS

- The Colorado Rockies continue the 2018 Postseason with the third game of the National League Division Series against the Milwaukee Brewers, the first postseason game at Coors Field since Oct. 12, 2009 vs. Arizona ... all-time, are 3-6 in postseason play at Coors Field.
- Were shutout on Friday in Milwaukee to fall behind 0-2 in the series, Colorado's first postseason shutout loss in franchise history ... have now scored two or fewer in each of their first three postseason games, their longest streak of scoring two or fewer runs in the postseason in franchise history ... had scored two or fewer in four total postseason games in history prior to this year.
- Have pitched to a 2.35 ERA (30.2 IP, 8 ER) with 16 walks and 33 strikeouts ... pitchers have received 1.17 runs of support in this postseason.

SOME DAYS ARE DIAMONDS

- The Colorado Rockies are playing in the National League Division Series for the fourth time in franchise history, the first time since 2009 when they fell to Philadelphia in four games ... it is their first postseason series against the Brewers and their second postseason series against a NL Central opponent, with their first having come in Tuesday's 2-1 NL Wild Card Game victory over the Cubs.
- Colorado is in the postseason for the second consecutive season for the first time in franchise history ... have advanced to the postseason as a Wild Card in 1995, 2007, 2009 and 2017.
- Colorado entered the postseason via the second Wild Card with a record of 91-72 in 163 games, the third season in franchise history in which they reached 90 wins ... their .562 winning percentage was the second-best in franchise history (92-70, .568 in 2009).

TAKE ME HOME, COUNTRY ROADS

- Colorado went 47-34 at home in the regular season, including a 13-4 home record in September in which they outscored opponents 156-100, averaging 7.1 runs per game ... have hit multiple home runs in each of their last five home games, their longest such streak at home since July 28-Aug. 8, 2007 (including the Oct. 1 tiebreaker at Los Angeles-NL, concluded the season with multiple home runs in six straight games, tied for the longest such streak in franchise history).

THE GAME IS OVER

- The Rockies advanced to their first NLDS since 2009 by winning the NL Wild Card Game at Chicago-NL in 13 innings by a score of 2-1 on Tuesday night ... Tony Wolters recorded the game-

- winning RBI on a single in the 13th inning.
- It was the longest postseason elimination game by time and innings in Major League history.
- Kyle Freeland pitched 6.2 shutout innings, tied for the second-most innings pitched in Rockies postseason history (most: Ubaldo Jiménez, Oct. 12, 2009 Game Four of the NLDS) and the most scoreless innings pitched in Rockies postseason history.
- Per Elias, Scott Oberg became the first pitcher in Major League history to win a postseason game in which he faced at least four batters and struck out each batter he faced.

NO ONE LIKE YOU

- Bud Black, in his 11th season as a manager (second season with Colorado), earned his first managerial postseason win in Tuesday's Wild Card game ... is the first manager to lead the Rockies to the postseason in multiple seasons.
- As a player, Black appeared in two postseasons with Kansas City, in 1984 and 1985 ... was a World Champion in 1985.
- Bench Coach Mike Redmond was a World Champion with the 2003 Florida Marlins.

IT'S A POSSIBILITY

- 12 players on the Rockies' Division Series roster have appeared in postseason play in their career prior to 2018: Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon, DJ LeMahieu, Scott Oberg, Chris Rusin and Trevor Story all made their postseason debuts with Colorado in the 2017 Wild Card Game ... players who have appeared in other postseasons include Wade Davis (2010-11 with Tampa Bay; 2014-15 with Kansas City; 2017 with Chicago-NL), Ian Desmond (2012, 2014 with Washington; 2016 with Texas; 2017 with Colorado), Carlos González (2009, 2017 with Colorado), Matt Holliday (2007 with Colorado; 2009, 2011-15 with St. Louis; 2017 with New York-AL), Chris Iannetta (2014 with Los Angeles-AL; 2017 with Arizona) and Gerardo Parra (2011 with Arizona; 2017 with Colorado).
- David Dahl, Kyle Freeland, Garrett Hampson, DJ Johnson, Ryan McMahon, Harrison Musgrave, Seunghwan Oh, Adam Ottavino, Antonio Senzatela and Tony Wolters are all on their first postseason roster.

HEY OLD PAL

- Colorado went 2-5 against the Brewers in the regular season, 1-3 at home and 1-2 at Miller Park.
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.
- Brewers pitcher Jhoulys Chacin spent the first six years of his career with Colorado after signing with the Rockies as a non-drafted international free agent in 2004 ... he ranks eighth in franchise history in starts (109) and wins (38) and eighth with 514 strikeouts.
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.

I REMEMBER YOU

- In the Rockies' three-game series at Miller Park Aug. 3-5, Trevor Story hit a home run in each game, including a two-home run game on Aug. 4 ... per Elias, he is the only Rockies player to ever hit home runs in each of three consecutive games in one series at Miller Park.
- Story's 1.222 slugging percentage against Milwaukee was the highest by any NL player against one team (min. 20 at-bats).

GERMAN ANDRES MÁRQUEZ

- 23-year-old right-hander a member of his second career Opening Day roster in 2018 ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Major League debut Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
- Named to the *Topps* All-Star Rookie Team last year, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced *HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z*.

GAME 163

- Started the NL West Tiebreaker last Monday at Los Angeles-NL and took the loss in the 5-2 Rockies defeat ... pitched 4.2 innings and allowed four runs (two earned) on five hits with two walks and nine strikeouts ... all four runs came on two, two-run home runs (Beltre, Muncy)
- The 4.2 innings pitched was his shortest start since June 24 vs. Miami.
- Snapped a streak of 12-straight quality starts, tied for the second-longest single-season streak in franchise history ... Ubaldo Jiménez had a 12-start streak in 2009 and a franchise-record 14-start streak to begin the 2010 season.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH

- Was named National League Pitcher of the Month for September ... went 3-1 with a 2.14 ERA (33.2 IP, 8 ER), with five walks and 48 strikeouts.
- Recorded 11 strikeouts in four of his five starts in September ... pitched seven innings in three of his five starts ... each of his five starts were quality.
- Became the third pitcher in Rockies history (fourth time) to earn Pitcher of the Month honors (also: Ubaldo Jiménez, April & May, 2010 and Shawn Chacon, April, 2003).

SIT 'EM DOWN

- His 230 strikeouts in the regular season were a single-season franchise record (previous: Ubaldo Jiménez, 214 in 2010) and ranked fourth in the National League.
- Tied a modern Major League record (since 1900) by striking out the first eight batters of the game in his last start at home, Sept. 26 vs. Philadelphia ... the eight straight strikeouts were also a franchise record for consecutive strikeouts in a single game and tied the franchise record for strikeouts vs. consecutive batters faced.

BEER MAKERS

- Made two starts vs. the Brewers this season, going 0-1 (Rockies 0-2) with a 5.40 ERA (11.2 IP, 7 ER), five walks and 12 strikeouts.
- Last start came Aug. 3 in Milwaukee, a 5-3 Rockies loss ... pitched seven innings and allowed two runs on three hits with two walks and nine strikeouts.
- In four career starts vs. the Brewers, is 1-1 (Rockies 1-3) with a 5.01 ERA (23.1 IP, 13 ER), seven walks and 25 strikeouts.
- Has made three starts vs. the Brewers at home, allowing 11 runs in 16.1 innings (6.06 ERA) with five walks and 16 strikeouts ... allowed five runs on 12 hits in 4.2 innings vs. the Brewers on May 10, a 5-2 Rockies loss.

COORS HEAVY

- Went 6-6 (Rockies 9-7) with a 4.74 ERA (89.1 IP, 47 ER), 31 walks and 110 strikeouts in 16 starts at home this season ... eight quality starts at home with eight games of eight-plus strikeouts ... 110 strikeouts at home ranked sixth in the NL.
- Each of his past seven games at home have been quality starts, going 4-1 with a 1.90 ERA (47.1 IP, 10 ER), 10 walks and 68 strikeouts over that span.
- In 32 career appearances, 31 starts, at Coors Field, is 13-9 with a 4.51 ERA (181.2 IP, 91 ER) ... Rockies are 19-12 when he starts at home.

RARE AIR

- His 3.77 ERA this year ranked eighth all-time in Rockies history for a single season ... his .241 batting average against was sixth-lowest all-time.

CATCH THE FEVER

- The Rockies went 12-5 over his last 17 starts since June 30 ... was 9-3 with a 2.47 ERA (113.0 IP, 31 ER), 22 walks and 146 strikeouts over that span.

ALL AROUND

- Went 8-5 with a 2.95 ERA (106.2 IP, 35 ER), 26 walks and 120 strikeouts over 17 road starts this season with 12 quality starts ... the Rockies went 10-7.
- His 2.95 road ERA (106.2 IP, 35 ER) this year ranked eighth in the NL ... tied for sixth in the NL with eight road wins ... his .203 (79-for-390) opponents' batting average against on the road ranked ninth in the league.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Allowed 32 of his 90 runs in the first inning (second-most were 13 in the fifth) ... gave up a run in the first inning in 19 of his 33 starts, including 11 of his 16 home starts ... opponents batted .333 (48-for-144) with seven of his 24 home runs allowed in the first.

K ZONE

- Fanned 11 or more in three consecutive starts from Aug 30-Sept. 10 ... in franchise history, only Pedro Astacio has notched four straight double-digit strikeouts games (May 8-24, 2000).

WHIFF

- The 13 strikeouts on Aug. 20 against the Padres tied for the third-most in franchise history, the most for a Rockies pitcher since Jon Gray's 16-strikeout performance vs. San Diego on Sept. 17, 2016 ... fifth pitcher in franchise history to strikeout out at least 13 batters (Gray, Ubaldo Jimenez, Shawn Chacon, Darryl Kile).
- Struck out 11 batters Sept. 4 vs. the Giants after striking out a career-high 13 hitters at San Diego in the previous start ... first player in franchise history to strike out 11-plus hitters in consecutive starts, the fourth to record double-digit strikeouts in back-to-back games (last: Jon Gray, Sept. 17-23, 2016).

SILVER ANNIVERSARY SLUGGER

- His .300 (18-for-60) batting average was best among all Major League pitchers (minimum 40 AB, excluding Shohei Ohtani) ... also led the Majors with a .350 slugging percentage and ranked first in hits with 18 ... tied for sixth with five RBI.
