REDBIRD RUNDOWN: The Cardinals conclude their first post All-Star Break homestand today, wrapping up a four-game series against the Colorado Rockies...the Cardinals went 12-14 in the month of July...they are 7-7 post All-Star Break and 8-7 under interim manager **Mike Shildt** since he took the post on July 15.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central, 7.5 games out of first place and 4.5 games out of the second Wild Card position. St. Louis has 54 games remaining on their schedule with 21 against N.L. Central opponents.

SCALING THE ROCKIES: Since Busch Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals are 33-13 (.717) against the Rockies at Busch Stadium III, which is the Cardinals 2nd-best home record against any National League opponent (Washington, 1st, 26-10, .722) at the ballpark; but the .283 winning pct. by the Rockies at Busch Stadium III, marks their lowest winning percentage at any current National League park. The Cardinals have won every home series against the Rockies since 2010.

HARD DAY'S NIGHT: The Cardinals and Rockies played a 3-hour, 59-minute game last night, marking the Cardinals longest 9-inning game of the season and the 2nd-longest for the Rockies as they played a 4-hour, 2-minute game in an 11-10 win at Arizona on July 20. It was the Cardinals longest 9-inning game since a 14-13 loss to the Rockies at Coors Field on April 16, 2000, when they played for 4-hours, 19-minutes in the second game of a doubleheader (STL won Game 1 9-3 in 2:53).

THE SUN ALSO RISES: Today's starting pitcher for the Cardinals is **Miles Mikolas** who has a perfect 6-0 record in day games this season, the only pitcher in the National League with a perfect record under the sun in four or more decisions. Mikolas has never suffered a loss in a day game in his Major League career (7-0, 17 day appearances, 10 starts). **Corey Kluber** of the Indians (8-0) and **Seth Manaea** (6-0) of the Athletics sport unblemished day marks of six-plus wins in the American League.

YOUNG GUNS: The Cardinals used six pitchers in last night's game to combine for the win with five pulling rookie status. Only starting pitcher, **Luke Weaver**, does not qualify as a rookie. The 21-year old rookie, **Jordan Hicks**, had appeared in more games than any of his other pitching mates last night as he made his 51st appearance (T8th NL) of the season, while Weaver (44th career), **Mike Mayers** (40th career), winning pitcher **Austin Gomber** (18th), **Daniel Poncedeleon** (3rd) and **Dakota Hudson** (3rd), all saw action in the win.

ROOKIE RACER: **Harrison Bader** stole his 10th base last night, marking the first time a Cardinals rookie posted double-digit stolen bases since **Kolten Wong** stole 20 in 2014 and before that **Kerry Robinson** swiped 11 in 2001. The Cardinals stole three bases last night to match their season-high, done previously at Cincinnati (April 14) when **Tommy Pham** stole two and Bader had one.

SECRET SALSA: **Matt Carpenter** is ranked for 2nd in the National League in home runs with 26 (**Nolan Arenado**, COL, 28). Carpenter is two shy of his career high of 28 home runs in 2015. He's four shy of becoming the 15th Cardinals left-handed hitter to whack 30 home runs in a single season and the first since **Jim Edmonds** hit 42 in 2004. Carpenter's 16 home runs hit on the road this season are tied for the most in the National League with **Paul Goldschmidt**. Carpenter's 11 home runs in July led all of Major League Baseball.

CARP PASSES LOU: **Matt Carpenter** led off Tuesday's game with his 22nd career lead-off home run, passing Hall of Famer **Lou Brock** (21) for the Cardinals franchise record for leading off a game with a home run. The home run was his 7th lead-off home run of the season, extending his own Cardinals single-season mark which also leads all of Major League Baseball. Carpenter leads all National League batters with 20 home runs batting No. 1 and trails only **Francisco Lindor** (26) and **Mookie Betts** (25) in MLB.

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first General Manager from 1991-99...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

Cardinals Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in a combined 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Cardinals infielder **Greg Garcia** served as a Rockies bat boy in 2001...his grandfather, **Dave Garcia**, was a bench coach with the Rockies from 2000-02 working under manager **Buddy Bell**.

Cardinals outfielder **Dexter Fowler** played six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13) and made his Major League debut...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...later traded by Colorado with cash to the Astros for outfielder **Brandon Barnes** and pitcher **Jordan Lyles** (December 3, 2013).

Cardinals infielder **Paul DeJong** made his Major League debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th player in Cardinals history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Cardinals outfielder **Harrison Bader** (July 25, 2017) and pitcher **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Rockies pitcher **Seung-hwan Oh** and Korean Interpreter **Eugene Koo** spent two seasons with the Cardinals (2016-17).

Rockies pitcher **Adam Ottavino** was selected by St. Louis in the first round (30th overall) in the 2006 MLB Draft...pitched in five games for St. Louis in 2010...selected off waivers by Colorado Rockies (April 3, 2012).

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed Cardinals infielder **Jedd Gyorko** (2013-15) and pitchers **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) and **Luke Gregerson** (2009-13) while in San Diego...all three made their MLB debuts under Black.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season. St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from nearby Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...previously worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist writer **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

FOX Sports Midwest reporter **Erica Weston** is originally from Highlands Ranch, Colo...attended Colorado State University.

Rockies Vice President Ticket Sales, Operations & Services **Sue Ann McClaren** worked 15 seasons (1978-92) in the Cardinals sales department before joining the Rockies in 1992.

- Makes his 59th career appearance (32nd start) today in his 22nd start of the season.
- Ranks among NL leaders in wins (11, 6th), winning pct. (.786, 3rd), ERA (2.83, 4th), innings pitched (130.1, 7th), WHIP (1.07, 6th), OPP SLG (.333, 5th), strikeout/walk ratio (3.96, 7th), baserunners/9 IP (10.01, 6th), fewest walks/9 IP (1.59, 2nd), ground ball pct (52.5, 3rd), HR/9 IP (0.62, 3rd), and quality starts (14, T4th).
- Pitched 7.0 or more innings in six starts (T8th in NL) and at least 6.0 innings in 16 of his 21 starts this season (T4th NL).
- Ranks 3rd in the National League in home ERA (2.09), trailing NYM's Jacob deGrom (1.66) and PHI's Aaron Nola (1.99). On the road, he is 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA in 10 road starts; his six road wins are T4th-most in the NL and he is the only NL pitcher with a perfect 1.000 win percentage.
- Ranks 2nd in the NL in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), trailing Jacob deGrom (14.8).
- Limited the opposition to three runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts (2 runs or fewer in six).
- Today marks his fourth straight day start. Is 6-0 with a 3.20 ERA (59.0 IP) in 10 day starts this season, T2nd in the NL in wins (Lester, 7) and is 1 of 8 MLB pitchers with a perfect 1.000 win pct.

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned his team-leading 11th win of the season in last Saturday's 6-2 victory over the Cubs at Busch Stadium. Induced 13 ground ball outs and a pair of double plays while recording his 14th quality start.
- Both runs came on a Javy Báez two-run home run, which snapped a 41 consecutive homerless streak.

- Missed the All-Star Game in Washington D.C., as he returned home to Jupiter, Fla., with his wife Lauren, as they welcomed twin daughter & son on July 16.
- Selected by Major League Baseball to represent the Cardinals on the 2018 National League All-Star team...it was his first MLB All-Star nod and second recognition of his career (2010 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star with Fort Wayne).
- Is the first Cardinals starting pitcher in franchise history to earn an All-Star nod in his first season after signing as a free agent and the only non-rookie player selected this season who didn't play in the Majors last year.
- 15 of his 44 runs (34%) allowed have come in the 4th inning (6.43 ERA).
- Sports an 11-0 record with three no-decisions (St. Louis is 14-3) when receiving two or more runs of support in a start.
- Ranks 6th in the NL with a 5.87 run support average (85 runs)...received 31 runs in last five starts.
- Ranks T5th in the NL with 6 starts without issuing a walk, trailing PIT's Ivan Nova (10), LAD's Ross Stripling (9), Zack Greinke (8), Alex Wood (7) and Clayton Kershaw (7).
- Is one of 16 pitchers in MLB and six in the National League with a shutout this season.
