TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their penultimate homestand of the season - a 10-day, 8-game, 3-team set - with the finale (1-1) of 3 games vs. the Baltimore Orioles...will also face the New York Yankees (Fri-Sun) and the San Diego Padres (Tue-Wed) during this homestand...went 4-5 on a recently-concluded 10-day, 9-game, 3-city road trip to Arizona (2-1), San Diego (0-2) and Oakland (2-2)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 12-12 in their last 24 games dating back to Aug. 9...are 22-31 in their last 53 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 37-38 in their last 75 games since June 10...Seattle is 63-51 in its last 114 games (4/28-c) and 68-54 over its last 122 games (4/20-c)...Seattle is 23-24 during the day and 54-38 at night...Seattle is 39-29 at Safeco Field, 38-33 on the road.

- **The Company You Keep** - **Mitch Haniger** (31 2B, 23 HR, 84 RBI) is one of 6 American Leaguers with at least 30 doubles, 20 home runs and 80 RBI...he is joined by Alex Bregman-HOU, Francisco Lindor-CLE, Jed Lowrie-OAK, J.D. Martinez-BOS and José Ramírez-CLE.
- **My Cousin Vincent** - over his last 12 outings at Safeco Field, dating back to May 20, **Nick Vincent** is 1-0 with 4 holds and a 1.38 ERA (2 ER, 13.0 IP)...during this span, he has recorded 13 strikeouts and 3 walks while limiting opponents to a .125 (6x48) average against and a 0.69 WHIP (3 BB, 6 H, 13.0 IP).
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 50-23 (.685) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 34-18 (.654) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 16-5 (.762) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (2nd-best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 55-18 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 22-44 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (66-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (68-0).
- **Milestones** - **Kyle Seager** (534) trails Raúl Ibañez (540) by 6 for 8th-most runs scored in club history...**Nelson Cruz** (295) is 5 doubles away from 300 in his career...Cruz (998) is also 2 RBI away from 1,000 in his career...he will become the 12th active Major League player with at least 1,000 RBI.
- **Heating Up** - dating back to Aug. 11, **Ryon Healy** is batting .354 (23x65) with 7 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI and 4 walks in 18 games...during this stretch his .354 average ranks 5th in the American League (min. 50 AB)...teammate **Jean Segura** is 2nd in the AL during this span with a .371 (26x70) average.

A PITCHER'S BEST FRIEND...**Mike Leake** leads American League pitchers in double plays with 23...**Marco Gonzales** is 2nd in the AL with 22 double plays...Leake is 5th in the American League with a ground ball rate of 49.2%, ranking just ahead of teammate **Félix Hernández** (46.7%)...as a team, Mariners pitchers rank 4th in the AL/7th in the Majors with 113 grounded into double plays.

CASHING IN...three active Mariners are batting at least .300 in their respective careers against Orioles starter Andrew Cashner...**Nelson Cruz** leads the club with a .375 (6x16) average vs. Cashner with 3 doubles, 1 home run, 2 RBI and 3 walks, followed by **Denard Span** (.360/9x25, 2B, HR, 6 RBI and BB) and **Kyle Seager** (.304/7x23, 2 HR, 6 RBI and 4 BB).

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 16 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the Majors and the longest streak of his career (previous: 13, 4/6-19/17)...during the streak (8/18-c), he is batting .309 (21x68) with 12 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 HBP and 8 walks...Haniger's streak is the longest by a Mariners player this season...he becomes the 24th player in club history (done 43x) to record a hitting streak of at least 16 games...dating back to July 31, Haniger has hit safely in 29 of his last 33 games, including 12 multi-hit contests; he is batting .331 (46x139) with 21 runs scored, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 16 RBI, 2 HBP and 11 walks over that span...since July 31, Haniger has raised his batting average from .260 (97x373) to .279 (143x512).

BIRD HUNTING...**Nelson Cruz** has reached base safely in 58 of 62 career games (w/AB) vs. the Orioles, including 55 games with at least 1 hit...overall he is batting .350 (82x234) with 46 runs scored, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 12 home runs, 51 RBI, 3 HBP, 28 walks and 4 stolen bases...among all active players, Cruz's .350 average vs. Baltimore is the 3rd-highest, while teammate **Robinson Canó's** .329 (235x714) average ranks 11th (min. 150 PA)...Cruz also ranks 5th in on-base percentage (.423), 5th in OPS (1.013), 7th in slugging percentage (.590), while Canó ranks 1st in hits (235), runs scored (128), doubles (50) and RBI (112), T3rd in home runs (30) and T6th in walks (52).

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 66 games this season, **Edwin Díaz** is 52-for-56 (92.9%) in save opportunities with a 1.90 ERA (14 ER, 66.1 IP) with 115 strikeouts and 16 walks...he has limited opposing batters to a .157 (36x230) average against with a 0.78 WHIP (16 BB, 36 H, 66.1 IP)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 52 saves...Wade Davis-COL is 2nd with 38.
- Is the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in ML history to record at least 50 saves in a season.
- Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 115 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 116.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 26 one-run saves...Blake Treinen-OAK is 2nd with 17.
- Is 26-for-29 (89.6%) in one-run save opportunities with a 0.92 ERA (3 ER, 29.1 IP) with 54 strikeouts and 5 walks...the Mariners are 29-0 this season when he enters with a one-run lead.
- Has struck out 46.0% (115 K, 250 BF) of batters faced this season, the top mark this season and the 4th-best single-season strikeout rate by a reliever in Major League history.
- His .157 opponents average against is the lowest in American League history among pitchers with at least 45 save opportunities (93 such seasons in AL history).
- His 0.78 WHIP is 3rd-lowest in American League history among pitchers with at least 45 save opportunities...only Dennis Eckersley-OAK (0.61, 1990) and Fernando Rodney-TB (0.78, 2012) posted a lower WHIP in a season with at least 45 save opportunities (93 such seasons in AL history).
- Has struck out his 1st batter faced 31 times this season, most in the Majors (Adam Ottavino-COL, 30).
- The Mariners are 61-0 when he enters with a lead, including 29-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Mike Leake** leads the Mariners with 165.0 innings pitched this season...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Leake is currently one of 3 pitchers in the Major Leagues to work at least 165.0 innings in each of the last 8 seasons since 2011?...he is joined by Max Scherzer and Rick Porcello...Jon Lester (158.0 IP) could also join this group this season.

ABOUT LEAKE...

- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 28th start of the season, 33rd Mariners start, 266th career appearance (261st career start) and 3rd career start vs. Baltimore tonight.
- A native of San Diego, CA, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft...did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 11-14 with a 4.34 ERA (93 ER, 193.0 IP) in 33 career GS in Sept.

LAST OUTING...

...took the loss in his last start as the Mariners fell 5-7 at Oakland on Aug. 31...allowed 6 runs on 11 hits and 2 walks while striking out 3 batters over 4.1 innings pitched...5 runs scored in the 1st inning; after surrendering a one-out solo home run to Matt Chapman, Leake allowed 5 straight batters to reach base with two outs...held the A's scoreless until the 5th inning, when he allowed 3 of 4 batters to reach base and 1 run to score (1B, 1B, SF, 1B) before being relieved by Adam Warren.

STAYING GROUNDED...

...is ranked 5th in the American League with a ground ball rate of 49.2%, trailing Dallas Keuchel-HOU (54.6%), Kyle Gibson-MIN (50.0%), Alex Cobb-BAL (49.8%) and Charlie Morton-HOU (49.2%)...opponents have grounded into 23 double plays with Leake on the mound this season, tied with Cole Hamels-TEX/CHI for the most in the Majors.

LEADERBOARD...

...among Major League leaders, ranks 6th in walks per batter faced (0.48), 7th in walks per 9.0 innings (1.80/33 BB, 165.0 IP), T11th in quality starts (16), 12th in innings pitched (165.0), 15th in home runs per 9.0 innings (1.15), 23rd in ERA (4.25/78 ER, 165.0 IP) and 24th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.18/105 K, 33 BB).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

...13 of his last 18 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 4 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only James Paxton (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...

...his 4 starts of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2 or fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB, 6/23 at BOS & 8/15 at OAK) are T3rd-most in the Majors (3 others), trailing only Jacob deGrom-NYM (6) and Kevin Gausman-BAL/ATL (5).

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE...

...has exited 18 of his 27 starts with a lead (12 games) or a tie score (6 games)...in 3 of his other 9 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, 0-3 in the 6th inning and 2-3 after 6.0 IP...the Mariners are 17-10 in his 27 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE...

...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-10 with a 3.97 ERA (87 ER, 197.0 IP) in 32 starts (20 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in games started, innings pitched and quality starts...in 23 of his 32 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 20-12 in Leake starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...

...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 260 starts, T12th-most among all pitchers (also: Clayton Kershaw)...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1611.1).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE...

...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

CAREER...

...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 91-86 with a 4.01 ERA (718 ER, 1611.1 IP) with 1,090 strikeouts and 375 walks in 265 career games (260 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

Leake is making his 3rd career start vs. Baltimore...is 0-0 with a 7.36 ERA (9 ER, 11.0 IP) in 2 career starts against the Orioles...recorded a quality start in a 4-2 Mariners win at Camden Yards on 6/28 (7.0,5,2,2,1,6,HR-2)... here is how he has fared against current Orioles hitters:

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JAMES PAXTON (11-5, 3.74 ERA)

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season Friday vs. New York-AL...W#11 in his last start, an 8-7 Mariners win at OAK on 9/1 (5.0,2,3,3,4,10,HR)...12 of his last 20 outings have been quality starts...was on the 10-day DL, 7/13-30, with lower back inflammation, and 8/14-31, with left arm contusion...has recorded 8 outings with double-digit strikeouts...tossed second complete game of his career on 5/19 vs. DET (9.0,3,2,2,1,8,HR-1)...pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history in W#2, a 5-0 Mariners win on 5/8 at TOR (9.0,0,0,0,3,7); first complete game and first shutout of his career...notched a career-high 16 strikeouts in the Mariners 2-3 loss to OAK on 5/2 (7.0,5,0,0,1,16)...2017: Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts... named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...CAREER: 41-25 with a 3.40 ERA (214 ER, 566.1 IP) in 99 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...vs. NYY: Is making his 2nd career start vs. the Yankees...took the loss in his sole start against New York-AL, a 3-4 Mariners loss on June 21 (5.07,4,4,3,9,HR-2).
