RAY MATTER—The Rays are 7-2 in their last 9 games and 16-5 in their last 21 games, and they are a season-high-tying 19 games over .500 (3rd time)...this 16-5 stretch coincides with the start of September, 2nd-best winning pct. in the majors this month behind the Astros (16-4, .800)...the Rays are 25-7 (.781) since Aug 19, best in the majors, and 38-21 (.644) since the All-Star break, 2nd in the majors behind the Athletics (39-20, .661).

- + This is only the fifth season in franchise history the Rays have ever been as many as 19 games over .500 (2008, 2010, 2011, 2013), and they made the postseason in each of these previous four seasons.
- + The Rays are 8-0-2 in their last 10 series and 11-1-2 in their last 14 series, with the only loss in the last 14 series coming at Boston.
- + The Rays would need to go 3-4 or better in the remaining 7 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays haven't lost back-to-back games in over a month.

THE E-WORD—Any Rays loss or Athletics win will eliminate the club from postseason contention...it would be the fourth time the Rays are eliminated from postseason contention in the final week of the regular season...they were eliminated last season on Sep 26 with 5 games remaining, in 2015 with 6 games left and in 2012 with 2 games left...since becoming the Rays in 2008, the club has played only 48 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.

- + The Rays are on pace for 91 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only team to win that many and miss the postseason is the 2013 Rangers (91, lost tiebreaker game).
- + For the record, the largest postseason deficit for a 90-game winner in the Wild Card era (1994) is 6 GB, when the 2002 Red Sox and Mariners went 93-69 but the Angels won the Wild Card at 99-63.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be leading the NL West, tied for the AL Central and 0.5 GB in the NL East.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays are 48-26 (.649) at home this season, 3rd-best winning pct. in the majors behind the Red Sox (54-21, .720) and Yankees (53-28, .654)...this winning pct. is currently 2nd for a single season in club history behind 2008 (57-24, .704)...they are 15-2 in their last 17 home games and 36-10 in their last 46 home games after a 12-16 start.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, tied for 4th in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Athletics (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are tied for most in the AL and are 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 52 games at home: 39 wins, 11 1-run losses, and only 2 losses by 2 runs or more.

RAYS vs. YANKEES—The Rays are 8-7 against the Yankees (5-1 at home, 3-6 on the road), including 8-2 in their last 10 games against them...most recently, they went 2-1 at Yankee Stadium, Aug 14-16, their first series win there since June 30–July 2, 2014 (3-0) to snap a streak of 12 consecutive series losses at Yankee Stadium, the longest streak ever by any team in the current building...the Rays have lost the last three season series, and a split or better would be their first season series win since 2014.

- + Over the last two seasons, the Rays are 9-3 against the Yankees at Tropicana Field...over this same span, they are 5-14 at Yankee Stadium and 1-2 at Citi Field (relocation due to Hurricane Irma).
- + The Rays have gone 4-1 in 1-run games against them this season.
- + The Rays have allowed 3.8 runs per game against them, while the Yankees are averaging 5.29 runs against all other opponents.
- + The Rays swept the Yankees in a 3-game series from June 22-24 at home, and remain one of two teams to sweep the Yankees in a multi-game series this season (Red Sox from Aug 2-5).

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 52nd time the Rays will use an opener and 11th time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 87 of 155 games (56.1 pct.).

- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.32 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays have pitched to a AL-best 3.31 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 45-37 with traditional starters and 42-31 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 66 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 57 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—Rays relievers have thrown 779.2 IP, most in major league history ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...prior to this season, only four teams ever saw its bullpen reach 600 IP, and all four finished with losing records...56.3 pct. of the team's innings this season have been covered by the bullpen...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 57 apps of at least 50 pitches and 27 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 86 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 141 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1985 Braves (158);
- + 68 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 44 apps of at least 4 IP, most since BB-Ref data is available;
- + 30 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

THROUGH THE WRINGER—The Rays 29-25 this season against the five AL teams currently positioned to make the postseason—and they have a winning record against four of these five teams...since June 22, they are 20-8 (.714) against these clubs, compared to 9-17 (.346) before that...at home, the Rays are 17-9 against these five teams: 5-5 against the Red Sox and a combined 12-4 against the Indians, Astros, Yankees and Athletics.

FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS—Since the start of August, the Rays are a majors-best 33-15 (.688), leading the majors since then with 55 SB, a .269 avg., .350 OBP, 2.96 ERA, 1.05 WHIP and .213 opp avg....they also rank 6th over this stretch with a .990 fielding pct. ...they Rays have scored at least 5 runs in 24 of 48 games (50.0 pct.) since the start of August, while they have recorded double-digit hits in 21 games (43.8 pct.), allowed 3 runs or fewer in 32 games (66.7 pct.) and played 32 errorless games (66.7 pct.).

CUSTOM BUILT—The club's remaining 7 games this season are against the Yankees (4) and Blue Jays (3)...while the Yankees have 12 players with double-digit homers and the Blue Jays have 11 players with 10+ HR, the Rays have only four, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...the Rays have only one player with at least 15 HR—no other team has fewer than two, and the Yankees have seven and the Blue Jays have six.

- + The Rays have totaled 145 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors and 83 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run, tied with the Pirates for most in the majors, and most in the AL.

TONIGHT'S START

- + This will be his seventh consecutive outing to come as a starter...last pitched on Fri at TOR, allowing a 1-out, solo homer to **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** in the 1st inning.
- + Has pitched to a 3.00 ERA (15-IP, 5-ER) in 10 starts, and four of the 5 runs allowed have come on a pair of homers (3-run, solo)...the Rays are 9-1 in his 10 starts, with the only loss on Sep 14 vs. OAK on **Khris Davis'** go-ahead 10th-inning homer.
- + Has pitched to a 1.54 ERA (11.2-IP, 2-ER) in 8 apps (7 starts) since the start of September and is 1-1 with a 2.28 ERA (27.2-IP, 7-ER) in his last 19 apps (10 starts).
- + In his last 12 apps (10 starts) dating back to Aug 19 at BOS, has thrown 38 pitches clocked at 100 mph or more...did this only once in his first 29 apps of the season.
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.5 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 101.9 mph in his start on Wed at TEX (**Rougned Odor**, 1st inn.).
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5, his first career major league action... went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER) and 32 SO in 19 apps for the Bulls.
- + Is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, tied with the Angels and Twins for most in the majors...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inn. ...struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat and got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Neftalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

2017 SEASON

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept. ...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

X-RAY REPORT

- + Diego is one of 10 children—and all of them are married...he has six brothers and three sisters.
- + Diego is known to cook for his teammates...he learned to cook as a 10-year-old by watching his mother in the kitchen...he once shared his special family recipe of chicken, rice and plantains in a November 2016 cooking video on the Rays Twitter account.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
