2B Ozzie Albies hit a two-out solo home run last night for his 12th home run this season.

Last night was the Braves' 37th game of the season and in MLB history, only three players 21 years old or younger have reached 12 home runs in a season quicker than Albies.

Two of the players, Eddie Mathews in 1953 and Orlando Cepeda in 1958, are Hall-of-Famers, while the third, Albert Pujols in 2001, owns 3,005 career hits and 620 total home runs.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Marlins continue a four-game set tonight with the fifth game of the Braves' third road trip of the season... This is the first meeting between the clubs this season... The teams will play again next weekend in Atlanta, May 18-May 20.

A The Braves went 11-8 against the Marlins last season, including 4-5 at Marlins Park... The four wins tied for the fewest the Braves ever recorded at the park in a single season since its opening in 2012 (also went 4-5 in 2014)... The Braves are 36-20 at Marlins Park and have the second-best winning percentage (.643) at the park by a N.L. team.

A RHP Mike Soroka is set for his third career start and his second on the road... He beat New York (NL), 3-2, in his major league debut on May 1 at Citi Field... He allowed one run, earned, over 6.0 innings with five strikeouts and no walks.

A LHP Jarlin García is set to face Atlanta for the first time as a starter... He owns a 3.68 ERA (3 ER/7.1 IP) and no decisions in 10 career relief appearances against the Braves.

VS. THE N.L. EAST: Despite last night's loss, the Braves are 15-8 (.652) against the N.L. East this season, and have won six of their last seven games within the division.

A The club is 5-1 against the Mets, 6-3 against Philadelphia, 1-1 against Miami, and 3-3 against Washington.

A The Braves have not finished with a winning record within the division since 2014, when they went 40-36... They went 34-42 the next year against the N.L. East, snapping a string of six consecutive seasons without a losing intradivision record.

YOUNGSTERS: RHP Mike Soroka, who is set to start tonight, is the youngest pitcher in the majors at 20 years, 281 days... LHP Luiz Gohara who collected the save in his season debut on May at Tampa Bay is the third youngest pitcher in all of baseball at 21 years, 285 days... St. Louis' Jordan Hicks is 21 years, 248 days old.

A The Braves also have the two youngest position players in the majors in 2B Ozzie Albies (21 years, 125 days) and OF Ronald Acuña Jr. (20 years, 145 days).

WITH TWO OUTS: The Braves scored all three of their runs last night with two outs and now have a MLB-most 99 two-outs runs this season... They also lead the majors with 142 hits, a .304 batting average, a .507 slugging percentage and a .388 on-base percentage in these situations.

A The club's .895 OPS with two outs is tops in the majors... The next closest team is Los Angeles (AL) at .850

MARKAKIS: OF Nick Markakis singled and doubled last night, giving a N.L.-most 51 hits this season... He is also hitting .345 (51-for-148), second best in the league.

A Markakis has struck out 13 times this season, the fewest among any qualifying N.L. hitter... His BB/K ratio of 1.54 (20 BB/13 K) trails only Minnesota's Joe Mauer's 1.59 mark for the major league lead among qualifiers... Only 12 qualifying hitters have a BB/K rate of 1.00 or better.

A Markakis is hitting .400 against lefties this season, tied for the seventh-best mark in the majors... His average is the best by any left-handed hitter, with the next closest qualifier at .357 (Minnesota's Max Kepler).

THE BULLPEN: The Braves bullpen tossed three more scoreless innings last night, bringing its season ERA to 3.61, the eighth-best mark in the majors.

A Over a 12-game stretch that began with allowing 11 runs in 2.2 innings at Wrigley Field on April 14 and ended on April 27, the bullpen went 3-6 with a 7.66 ERA... Since April 28, Braves relievers have compiled a 2.18 ERA (10 ER/41.1 IP) and converted all five of their save chances.

A Their 80.0% save percentage is the best in baseball, as they have the fewest blown saves in the majors at two.

A The Braves are 16-1 when taking a lead to the seventh inning this season.

A The bullpen has allowed eight total home runs, tied for the second fewest in the majors... Only Arizona has surrendered fewer with seven.

THE OFFENSE: The Braves offense leads all of the majors in batting average (.268) and on-base percentage (.336), while leading the N.L. in slugging percentage (.437), runs (199), hits (356), doubles (80) and extra-base hits (129).

DOUBLE PLAYS: The Braves turned four double plays last night and are tied for third in all of baseball with 41 double plays... Only San Francisco and Texas at 43 have more.

A 2B Ozzie Albies is tied for the MLB lead among non-first basemen with 31 double plays... San Francisco's Brandon Crawford also has 31.

A The next closest second baseman is Seattle's Robinson Cano at 26... The next closest N.L. second baseman is St. Louis' Kolten Wong at 22.

THIRD BASE: 3B Ryan Flaherty went 1-for-3 with a walk last night... Braves third basemen this season have a .383 on-base percentage, third best in baseball... Only Colorado (.388) and Chicago-NL (.387) have better marks from their third basemen.

Tonight's Game

A Set for the third start of his major league career...Made his major league debut, 5/1 at NYM.

A Is the youngest pitcher in the majors at 20 years, 281 days.

A Has allowed just three hits and two walks in 18 plate appearances (.188 average) during his first time through the lineup...Opposing batters are hitting .500 (8-for-16) when seeing him for the second time, and .250 (2-for-8) in his third time through the lineup.

A Entered the 2018 season tabbed by Baseball America and MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 3 prospect...MLB.com named him as the No. 27 prospect overall in the minors.

A Made four starts with Triple-A Gwinnett prior to his selection and pitched to a 2-0 record with a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP)...Allowed just 17 hits and five walks while fanning 24.

A Tossed the first shutout of his career in his last minor league start, 4/23 at Rochester...Allowed just three hits and three walks over 7.0 scoreless innings in the first game of a doubleheader.

A Following his last start, ranked among IL pitching leaders in shutouts (1st, 1), complete games (T1st, 1), GO/AO ratio (3rd, 2.15), wins (T4th, 2), strikeouts (5th, 24), innings (T-5th, 22.2) and WHIP (T-8th, 0.97).

2018 Recap

A Made his first career start at SunTrust Park in his last turn, 5/6 vs. SF...Allowed seven hits and four runs over 4.0 innings to take the first loss of his career.

A Beat the New York Mets in his major league debut, 5/1 at Citi Field...Tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball and allowed six hits with five strikeouts.

A Won his debut at the age of 20 years, 270 days, becoming the youngest Braves pitcher to win his debut since LHP Charlie Vaughan beat Houston in game one of a doubleheader on September 3, 1966.

A Beat the NL East-leading New York Mets...The last time a pitcher as young as Soroka won his major league debut against a team in first place at the time was 1997, when the Dodgers' Denny Reyes beat the San Francisco Giants on 7/13...Reyes was 20 years, 85 days at the time, while the Giants were 52-39 and leading the NL West by four games over the Dodgers.

A Became the eighth Braves pitcher to start against the Mets in his major league debut...The eight starters, including Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz on 7/23/88, have combined to go 5-2 with a 1.95 ERA (11 ER/50.2 IP).

A Needed just 80 pitches to complete his 6.0 innings, becoming just the second Braves pitcher to go that long in as few pitches during his major league debut...RHP Ryan Weber went 6.0 innings in 74 pitches on September 8, 2015.

A Made his major league debut at the age of 20 years, 270 days...Became the youngest pitcher to make his debut in a start for Atlanta since RH Julio Teheran debuted at 20 years, 100 days on 5/7/11.

A Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, only five starting pitchers have debuted at a younger age than Soroka - LH Charlie Vaughan (18 years, 332 days - 9/3/66), LH Mike McQueen (19 years, 033 days - 10/2/69), LH Steve Avery (20 years, 060 days - 6/13/90), Teheran and RH Al Santorini (20 years, 114 days - 9/10/68).

A Went 2-0 with a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP) in four starts for Triple-A Gwinnett...Opponents batted just .207 (17-for-82).

A Tossed the first shutout of his career in his last minor league start, 4/23 at Rochester...Allowed just six total baserunners and fanned four over 7.0 innings in the first game of a doubleheader.

A The effort was the second career complete game for Soroka and his first since also going 7.0 innings in a doubleheader on 6/28/16 while with Single-A Rome.

A Soroka's shutout was the first of any length in the International League this season.

A Allowed season highs in hits (6) and runs (3) over 5.0 innings on 4/17 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...Left the game trailing 3-0 before Gwinnett scored eight unanswered runs to win 8-3.

A Fanned a season-high eight over 5.2 innings, 4/12 vs. Rochester...Allowed five hits and two runs in a 7-6, 14-inning loss...The loss was the only defeat for Gwinnett in Soroka's four starts this season.

A Named Gwinnett's Opening Day starter and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings on 4/6 at Norfolk...Yielded just three hits and one walk while striking out five.

A Became the youngest Opening Day starter in the 10-year history of Gwinnett's franchise...Soroka (20 years, 8 months, 2 days) was nearly two years younger than the previous youngest, RHP Tommy Hanson (22 years, 7 months, 12 days), who pitched the inaugural game in Gwinnett history, 4/9/09.

A Named the Braves' organizational Pitcher of the Year after going 11-8 with a 2.75 ERA (47 ER/153.2 IP) in a career-high 26 starts for Double-A Mississippi.

- Has four hits in his last 28 at-bats over a seven-game span dating to 5/4.
- Became the youngest player (20 years, 141 days) to homer in a 1-0 game (5/8 at TB) since 1935, when the Cubs' Phil Cavarretta did it at 19 years, 68 days.
- Became the youngest player to homer for the Braves since Andruw Jones in 1997, hitting a solo shot off Homer Bailey for his first career homer on 4/26 at CIN.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25, for his first appearance on a major league roster...Is the youngest player in baseball.
- Opened the season with Gwinnett and batted .232/.321/.304 over 17 games...Had 11 hits, seven runs, two extra-base hits and three steals in his last eight games.
- Entered the 2018 season tabbed as Atlanta's top overall prospect by both Baseball America and MLB.com, and as the top overall outfield prospect in the minors... MLB.com named him as the No. 2 prospect overall in the minor leagues.
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by both Baseball America and USA Today, Hitting Prospect of the Year by MLB Pipeline.com and Organizational Player of the Year by the Braves last season.

- Leads the N.L. in extra-base hits (26), runs (37) and total bases (97)...Is tied for first in doubles (13) and home runs (12), third in hits (46) and is fourth in slugging percentage (.599).
