RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers completed a two-game sweep of the Reds with a 7-4 win on Wednesday at Comerica Park. José Iglesias had a pair of hits and drove in a game-high three runs, while Jim Adduci went 2x2 with a solo home run. JaCoby Jones and Ronny Rodriguez each added two hits and a RBI in the victory. Drew VerHagen earned the win in relief, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed and two strikeouts. Shane Greene pitched a scoreless ninth inning to notch his 23rd save of the season. The Tigers tonight begin a six-game road trip as they open a three-game series at Oakland. Following the three games against the Athletics, the road trip continues with a three-game set at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8).

GOODRUM, FIERS EARN JULY HONORS: Niko Goodrum and Mike Fiers have been selected as the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for July. Goodrum played in 23 games during the month, hitting .286 (26x91) with 11 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, three home runs and nine RBI. Goodrum was tied for the American League lead with nine doubles in the month. Fiers, who also won the award for June, started five games in July, compiling a 2-1 record with a 2.23 ERA (32.1IP/8ER) and 23 strikeouts. He ranked seventh in the American League with 32.1 innings pitched and a 2.23 ERA during July, while he was eighth with a 1.11 WHIP and 10th with a .232 (29x125) opponents batting average.

GETTIN' IGGY WITH IT: José Iglesias went 2x3 with a double and three RBI in Wednesday's game to record his fourth game this season with three-or-more RBI. Iglesias has now driven in 43 runs from the eighth spot in the batting order this season, which is the most in the Majors at that slot and 17 more than the next closest player.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Drew VerHagen pitched 3.0 shutout innings on Wednesday to earn his second win of the season. In seven games since being activated from the disabled list, VerHagen has posted a 1.72 ERA (15.2IP/3ER) with a 0.70 WHIP, a .179 (10x56) opponents batting average and 12 strikeouts...Jim Adduci hit his second home run of the season and the fourth of his career on Wednesday, blasting a solo shot in the 4th inning.

RECAPPING THE HOMESTAND: The Tigers went 3-2 on their recently completed five-game homestand, going 1-2 vs. Cleveland and 2-0 vs. Cincinnati. As a team, Detroit hit .238 (38x160) over the five games, while the pitching staff posted a 4.40 ERA (45.0IP/22ER), including a 3.38 ERA (24.0IP/9ER) by Tigers starting pitchers. Individually, José Iglesias hit .333 (5x15) during the homestand with three runs scored, three doubles and three RBI, while Jim Adduci batted .333 (3x9) with one home run and Victor Martinez hit .308 (4x13) with a homer.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Tonight's game marks the 30th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 16-13 (.552) against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .268 (248x925) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank third in the American League with a .268 batting average vs. lefties. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos ranks second in the Majors with a .398 (41x103) batting average vs. lefties, while he is fourth with a .451 on-base percentage vs. southpaws and eighth with a .650 slugging percentage. José Iglesias ranks eighth in the AL with a .324 (23x71) batting average vs. lefthanders.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers tonight begin a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (August 3-5) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8). Detroit is 18-35 on the road this season and has lost 15 of its last 20 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .232 (423x1821) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.79 ERA (448.2IP/239ER).

TIGERS AND A'S: The Tigers and Athletics continue their seven-game season series tonight. Detroit is 0-4 against the Athletics this season after being swept in a four-game series at Comerica Park from June 25-28. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost nine straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's longest losing streak against the franchise since dropping 10 consecutive games to the Philadelphia Athletics from May 19-June 28, 1931.

WEST SIDE STORY: Detroit is 10-15 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 30 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-77, .379).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 47-62 (.431) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,115-1,101 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks tied for 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his 21st appearance and 11th start of the season tonight in the series opener at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy earned his fourth win of the season on Saturday vs. Cleveland, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and one strikeout in 5.0 innings.

VS. OAKLAND: Hardy has made 11 appearances, including one start, in his career against the Athletics, posting a 1-0 record with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP/5ER) and 12 strikeouts. He started against Oakland earlier this season on June 26 and received a no decision after giving up six runs, three earned, on six hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 4.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Hardy has pitched in 89 games, including three as a starter, in his career on the road and has a 4-5 record with one save, a 3.99 ERA (97.0IP/43ER) and 86 strikeouts. In 12 road outings, including three starts, this season, Hardy has a 1-2 record with one save, a 3.60 ERA (25.0IP/10ER) and 17 strikeouts.

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Hardy is making his fifth career appearance and first career start at Oakland Coliseum tonight. In four previous outings in Oakland, Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (3.0IP/1ER) and one strikeout.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Hardy has pitched in 46 games, including two starts, in his career against American League West teams and has a 1-1 record with a 2.60 ERA (52.0IP/15ER) and 53 strikeouts. In seven appearances, including two starts, against AL West opponents this season, Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP/5ER) and 15 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST : Hardy has appeared in 26 games, all in relief, during the month of August, posting a 2-0 record with a 2.48 ERA (29.0IP/8ER) and 28 strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT HARDY'S JULY: Hardy made seven appearances, including two starts, in July, compiling a 1-2 record with one save, a 3.68 ERA (14.2IP/6ER) and 11 strikeouts.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed three runs-or-less in seven of his 10 starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 4-2 record with a 4.01 ERA (51.2IP/23ER) and 34 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .230 (76x331) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .289 (151x522) against him. In 20 appearances, including 10 starts this season, lefties are hitting .221 (15x68) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .272 (46x169).

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

FIRST WIN AS A STARTER: Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.
