FRIDAY THE 13TH: In anticipation of Friday the 13th, the Cardinals scored a season-high 13 runs last night including a seven-run 7th inning. The last time the Cardinals scored seven or more runs in an inning was at Great American Ballpark on Aug. 6, 2017, when they tallied nine runs in the 4th inning en route to another 13-4 victory.

FOUR!: The Cardinals set a season-high smacking four solo home runs last night. It also marked the 8th game in which the 'Birds have whacked four home runs at Great American Ballpark, tying the Milwaukee Brewers for the most games with four or more home runs by an opposing team at GABP.

CAFECITO'S COLLECTION: José Martínez went 4-for-5 with a home run, two doubles and six RBI last night. The four hits and six RBI both marked career highs and was the first Cardinals player (6th all-time since 1908) to record 6 RBI, 4 hits, 2 doubles and a home run in a single game since Red Schoendienst vs. Pittsburgh on May 20, 1953 at Sportsman's Park.

2-FOR-1s: José Martínez was 2-for-2 with a home run and a double in the 7th inning last night becoming the first Cardinals player with two hits in an inning since Matt Carpenter (7/21/17 at CHI). The last Cardinals player to record two hits including a home run in the same inning was Matt Holliday vs. the Dodgers in Game 1 of the 2014 National League Division Series.

YEAH, BABY!: Mike Mayers was recalled yesterday and made a 3.0-inning appearance for his first Major League save last night. It was the first Cardinals save of 3.0 innings or more since Tyler Lyons vs. MIL (6/13/17-Game 1) and the second 3.0-inning save of the 2018 MLB season (Jake Thompson, PHI, 4/7/18 vs. MIA).

THE O-ZONE: Outfielder Marcell Ozuna began the season 0-for-8, but has hit safely in his next 11 games and is currently T3rd in the National League with 17 hits. His active 11-game hit streak leads the N.L. and is tied for the longest streak in MLB (Brian Dozier, MIN). Ozuna's career-long hitting streak is 16 games (4/30-5/16/16).

EXTRA! EXTRA!: Marcell Ozuna has tallied 19 career hits against the Reds with 13 of those for extra bases (68.4%). Last night, Ozuna hit his 5th career home run vs. the Reds, to go with his seven doubles and a triple.

PASSING LOU: Yadier Molina hit his 130th career home run last night, passing Lou Brock for 15th all-time in Cardinals history. Next up on the list ranking 14th is Bill White with 140, then Enos Slaughter at 13th with 146.

BACK-TO-BACK JACKS: José Martínez and Yadier Molina went back-to-back to lead off the 7th inning off rookie Zack Weiss making his Major League debut. The back-to-back jacks were the second set hit by the Cardinals this season as Dexter Fowler and Tommy Pham homered as the first two batters at Milwaukee on April 3.

YOU GO, WE GO: Dexter Fowler scored a team-high three runs last night. When Fowler scores two or more runs in his career, the team he is playing for wins 84% of the time (121-23) and has a 13-2 mark with the Cardinals (86.7%).

ONLY TAKES THREE: Luke Weaver is 9-0 in his career and the Cardinals are 11-0 when the Cardinals right-hander is backed with three or more runs of support in any of his starts.

DUKE REPORT: Luke Gregerson (left hamstring strain) made his third rehab appearance in Palm Beach (A) last night and threw a scoreless inning allowing a single, but erasing it with a double play on the next batter. He threw nine pitches, eight for strikes.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Cardinals Manager Mike Matheny (1988) graduated from nearby Reynoldsburg (Ohio) High School...his daughter, Katie, played women's ice hockey at The Ohio State University.

Cardinals outfielder Marcell Ozuna and Reds pitcher Austin Brice were Marlins teammates in 2016.

Cardinals infielder Jedd Gyorko and Reds pitcher Kevin Quackenbush were Padres teammates for two seasons (2014-15).

Cardinals pitcher Michael Wacha's uncle, Dusty Rogers, was a Reds first round draft pick in 1984...played in the Reds minor league organization for five seasons (1984-88)

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO Walt Jocketty served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)...named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds Player Performance Special Assistant Eric Davis played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds bench coach Jim Riggleman spent 18 seasons (1976-90, 2005-07) in the Cardinals system as a minor league player (1976-81), minor league coach (AA-Arkansas, 1981), minor league manager (High-A-St. Petersburg, '82-84 & AA-Arkansas, '85-88), Director of Player Development ('88-89), St. Louis First Base Coach (1989-90) and minor league fielding coordinator (2005-07).

Reds professional scout Bruce Manno (2002-07) previously worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons (2002-07)...served as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds assistant pitching/bullpen coach Ted Power pitched in 23 games for St. Louis in 1989.

Reds catching coach Mike Stefanski played parts for six seasons in the Cardinals minors (1996-2001)...originally acquired by St. Louis from Milwaukee in exchange for catcher Marc Ronan (November 19, 1995).

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager, Player Personnel Cam Bonifay worked for the Cardinals as a special assistant, evaluating the American League East from October of 2007-08.

Reds broadcaster Jeff Brantley pitched in 48 games for St. Louis (1998).

Reds Special Assistant to the GM Marty Maier spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager John Morris played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer Jim Edmonds played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season (2010).

Reds broadcaster George Grande was a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer William DeWitt Jr. was a prior owner of the Reds, and a shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, William O. DeWitt, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Castellini, Chairman W. Joseph Williams Jr. and Vice Chairman Thomas Williams were investors in the Cardinals from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

Reds Media Relations Intern Ben Barnette was a 2015 Cardinals Spring Training Intern and 2016 Memphis Redbirds (AAA) Media Relations Intern.

- His 1.59 ERA is tops among STL pitchers.
- Has allowed just one extra base hit (2B) among 8 hits allowed and only 9 total bases

CAREER

- Averaging 10.58 K/9 IP over his career 108.0 career Major League innings.
- His 127 career strikeouts are the T2nd-highest total all-time among Cardinals through their first 24 career games with Michael Wacha, behind Shelby Miller (128)...through 25 games, Miller finished with 134 and Wacha with 131.
- Won team-leading seven consecutive 2017 starts (8/2-9/20/17) was the 4th-longest in the National League and the longest by any MLB rookie in 2017...was the first Cardinals rookie to achieve the feat since Ted Wilks (1944) & Johnny Beazley (1942) (*Elias*).
- Became the fifth rookie pitcher in the last 70 years to allow two runs or fewer over seven consecutive winning starts, joining Fernando Valenzuela (eight straight in 1981), Cal Eldred (1992), Jered Weaver (2006) and Steven Matz (2016) (*Elias*).

2017

- Pitched the majority of the second half of the season with St. Louis, pitching in 13 games (10 starts) over three stints. Was the 7th different Cardinals pitcher to make a start behind the original starting five and Marco Gonzales.
- Struck out 72 over 60.1 IP to average 10.74 K/9 IP, the 5th-highest mark among National League starters (min. 60.0 IP), trailing Robbie Ray (12.11), Max Scherzer (12.02), Rich Hill (11.01) and Dinelson Lamet (10.94).
- Was one of five rookie pitchers to sport a pair of double-digit strikeout games (8/23 & 8/29) in 2017: COL's German Marquez, SF's Chris Stratton, PHI's Nick Pivetta & SD's Dinelson Lamet.
- As a starter in 10 outings, was 7-2 with a 4.23 ERA (55.1 IP/26 ER), 69 strikeouts and .255 (55-for-216) average against (St. Louis was 8-2).
